

His words take you back to the days of church picnics held by a local pond, where a young man might court a young girl over a sweet slice of watermelon. They recall the days of church bazaars, which featured a variety of wares, like colorful quilts and homemade desserts. For Harry Hitt, previous generations and, he hopes, generations to come, the church which has stood the test of time and become a central part of their lives is Bethel United Methodist Church (Bethel UMC) near Waxahachie.

The church was founded in the summer of 1853, when several pioneer families in the area felt they should establish a place of worship for themselves. Over the years, various buildings have been erected, destroyed and rebuilt, all on the faith and staying power of steadfast members. Government projects and even the bright lights of Hollywood have influenced the ebb and flow of the church and put its beautiful buildings at center stage. Through it all, the church has remained and this year celebrated its 155th anniversary.

Born and reared about eight miles outside of Waxahachie off FM 876, Harry is a lifelong member of Bethel United Methodist Church. At 87 years of age, his personal perspective on the growth, challenges and joys that the church has endured and experienced is invaluable. “When I was small, we lived, I

guess, a mile from the church. As long as I can remember, I went to church there," Harry said. Like any child, his mind would wander during services, but his family's guidance kept him in line. "They instilled in me that [going to church] was the thing you needed to do," he added.

As he grew up, Harry was present for the establishment of several church traditions, which are carried on to this day, including their popular Lord's Acre Sale. The Lord's Acre Sale is an annual fundraising event. The program

began under the leadership of the Reverend James H. Ellison, in 1952. The funds raised from the first Lord's Acre Sale in the state of Texas were used to move the parsonage, located two miles from the church, to its present location on the church grounds.

The parsonage was also redecorated and landscaped. A section of a former schoolhouse built just before the Civil War was also purchased and moved to the church property, where it underwent a full renovation. A modern kitchen and restroom facility were added for community use. In December of 1952, the Reverend L. S. Williams dedicated this building as the church's fellowship hall.

Harry recalls the first Lord's Acre Sale with fondness. "We'd never had or seen anything like that before. Everybody was just having a big time. People got to bidding against one another 'cause it's all auction," he said. "The members



bring something to sell, either of their creation, farm products or something that they've invested in. Cakes, pies and a lot of them make quilts." Harry himself brings wares for sale, traveling to Golden, Texas, to pick up sweet potatoes for the festivities.

Bethel UMC, which traces its roots back several generations, has withstood the test of time; a walk around its grounds is a real-life Texas history lesson. In 1978, the Texas Historical Commission recognized the church's cemetery with a historical monument. Located nine miles southwest of Waxahachie on the banks of Bakers Branch, the cemetery has graves which date back to 1873, and even serves as the final resting place for two female slaves. In 1979, the Commission recognized the church as a historical structure and an official marker was placed at the church.

In 2001, the church began a very detailed process of applying for a Registered United Methodist Historic Site marker through the Commission on Archives and History within the Central Texas Conference of the United Methodist Church. The process included a lengthy questionnaire, a written essay and photos, along with other supporting and background material. The application was approved in November of 2001, and the church officially dedicated the marker during its 150th anniversary weekend in 2003.

Its recognition as a historical landmark may or may not have influenced the church's unexpected visitors in 1983. That year, the grounds were used for several scenes in the movie *Places in the Heart*, which included a honky-tonk scene filmed in the church's tabernacle. Burial scenes were filmed in the cemetery and the closing scene, which depicted a worship service and communion, were filmed in the sanctuary. Dairy Queen also filmed a commercial on the property, as well as portions of the TV show *An American Cowboy* with Charlie Pride. Most recently, shots of the church were seen on the television show *Walker, Texas Ranger* with actor Chuck Norris.

As a lifelong member, Harry has



seen changes in his community that directly influenced the church. One of the biggest was the announcement of the Super Conducting Super Collider in the late 1980s. During the planning phases of the failed project, much of the land, home to many church members, was bought and members moved away. Attendance dropped significantly and the church's own literature refers to this as a bleak time for the congregation. However, once the project was cancelled, Harry and the church saw an influx of young families who breathed new life into the community and church. "The Super Collider collapsed and all this land went back on the market," he explained. "Well, people are moving out there and building, and that's what they're looking for. They're looking for a place to worship."

Harry believes the church has withstood for over a century because of its strong founding roots. "The dedication of the heirs of the pioneer families that established the church have kept the church going," he said. "People that grow up in the community have roots here, and even when they move away they still support the church. That support, combined with the movement of new members into the church has held the church together to the present time."

As he speculated on the church's future, Harry's wish is very simple. "I'd like to see it carried on," he said. "I think there's a lot of use for country life, country style and people. I think it's the place to be. And I hope it carries on." **NOW**

Family, as defined in the dictionary, means a mother, a father and a child who coexist happily with one another. For Mike and Tess Reed, family is this and so much more. “We love to watch movies and cook as a family,” Mike explained. “We just love hanging out together as a group,” Tess added. “We enjoy each other’s company.”



The decision for the young family to move from Midlothian to Maypearl less than a year ago also had a great deal to do with the couple's three children — Maylian, Abrey and Brigden.

Relocating to the country meant all the children would be attending one campus, while the six acres of undeveloped land allowed for the open space where they could safely flourish. "We currently have three dogs, three cats, seven chickens and five ducks," Mike laughed, as the dogs greeted visitors with loud barks and one of the cats meowed at the back window. "One day, we hope to also have a horse or two."

The couple modified the floor plans specific to a few of the family's needs. "We knew what we didn't want," Tess said, referring to problematic areas they left behind in their old home. The building process took 18 months due to complications from wet weather, and because Mike, one very talented individual, did most of the work himself. "I hired out a small portion of the electrical, the roofing and the stucco work on the back porch," he said. "It took nearly two full months just to frame the house." Reason being, all the ceilings are 10-foot except for the family room, which measures 11 feet from floor to recessed ceiling. "The brick work was hired

out," Tess added. "Someone installed all the molding, but we painted it."

While the four-bedroom, two-and-one-half bath, Old World European-style inspired home was nearing completion, the family made the actual move to Maypearl, and took up housekeeping within the close constraints of a recreational vehicle. "As the winter winds began to blow through the RV,"

Tess interjected with a smile, "we decided to move into the one room in the house that was complete." Art is an expression of life as seen through the eyes of the artisan. Many times, it is the window to their heart and soul. Such is the case with the artists David Lozano represents. Through their artwork, in every medium imaginable, David has learned there is much more to Columbia, South America, than the violence and drugs, which was all he heard about through the American media. “It was September 14, 1998, and I had just arrived in Bogota, Columbia,” David said, remembering how skeptical he was on that first journey abroad. “I traveled there to see firsthand what Columbia was really like.”

He found beauty on his first night in Columbia — her name was Maria Victoria Palacio Villegas. “We were married seven days later,” he stated proudly. “Vicky introduced me to a country that greets a stranger as a member of the family.” Everything seemed to factor into the couple’s desire to bring Columbian artists to America. “The country’s natural, untouched landscape is as beautiful as a painting depicting an imaginary place filled with peace and tranquility,” David explained. “This is one of the main reasons Vicky and I embarked on this journey to bring some of the finest and most talented Columbian artists to the United States. We wanted the American people to see the other side of Columbia.”

The idea blossomed into reality as a journey, which started in November of 2006. Currently, David handles the artwork



of 62 artists from Columbia, and that number is honestly a drop in the proverbial bucket when it comes to the talent

still yet to be recognized.

“My wife’s family is filled with talent,” David said.

“Pereira is a very small town, but it’s filled with talented individuals. There’s at least one artist or musician per family.” Vicky’s family is politically affiliated, so they have been instrumental in helping David recognize the talent the country has to offer.

David will be the first to admit he has no artistic talent, but his appreciation for those who do is limitless. “These artists enjoy what they do,”

"You can see the pain in her eyes as one tear begins to fall," he added. Ortega Toscano is another painter, who loves painting abstract personalities. David has already acquired paintings of Marilyn Monroe, John Lennon and Angelina Jolie.

While David handles many artists, the one he has grown to love as family is Danilo "Daper" Marin. "He is like a brother to me," David said. "We have a closeness I never had with my own real brothers." Danilo is not only a



first class painter, he is also a singer, guitar player and comedian." Since partnering with David, Danilo no longer goes to work in a Columbian factory, his asthma is under control and his hands are better cared for. "He's much happier," David enthused. "Everyday in Columbia is much like a vacation to Danilo. His passion goes well beyond the canvas and the pastels."

Like Ortega, Danilo also paints personalities. His painting of a young Elvis dressed in a gold jacket, looking as if he is about to twist right off the canvas has received rave reviews. Then there is Dallas Cowboy Quarterback Tony Romo as *The Matador* and another Dallas Cowboy, Terrell Owens, encouraging the fans to get "their popcorn ready." His latest offering is



From Boys to Men

Chad Trinkle grew up in Oklahoma. He moved to Waxahachie to play college football at Southwestern Assemblies of God University (SAGU), while he worked on his bachelor's degree in professional development. As he puts it, "I'm an educator with a minister's degree." Chad's college football career only lasted two years. "I played defensive end," he reminisced. "A serious knee injury put an end to playing football."

The injury may have sidelined Chad until college graduation, but thanks to an opening at Eagle Advantage Academy, formerly Cornerstone Christian Academy, Chad was offered the wings he needed to soar as the head coach of the school's six-man football team. "I came on board as the defensive coordinator when the school was still privately owned and operated," Chad said, explaining that the school has had a six-man team since 1980, when its educational doors first opened. "My second year, I was promoted to head football coach."

Chad, now deep into his third year at Eagle Advantage, comes to the field on a daily basis with one main goal in mind. "I love football and the impact it has on the kids," he enthused. "I want

to be that positive influence. I want to teach them the game of life after sports. Life is much like football; it's full of ups and downs, and highs and lows."

There is a responsibility, Chad stated, that comes with being a member of a football team which is quite similar to being a member of a team in the workplace. "We are a brotherhood," Chad said. "I'm teaching them to be responsible and know that their actions don't just affect them." Chad is a firm believer that choices can change lives. "My goal is to help them change their lives for the better," he added. "I'm not just coaching football, I'm teaching boys to be men before graduating."

Currently, Chad, along with defensive coordinator Neil Rodriguez and special teams coach Gordon Mattison, oversees both the varsity and junior varsity teams. Players come to the game as

ninth-graders, many never having played football prior to this time. Last year, only the varsity team was in place. By the time the season started, Chad had 16 active players remaining on his roster. "This year, I started with 38, but I lost a few when two-a-days started," he explained. "There were 20 open spots on varsity. All the rest went to junior varsity."



Every morning before practice starts, time is reserved for character building. "The first 15 minutes are spent teaching them not only about being responsible young men," Chad said, "but also sportsmanship, understanding and patience. They learn that winning is the icing on the cake, but it's not all about winning. It's more about how they play the game."

The differences between six-man and 11-man football are many. Chad decided the easiest way to explain the nuances found in a six-man game would be to list what he considers to be the top four. "The field is 100 yards in 11-man and only 80 yards in six-man," he explained. "In 11-man, players have to run 10 yards for a first down, while those on the six-man team have to run 15 yards for the same first down." The reason for the extra yards is simple to understand once Chad fully explained. "On offense, all six players can receive or run the ball," he said, "where on an 11-man team, only the wide receivers can run with the ball to score points."

Touchdown conversions are also quite different, due, in large part, to

the overall speed of the six-man game. "On 11-man, when a field goal is kicked the team earns one point, and when the ball is run in, they score what's called a two-point conversion," Chad stated. Rumor and reputation swirl around the Catfish Plantation in Waxahachie. Its reputation includes trademark recipes made with all fresh produce and batter, making it a Cajun favorite among the locals. New owners, Richard Landis and brothers, Ryan Rodriguez and Jim Ensinia, have expanded the menu to include "the best down-home cookin' that will melt in your mouth." The perfect blend of Cajun and Southern style cooking has earned the restaurant "The Top 10 Favorite Catfish Restaurant in the State of Texas," according to the 2006 *Texas Highways* magazine.



Catfish is not the only reason people travel from all over the United States to visit this Victorian-style, historic home-turned-restaurant. It is said to be haunted. To be specific, three individual spirits haunt it.

In 1984, when original owners Tom and Melissa Baker opened the Catfish Plantation, odd things began to occur. Silverware and pepper shakers moved, spoons disappeared, teacups were precariously stacked in unusual places and doors randomly

opened and closed. When the couple hired a team of parapsychologists, they learned of Elizabeth, Will and Caroline.

The residence of 814 Water Street,

believed to be built in 1895, was once home to Elizabeth, a young bride killed by an ex-lover on her wedding day. Will, a farmer who lived in the home during the same time period is reputedly the reason many female customers feel a cool sensation on their knee. He does like the ladies. "But Caroline is the lady of the house," Jim said with a smile.

While the Catfish Plantation does not serve alcohol, customers are welcome to bring their own. The staff, pleased to see their customers celebrate a special occasion, will provide wine or champagne buckets. "And that's when we see the most activity," Ryan said. Caroline was a devout Southern Baptist woman, so her spirit is most active when she is disapproving.

Jim, who began working as a busboy

when the restaurant opened, has seen many strange things over the years. Initially, he would not tell anyone of the strange occurrences, yet he was never concerned for his safety. "They are gentle spirits," Richard said. "They are part of the ambiance, and we'd never try to change that."

When Ryan learned the Catfish Plantation was for sale, he called Jim and family friend, Richard. He knew they needed to buy the restaurant because there is yet another untold secret about this captivating culinary delight. "We are so much more than them {the ghosts}, " Richard said.

While all three men talk about their love of their hometown and of their newly acquired restaurant, more secrets come tumbling out. As they point to the historical marker on the building, share stories about previous residents and of the old ways of Waxahachie, it is clear that the Catfish Plantation is about family, preserving history and tradition. "It takes a concerted effort," Richard said, "to preserve the downtown history. We're the only three-star restaurant in direct support of the square!"

The men are excited about the future. They extended their business hours, began a brand new catering service and introduced the clever ideas of a "family pack," a preordered meal to-go and "family-style dining," an economical way for the entire family to dine, including appetizers, drinks, main course and dessert. The entrepreneurial trio hopes to make the experience of good food, family and dining the tradition it once was in this country. "With us," Jim said, "the sky's the limit." Just ask the ghosts.



Modern Day Drama

When Dr. Skip Redd directs a play for the Southwestern Assemblies of God University (SAGU) drama department, he blends classics with contemporary, traditional with modern, stage acting with 21st-century technology. The result is fresh, enjoyable, exciting and high-quality dramatic productions.

Skip said audience members are pleasantly surprised by the caliber of SAGU's plays. People also are often surprised to learn that SAGU does not only perform religious plays. Last year's plays were *The Crucible*, *Arsenic and Old Lace*, *The Diary of Anne Frank* and *To Kill a Mockingbird*. This year, the theatrical team will perform *It's a Wonderful Life* in December. The spring plays have not yet been decided.

Before the *The Crucible* was performed, Skip partnered with the English, history and theology departments to give presentations to the students. The English department discussed the play itself and the literature. The history department explained the historical context of the Salem witch trials, while the theology department explained what the Puritans and Quakers believed at that time about demon possession. All of this gave the students a much deeper understanding of the play they were performing.

For *The Diary of Anne Frank*, Skip took the students to the Holocaust museum in Dallas. "It changed their lives," he said. He also scheduled a 5:30 a.m. Saturday rehearsal so that students would feel what Anne Frank experienced getting up so early to go with her family into hiding. "They realized

this was a real person's life," he said. "It was amazing to watch their development. It was a life lesson."

Jumping headlong into projects is nothing new for Skip. An ordained minister from Colorado, Skip was a minister of music with his church back home. That was not enough for him. "I wanted to know what the schools were teaching kids, so I got a master's in music education and my teaching certificate." He became a music teacher and a minister of music, media and drama. He also has a master's degree in communication with an emphasis on TV production and film and a Ph.D. in communication arts. "The path God has kept me on has kept me innovative," Skip said. With a sly smile, he added, "And it's been fun."

That path has also kept SAGU's drama department state-of-the-art, by integrating media into its productions. "I see how it's a tool and it's a craft," Skip said. "Society has changed so much that we have to be cognizant of that view. I had a phenomenal pastor who mentored me to go beyond the typical. But at the same time, I am very sensitive to our audience. The plays, after all," he added, "are our gift back to the community."

Another way Skip has gone beyond the typical is by creating a dramatic team of students called Dramatic Pause. The team is made up of eight students who travel around the state and nation, visiting prisons, children's homes, psychiatric hospitals and retirement homes. They tell stories through skits,

monologues and "human videos" — movement choreographed to music. "The stories reach people; they touch people," Skip explained.

In addition to being drama director, Skip is director of media services and communications arts departmental chair. He has directed more than 40 productions. He came to SAGU in 1998. Coincidentally, his oldest daughter started as a student there the same year. "Melody accused us of following her to college," Skip laughed. Three of his four children have graduated from SAGU. He and his wife, Claudia, also have two grandchildren.

When he talks about his children, grandchildren and students, Skip reveals the same compassion and humanity that comes across in his dramatic productions. He speaks of the life lessons that drama provides and the benefits of being involved. He talks about people's choices having consequences, but at the same time he believes people deserve second chances. He also speaks about keeping up with societal changes, staying relevant, so that the plays' messages are meaningful and powerful.

That contemporary compassion and forgiving nature may be the reason his students work so hard for him. It also may be why his plays touch so many people. Yet he gives the credit to his students. "We have a thriving program," Skip said. "It's phenomenal entertainment for local people at a professional level. I'm really pleased with the students. They really work hard. They are very creative and very aggressive. They want to be on the cutting edge of the whole craft, so they're exciting to be around."

Indeed, students are responsible for every aspect of the productions — from set and costume design to lighting. Remarkably, while some students do have dramatic backgrounds, many have never been involved with plays before. "I'll find their gift and put them to work where they're best suited and where they will learn the craft," Skip said. **NOW**



CHICKEN TORTILLA SOUP

- 1 whole chicken
- 1 16-oz. can chicken broth
- 1 8-oz. can diced green chilies
- 1 10-oz. can chopped Ro-Tel tomatoes
- 1 cup onion, chopped
- 1 to 3 lbs. Velveeta cheese

Boil, debone and dice whole chicken (or just breast if you prefer white meat). Add chicken broth, green chilies, Ro-Tel tomatoes and onion. Simmer for about 1 hour. Add Velveeta cheese to taste just before serving; just long enough to melt well. Serve hot with tortilla chips. Soup is one of our most requested dishes for catering.

APPLE BREAD

- 1/2 cup shortening
- 1 cup sugar

- 2 eggs
- 2 cups flour
- 1 tsp. soda
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. cinnamon

Blend shortening, sugar and eggs until good and smooth. In a separate bowl, blend flour, soda, salt and cinnamon; blend into egg mixture. Add sour cream and apple. Pour into greased and floured 9-inch loaf pan. Bake 1 hour and 20 minutes at 350 F. Makes one loaf.

EASY MEXICAN BRISKET AND BEANS

- 1 lb. dry pinto beans
- approximately 4 to 5 cups water
- 1 3 to 4-lb. trimmed brisket
- garlic salt to taste
- pepper to taste

- 1 14.5-oz. can cream of mushroom soup
- 1 10-oz. can Ro-Tel chopped tomatoes

Wash beans and spread out in bottom of 13 x 9-inch baking dish. Add enough water (4 to 5 cups) to cover beans. Season brisket with garlic salt and pepper to taste. Place in baking dish on top of beans, fat side up. Pour soup on top of brisket. Pour Ro-Tel tomatoes on top of soup. Cover with foil and bake in 275 F oven for about 12 hours or until beans are soft. The Amazing Liver

The largest organ inside the body reveals remarkable regenerative properties. You can lose a majority portion of your liver and the remaining tissue can grow into a whole organ once again. Amazing. This vital organ performs numerous functions and without it, the body would perish.

It is located in the upper right side of the abdomen and below the diaphragm. One of its more important jobs is to remove waste products from the bloodstream by performing as a filter. Drugs, alcohol and environmental substances are just a few of the substances removed or neutralized by the liver. The liver produces and regulates cholesterol, manufactures clotting factors for the blood and other proteins. It helps to maintain the balance of hormones. Making and secreting bile and storing some vitamins and minerals are some of the more well-known functions. The liver also helps to regulate blood sugar levels by storing glycogen.

There are many things you can do to keep your liver healthy. Excessive intake of alcohol is the leading cause of liver disease, so drink in moderation. Use over-the-counter medications and herbal or natural remedies with caution. Your liver still has to process it whether it is man-made or "natural." Even high doses of certain vitamins can be harmful. Follow your physician's instructions on any prescribed


medication. Limit or avoid any exposure to environmental hazards and toxins such as certain cleaners and insecticides. If you can breathe it, consume it or have it penetrate your skin, it will eventually reach your liver. So, use gloves and a mask in a well-ventilated area when handling hazardous chemicals. Try to avoid foods that are high in unhealthy fats. The diseases of Hepatitis A, B and C can cause significant damage to the liver, but there are vaccines available for Hepatitis A and B. Since the virus is spread by contact with another's bodily fluids or blood, try to avoid contact with these substances.

Although it can regenerate itself, the liver is not indestructible. Some of the signs and symptoms that your liver may be headed for trouble may at first be too vague for a diagnosis. Nausea, weakness, lack of energy and a change in appetite can be attributed to a host of diseases. The more specific indications that are cause for alarm are yellowing of the skin, eyes and urine

(jaundice). Advanced cases would present with symptoms such as unexplained itching of the skin, abdominal pain and swelling, in addition to the previous presenting symptoms.

These symptoms are cause for concern and warrant monitoring by your physician. Many liver ailments can be treated. The best course of action is to protect yourself and keep you and your liver safe. **NOW**

Shade Gardening

Are you ready for fall yet? October, pumpkins and falling leaves are all sure signs that the seasons are changing once again. It is time to put a bit more nitrogen on that lawn area and decide if those great containers are going to have to find a warmer place for the winter. I usually cut container plants back severely and put them in the garage from Thanksgiving until after Valentine's Day, but there is a limit to the amount of space my husband is willing to share, so I need to put in my request early!

Once this year's plants are taken care of, it is time to look hard at those shady places in my yard. They never seem so shady in the spring, since it takes a while for the leaf cover to reach its full maturity. If we can plant now for color next year, the plants will have a better chance to grow strong root systems before it heats up in July and August.

Columbine perennial flowers, both Wild Red and Texas



Gold varieties, are good for dry shady areas. Daylily, irises and coral bells will all bloom in the spring shade if they are put in the ground now. Oxalis, both purple and green, will bloom early and still add color all summer long. Inland Sea oats, Turks Cap and Cast Iron plants are among my favorites for the dry areas under trees. Once they get going, they will add late summer color and flourish on neglect!

Take a look now at that landscape and see what you have room for, or where you would like to see more color next year. It is never too early to start dreaming and planning! **NOW**


