#### Dear Friends,







# Believing in a Cure — By Sydni Thomas

Teen sensation Nick Jonas (of the Jonas brothers) was diagnosed with diabetes in 2005 and has since been spreading awareness and writing

songs about how his condition will not control his life. Mansfield High School student Rebecca Rangel knows all too well the effects of diabetes on the young. At 16, Rebecca leads a team, Becca's Believers, raising funds for the American Diabetes Association's Step Out event. She believes in a cure.

Rebecca was just 10 when she was diagnosed with maturity-onset diabetes of the young, also referred to as MODY. This form only affects about two percent of those diagnosed with diabetes and it is so rare that many doctors do not recognize it. Many times it gets diagnosed as Type 1 because of low insulin levels. The pancreas

makes enough sugar, but does not distribute it. MODY is a genetic disorder, which has a 50-percent chance of being passed along if one parent has it. Typically it is diagnosed in those under

the age of 25.

Diabetes is common in the Rangel family. "The diagnosis comes as diabetes," Rebecca's mother, Mary Margaret, explained. "Then you are classified as MODY, Type 1 or Type 2." Rebecca's father, Eloy, was diagnosed late in life during a routine checkup. Her uncle, Omar, was diagnosed with Type 1. Both of Eloy's parents were diagnosed when they were very young. Rebecca's 11-year-old sister, Vanessa, gets tested every year.

Rebecca's grandmother still lives with Type 2 diabetes, while the family continues to grieve over the loss of her grandfather, who passed in August as a result of his Type 2 diabetes. "I try to eat right and exercise to prolong that from happening to me," Rebecca stated.

Rebecca does not have to give herself insulin shots, but has to take a daily pill. In most cases of MODY, monitoring


exercise and eating will control the situation. As with all types of diabetes, testing blood sugar levels is important. When her levels get too low, which does not happen very often, Rebecca just has to eat. She keeps Skittles candy in her car in case something happens while she drives. "At a conference I heard a guy speak about how he lives with his diabetes," Rebecca said. "One of the tips he gave us was to always keep something sweet in the car in case our levels got too low while driving. He would keep Skittles because they can't melt like chocolate and they are pure sugar. When I started driving that was the first thing I did."

The Rangel family lived in Corpus Christi when Rebecca was diagnosed. Not long after the family moved to Colorado. To learn more about diabetes Rebecca's mom, Mary Margaret, found the Barbara Davis Center for Childhood Diabetes, one of the few places in the area specializing in MODY. "We were really involved in the Barbara Davis Center," Rebecca said. "I was in fifth grade and had no idea what to do. It took me a while to get adjusted, but the people at the center helped me understand."

The center offers classes and training

for the diagnosed and their families. Summer camps are held for children with diabetes to help them learn how to do fun outdoor activities while learning to live with their condition. Rebecca attended these camps when she was younger and now she serves as a diabetes counselor-in-training. "I get to work with the young kids," Rebecca said. "We take them swimming, make sure they get a snack and then we are back at it again, always monitoring their levels and showing them how also."

Her father, Eloy, is in the Navy and they have to move around a lot. When Eloy was transferred from Colorado



to Texas there was not a place like the Barbara Davis Center. Instead, they became active in the American Diabetes Association (ADA). Last year, Rebecca decided to participate in the ADA's Step Out event. Participants gain support by building teams and getting donations. "I had to come up with a name for my team, and my aunt suggested Becca's Believers," said Rebecca, who created a Facebook page for Becca's Believers. "I had people sign up to walk with me last year that I didn't even know. It was such a great experience."

Becca's Believers raised over \$700 last year. With the help of her family and friends, Rebecca plans on exceeding \$1,000 this year. The walk will take place later this month and they are very close to the goal already. They had a fundraiser planned every month until the event. Earlier in the year they hosted a fundraiser at Johnny Carino's in Mansfield. Guests came from 5:00 in the afternoon until closing and a portion of each ticket was donated to Becca's Believers. "All of my choir friends came to the event," Rebecca said. "They serenaded the diners, and we all had a great time."



Having diabetes makes a person different. Even though it is becoming more common in children, it is still a condition that many are uneducated about. Every day when Rebecca has to go to the nurse before lunch students get curious. Only her closest friends know about her diabetes. Those that she encounters who know about diabetes often have not heard about MODY. She has taught her friends all about it, and they know that when she says she needs food that it means now. "When my friend, Hallie, found out she introduced me to her best friend, Marshan," Rebecca said. "He has Type 1 diabetes. We go test our blood sugar every day together at lunch. He won't tell people he has diabetes. He says he has 'livabetes' because it isn't going to get him."

# "I keep diabetes in the back of my mind."

Rebecca is a normal teenager, and nobody would know she had diabetes by looking at her. She enjoys athletic activities like jogging with her dad and swimming with her little sister. This year she will be one of the yearbook editors at Mansfield High School. She is passionate about writing, traveling and the '80s, even though she was born in the '90s. After high school she plans to go to college and study law.

Having diabetes and the fear of what effect it will have on her life in the future is not stopping Rebecca from living her life. Raising money and being active in the ADA has helped her take control of her life. "I keep diabetes in the back of my mind," Rebecca said. "I'm blessed that it isn't like Type 1 where I have to be constantly thinking about it. I don't have to worry as much. It's relevant, but I don't let it control me." **NOW**

God and family are very important to Mannie Toledo, who has been gifted with a soul mate whose energy sparks all sorts of creative touches around their home. "Without God's blessing and Kristene's entrepreneurial spirit, her inspiration of creating beautiful floral arrangements and helping people achieve their full potential in their homes, we would not be where we are today," Mannie said. "My wife and I are very blessed to be able to enjoy our work and raising our two beautiful daughters, Katarina and Sydney."





Sometimes when Mannie comes home from his work as director of Operations and Banquet and Convention Services at The Grand Hyatt DFW, he is welcomed by the melodious sounds of his daughters playing the piano that Kristene's grandparents bought for her dad and both her uncles in the '40s. "They left the tag that says they paid \$920 in the bench where the music is stored. Any little kids, as soon as they get here for parties or whatever, they just go straight to pounding on the piano," said Kristene, who worked side-by-side with Mannie to set off their entry-hall piano room with Austin-chalk stoned archways.



time, so each could dry," Kristene said. She painted the other three walls with Bungalow Gold. Mixing and matching colors, textures and furniture that they like, the Toledos have achieved an eclectic, earthy, homey mix. Adorning the wall facing the Toledos' bed are portraits of Sydney and Katarina, made by a very good friend of theirs. Outside their window is a sweet fountain, given to Kristene by another friend. As a thank you, Kristene made her a signature floral arrangement.

Throughout the Toledo home every decorative wall sconce, vase or floor setting containing dried flowers has been made by Kristene. "I don't know if what I do for a living is a blessing or a curse. I always have the materials for decorating at my fingertips, and always change things," said Kristene, who excuses her habitual do-it-yourself projects by telling herself that she has to practice before she can tell a customer she can do it. Mannie always helps with the various projects. "I don't want to call it 'a perfect home,' but to know it's a place where family and friends can be comfortable," Mannie said.

The couple's most recent project is their backyard grill, which they built using more of that recycled dry stack stone. "We grill all the time, even in cold weather," said Mannie, whose daughters hold an umbrella over their dad while he grills on rainy evenings. Surrounded by three oak trees, which Mannie planted from acorns, the four pecan trees he has babied, the built-from-scratch pergola and the playhouse for the girls, Mannie enjoys the creek and remembers watching his grandfather build things on the farm.

not know where you came from, you're not going to know where you're going.' If I get frustrated, I think, *Okay, they had it hard, too*!''

Across the hall from her office, Kristene makes bouquets in a light-filled room containing hundreds of varieties of dried flowers. 



# Giving It Their Best Shot - By Melissa Rawlins





Success in shooting competitions comes as no surprise for three young men, who each got started in the sport through a 4-H club, grew up in families filled with hunters, went to Legacy High School, live within five miles of each other and spend all their free time shooting sporting clays together. Hard work combined with a great support system results in high scores every time they lift their shotguns to shoot the slender clay discs, whether down at Beaumont Ranch in Grandview, up at Fossil Pointe in Slidell, right here at Alpine Shooting Range on Shelby Road or even at Leakenheath in Great Britain.

England was the host country where this year's Junior Team USA Sporting Clays Team won the gold in July. Hunter Milligan, 15, Kyler Ford, 17, and J. Henderson, 19, were all invited to join the team of eight individuals from all over the USA. The three friends enjoyed their visit to England and polished their technique during that tournament, going back over their shooting to learn from mistakes. "When we were in England, I had the worst score of the team on the first day," Kyler said. "When we went back to the hotel, I thought about what went wrong and realized I was tense. The next day I went back relaxed, and had a good time. When things go wrong, you just go back to the fundamentals."

Once the Sporting Clays Team won their gold, they headed off to the airport and all but J. returned to the United States. One of 1,200 people from 33 different countries traveling that week to Arezzo (in the Tuscany region of Italy), J. was captain of the French-inspired Federation Internationale de Tir Aux

Sportives de Chasse (FITASC) Team, representing the Junior Team USA. "FITASC is like shooting clays, but it simulates European bird shooting, a bigger sport in Europe," J. said. "It's the same principle: you want to go out and break more targets than the other guy, but there are a few more rules to follow, and it's harder to hit the targets." Everything went as it was supposed to for J. "You want to make sure everything counts," he said. "I have a mental routine I go through. I make sure that right before I call for the target, I go through the system. Whenever I run that system, I'm confident that bird's going to break."


Kyler and Hunter run similar routines. Hunter takes 10-15 seconds before he





### Learning simple self-defense techniques develops discipline and confidence for Troy's students ages 5 to 87! — By Melissa Rawlins

Sometimes the difference between life and death is just seconds. Troy Dorsey's Karate and Fitness Kickboxing prepares men, women and children to react quickly in real-life situations by training the body and the mind to work in unison. "One of the toughest things people do can be walking in their front door, because of the fear of the unknown. Don't worry, you're not gonna get hit when you come here," said Troy Dorsey, owner and one of six instructors at the clean, spacious studio in historic downtown Mansfield. "Everything we do in each class will help students of any age defend themselves better. So often people think martial arts has a kind of mystical awe about it. But it's not really at all like that."

Mansfield born and reared, Troy designed his classes in kickboxing and American karate (also known as American tae

kwon do) to teach students discipline. "We say a student creed at the beginning of the class, just some general reminders of what we should be thinking and what we should be doing and when to use what we learn," said Troy, whose focus is strengthening students' minds and bodies. Turns out customers also increase their confidence and self-esteem through karate. The belt system is designed so as a person is promoted they can see improvement quickly. "We have progress checks monthly. This month, the belts are awarded at the Blackbelt Extravaganza at the Mansfield Activity Center. If the student has been here the month, averaging twice a week, they will receive a stripe because of what they know."

Troy shares the wisdom he has learned over his years practicing martial arts in the '70s, '80s and '90s, and he is grateful

for this opportunity. "I started karate in historic downtown Mansfield in 1973. I've been able to travel and be a competitor. I've won six world titles in kickboxing, and two in boxing. My last fight was in 1998, and we opened this business in 1999," Troy said. "I owe this to the Lord's supernatural provision He's given me for 11 years. I know without Jesus Christ this business wouldn't exist. I thank Him because I don't deserve it!"

The joy of Troy's life is his family of females, who inspire him to continue helping others develop self-confidence. "I wouldn't have this business if it wasn't for my wife, Leslie. My daughter, Kendra, works here with me. Shelly is 16 and a cheerleader. There are three women [in my family]," Troy said. "There's a crazy statistic [which says] one in three will be violently attacked in their lifetime! We

teach self-control — whenever a situation arises you have to be able to use selfcontrol to avoid some type of penalty or pain or even death," Troy said.

Troy is proud of his teaching staff. Two women instructors, Candace Anders and Karen Cook, teach kickboxing. Including Troy, there are five karate instructors: Cody Dunn, Ben Roden, Cody Cook and Robert Sapp, who was one of Chuck Norris' black belts and this month celebrates his two-year anniversary at Troy Dorsey's Karate and Fitness Kickboxing. "We require parents to be here for the first two lessons," Troy said. "They can see in our classes the energy, the roleplaying we do. Parents can see exactly what we'll teach the children: respect, selfcontrol, discipline and also the dangers of drugs and alcohol. We drill them, over and over, until they can just walk away when we ask: 'Hey, you want to smoke a cigarette?' We confront them with those things, and they react with confidence, discipline and self-control." Now that is total fitness!

# Relationships – Priority Number One – By Adam Walker



Relationships are very important for Derrell Douglas, the new principal at Mansfield Timberview High School. With 18 years as an educator, 12 of those as a principal or assistant principal, Derrell has learned a thing or two and knows the value of people. "School," Derrell explained, "is the people business. Relationships are important. When there is trust and caring in the teacher-student relationship, students will perform better and learn more. When students can see the relationships between what they are learning in their different classes and between yesterday's lesson and today's, they will understand more. When they see the relationship between what they are learning at school and the real world, they won't have to ask, 'What does what I'm learning have to do with my life?""

Derrell started his career in education as a history teacher and coach at Nichols Junior High School in Arlington. One year, while expecting his third child, he found himself at a Promise Keepers meeting in Washington, D.C. and came away convinced that God wanted him to leave coaching. So when he returned to his school, he went to his principal and asked to be released from his coaching duties. His principal informed him he would have to resign his contract. "I took a leap of faith. I thought I would just be a history teacher." But his principal surprised him by asking him to apply for the job of assistant principal. He got the job, but that meant he had to go back to college for his master's degree in education, which he finished that year. Three years later that principal retired, and Derrell was picked as the new principal of his school. "God had a plan and steered me in the right direction," Derrell said.

Now after working at the middle school level for 18 years, Derrell is



looking for new challenges and new experiences as a high school principal. "I felt like I had experienced just about everything at that grade level, so I wanted something new. Timberview is the high school that my old school, James Coble Middle School, feeds into, so I already know many of the students and parents here." But there is a second middle school, Danny Jones Middle School, which sends its students to Timberview as well. Derrell is excited about getting to know those students and parents, also. "All the teachers and staff members were new faces to me," Derrell said. "I looked forward to showing them what to expect from me and learning what to expect from them."

Derrell's many years of experience stand him in good stead. "Most things that come up, I have experienced them before, so I don't overreact. I remain calmer because I have been through some similar situation before," he explained. "But every year new things do come up. I try not to get too worked up about those either." He sees an important part of his job as "helping teachers understand areas of need in our school and getting them the training and resources they need to deal with the needs of our students." Mounds of data about every aspect of education are available to today's educators. "There

is so much more data available today," Derrell explained. "As principal, I am responsible to help teachers and staff know how to use that data."

The challenging part of being principal of a large school is the numbers. "We have about 2,500 students and 100 to 150 staff. It's impossible to know what's going on with that many people," Derrell confessed. "There is only one principal. I care about what is going on in every classroom and at every event, but I can't be everywhere. Sometimes there are three events on the same night; I try to show

up for at least part of all of them to let the students and parents know what they are doing matters to me. Part of being effective is finding the right number of people with whom I can consistently communicate, who are in regular contact with everyone else — to not let people get lost in the crowd. I can't see every student or even every teacher every day, but I can keep in touch."

Derrell likes to keep in touch with people long after they have left his classroom or school. "Facebook has allowed me to reconnect with former students and see the success in their lives years after school, hear about their careers and families. Their success is kind of why I do this."

He also loves to see other people succeed. "I enjoy what I do because of the relationships. I enjoy watching students perform and succeed, both academically and in their sports and other activities like band. I enjoy watching teachers succeed and reach their goals whether they stay in the classroom or go on to become counselors or administrators." Other people's success is how he measures his own. "You hope you have given students some sort of tool that helped them succeed, that you didn't get in the way of their success," he stated. "Seeing them successful, independent and on their own, taking care of themselves, that's the goal."

#### SOUTHWESTERN PORK TENDERLOIN WITH PICO DE GALLO

2 Tbsp. of honey

- 2 Tbsp. of olive oil
- 1 tsp. of oregano flakes
- 1/4 to 1/2 tsp. of cayenne pepper
- 1 3/4 to 2lbs. pork tenderloin
- 2 ripe tomatoes, diced
- 1 small onion. diced
- 1 jalapeño pepper, seeded, membranes removed and diced
- 1/4 cup of diced cilantro
- 2 Tbsp. lime juice
- Salt and pepper, to taste
- Pico de gallo

1. Combine honey, olive oil, oregano and cayenne pepper in a bowl to form a paste. Rub into pork tenderloin; cover and marinate overnight or at least 8 hours.

 Combine chopped tomatoes, onion, jalapeño pepper, cilantro, lime and salt and pepper to taste. Cover and refrigerate for at least 4 hours to allow flavors to blend.
 Preheat your grill to medium heat; cook pork to at least medium or medium well 160-170 F. Remove; let rest for about 10 minutes.
 Slice and serve with pico de gallo on warm tortillas.

#### STUFFED RED PEPPERS WITH CHEESY POLENTA AND GREEN CHILIES

3 medium red bell peppers 3/4 cup yellow cornmeal 2 cups water 1 tsp. salt 1/2 tsp. garlic salt 1/4 tsp. freshly ground pepper 1/2 cup heavy whipping cream 1 7-oz. can chopped green chilies, drained 2/3 cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese 1/2 cup Parmesan cheese 1. Preheat oven to 400 F. 2. Cut red bell peppers in half length wise and discard the seeds and membranes. Place bell pepper cups in a lightly greased 13 x 9-inch baking dish. 3. Whisk cornmeal and next four ingredients in a large saucepan over medium heat; bring to a

boil. Cook, whisking constantly, 5-7 minutes, until polenta thickens and is creamy.

4. Stir in cream and next three ingredients, blending well.

5. Spoon mixture into pepper cups.

6. Bake at 400 F for 25-30 minutes or until peppers are tender.

#### SAUSAGE STUFFED ACORN SQUASH

3 acorn squash 2 cups water 1/2 lb. spicy Italian sausage, casings removed and sausage crumbled 1 medium onion, diced 1 red bell pepper, diced 1 can chicken broth 1/2 cup water



- 1 6-oz. box herb seasoned stuffing mix.
- 1 egg beaten
- 3 Tbsp. maple syrup
- 2 Tbsp. grated Parmesan cheese
- 1. Heat oven to 400 F.

 Cut squash in half length wise and scoop out the seeds. Place in a jelly roll pan, cut sides down. Add 2 cups water and roast for 30-45 minutes or until squash is fork tender.
 Meanwhile cook crumbled sausage in a sauté pan until browned. Add onion and pepper; cook 10-15 min until vegetables are tender. Add chicken broth and water to sauté pan. Bring to a boil over high heat.

<sup>4</sup>. Place stuffing in a large bowl. Add the sausage mixture to the bowl with the stuffing; stir until moistened. Add the beaten egg after mixture has cooled a bit.

5. Remove squash from oven; invert squash. Brush the insides of the squash with the maple syrup. Fill with the stuffing mixture; mound it generously. Cover loosely with foil. Roast for 15 minutes. Remove foil and roast an additional 15 minutes. Remove from oven, top with cheese.

#### **CLASSICAL COOKIES**

- 3/4 cup butter or margarine
- 1 cup graham cracker crumbs
- 1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips
- 1 cup butterscotch chips
- 1 cup chopped nuts
- 1 cup shredded coconut
- 1 can sweetened condensed milk
- 1. Preheat oven to 350 F.

2. Melt butter or margarine and spread in a 13 x 9-inch baking pan. Spread graham cracker crumbs on top to form a crust on the bottom of the pan.

3. Evenly layer: chocolate chips, butterscotch

- chips, chopped nuts and shredded coconut. 4. Drizzle sweetened condensed milk on top.
- 5. Bake 20-25 minutes until barely brown.

Cool in pan on a wire rack. Cut into 2 x 1 1/2inch squares.

6. This is great served with hot fudge or caramel sauce and ice cream!



### Are You Taking Advantage of a Roth IRA?

Simply put, contributing to a Roth Individual Retirement Account (IRA) may be a smart money move. The question then is ... are you taking full advantage? The benefit of contributing

to the Roth IRA is the money you put into one of these accounts grows tax free and distributions may be made tax free.<sup>1</sup>

If you haven't opened a Roth IRA, do it now. You have until your tax deadline (typically April 15) to set up an account and make contributions for the previous year. Annual contributions are limited; currently the maximum amount is \$5,000.<sup>2</sup> That means you can invest \$5,000 for 2010, giving you a solid start to your savings.

If you're just starting to invest, the Roth IRA should be one of your first options — even

before you open a regular, taxable account or contribute to a workplace retirement savings plan. The only exception is if your employer offers a match on your 401(k) contributions. That's free money you don't want to pass up. You can invest in both a Roth IRA and a workplace retirement plan.

Not sure where to find money to fund your account? Consider investing your tax refund. The amount could be a great start for funding a Roth IRA.

There are specific income restrictions for contributing to a



Roth IRA. Contributions are limited and based on the taxpayer's filing status and Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI). When the taxpayer's income exceeds the eligibility limits for contributing to a Roth IRA, an eligibility phase out period begins.

For 2010, the MAGI phase out range for contributing to a Roth IRA is:

• At least \$167,000 but less than \$177,000 for a married couple filing a joint return or a qualified widow(er).

• At least \$105,000 but less than \$120,000 for a single individual or head of household.

• Less than \$10,000 for a married individual filing a separate return.

Your exact contribution amount can be calculated using the worksheets found in Publication 590 on the IRS Web site at www.irs.gov.


#### Sources:

1. Withdrawals are tax-free if you're over age 59 1/2 and at least five years have expired since you established a Roth IRA. Otherwise withdrawals of gain may be taxable (unless the withdrawal is "qualified") and may be subject to a 10-percent tax penalty.

2. An individual can contribute up to \$5,000 (or 100 percent of earned income, whichever is less) for tax year 2010. If you are over age 50, you are allowed to make additional catch-up contributions of \$1,000 for tax years 2009 and 2010. Your adjusted gross income may limit your contribution amount.




