

"When everybody in school sees you wrestle, it helps," he said. "We just moved some things around in our fitness center, and the minute we opened it up for practice, kids stopped by wanting to join. One night after a basketball game, we had some folks just standing outside the room watching. They were all looking in here like they'd never seen anything like it before."

wrestling is as popular as basketball, baseball and a variety of other sports. In Texas, however, it is still growing.

Centennial began its program at the start of the 2015-16 school year. It is something Blake, in his sixth year at the school, has wanted since he first arrived. Turns out, he wasn't the only one who wanted to add wrestling to the sports offerings. He got help from higher sources. "Our head football coach and athletic director, Coach Kyle Geller, was a high school wrestler in California and has a passion for the sport," Blake shared.

Kyle said it was a dream of his to have a really good football and wrestling program within his athletic curriculum. He and Blake had made some progress toward getting the program started, and then came along an essential hire for a final push. In 2013, Burleson ISD hired Dr. Bret Jimerson as the new superintendent. Not only is he a wrestling fan, he also had previous experience helping start a program in the Willis ISD. "He's open to anything that will get kids involved," Blake said.

"In my previous district, the wrestling program started from the interest of one wrestler," Bret said. "By the second year, it had grown to include around 30 boy and girl wrestlers."

In the inaugural season, Blake said about 30 wrestlers took part in the program each day after school. The team got off to a late start, competitively, because the Spartans football team advanced to the third round of the playoffs, and several members are also football players. "We started in December, and most teams start in





October, so we had some catching up to do," he said. "I'm pleased with the progress we made."

Blake said the first season, which also included a few senior girls, wasn't so much about winning and losing. It was about gaining valuable experience. "We didn't have one single kid who had wrestled, been to a wrestling match or had even seen a match," he said. "But now, they've got that experience, and one year will help a lot."

The schedule for the coming season, which Blake said will begin on time (though some may show up late, if football does well again), includes seven tournaments with several dual matches. They will wrestle in District 6-5A, which includes Arlington Seguin, Grapevine,

Colleyville Heritage, Arlington Heights, Fort Worth Carter-Riverside, Fort Worth Trimble Tech, Fort Worth Western Hills, Fort Worth O.D. Wyatt, Midlothian, Benbrook, Kennedale and Midlothian Heritage, all of whom will compete in a district tournament to determine postseason representatives.

"The Spartans return with some solid talent," Blake said. "Among them, Alonzo Chatman, a junior, lost one match in the 138-pound division. There's no certain body type or size you need to be successful in wrestling," Blake explained. "You compete in weight classes. In many other sports, size matters. In basketball, it helps to be tall. In football, it helps to be big and strong. But in wrestling, you only have to deal with others who are in your weight class.

"Wrestling opens up a whole new sport for a group of kids," Blake said. "There are kids everywhere who wouldn't be involved in sports were it not for wrestling. We have guys who weigh 95 pounds, but wrestling is something they can compete in."

Kyle wanted to add the sport because of the things it teaches competitors. "Topping that list," he said with a chuckle, "is humility. I remember in junior high getting thrown on a mat and pinned. It humbled me, but I kept going, and it has served me well," he said. "That's the kind of kid we want graduating high school. I wouldn't trade my time wrestling for anything."

Crosstown rival, Burleson High, does not yet have a program, though interested participants are invited to work out with the Spartans program and can compete representing their own school. While Blake said no Burleson students accepted the offer this past season, Bret indicated steps are underway to get a program started for the Elks. "We're currently

working on the logistics for a BHS program. Adding wrestling programs is another way we can provide choices to students and more opportunities for kids to participate in something they're interested in," Bret said.

In the meantime, Blake is also working on growing the sport at the junior high and even the elementary level. There aren't programs at those levels in the schools, but through camps and youth wrestling teams, which Blake has been coaching for eight years, he said the growth is there. His own son, Hank, an eighth-grader, has been wrestling since age 5. "We've got about five or six kids in middle school who wrestle, and we had 12 kids at camp, all middle school," he said. "It's catching on. The best way we're going to grow wrestling in Texas is to keep getting the football coaches on board. You look at great programs like Allen, Southlake Carroll, Katy and (Euless) Trinity - they all wrestle."

And each of those teams he mentioned wins quite a bit. Kyle sees the same thing happening at Centennial, thanks largely to Blake's leadership. "It will take a coach with passion, and that's Blake," Kyle said. "With his son and others coming up, we've got a good corps of wrestlers."

Blake believes that, eventually, almost every school in Texas will have a team. After all, the sport has stood the test of time worldwide. "It's the oldest sport in the world," he said with a smile. "It's not going away."

Look up the words "throttle jockey." If a picture accompanied the definition, it would be of Curtis Terry, a lifelong Texas resident living with his wife, Helen, in Burleson. He lights up when you say anything pertaining to motorized vehicles. He's a certified master mechanic of automobiles, motorcycles and scooters — basically anything you can ride in or on. A former Honda motorcycle dealer, (among other brands) and Tarrant County College professor emeritus, Curtis is a highly skilled and trained technician. His catalogue of accomplishments is exhaustive. Blood testing would reveal top-grade AMSOIL running through his veins.

Back in 1948, 14-year-old Curtis was on his regular three-mile walk to Amon Carter Riverside High School in Fort Worth clutching a notso-macho, brand new clarinet. A joyride with a friend on a Cushman scooter changed the direction of his life. From time to time, he was allowed to ride that old Cushman by himself. It was a real thrill for him. "What a feeling to ride something and not have to pedal," he stated. Although Curtis was hooked, he was still the guy with a bike and clarinet. His friends were the ones riding scooters.

A ride home on the back of another friend's scooter sealed it in his mind. He wanted a scooter so badly he risked getting into trouble with his father by making a deal that could have had dire consequences. So, what did Curtis do to scratch the itch for a scooter? He did what any red-blooded, American teenage boy in 1948 would do under these circumstances — he sold his new clarinet to buy a scooter! He took the clarinet back to where it was purchased. "I didn't know what dad paid for it. I guessed maybe \$100. They gave me \$20," he said.



His father was in disbelief and, needless to say, he was angry. Fortunately for Curtis, his punishment was a ride with his father to Leonard Brothers, the place to purchase scooters in Fort Worth. There Curtis feasted his eyes on an old sputtering Whizzer, with a price tag of \$20. Curtis was jumping for joy, but the Whizzer was in really bad shape. Once the scooter finally started, they saw it had a bad leak. His dad said, "Let's go inside." Thanks to his father, he rode home on a shiny new scooter, replete with saddle bags, chrome fenders, a two-tone windshield and reflectors. The only thing it didn't have was the girl, but she would soon follow. Curtis and Helen recently celebrated their 62nd wedding anniversary. They also have an adult son, Tony, and daughter, Debbie.

Curtis parlayed his childhood love of scooters into a lifetime of mechanical mastery over all things driven by fuel, oil and spark plugs. This high level of passion led him to own many motorized vehicles, accomplish myriad endeavors and meet and form friendships across the country. "I've been allowed, with the support of my wife, to earn a living while playing and doing what I love to do," he shared. "I felt like I've never worked a day in my life." He's owned Honda, Kawasaki and Triumph motorcycle dealerships and built a vehicle that's raced at Daytona. At a young age, Tony was introduced into the family business. He started racing motorcycles and cars as a youngster.

# **SPARE A MATT**, **SAVE A**

What seemed like it might be a passing fad 10 years ago, appears to be here to stay — energy-efficient upgrades to new and existing homes. With oil prices constantly in flux, homebuilders have started adding key improvements to energy efficiency in their construction process, and many appliance manufacturers offer models that can cut bills in half. Here are some things to consider including as you build a home, as well as simple upgrades you can take advantage of in a home that has already been built.

#### **New Appliances**

• Do the math. When appliances, such as refrigerators, washers, dryers or ovens start having problems, think about the potential monthly energy savings of a new model before pouring money into repairing an older, less efficient unit. If you are buying replacements, or completing a new build, make sure you know the monthly energy costs before simply picking the cheapest model. You can easily find the energy use specifications on manufacturer or retail websites.

• Look for the logo. For two decades, the government has sponsored Energy Star, an agency that tests products and reports on their energy efficiency. Products that meet the highest standards will have a small blue sticker with the word, "energy" followed by a star. When buying new appliances, it is usually worth spending a few dollars upfront for the savings over the life of your machine.

• Remember the "Big Two." Draining your water heater allows you to get sediment out. This allows your heating elements to last longer and work better. For your air conditioning system, you can change your filters yourself, but it might be worth calling a professional for a yearly air duct cleaning to help the unit, and to give your family cleaner air. Preventative maintenance on your unit is important. When it comes to repairs, though they can be costly, many issues may lead to larger, more expensive problems if left unchecked. Contact your local plumber or HVAC serviceman to keep your equipment running smoothly.



## Keep the Air In

• Do not cool the outside. The average Texas home uses more electricity on the cooling system than it does on anything else, and letting air out through cracks makes it worse. You can probably solve the issue with weather stripping, which is available at any hardware store or superstore. If that is not enough, you might need to adjust the door to square it in the frame and minimize air drafting to the outside.



• *Check your mindows*. Air can also escape through cracks near your windows, and weather stripping and caulk should be all you need to correct this problem. If you have older, single-pane windows, getting an estimate from a local window replacement company may be worth your while.

## **Shield It Inside and Out**

• *Think about shade.* While they are great for offering views of the yard and can be made to be very attractive from the outside, windows have a notable downside. During the hot summer months, heat comes in through the windows. If you are building a new home, try to include some trees or shrubbery close enough to shade some of the direct sunlight coming in through your windows. And if you need a quick fix or cannot add vegetation, consider solar screens instead.

• Insulation is key. Hot air comes into the house in the summer and flows out during the winter, and your main defense against that unwanted and expensive heat transfer is insulation. If you do not have adequate insulation in your walls and attic, you need to add it as soon as possible. There are pros and cons to options, such as batting, spray foam and radiant barriers, but the key is to have it installed properly, so be ready to hire a professional.



#### **Make Small Changes**

• Insulate your pipes. Your attic and walls are not the only things that need insulating — your pipes do, too. The copper pipes for your central air unit undoubtedly have insulation already, but some people neglect to cover their hot water pipes. Insulation there will keep your hot water from cooling down as quickly, which means your hot water heater won't have to work overtime to do its job.

• Invest in new bulbs. You might have noticed that the light bulb section at the store has changed more and more over the last 10 years. Compact fluorescent lamps (CFL) and light-emitting diodes (LED) are replacing what used to be standard incandescent light bulbs, and for good reason. There is some fluctuation, but CFL and LED lights typically cut electricity by more than half, with some LEDs cutting cost by as much as 90 percent. While there is a bit of an upfront cost difference, the bulbs last much longer, and emit less heat, leading to less electricity being used in the home's cooling process.



## Consider All Aspects of College Savings Options

It's almost back-to-school time. If you have young children going to public schools, your biggest expenditures may be on pens, pencils and notebooks. But if you want those same kids to go to college someday, you'll eventually face considerably larger costs — so you may want to start preparing soon.

• How much can I afford to contribute? As much as you'd like to help your children pay for college, you also have to think about your own needs - specifically your retirement. Think very carefully before reducing contributions to your retirement plans, such as your IRA and 401(k), to help fund a college savings plan. After all, your children may be able to get scholarships and grants, and even if they have to take out loans, they'll have many years in which to repay them. But you can't postpone saving for retirement without jeopardizing your ability to enjoy a comfortable lifestyle. When it comes to prioritizing your financial goals, putting yourself first is not necessarily a selfish act.

• What college savings plan should you consider? A number of college savings options are available. For example, you could contribute to a 529 plan which offers potential tax advantages and high contribution limits. You might also consider a custodial account, such as a UGMA or UTMA, although when your children reach the age of majority, they are free to do whatever they want with the money — and their plans may not include college.

• What will be the effect of a college savings plan on financial aid? When colleges determine financial aid packages, they will evaluate your child's assets differently than your assets. Your child typically would be expected to contribute 20 percent of his or her assets, while you are only expected to contribute up to 5.6 percent of your assets. Consequently, you may be better off saving for college in your name, rather than your children's. Under the federal financial aid guidelines, a UTMA/ UGMA account is classified as a student asset, while 529 plans are counted as parental assets if parents are the account owners. (The rules on financial aid are not always so clear-cut, however, so it might be worth your while to contact a financial aid officer at a local college or university to ensure that your chosen method of saving will still allow for the greatest possible assistance.)

As you can see, you've got several factors to think about when it comes to helping your kids meet their higher education goals. Study up on these options, so you can find the right answers for your family's needs. **NOW**

## In the Kitchen With Jennifer Delaney

Shaking Jiffy Pop popcorn over the stovetop burner with help from her grandfather, Jennifer Delaney learned to respect heat. Later, she started baking with her grandmother, who is still her favorite cook.

Jennifer has since left Oregon to settle in Burleson. She employs her oven with skill. Her versatile recipe for Oven Roasted Cauliflower, a staple in her home, can be altered with different spices and herbs. Jennifer tries to keep meals simple and healthy. "I like eating and feeding real food, and also prepare a variety of fermented vegetables for their probiotic goodness," she said. Of course, the hands making the food and serving it matter just as much as the ingredients. "If I am preparing a dessert, it's about a little extra love in the meal."

#### **Taco Seasoning**

Tbsp. chili powder
 1/4 tsp. garlic powder
 1/4 tsp. onion powder
 1/4 tsp. crushed red pepper flakes
 1/4 tsp. dried oregano
 1/2 tsp. paprika
 1/2 tsp. ground cumin
 1/2 to 1 tsp. sea salt, or to taste
 1 tsp. black pepper

 In a small bowl, mix all ingredients and store in an airtight container. (Or you can mix it together in the container you are going to store it in; just give it a shake!)
 Add 2 to 3 Tbsp. of this mixture plus 1/2 to 3/4 cup of water to 1 lb. of cooked meat of your choice. Simmer over medium heat, stirring frequently until there is very little liquid left in the pan.

#### **Oven Roasted Cauliflower**

3 Tbsp. olive oil I head cauliflower, separated into florets Taco Seasoning, to taste

Toss cauliflower with oil.
 Sprinkle Taco Seasoning (see previous recipe) evenly over cauliflower.
 Bake at 425 F for 20-25 minutes, stirring halfway through cooking time.

#### Paleo Chocolate Chip Cookies

1 cup almond flour 4 tsp. baking soda

- 8 tsp. salt
- 2 Tbsp. coconut oil, melted
- 2 Tbsp. honey or maple syrup

2 tsp. vanilla

#### 4 cups chocolate chips 2 cups almond slivers

 Combine all ingredients well. Drop quarter-size dollops 1 inch apart on a greased cookie sheet.
 Bake at 350 F for 10-12 minutes.

#### Butternut Squash Soup

5 slices fresh ginger root
1 1/2 cups butternut squash
1 apple
3 medium white sweet potatoes
2 garlic cloves, whole
1 Tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil
1/2 tsp. cinnamon
4 cups yeast-free, gluten-free broth, vegetable or chicken
3/4 cup full-fat coconut milk
1/2 cup water
2 Tbsp. lemon juice
Sea salt, to taste
Pepper, to taste

**I.** Using a carrot peeler, peel ginger and then slice off 5 2-inch-long pieces.

**2.** Cut squash into cubes about 1-inch square. Peel, core and chop the apple into bite-size chunks.

**3.** Slowly bring first 10 ingredients to a simmer over medium heat.

**4.** Use a stick blender to puree. Serve hot, garnishing with lemon juice, sea salt and pepper.

#### Pumpkin Oatmeal Breakfast Bake

- 1 15-oz. can pumpkin
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 2 large eggs
- I tsp. pumpkin spice
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 3/4 tsp. baking powder
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla extract
- 1 15-oz. can full-fat coconut milk
- 2 1/2 cups dry, old-fashioned oats
- I cup pecans, chopped


**I.** Mix first 8 ingredients. Add oats and stir well.

**2.** Pour into an 8x8-inch greased pan. Top with pecans.

**3.** Cover with foil, and bake at 350 F for 30 minutes. Remove foil and bake an additional 15 minutes. Serve warm.


