



quickly changed her mind, becoming a seasoned African safari photographer. Her good eye and skills with a camera allow family, friends and her third-grade students at Bowie Elementary School in Corsicana the chance to see what the Curingtons have experienced.

After years of saving and months of planning, Chip and Becky took their first trip to Zimbabwe, Africa, in July 1998, during the winter season when temperatures never got much over 70 degrees throughout the day. They vividly remember the 10-day trip to the one million acre conservancy — the grass-thatched cabin, the wonderfully

delicious food, the bougainvillea and poinsettias growing wild and the gorgeous weather without a single day of rain.

Each morning before sunup, Chip, his assigned professional hunter and the rest of the safari team prepared to go out into the bush; Becky was also packing up what she would need on the days she decided to tag along. "She sees what she likes and shoots it," Chip said smiling, referring to her perfect aim with a camera. Becky has not only captured superb photographs of the country with its boabab and fever trees, but she has also successfully

documented each of Chip's kills.

Hunting plains game in Zimbabwe proved more difficult than Chip had imagined because the bush was so thick and the red soil was quite thorny. "The animals just blended in with their surroundings," he said. "The zebras, baboons, kudus and jackals were all equally hard to see." Once Chip spotted each of the animals aforementioned, he wasted no time preparing himself for the hunt ahead of him. "Hunting takes a lot of patience," he explained. "Sometimes the hunt can take two to three hours. It all depends on the animal."



The kudu trophy hanging above the fireplace mantle in the Curington home was one of 11 animals Chip landed in 1998, weighing in at well over 600 pounds. "These animals are referred to as gray ghosts because of the way in which they are able to hide themselves in the bush," Becky said. "The one Chip brought home was so big he overshadowed five grown men."

Chip considers himself to be an ethical hunter. "To preserve something means sitting it on a shelf only to look at it," Chip explained further. "Conserving something means not allowing any of it to go to waste." The meat from the animals killed by Chip, and other hunters like him, is almost always prepared and eaten at the evening meal. The remainder of the meat is parceled out among the villages, allowing the locals to add protein to their minimal diet. Through what is known as the Campfire Program, African villages receive 40 percent of the money trophy hunters must pay after a kill such as the kudu. "The animals in Africa have great value," Chip said. "The people realize their value. The trophy hunts do have a limit, making certain there will be more animals for tomorrow."

The couple's second trip to Africa did not come until July 2006, when Chip and Becky went to Namibia, not far from the South Atlantic coast. The land in Namibia was very different from what they had experienced in Zimbabwe. "The land resembled the Kalahari Desert. It looked a lot like

West Texas," Chip said, with Becky nodding her head in agreement. "We had to sneak up on the game — use a much different strategy. The animals had nowhere to hide." Becky added that the land was barren. "Everywhere we looked," she said, "we saw troops or herds of wild animals."

Chip expereinced his most difficult hunt to date while on this second trip.



He spent the better part of one day trying to bag a heartabeast, a large, oversized antelope-like animal with thick, sharply pointed horns. "There must have been at least 100 in the herd," Chip remembered. "The ground was dry, dusty and crusty." All the eyes of the herd were focused on Chip, keeping him alert and on his toes. The goal in the hunt was to get within 200 yards of the heartabeast Chip had chosen as his trophy.

Getting the trophies home to Texas is another story in and of itself. In a nutshell, it takes approximately 18 months for the process of packing, dipping and shipping to be completed. Waiting on the trophies to arrive in Corsicana has been almost as much fun for Chip and Becky as planning the trips. "The anticipation," Becky said, "is like looking forward to Christmas."

As Chip and Becky begin to plan a third trip to Africa, they remember what was most important to the people who welcomed them. "Water is a prized commodity, and everything over there is so true," Chip said, referring to the clean, untainted area known as Africa. "They are endeared with their country. As we come and go, we've learned to leave nothing but our footprints behind." • VOW

Frank and Gayle Steed live in a home that draws you in immediately. Yet, as soon as you enter the welcoming family room area, with its white couches and chairs and cozy Austin stone fireplace, your eye is drawn outside. Gayle has decorated her back patio so artfully, with its rattan seating area and attractive table arrangement, that you want to slip right out to settle on the cedar deck with a cool drink and admire the sunset. "We love the sunset," Gayle said. "The view is wonderful. We like to watch the storms gather."

Frank is quick to point out that the views from the property were much of the attraction of the site. "In spring it is just beautiful with all the colors. 

is the treasurer," Gayle said.



At the age of 85, Forrest Green, rancher and operator of the 550-acre Tree Brand Ranch, former postal inspector, four-term state representative and World War II fighter pilot, is still a vibrant and integral part of life in Corsicana. Until sundown, he can be found on the rolling acres of his

ranch, where he breeds registered Herefords. He mends fences, tends cattle and grows his own feed. When he has time, Forrest also tends another herd — his collection of Model A cars. He has restored a complete fleet of drivable paeans to Henry Ford's genius. "This is the one I am working on now," Forrest pointed out. "It was one of the first pickups."

Hobbies aside, Forrest is a serious rancher, a goal he nurtured since his youth in Arlington. "I always wanted to be a rancher; in senior English, I

decided, since my name is Forrest Green, my brand would be two trees."

Although his sights were set on a rustic life, it was an informed decision. He had the opportunity to see the world as a youth. "I was a Boy Scout and, in 1937, I went to the World Jamboree before World War II," Forrest recounted. "Boy Scouts from all over the world came to Holland to a big camp site. I was lucky to go and see a lot of the European countries, including Italy, Switzerland

and Germany, before they were decimated in World War II."

After two years of aeronautical engineering at North Texas Agricultural College (now the University of Texas at Arlington), World War II began and Forrest joined the U.S. Army



Air Corps at age 20. He trained for combat with dive bombing, skip bombing, ground gunnery and aero gunnery, graduating from flying school in 1943. "The company commander called us in one at a time to tell us our assignment," Forrest said, remembering the day well. "Most of the class of about 40 was assigned to the European theater. Two of us, Don McCloud and I, were kept at that training base to be flight instructors. We were crushed, because we wanted to go to combat with our class. It was really an honor, but we were kind of disappointed." For a year, they honed their experience in all the phases of fighter training. "We admired my old squadron commander, who was an original Flying Tiger, and we decided we wanted to go to China." Before World War II, General Chennault went to China to battle the Japanese with the American Volunteer Group, (the AVG). During World War II, the AVG was transferred to the U.S. Army, but they still called

> them the Flying Tigers, although they were not the original volunteers.

Finally, Forrest and Don were sent to China as Flying

Tigers. "Most of our missions were ground support, looking for supply trains and truck convoys. On my very first mission, I flew Tail-End-Charlie, the

last man in a formation of four. We flew P-38s down the South China Sea, looking for ships. We found two ships tied up at a dock, an ideal target. We had two 500 pound bombs on our planes. The three planes in front of me dropped their bomb, and when the








third man peeled off in front of me, I could see that the ships were unscathed. Six bombs had missed. I thought, 'If I miss, this whole mission is going to be washed out." Confident because of his experience, Forrest went in and dropped his bombs. "I looked back and there was black smoke coming from both ships. We were supposed to keep radio silence, but when I dropped those bombs, the other pilots came on the radio and said, "Ding hao, ding hao!" which is Chinese for 'Great, well done!"

After the war, Forrest flew out of China, over the Himalayas, and into India, near Calcutta, where he was assigned to fly transports. Eventually, he rotated out on the troop ship, the



General Bliss. "I left the U.S. from Miami, Florida, and went all around the world, and came back to San Francisco, and it didn't cost me a penny. Most people have to pay to go around the world."

Forrest had purchased a 160-acre ranch in Arlington during the war. When he returned following the war, he spent eight hours a day working at the post office, then eight more hours a day working his ranch. "Highway 30






came along, and it put most of my land on one side and most of my improvements on the other side." Disheartened, he spent five years in Iowa as a postal inspector. "It was a real interesting and challenging job. I never did get used to those winters. The snow would go as high as the cross arms on the telephone pole." As he recalled basking in the Texas sun, he soon decided to follow the example of the geese flying south, and returned to Texas and to ranching. He worked at Bell Helicopter for a couple of years, and then in 1964, he had the opportunity to purchase his current land in Navarro County.

In the '70s, Forrest was the chairman of the Beef Cattle Committee, which is under the county agent. This led to successfully running for state representative for Navarro and Ellis Counties in 1972. "I thought, well, I have given four years to the federal government in World War II; I will give four years to the state. I wound



up with eight years." Getting the land in shape took a lot of work. "I would work all day on that fence and hate for that sun to start going down, because I wasn't through. Now, I am 85, and I look at that sun, and I say, 'I don't know if I am going to be able to make it until sundown or not," Forrest added with a laugh.
"This is a different phase of life."

But, after many years of ranching, Forrest shows no signs of slowing down. He enjoys being involved with philanthropic community efforts. "I am on the Navarro College Foundation Board, one of my favorite jobs because you are associated with businessmen that have a goal in mind and get things done. Mainly, I have worked with the Cook Center." In spite of a busy life, Forrest has always made time for contributing his time, energy and resources to the good of his country and community.







LaKresha Bradford was just 8 years old when she discovered the world of speed skating. "My aunt and my parents took me one time to roller skate," LaKresha remembered. It was a day that changed her life. She took to it like the proverbial duck to water. "I am quick to learn things," she explained. Her athletic ability, including a natural agility and amazing capacity for speed, was soon noticed by the rink's owner, Delisa Dean. "She noticed my speed and approached my dad and told us about the speed skating team in Longview, Texas."

In 1992, LaKresha joined the team. "My parents were always with me," she recalled appreciatively. "We went two or three times a week to Longview to practice, driving an hour to an hour-and-a-half each way." She started in quads (four-wheeled skates), then she also began to compete in in-line skating events. "In-lines are different from roller blades," LaKresha pointed out. In-line skates are what the speed skaters use. In her first year of competition, she excelled. "I was in a two-girl relay in Fresno, California, at the National Speed Skating Championship Competition with my partner, Carmen Snapp, in 1992." Carmen and LaKresha placed in the finals at that event.

At one point, the Olympic Committee was considering having

speed skating as an event. In 1995, LaKresha was invited to train for three days at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colorado.

For four exciting years, LaKresha participated in speed skating, qualifying for the nationals each year. She traveled to Buffalo and to Syracuse. She also went to Lincoln, Nebraska, to compete. It was an exciting and busy time for her, traveling to competitions and practicing her sport.

Her family was always involved. "My dad and I would go and skate the bike trails at White Rock Lake when I was doing the speed skating," LaKresha remembered. As an only child, she enjoyed spending time with both her parents.

By the time LaKresha reached junior high age, she was ready to concentrate on school sports. "I did basketball, and I was the Varsity Point Guard for ladies basketball," she remembered. "I played second base in softball." Her speed skating training made her a natural in track. "People were amazed that I never tired."

However, the love of skating remained a strong pull. "When I was 16, I was watching TV with my parents, and we saw a rink in Oak Cliff called Southern Skates. It was owned by an African American, and that stood out to us as being unusual at the time. Speed skating had been a predominately Caucasian sport." The family went up and skated there. LaKresha remembered that it was primarily adult skating, 21 and up. "But, my dad told them about my skating background, and since I was with them, they let me skate there." In college, she started skating a lot at Southern Skates. What she saw there introduced her to a new aspect of skating. "I saw people there dance skating to the music! I went home and practiced in my kitchen." LaKresha watched the dance skaters whenever she was at the rink and returned home to learn the moves on her own. Eventually, she

began dancing with them at the rink. Before long, LaKresha met Cornelius Granger, the founder of the dance skate organization called the "Showtime Rollers."

In 2004, she officially joined the organization. "I had some catching up to do," she admitted. LaKresha spent her evenings practicing dance skating,



while she spent her days preparing for a teaching career. She graduated in December 2006 from the University of Texas at Tyler with a Bachelor of Science in Interdisciplinary Studies. LaKresha is certified to teach early childhood through fourth grade. She now teaches second grade.

All of her skating practice paid off. For the last two years, she has won Best Female Free Style Skater at the Memphis, Tennessee, national convention called "Rolling on the Bluff." At the national conventions, skaters come from each state. "Each state does a different style and does an exhibition of their skating," she explained. "Then there are competitions."

When the team is home in Texas, they practice every week, and perform in local events and parades. "We performed in the Martin Luther King Day parade in Dallas." The team has over 20 members, who gather on Sunday evenings to skate together to hip-hop and rhythm and blues music. "We do synchronized skating," she said. "We each have skater names, and mine is KSmooth." The team just returned from a trip to Chicago where



they had what LaKresha calls "a skate jam." A national skate event in Arkansas was next, where each athlete skated individually, and then they all skated as a group.

Competitions are satisfying, and LaKresha likes the opportunity to showcase the sport of skate dancing to hip-hop music. "Skating is not just



for kids; there are skating opportunities for adults, also." Yet, one of her favorite activities is doing performances for kids and exhibitions at schools.

LaKresha enjoys sharing the thrill of skating to music with young people and introducing them to the sport. "I love dance skating because it is a passion — I like the energy. When the song comes on, I can't be still." ***TOW**



Jim Barnette is a true Corsicana Tiger through and through. He has been associated with the Corsicana Independent School District and the high school in one way or another for over 26 years. He has held an amazing career within the academic arena, and in his current position,

he is managing to wear numerous hats for various job responsibilities.

His career in the academic world began when he obtained his bachelor's in education from the University of Texas at El Paso. He subsequently went on to pursue and obtain his master's in education from the same institution. "Someone once told me that if you didn't get your master's immediately after your undergrad years, you will never go back to school," Jim stated, "so I got mine immediately."

After a brief stint of coaching in El Paso, Jim and his lovely wife, Beverly, moved to Arlington and then on to Athens, Texas. In 1981, he began his career in Corsicana. Dedicated to his wife and two children, Jennifer and Joshua,

Jim commuted for two years back and forth between Athens and Corsicana High School (CHS). Finally, the time came for the family to move to Corsicana.

When Jim first began his career at CHS, he was one of the

varsity football coaches in addition to being a math teacher. He taught geometry, algebra (I & II), trigonometry and the fundamentals of mathematics. After 16 years

of teaching math and coaching football, Jim was given the opportunity in the fall of 1997, to move into the administrative side of education as the Collins Scholarship Program administrator. Jim did not officially start the position until the end of the 1997 football season.

The Collins Scholarship Fund was originally set up in 1954 by James L. Collins of Corsicana. At the beginning of the life of the scholarship, Mr. Collins wanted to assist at least three students in going to college. Today, the board of

directors, under the guidance and assistance of Jim, is able to give almost 30 scholarships per year.


Jim explained that his job brings him much joy and heartache. There have been numerous students who



rightfully deserved the scholarship and did not receive it. "There really is no hard and fast rule," Jim said, "It's on a comparative basis." Jim went on to explain the basic stipulation for being considered for a scholarship: A student must be in the top 25 percent of their graduating class; they must have attended CHS for three years; they have to have taken the SAT or ACT, in order to demonstrate a motivation to attend college; their citizenship grade point is taken into consideration, and they can not have any red flags on their record; and they must show discernible financial need.

In addition to giving out the scholarships, Jim is also in charge of monitoring the students who have received them. Jim travels all over to visit the scholarship recipients, making sure they are maintaining the required 2.5 grade point average.

His second standing job is the GO Center Director at CHS. The GO Center assists and motivates students to realize and reach their potential goals. "College is the number one thing we push for, but we respect all post-secondary opportunities," Jim explained. "We are trying to connect

them with the opportunities that can train them for the skills they will need in the career of their choice." The GO Center is designed for students to look at their options after graduation, be it college, a technical school, a trade school or the military. "We work through the senior English classes trying to assist them and encourage them to make a transition decision," Jim said. "The key is getting the parents on board through brochures and evening meetings."

The third hat Jim wears at CHS is that of the Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) district director. AVID takes the average student, not currently engaged in the most rigorous curriculum, and encourages them to take the more difficult curriculum and be successful. "This is our first year," Jim said, "and we have begun with the freshman class. Next year, hopefully, we'll be able to add the 10th grade and [also] begin the program in the middle school." Jim proudly stated that over 99 percent of the students in the AVID program will go on to college.

Finally, Jim juggles, along with teachers, staff and administration at CHS, another new program implemented this year — the "ATTACK Squad," meaning All Tiger Teachers Advocate for Corsicana Kids. Each teacher and administrator at CHS is assigned 11 students to watch over. "Our goal and duty is to stay on top of our assigned 11 students. Saturday is "ATTACK Day," that's when we call or follow up with personal meetings with parents of each of the students," Jim explained. "Our goal is to meet each ninth-grader's parent in person, so we can get to know them and they can get to know us. We are their mentors and their positive connections on campus. We want them to feel they can come to us for anything." Jim and many others just like him are making positive connections at Corsicana High School. WWW

- 10 saltine crackers, crushed
- 1 Tbsp. chopped onion
- 1/4 cup Bisquick
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. pepper
- 1/2 cup grated cheese

Combine all ingredients and pour into 10 - 12 muffin cups. Bake at 350 F for 20 - 25 minutes.

- 1 15-oz. can pumpkin

- 1/2 tsp. salt

Preheat oven to 350 F. In a large bowl combine eggs,

pumpkin, cream, brown sugar, pumpkin pie spice and salt. Mix well with a whisk. Divide among 8 6-oz. custard cups. Place in a roasting pan. Pour hot water into pan around custard cups to a depth of 1 inch. Bake for 45

- 55 minutes or until set. Remove cups from water. Cool slightly and serve warm or chilled.

PORK TENDERLOIN

- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 2 Tbsp. olive oil
- 1 Tbsp. lemon juice
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. pepper
- 2 pork tenderloins (1 pound each)

Combine first 6 ingredients. Rub over tenderloins. Place tenderloins on a rack in a shallow roasting pan. Bake uncovered at 350 F for 1 1/2 - 2 hours or until desired tenderness. Use a meat thermometer (for medium at 160 F or well done at 170 F). Cover with foil and let stand for 10 minutes or longer before slicing. Serves 6 to 8.

FESTIVE PINEAPPLE CRANBERRY SALAD

- 8 oz. crushed pineapple
- 1 8-oz. pkg. raspberry Jell-O
- 1 16-oz. can cranberry sauce
- 1 medium chopped apple
- 1/3 cup chopped pecans or walnuts

Drain pineapple, reserving liquid. Add enough cold water to liquid to measure 2 cups. Pour into medium saucepan. Bring to a boil. Remove from heat. Add dry Jell-O mix and stir until dissolved. Add cranberry sauce and stir until well blended. Refrigerate 1 1/2 hours or until thickened. Stir in pineapple, apple and nuts. Refrigerate 4 hours or until firm.

MISSISSIPPI MUD PIE

FILLING:

- 1 cup unsifted flour
- 6 Tbsp. cocoa
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1 cup butter, room temperature
- 1 1/4 cup sugar
- 3 large eggs

1 1/2 tsp. vanilla

2/3 cup chopped pecans or walnuts

FUDGE CANDY ICING:

6 Tbsp. butter

6 Tbsp. cocoa

2 cups powdered sugar

6 Tbsp. Eagle Brand Condensed Milk

1 Tbsp. light corn syrup

2/3 cup plus 2 Tbsp. chopped pecans or walnuts

1 tsp. vanilla

PIE: Preheat oven to 325 F. Sift flour, cocoa and salt together. Set aside. Cream butter and sugar together, add eggs one at a time. Add vanilla. On low speed add flour mixing only until well blended. Stir in nuts. Pour batter into a generously greased 11-inch pie plate. Bake 35 - 40 minutes, until a toothpick inserted comes out clean. Do not over bake. ICING: Melt butter over low heat in a heavy 2-quart saucepan. Remove from heat and blend in cocoa, powdered sugar, condensed milk and corn syrup. Mix until smooth. The mixture will be thick. Place saucepan back over low heat and stir constantly until the mixture becomes shiny and thin enough to spread. Remove from heat and stir in 2/3 cup nuts and vanilla. Spread over pie while it is warm. Sprinkle 2 Tbsp. of nuts around the edge of the pie.
