



A little boy approached the school bus, head down with a deep frown on his face. It can't be that bad, Cynthia Hall thought. As he stepped onto the bus, her smile broadened. "Good morning. Rise and shine," she said. A tiny smirk crossed his lips.

For weeks, they continued the morning ritual. Each day, the child's smile grew. Before long, he stepped onto the bus and broke into a wide grin before Cynthia spoke. She beamed, feeling she helped make his days brighter. "When other people are happy, it makes me happy," she said. In spite of a less-than-perfect life, bad marriages and being a single parent to four children, Cynthia chose happiness. No matter what life threw her way, she looked for the positive from negative circumstances. "You can let the bad stuff drag you down for the rest of your life, or get back up and keep going," she said. "For the sake of my children, I have to keep going." She set an example for them of how to produce a positive attitude. As a single mother, staying positive wasn't always easy, but she remained upbeat.

"Even though bad things happen in life, we make the choice of whether it's gonna affect us or not," she said. "It's not what your parents did or didn't do, or what anyone has done to you. Your choice — you choose which way to go."

Cynthia grew up in Lewisville, Texas, but has lived in the

Burleson area since 1992. She spent many years being a substitute teacher. However, when her oldest daughter got pregnant, she moved to Arkansas to be with her. With no substitute teaching jobs available, she opted for a position as a veterinarian assistant. After several years, she decided it was time to move back home to Burleson, where another veterinarian assistant job waited. She liked working with animals, but missed being with children.

During that same time, her youngest son struggled with emotional and behavioral issues. Cynthia knew more than missing a male role model hid beneath the surface. After many misdiagnoses and medications that didn't help,



doctors finally pointed to Asperger's Syndrome, a type of high-functioning autism, as the true issue. A job opening for a bus driver with Durham in the Burleson ISD gave her the perfect solution.

At first, she said, "It's so big. I could never drive one of those." But she learned. A split schedule allowed her to take her son to doctor's appointments and provided the opportunity to eat lunch with her daughter, who loved seeing her mom appear at Centennial High School with a pizza.

behind, not bringing it up or dwelling on it. She has decided instead to focus on the good things in life. She greets the day determined to practice happiness and spread it to others. She pushes toward a personal goal of making at least five people smile each day, whether it is her children, co-workers, bus kids, their parents or a stranger at the store. The simplest things place the biggest smile on Cynthia's face.









As a bus driver, she gets to impact children before they ever reach school. When they board the vehicle, she offers a positive attitude. Cynthia treasures the relationships she builds with the children throughout the year as one of the few adults with whom they interact. When a child experiences a less-than-good day at school, they confide in her. She listens, soothing their hurts so by the time they get home things look brighter. They trust her, not quite like a best friend forever, but as an adult who they know will take them seriously.

Cynthia doesn't take for granted the amount of trust parents give her. Bus rules center first on safety. She also demands respect for herself and other students, and insists on keeping the bus clean, allowing no food or drinks. "A clean bus impacts their attitudes," she said. "If a bus is dirty, they show less respect for it."

While she is strict with rules, she also makes riding to and from school fun. She decorates for each season, often considering and adding elements of activities important to the children. When they arrive at school early, she'll ask them an age-appropriate trivia question. She looks for opportunities to have fun. "Life's too short to be a grumpy, negative person," she laughed.

During the summer, Cynthia drove for Fort Worth Recreational Center trips. One of her memorable moments came during such a trip. While visiting Ripley's Believe It or Not, a little boy became frightened going through the tornado exhibit. She told him it wasn't real. "I won't let anything happen to you," she assured him.

"OK, but you have to hold my hand, because I'm really scared," he said.

Clinging to her hand, they made it through the area. With a sigh, he gave her a big hug and said, "Yep. You're my best friend."

One of her most enjoyable activities comes from volunteering for Special Olympics. She gives her time not only through Durham, but personally as well. She first volunteered because of her son, hoping he might get involved. However, she quickly became a part of this special community of people. "The athletes are amazing," she said. "They don't judge or discriminate, they just have fun. I

think our society could learn a lot about being positive from them. And they are the happiest people, despite whatever disability they have."

One boy touched her personally during a 2012 event. A child with severe Down's syndrome started to exit the bus and stopped. "You're so pretty. You're my best friend," he said. Then he gave her a big hug and handed her a little football. She kept it as a reminder of the extraordinary little boy who brought tears to her eyes. As a volunteer, she admits the children affect her life in a very positive way. She is seeking new ways to grow more involved in community volunteer work.

Cynthia holds an associate degree in business administration and communications. She plans someday to complete her bachelor's and perhaps become a teacher. For now, she focuses on getting her two youngest children finished with high school and encourages them to fulfill their dreams.

When people ask how she can be so happy after all she's been through in life, she smiles. "I have beautiful children, a roof over my head, a good job and good friends. What's not to be happy about? Things could be so much worse. I've been there, and now I'm not. I have good reasons to be happy," she said.

She encourages other single moms to choose happiness no matter what they face. "For the sake of your kids, don't give up," she said. "You can still be happy — it's your choice."





Since he was just 5 years old, Isaiah Hall has been playing the game of football. He has excelled out on the field over the years and now leads the Burleson High School football team as quarterback. Isaiah's father, Todd Hall, was instrumental in his son's decision to stay true to the sport.

> While Todd was growing up in Burleson, his favored football position was running back. Todd tried to steer his son into becoming a running back so Isaiah could follow in his father's footsteps. However, Todd's late father, Clarence Newton Sr., had a different idea, even when Isaiah was just starting the sport. "My father said, 'Anybody can see he's going to be a quarterback. I may be dead and gone, but before it's all said and done, he'll be the quarterback for Burleson," Todd explained.

And, that's exactly what happened. "For a little while, I couldn't even throw too far," Isaiah confessed. But, Isaiah has developed his skills over the years. He began his stint as quarterback for the Elks in 2012, his junior year. "It's a pretty good

feeling to have. Occasionally, I need to keep the team calm so we can win in a time of adversity," he said. "You can't be freaking out if everyone is looking to you for all the answers or to do something. You have to always know what you're doing and keep your cool."

Keeping his cool comes easily for Isaiah. His father thinks he has ice water running through his veins, because his facial expression rarely changes whether a play didn't go so well or resulted in a touchdown. "The kids and coaches would question him about why he didn't look excited, and he would respond, "The game isn't over yet," Todd said. "I think he is his hardest critic."

Isaiah likes the camaraderie that comes with playing a team sport. "One person does well, and the whole team gets excited. Everybody is having a good time," Isaiah said. "When you score a touchdown, that feeling you get, it's hard to explain, but I've always loved it." He appreciates the support from the local community each Friday night in the fall. "At times, it gets your heart beating pretty fast. But then, we start playing," Isaiah explained, "and you focus on the game."

Todd gets a little nervous before Isaiah heads out onto the field on Friday nights. "I try not to let him know that. I can't sleep the night before the game. I'm nervous until the very first play," Todd

said. "I just want to see him do really well, because he's worked really hard."

Although Todd may not worry too much about Isaiah getting hurt, his wife, Lydia, wants her son to stay safe. Football has been a legacy on both sides of the family. Lydia's father, Eddie Denson, played quarterback for Burleson back in the 1960s. Both Lydia and Todd grew up in Burleson, and they have reared their children there because of the small town feel and the education system.



As the community members join together in the stands for football games, the Hall family is right there with them to cheer on Isaiah and the Elks. Isaiah's three younger sisters — Myah, 14; Gianna, 7; and Laila, 3 — wear shirts to support Isaiah and paint his jersey number, No. 2, on their faces. "They all pretty much adore their big brother. Although, it's a lot of chaos with that many little girls, he handles it well," Lydia said.

The No. 2 has a historical tie to the Hall family. Isaiah's father wore No. 2 on his jersey, and Isaiah has worn the number since his first experience on a football team. When Isaiah first started playing football, Burleson only had one



Pee-Wee football league. Todd and a few other dads decided to start the Raiders organization, and it's still thriving under the Burleson Youth Association. Todd has always been his son's coach and feels like he has done a pretty good job. "I like to call myself his agent," Todd joked. He enjoys the game and his time serving as president of the Burleson Football Booster Club. "It's for the boys, so I don't really mind," Todd said. "I like to work with football and the kids."

Isaiah's focus is on both football and the team. During the summer, he lifted weights four days a week, and in August, he began practicing with his team twice a day. "I'm very dedicated. Pretty much 24/7." Isaiah was selected to participate in the Elite 11 Quarterback Camp this past summer at the Dallas Cowboys practice facility at Valley Ranch. The best of the best quarterbacks from across Texas and surrounding states were chosen for the camp. "It's a pretty




Since most dining is done at night, it's important to test colors under artificial light. This type of lighting turns some colors muddy and could ultimately make food look less appealing.

pumpkin or squash soup in mugs during Thanksgiving meals," Luanne said. It's flanked on either side with candle sticks and pumpkins. The word GOBBLE is spelled in huge letters across the French doors leading out to the play area she created for her grandchildren. A rocking rabbit sits in Luanne's favorite rocking chair, which she received from her mother's cousin. "It must be over 80 years old," Luanne shared. Pumpkins of all shapes, sizes and textures are scattered throughout the home and rest beside the bunny. Other items close to Luanne's heart are her great-great-grandmother's bread box and a five-generation cookbook she helped put together with her family.

"I never get rid of anything," Luanne admitted. "I rework and repurpose everything." Everything in Luanne's house has its place. Luanne is very organized. Even the garage is organized and labeled. This quality is beneficial since Luanne is a librarian. For 19 years, she has used her gift of organization at work and at home. "My daughter, Lindsey, says it's a sickness," Luanne laughed. "Organization is my thing. I love to organize." Their matching beds are among the French country accessories Luanne decorates with.

- Green yarn



### HOW TO DO IT.

1. Create frame by cutting cardboard into a piece measuring 8 1/2x11-inches. Paint front side black. Allow to dry completely.

#### 2. Create background

by cutting foam into a piece measuring 7 1/2 x10-inches. Glue foam to cardboard allowing cardboard to frame the foam.

3. Paint one side of the puzzle pieces, alternating gold, red and brown until you have three equal piles of 12 to create fall leaves. Allow to dry completely.

4. Cut bottom off lunch bag and discard. Wad up remaining section of bag to form tree trunk. Set aside.

5. Cut green yarn into 1/2- and 1-inch pieces to represent grass. Glue bag to bottom edge of foam to make trunk.

**6. Glue yarn** pieces randomly along bottom edge of foam to make grass. Glue puzzle pieces haphazardly around bag to represent leaves on the tree, making sure to glue some in the grass around the bottom of the trunk to represent leaves that have already fallen. Allow to dry overnight before displaying.





### NOT YOUR BASIC HAND TURKEY

This three-dimensional hand turkey can be used annually as a holiday table topper or mantel decoration. More than one can be made and presented to those grandparents who can't get enough of their grandchildren!

#### DIFFICULTY LEVEL: MEDIUM

- Tracing pencil
- 2 squares beige felt
- Scissors
- 1 square each: red, orange and yellow felt
- Pinking shears
- White craft glue
- Cool melt hot glue
- Wiggle eyes, 2 each
- 3x2 1/2-inch piece of cardboard
- Brown acrylic paint
- Cotton balls

### HOW TO DO IT. 🔻

**1. Trace hand print** on both pieces of beige felt. Cut both prints out.

**2. Using pinking shears**, cut 6 red, 6 orange and 2 yellow triangles (2 1/2 inches from top to bottom and 2 inches from side-to-side for adult handprint and 2 inches from top-to-bottom and 1 1/2 inches from side-to-side for child's handprint).

**3. Glue handprints together** with craft glue making sure to leave palm area and bottom unglued. Let dry. Reinforce with hot glue if needed.

**4. Using craft or hot glue**, glue 3 red triangles in between fingers on each side. Glue 3 orange triangles in the middle on each side. Glue 1 yellow triangle toward the bottom on each side. Let dry.

**5. Cut two very small triangles** from remaining yellow felt, gluing on each side to make turkey's beak. Glue eyes in place. Let dry.

**6. Paint cardboard brown.** Let dry. Stuff cotton balls into bottom opening to plump up the holiday hand turkey. Glue turkey to board before displaying.

#### DIFFICULTY LEVEL: MEDIUM TO CHALLENGING.

- Sepia-tone photographs from nature that spell THANKS
- Scissors
- Holiday scrapbook paper
- Natural burlap
- Elmer's craft glue
- 12 clothespins
- Twisted jute twine, 5-foot length

### HOW TO DO IT. 🔻

**1. Take photos in nature**. You can design them yourself to complete the project sooner, or you can hunt until you find the "letters" to spell THANKS. Have photos developed into 4x6 prints.



**2. Cut holiday printed paper** into 6 5x7-inch rectangles. Cut burlap into 6 6x8-inch rectangles.



**3. Glue paper to burlap.** Let dry. Glue photo to paper making sure to secure corners. Let dry.

**4. Trim burlap** from top allowing the paper edge to be your guide. Make fringe frame by shredding remaining edges of burlap by pulling strands until reaching edge of paper.



**5. Glue clothespins** to front corners of photographs only. Let dry. Backside needs to remain unglued to allow for stringing.



6. Lay photos face down. Thread twine through circular cutout on clothespin allowing you to hang pictures in the same manner you would hang clothes on a line. This trick also allows you to move photos freely on the twine, bringing them close together or stretching them farther apart.

7. Tie loop knots and cut excess from twine before hanging. **NOW**

### A Painful Swallow

One minute you are humming along just fine. The next minute your throat feels so horrendous you practically quiver when you swallow. Your body temperature shoots into the fever zone. All you have the energy to do is lie down with the wretchedness of your misery. You may have a strep throat infection. The majority of sore throats are not from strep but from viruses. Strep throat is a bacterial infection from *Streptococcus pyogenes* bacteria. This is not to say sore throats from viruses are not also painful. They can be, but they are usually not as intense as with strep.

To be absolutely sure of a strep diagnosis, laboratory tests must be given. However, there are some clues that point to strep being the culprit. If the symptoms come on suddenly with a high fever, tender swollen lymph nodes in the neck area, fatigue and an extremely sore throat, it may be from a strep infection as opposed to a cold or other viral infection. Also, if you look at your tonsils, and they have white or yellow patches of pus on them, it is probably from a strep infection. The typical symptoms of a cold or viral infection — coughing, sneezing, congestion, runny nose — are usually absent with strep throat infection.

Even if you come to the conclusion you have strep throat without the benefit of lab tests, it still needs to be treated with

antibiotics. Treatment will lessen the symptoms fairly quickly, and you will feel better. Treating strep infections is very important, because of possible complications, such as rheumatic fever, scarlet fever and kidney complications. After taking the antibiotics for 24 hours, you are no longer contagious. If you feel well enough, you may resume your duties. If you are prescribed a course of antibiotics, take all of the medication as ordered. Stopping your treatment after you feel better can lead to relapse and still leave you vulnerable to complications. Discontinuing antibiotics prematurely also contributes to antibiotic resistant organisms.

The best way to prevent a strep infection is to hold high standards for your personal hygiene. Wash your hands frequently — particularly if you are around someone who has strep throat. Do not share personal items such as towels, cutlery, plates, drinking glasses, etc. Since the bacteria is spread by droplets, be diligent about containing sneezes and coughs in a manner that doesn't spew them into the air. If you do get strep throat, see your doctor, complete your medication, take care of yourself and feel better soon! **NOW**

#### **Banana Pudding**

- 2 3.5-oz. boxes French vanilla instant pudding mix
- 3 cups milk
- 1 14-oz. can sweetened condensed milk
- 2 Tbsp. Mexican vanilla (or Adams Best)
- 1 10.6-oz. tub Cool Whip
- 1 11-oz. box vanilla wafers
- 4 medium bananas

**I.** Mix pudding, milk and condensed milk with electric mixer.

- 2. Add vanilla and Cool Whip. Beat.
- 3. Line bowl with vanilla wafers.

**4.** Layer 2 sliced bananas over the vanilla wafers.

**5.** Put half of the pudding over the wafers and bananas. Repeat, ending with vanilla wafers on top.

### **Creamed Squash**

5 medium yellow squash 1 Tbsp. butter

#### 1/4 cup sugar, or to taste 3 Tbsp. powdered Cremora Salt, to taste

**I.** Wash and slice squash to desired size. In a pot, cover squash with water and boil until done (about 10 minutes).

**2.** Drain squash well. Return squash to pot with remaining ingredients and mix well. Heat thoroughly before serving.

### **Orange Sherbet Salad**

- 1 6-oz. pkg. orange gelatin
- 2 cups boiling water
- I pint orange sherbet
- I II-oz. can mandarin orange sections, drained
- 1 20-oz. can crushed pineapple, drained

**I.** In a large bowl, stir together gelatin with boiling water until gelatin is dissolved. Add sherbet; stir until melted.

**2.** Stir in oranges and pineapple; pour into a 2-quart baking dish or mold.

**3.** Cover and chill for 4 to 6 hours, or until set.

### Never-fail Cornbread Dressing

1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
 4 tsp. baking powder
 2 1/2 tsp. salt
 2 tsp. dried sage
 1 tsp. dried thyme

- i tsp. dried tnyme
- 1 1/2 cups commeal
- $1 \frac{1}{2}$  cups onion, chopped
- 1 1/2 cups celery, chopped
- 1/4 cup pimiento, chopped
- 3 beaten eggs
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 1/3 cup oil
- 1/2 quarts chicken or turkey stock

**I.** In a large bowl, mix together all dry ingredients; add the onion, celery and pimiento.

**2.** In a small bowl, combine eggs, milk and oil.

**3.** Add egg mixture to the large bowl. Stir until well-blended.

**4.** Pour into a 9x13-inch pan or a greased 10-inch cast iron skillet. Bake in a 400 F oven for 35 to 45 minutes until well-browned.

**5.** Crumble the corn bread. Add the stock to the crumbled corn bread. Mix well with a hand-held potato masher.

6. Continue baking for about 35 minutes.

#### Mama's Lemon Cake

Cake:

1 18.25-oz. pkg. lemon cake mix
 1 3-oz. pkg. lemon Jell-O
 3/4 cup water
 4 eggs, beaten 2 minutes
 3/4 cup corn oil
 lcing:
 2-3 lemons

I cup powdered sugar

 To make cake: Combine all ingredients into 9x13-inch pan or a Bundt pan. Bake at 350 F for 30 minutes for metal pans or 325 F for 30 minutes for glass pan.
 To make icing: Squeeze juice from lemons into mixing bowl. Mix in powdered sugar.

**3.** Prick the cake with a long fork while still hot. Spoon icing over cake, making sure some goes into each hole.
