

Happy Thanksgiving to you and yours!







Hope from despair, light from darkness and a future from the dust of the past. The promise of a better tomorrow is what drives human beings to continuously improve themselves. It's also human nature to gather with those of similar mind and background in order to find a common bond and a way toward inner peace. That's the goal of the Celebrate Recovery program offered through The Avenue Church, combining the

dynamics of worship and testimonials with small groups and individuals to build recovery for the walking wounded.

There are many recovery programs for alcoholics, drug addicts, sex addicts, overeaters and more in the large group format. The Avenue's Care Pastor Alan Rogers attended many of those meetings when gathering information to build the church's recovery program, and he found that almost everyone is burdened with hurt, and they needed the power of the small

group, too. "I would say only one-third of all our attendees are drug or alcohol addicts," Alan said. "The rest are dealing with life hurts and issues. We follow the same 12-steps as other programs, but we use them for any of life's hurts, habits or hang-ups."

Four years ago, Alan was a senior pastor in Northeast Arkansas when Avenue leadership approached him about building a recovery program here,

as his background made him the ideal candidate. Alan was raised on the Texas Baptist Home campus, where his parents worked. "I grew up in an environment of brokenness," he recalled. "I saw the devastation that these hurts can cause." Alan moved into ministry himself, and in 2000, he began a four-year stint as president of the Texas Baptist Home. "I saw all the hurt again, the things in people's lives that just shattered them," he recalled. With the invitation to return to Waxahachie, Alan set out on what would become one of the most joyful journeys of his life.

Celebrate Recovery is an international program, with ministries in over 20,000 churches, including others in Ellis County. The program is Christ-centered, so when Step 2 of the 12 Steps refers to a higher power, Celebrate Recovery names Him. "It's all about building your relationship with Jesus Christ," Alan explained. "All 12 steps are supported by Scripture. Jesus had this figured out long

before we did." The need for a recovery program in the community arose from a desire to serve the unchurched and the de-churched. "The ones who were hurting or broken, with marriages crumbling and all kinds of addictions," Alan said. "The church wanted to give them a hand."

Alan spent the first year visiting recovery groups to see what worked and what didn't and seeking people who could help start the program. "We only had one guy who had experience with Celebrate Recovery," he said. "The rest were trained and invested themselves in the program." During the weekly Monday night sessions, the focus is on God's healing power through fellowship with others. The program launched with 25 attendees, and after two years, it reached 50. Now, at the end of three years, there are 150 adults in attendance each week. Reflecting on the cause of the growth spurt, Alan said, "This is a safe place where we love people where they are, and we love them too much to let them stay there."

The sessions are free and open to community members age 18 and up and begin with an hour of worship, including a live band and a testimony or lesson. The second hour is for open share group and is gender-specific. "There are things that women and men might want to share, and they might not want to share them in front of the opposite gender," Alan explained. "We want it to be a safe place." The program examines 25 lessons a year, and when those end, they start over at lesson one. Alan emphasized that there is no right or wrong week to begin. "Each week stands alone, and it's a good mix of first timers with those who are 20 years sober," he said. "We always operate with a newcomer in mind. It's very scary to go for the first time, and we all know that the walk from the parking lot is the hardest walk of your life."

During Open Share, several groups cover different topics, with ones for women's addiction, codependence and general women's issues, and groups for addictions and issues for men. "People identify with people hurting like they are hurting," Alan explained of the format. "This is why we want to help anyone identify their issues. You can sit and listen. You don't have to talk. People need to figure out if they want company or to be alone." Alan stressed that Celebrate Recovery is not about fixing anybody, but rather about supporting everyone. Additionally, he noted that some hurts are bigger than what the program can manage, and the group has resources they can share, including counselors, rehabilitation facilities and contacts at Child Protective Services.

The heart of Celebrate Recovery is to be an asset to the community, families and individuals, no matter their demographics or religious preference. "We've had atheists and agnostics," Alan



said. "You don't have to believe, but you are going to hear about Christ. We want to help people get their kids, families and themselves back." In addition to the weekly sessions, there are 12-step classes that last six to nine months, so members can take their time and work through the recovery process. Alan noted that many of the ones who finish the in-depth classes go on to become leaders for the program. "Recovery is a journey of a lifetime, and we love when people take on leadership roles and serve others," he said. "Sometimes, we need to serve through our pain."


The church offers child care during meetings for kindergarten through fifth grade. Kids learn recovery terminology and have a lesson based on the worship topic for the week, so they also learn the process. "We want this to be a family thing," Alan said. "We all need to know about denial, powerlessness and surrender. It's our hope to eradicate a generation of addiction." The Avenue plans to add "The Landing" to the Celebrate Recovery program for sixth grade to 18 years. "Kids are part of the home," Alan explained, "and some of their parents' problems, they've seen."

In the end, Celebrate Recovery is all about the journey, regardless of background, ethnicity, age or religious preference. "This is a remarkable ministry," Alan said, likening it to watching children grow. "When you hear the testimony of someone who's been battling addiction for years, and then they experience freedom ... I'm the happiest dad you'll ever find." NOW

"It definitely fell in line with the purview and scope of work set out by the city, and the committee got people mobilized and engaged."

The group has accomplished so much. In fact, they decided this fall would be a great time to unveil their new bee mascot. More than just a nod to one of the hardest working members of the

insect kingdom, the selection honors longtime community advocate Beverly Worthington, who passed away in February of this year. "It seemed such a natural progression to name it after Beverly," explained Amy Hollywood, director of communications and marketing for the city. "Bees are majestic creatures. They work hard behind the scenes in a team, and they have a queen. Beverly fit that description," Amy added with a smile.

"We thought we needed a mascot, and the name recognition couldn't have been better," Derica noted.

The idea for the bees, however, goes even further back. Approximately four years ago, Beverly traveled to Australia, and when she returned home, she brought an intriguing idea to Amy. "Everywhere she went, there were trash cans made by artists," Amy explained. "There were bugs and other styles, and she thought it would be a neat idea to have them here, supporting public art, as well as having functional trash cans." The idea became a Leadership Waxahachie project, with creature cans that looked like butterflies placed in Getzendaner



Park. "Those were Beverly's idea, and the

plan was always to add more," Amy said.

With Beverly's passing in February, the KWB decided to honor her legacy and continue to advance her goals for the community. "We saw what other cities were doing with beautification, and a lot of them had mascots," Amy said, adding that the choice of a bee "just felt really right to honor Beverly in that way, and her family and friends loved it." Derica and Amy explained how Beverly was a great supporter of beautifying Waxahachie, beginning in her own neighborhood. "She walked every morning around Chapman Park, and she picked up trash and would recycle what she could," Amy said. "She was a real champion of beautification."

The Parks Department crafted and assembled the bee trash cans and installed them around Chapman Park earlier this year. The cans highlight the need to care for public spaces, as well as private property. "It enhances the quality of life for our citizens," Derica said. "People like living here, and beautification makes for better living." Adding in the fact that Waxahachie relies on tourism as an economic driver, KWB encourages

residents to keep their lawns mowed and free of trash.

"Everyone can help cultivate the tourist-friendly aesthetic," Amy said. "The current city council has placed beautification as a top priority and encourages residents to have excellent maintenance."

The KWB group has joined the Adopt-a-Highway program, taking over Brown Street from Marvin Drive to the curve where it turns into FM 813. They schedule quarterly cleanups, and everyone is welcome to join. "Anyone can help Keep Waxahachie Beautiful by volunteering their time and energy with roadside litter," Derica said. "The more people we have, the better. We've pledged ourselves to this work, including the bigger scale litter issues. We tell potential volunteers that it's super fun, and it's easy to give back."

Derica noted this isn't the first incarnation of KWB, which began in the Beautification committee of the Chamber of Commerce. In partnership with Keep Texas Beautiful, KWB worked to "preserve the natural beauty and protect the environment, making the city of Waxahachie and the state of Texas a better place to live," according to the Chamber archives.

The group flourished for 20 years by hosting the Texas Trash Off in town each year, advocating for reduce, reuse and recycle, and by hosting the annual Christmas lighting contest. Residents, businesses and industries were involved in beautifying Waxahachie, as KWB received the Silver Star Affiliate from Keep Texas Beautiful in 2006. Eventually, however, the program went dormant.

The legacy remained, and in 2014, the city found itself in need of it. "We were applying for a Scenic City Award through Scenic America, and one of the criteria is an organization for beautification," Derica explained. "The city took it over in May 2014 as a staffed program, and we did receive the certificate. It was the first great thing as the new Keep Waxahachie Beautiful." Now, the program includes Adopt-a-Block, Project Pride in the Neighborhood, America Recycles Day, the Texas Trash Off and lots of public education.

Last year, KWB planted wildflowers at Northside Elementary through the Adopt-a-School program of WISD's Partners in Education. "The city staff adopted a fifth-grade class, so we gave them a lesson in wildflowers, and then we planted them and watched them grow and bloom," Derica said. "This year, we will double in size, and we hope every class gets to experience it."

Through programs like this, KWB hopes to encourage residents of all ages to care about their community and how it looks. For example, the WHS Cherokee Charmers adopted the entire square block around the high school, making a commitment to keep it clean. "This is something easy to do, and it can be one small block, an entire neighborhood, done alone or in groups," Derica said, as she emphasized the mission to educate and engage citizens to take responsibility for improving their community environment. NOW



Dealing With Problem Pets

Whether dog or cat, a pet depends on its human for more than just food, water and love. They also require structure, which will prevent many problems faced by parents of four-legged children.


Even though different animals react differently to circumstances and training, common amongst both felines and canines are separation anxiety and food aggression. Both problems inspire some very nasty behaviors that are enough to make you feel like withdrawing your love and, sometimes, your food! Instead, remember that vast resources are available to help resolve your pet problems and restore peace at home.

Veterinarians are a wealth of knowledge about your pet's health. Since your animal's behavior is often the vet's best clue to what's going on inside your pet's body, you'll find conversation



with your vet an informal source of pet training information. For instance, you will want to have your cat tested for a urinary tract infection if you notice them spraying urine. While there, your vet will discuss with you the fact that when cats spray urine, they are either marking territory or indicating stress.







Your job is to manage your cat's behavior, since you can't train this instinctive reaction out of them. First, look for environmental triggers like your own schedule or other cats. Some cats are agitated by the slightest changes in routine. Many felines feud, and urine spraying is part of their arsenal. All you can do as a steward is keep the fighters separated. Most importantly, feed them in distinctly different locations where they cannot see each other.

Similar mitigation is necessary when dogs exhibit food aggression, which the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals simply calls food guarding. Their research says that unless you fear your canine will bite you, you can employ desensitization and counterconditioning techniques to change the way your dog feels about people approaching him when he has food. The ASPCA website warns never to punish or intimidate the dog that guards food. This could be dangerous and, possibly, derail the relationship you're building with your dog.

A variety of reasonable precautions ensure safety for people and other dogs. Simple procedures to prevent drama include:

· Leave dogs alone while they're eating.



- Feed dogs in a separate room, in a crate or behind a barrier.
- Provide dogs with adequate amounts of food so the canines feel less motivated to guard.
- Do not attempt to take away stolen or scavenged food from dogs.
- Cause the food-aggressive dog to realize that food is provided by you by placing the food bowl at your feet or requiring the dog to eat directly from your hand.

One key to dwelling in a peaceful kingdom is empathy. According to Emily Gilliland, a young mother who has also trained her own cats and dogs for over six years, it makes all the difference when you understand how your animal is feeling about the task or behavior at hand. Commonly, cats jump up on counters and tables reserved for human use. Emily patiently uses a spray bottle of water or an air can to chase them off surfaces, and then sets it on the counter where the cat was. This teaches the cat they will not be comfortable where they once felt welcome.

Repetition is another key. "As a 2-year-old child, a dog has the ability to grasp simple commands only after many repetitions," Emily said. "They also can problem-solve simple tasks. Our communication is skewed, though.



FALL IS TREE PRUNING SEASON!

Animals can be misunderstood because they communicate not with words, but with subtle cues. Remembering this when training and behavior shaping can have a significant impact on the end result and reduce overall stress levels for all involved — canine and child included."

Emily experienced the joy of a strong trust and loving bond with all her animals after investing patience and energy. "Training my pets is beneficial to both my pets and me," she said. "They are expected to behave in a particular way, and they have learned to expect the same from me."




Whether taking in a new dog or changing your schedule, Emily suggests watching for symptoms of separation anxiety that include, but are not limited to: excessive chewing, destruction of doors when keeping the dog inside, pacing, whining, barking and window surfing. There is a simple solution. Have the dog lie or sit in a room, and then leave, closing the door and waiting five seconds before returning. Repeat this procedure, stretching the wait time progressively to 10 seconds, then 45, then a minute-and-a-half and so on. "As you do this, the dog will start to realize you will come back," Emily said. "Adding in a treat or a little play time on your returns will certainly make this a positive experience in the dog's mind."



Jerry's Tires and Wheels has served Ellis County and the surrounding areas for 39 years at the same location just west of Grand Avenue. As the shop foreman, Branden McClain has vivid memories of growing up in and around the tire business. "My dad, Marvin McClain, worked for the original owner of Jerry's Tires and Wheels for 17 years," Branden stated. "I always wanted to be in the tire business because it came natural to me."

never missed a beat. "It was important to him that the new owners carry on with business the same way he did," Kelli said. "He didn't want the name changed, and he wanted to know his employees would have job security."

Steven and Kelli proved to be the right fit. So Jerry sold, and they purchased Jerry's Tires and Wheels in May 2015. While Steven holds down a full-time job with Standard Pacific Homes, Kelli is an active, full-time member of the team at Jerry's. "The only thing different is the paint," she said. "We repainted and revamped the building."

In addition to Kelli and Branden, the staff at Jerry's includes Zachary Huskins and Dustin McClain. The lack of turnover has a lot to say about the work atmosphere at Jerry's. The biggest obstacle Jerry's has faced over the years is the large group of people who don't know they exist. "There were 5,000 people in town when Jerry's first opened," Branden stated. "Now, there are more than 35,000. We are dependent on advertising and word of mouth in order to let people know we are here, ready to take care of all their tire needs." NOW

Money Management for Teens



Medicinal Herbs for Oral Health

Alternative medicine has been practiced around the world for centuries, and it is now a popular and growing field in the United States, as well. Herbal and alternative medicine has its place in health care, when used properly and responsibly and in conjunction with professional supervision. There is no substitute for seeing your dentist on a regular basis to have your teeth professionally cleaned, and your gums, mouth and teeth evaluated for disease.

The conditions for which possible herbal remedies exist are often symptoms of disease and should be reported to your dentist if they persist. A dry mouth, which can cause tooth decay, is often a side effect of medications, such as antidepressants, and can be treated with Echinacea, multiflora rosa or capsicum in mouthwash or toothpaste form. Bad breath that is not being caused by gum disease and bacteria on the tongue can respond to alfalfa tea, chewing parsley or using mouthwash or toothpaste with clove, fennel seeds, myrrh, rosemary or wintergreen. Inflamed or irritated gums can be soothed with topical application of aloe vera gel, chamomile, eucalyptus oil, evening primrose oil, goldenseal, red clover or tea tree oil. Mouth sores can be medicated with topical application of horsetail, goldenseal, myrrh, rockrose or sage in poultice, salve or compress. Headaches and muscle tension associated with TMJ Disorder can be relieved with burdock poultice and herbal teas. Anxiety before dental appointments can be


lessened with sage, chamomile, wood betony, sarsaparilla, skullcap tea or valerian capsules. Valerian should not be used in conjunction with any other sedatives.

Do not try to treat an abscess with herbs. Abscesses are serious dental infections that typically are caused by very deep decay or advanced periodontal disease. It is important to have an abscess evaluated and treated by a dentist as soon as possible, and even more quickly if swelling or fever is present. An abscess can be a dangerous health problem if the infection spreads into your blood stream, and antibiotic therapy is a must in these cases.

The judicious use of herbal remedies for select dental conditions can provide relief in many cases. When using herbs, it is important to do some research, use the proper dosage and to take them with food if the herb is taken internally. Choose a product that is tested and lists its ingredients on the container. Products that have the American Botanic Council seal are a great place to start. Only take one herb at a time, as herbs can interact with each other in unfavorable ways just like traditional medications can. Always check with your health care provider before combining herbs with prescription or over-the-counter medications, and be sure to see your dentist every five months! NOW

In the Kitchen With Johnnie Peebles

Johnnie Peebles enjoys cooking, for many reasons. "One of the most important reasons is how a home-cooked meal brings family together," she said, referring to her own large family. "We gather around the table to eat, but we end up spending hours just talking and laughing." Many memories have been made around the Peebles' dinner table.

Cooking also takes Johnnie back to her childhood. She remembers the friends that would stop by. "My mom and dad made sure there was always something to eat," she shared, "whether it be a full meal, a cake, cookies or candy, it was always homemade from scratch." Johnnie has tried to do the same, and she feels the greatest compliment is when someone enjoys something she's prepared, and then asks for the recipe.

Chicken Empanadas

3 cups chicken, cooked and chopped
1 8-oz. pkg. shredded Colby and
Monterrey Jack blended cheese
1 4-oz. pkg. cream cheese, softened
1 jalapeño, seeded and chopped
1 tsp. ground cumin
1 1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 tsp. black pepper
1 15-oz. pkg. pie crust
1/4 cup water
Sour cream (optional)

- **I.** In a large bowl, add chicken, blended cheese, cream cheese, jalapeño, cumin, salt and pepper. With an electric mixer, beat all ingredients together until well-blended.
- **2.** Unroll pie crust, roll into a 15-inch circle. Cut out 12-15 circles with a 3-inch cookie cutter.
- **3.** Place a heaping tsp. of chicken mixture in the center of each round of pie crust.
- **4.** Lightly brush the edges with water. Fold the pie dough over and press the edges

together using a fork.

- **5.** Bake at 400 F for 15 minutes, or until golden brown. Serve with sour cream.
- **6.** These can be made ahead and kept frozen for up to a full month.

Pineapple Cheese Ball

2 8-oz. pkgs. cream cheese, softened 2 Tbsp. green pepper, finely chopped 2 Tbsp. onions, finely chopped 1/4 cup crushed pineapple, drained 3 tsp. seasoning salt 2 cups chopped pecans (divided use) Fresh fruit, optional Assorted crackers, optional

- **1.** Beat cream cheese until smooth. Add green pepper, onions, pineapple, seasoning salt and 1 cup of pecans. Mix well.
- **2.** Shape into a ball. Roll in remaining pecans.
- **3.** Chill cheese ball for 1-2 hours. Garnish with fresh fruit and serve with assorted crackers.

Pizza Dip

1/2 cup whole milk
6 oz. cream cheese
1 cup mozzarella cheese (divided use)
1 cup Parmesan cheese (divided use)
1/2 cup spaghetti sauce
Pepperoni, enough to cover the top of the dip
Garlic bread (optional)

- **1.** Melt the milk, cream cheese and 1/2 cup of each cheese in a medium saucepan.
- **2.** Pour melted mixture into a pie dish. Top with spaghetti sauce and pepperoni.
- **3.** Sprinkle top with the remaining two cheeses.
- **4.** Bake at 320 F until the dip begins to bubble.
- 5. Serve with garlic bread.

Chocolate Meringue Pie

- 1 1/4 cups plus 3 Tbsp. sugar (divided use)
- 2 Tbsp. all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- 2 cups milk
- 2 Tbsp. cornstarch
- 4 large eggs, separated
- 1 tsp. pure vanilla extract
- 1/2 stick unsalted butter, cut into 1/2-inch pieces
- 1 prebaked pie crust
- **1.** Preheat oven to 350 F. Combine 1 1/4 cups sugar, flour and cocoa in a bowl. Stir to mix well. Set aside.
- **2.** Whisk together the milk, cornstarch and egg yolks in a separate bowl, until well-mixed.
- **3.** Slowly add the milk/egg mixture to the flour mixture. Whisk to blend thoroughly.
- **4.** Pour mixture into a saucepan. Cook and stir constantly until thickened, then add the vanilla and butter. (This can be made several days in advance. Keep refrigerated with plastic wrap placed on the surface of the filling to prevent a film from forming.)
- **5.** Whip the egg whites in a bowl with an electric mixer for 2-3 minutes, or until soft peaks form. Add the remaining sugar and beat just to mix.
- **6.** Pour the filling into the pie crust. Top with the beaten egg whites, making sure to spread evenly to cover the chocolate mixture. Sprinkle with additional sugar, if desired.
- **7.** Bake 5-7 minutes until the meringue topping is golden brown. Remove the pie from the oven. Cool for 2 hours before slicing.


