
The Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade was usually on TV in the living room. I loved the parade — the bands, the



Through great dedication and sacrifice, veterans have stood with America. The community of Midlothian stands with its veterans. For the past eight years, Midlothian celebrates Veterans Day by honoring them with the Veterans Tribute Dinner. The first one began with a picnic planned by a handful of citizens and veterans. That special barbecue began the tradition of having this event with all volunteers and everything donated.



After the initial picnic in 2010, the committee wanted the tribute to be a continuous event, so they asked the city for help and was enthusiastically received by the City Council and administration. With the addition of the city's support, Special Events/Recreation Coordinator Gina Moore and School Resource Officer at Walnut Grove Middle School Sgt. Richard Pena eventually became part of the team spearheading the event, and the outdoor picnic became an indoor annual dinner.

"The founding members said that everybody who volunteers needed to do it out of their good will and not for anything in return, so that's what we've continued," Gina said. "I met Sgt. Pena when he assisted with a parade the city was hosting. I found out he was a veteran, so I asked for his help with the tribute dinner."

Pena joined the Marine Corps in 1994 and served until 1998 as a machine gunner in the infantry. "I joined because with my background, I felt like I had little choice," he shared. "I didn't grow up with money, and it was something I needed to do to have somewhere to go after high


school. I was self-aware enough to know I needed direction. I'd always wanted to be a Marine, so it was probably the easiest recruiting job that recruiter ever had. I told him I wanted to sign up, and he asked, 'Don't you want to talk about it?' I said, 'No, not even a little bit.' That night I found myself in a hotel in Dallas taking a test and was sworn in the next day. That's how quick it was!"

Sgt. Pena started working for the city of Midlothian at the water department, but decided he wanted to go into police work. After completing the Police Academy, he was hired in 2002. Since becoming one of the members of the Veterans Tribute Dinner committee, he is very impressed with the dedication that

goes into planning the tribute. "The city and Gina work themselves to the bone," he stated. "This is a dinner where these veterans can get together, at least once a year, and fellowship with each other. It is also to honor the families of these veterans, who were at home while their loved ones were out doing their service."

Everything the committee does is about honoring vets. "I also do it to honor the ones before me," Sgt. Pena remarked. "You have grandparents who served in WWII. We're losing more and more of them every day, so we need to honor them while they are still here. I was never involved in conflict, so I've never had to fight. But I've known guys who did. While I served, we did lose some guys. During the tribute dinner, you start remembering things like that, so it can get to be solemn. But then you look around and see a room full of people who gave their all and the families who stuck by them. It's very moving. It's also good to see some of the guys who've been around forever and try to get them to tell some of their stories. That's when it becomes a good time and fun."

The Veterans Tribute Dinner is held at the Midlothian Conference Center, so the organizers can expect up to 500

people. "We don't discriminate on who comes to the dinner," Gina explained. "We don't even object if someone is from Venus or Waxahachie. If a veteran wants to bring a significant other, they just need to make a reservation online, so we have a head count. We would never say no to a veteran."

A few veterans have discovered unexpected welcomed surprises at the event, "We've had some of the veterans who did not know each other but found out they were in the same place, on the same base, at the same time and did not know it!" Gina enthused. "Here in Midlothian, they found each other. The dinner gives them an opportunity to talk to each other about their experiences. Usually they don't want to bring up the memories, but in this setting they can."

Sgt. Pena understands how important this time of solidarity can be. "They are talking to another veteran who gets it, so they feel as if they are talking to a brother or sister," he explained. "You never forget the guys you meet when you're in the service. You eat with them. You sleep with them. It was good camaraderie."

On November 11, Veterans Day, Midlothian will reach out to remember and honor its veterans again. Captain Zina Salazar, U.S. Army engineer officer with Battalion 2IC, will be the guest speaker this year. It will be the first time the dinner has hosted a female speaker.

Gina's commitment with the Veterans Tribute Dinner comes from a personal place. "I come from a military family," she shared. "All my uncles were military. I could never serve, so I try to honor the ones who did and do. It's my way of giving back, and it's an honor to do it. It's an honor to be a part of this." NOW



Midlothian has been home to Landry all her life, with the exception of her first year, which was in China. Here in the Midlothian community she indulged in her hobby of photography and accumulated a remarkable portfolio of varied interests. "I always had an eye for things, different angles and colors and whether it looked nice," she shared. "When younger, I liked taking photos of nature. I remember taking pictures of pretty trees, but I wasn't serious about it until I received an official photography



camera in middle school. In high school, I took a photography class, where I was able to learn different techniques. The photography teacher was a great help in teaching me all of the basics." Landry still uses the Nikon D3100 camera she received in middle school. She's hoping this Christmas brings her a much-needed newer model!


By observing different types of photos on social media and in blogs, Landry was able to develop her own personal photography style. "I think the kind of style that I aim for is something genuine, yet unique," she mused. "That probably sounds super cheesy, but I really do try to make my pictures stand out and/or have some unique quality about them that people stop and notice. I try not to edit my photos too much, but just enough to where it enhances the photo rather than hijacks it. I think I knew I was good at taking pictures around my sophomore or junior year of high school. I traveled quite a bit during those years, and I would take my camera with me to take photos. When I posted them on my social media, I got some good feedback."

When considering a setting to photograph, Landry looks to see whatever catches her eye. "If it's a person, then it's their facial expression or what they are doing," she explained. "If it's a still shot, for example a city or a building, then I look at the angles. Sunlight is important. It is better to not take pictures of people under harsh sunlight because it washes them out.











It just looks better if it's in the shade. Obviously you wouldn't want to shoot at noon because the sun is directly overhead. The best times to shoot are at sunrise and sunset. They are called the golden hours."

Although she usually avoids the harsh sunlight, there are times when Landry specifically seeks it to use it as a prop for her photos. "You can be backlit with the sun behind you, and it will leave an outline of your body. On a photo I took of a couple with the sun behind them, it looked like a silhouette. It looked really cool!"

Landry's favorite photos to take are senior photos. She likes to be creative with light, and her first main photo shoot was also her favorite one. It allowed her to experiment with different sets, angles and lighting. "It was a photography project called Fashion Photography with Kaci Wiens as the model. We set up a photo set in her living room like an actual photo shoot. I loved all the pictures! They are probably some of my favorite pictures I've ever taken."

It's no surprise Landry enjoyed taking the senior photos and the fashion shoot





because they are all about people. "I like their expressions because it enables me to really capture who a person is. Sometimes I'll see someone and think, They would make a great photo! Other times I'll be taking photos of someone for a photo shoot, and they will start laughing or they will do something silly. I'll think, That's them!"

Sometimes, it's difficult for Landry to get the shot she really wants because the subject is so focused on the fact that they are having their picture taken. "They feel like they need to pose to look their best, and I feel like you can't really see who they are," she said. "It would be better for photographs if people could be who they are. Sometimes, to get them to relax, I try to get them to laugh by telling jokes. On the other hand, it can be cool to have photo shoots of someone who is super posed, like my fashion shoot with Kaci. A lot of fashion photos are stiff and dramatic, and I try to capture that rather than their personality."

Landry has big plans for herself after she graduates from UT. She not only loves photography, she also loves to write. Her dream is to be a travel journalist and

work for a company such as National Geographic, People or Time magazine. In order to prepare herself as much as possible during her time at school, she will continue to build her portfolio and hopes to work for the newspaper staff at the Daily Texan. She is also looking to study abroad with the journalism program. With her skill in writing and photography, Landry's future readers will not only be able to read her stories, but see them in pictures — hopefully from a new camera! NOW



loved the photos, especially the ceiling, and it was Texas."



Inside, photos of their family accentuate a handsomely tiled entry hallway that leads in multiple directions. The front guest room is definitely Christine's, made clear by the overwhelming amount of Dodgers gear inside. "It's momma's room," she gloated. Though they are both from Southern California, Michael's rooting interest in the Yankees is at odds with Christine's fervor for the blue and white. There is another guest room down the hall, this one resplendent in its white and gold color scheme. The shared guest bathroom is peach for now, but is on Michael's list of home renovations. First, though, he had to tackle their room. "We redid the floors, but we have to redo the bathroom next," Christine admitted. The bedroom looks nice with its light blue walls, large vanity and deep wood colors.

While Christine gets to claim the first room most guests will see, Michael has taken over decorating the guest suite in the back. "I'm slowly adding more Raiders and Yankees stuff. 

Going shopping at 4L Marketplace is an event and a treat! Stepping into the spacious building is akin to walking into 18 different shops all together in one business. Patricia and George Luedtke opened 4L Marketplace in November 2016, along with assistance from their daughter and son-in-law, Reagan and Weston Williamson. They wanted to give Midlothian the same shopping experience they enjoyed in other cities. "Waxahachie has so many places you can go browse through, so we were thinking this would be a great thing for Midlothian to have instead of everybody having to go over there," Patricia stated.

The family already had talents in constructing creative arts and crafts. With George's interest in buying and selling antiques, 4L Marketplace became a natural business venture for the family.

Reagan has joined her dad and husband in making creative pieces they've sold. "My dad and I made a kid's table out of a wire spool," she explained. "My husband made picture frames and different pieces of furniture out of barn wood. We would go to antique and thrift stores to see what we could find and see what we could make out of what we found — whether we'd need to paint it or fix it."

Even though they don't have the time to be personally creative today, their business is full of inspired- and artistic-minded vendors who are the equivalent of 18 different businesses. ### In the Kitchen With Steve Randle and Rick Hensley

Avid hunters and longtime NOW Magazines employees, Steve Randle and Rick Hensley, cook a lot in their homes and at their respective camps. At 5 years old, Rick began helping his mom in her kitchen, and then he was happy to man the grill or fire pit once he started hunting in his early 20s in Nacogdoches, Texas. Steve and his three sons have hunted turkey and deer in Comanche and Mills counties for over 30 years. Starting a brisket and a campfire Friday night, their pit and the camp fire smokes all weekend.

The recipes he and Rick share here are so simple, but they earn compliments from their friends and families. "And they're great," Rick said, "for sitting around a camp fire on a cool fall evening after you've been out hunting." **NOW** 

#### Rick's Cajun Rib Eyes

Best prepared before you go out for the evening hunt.

- 2 1.25-inch-thick prime or choice rib eyes, bone-in or boneless
- 1 Tbsp. Tony Chachere's Original Creole Seasoning
- 1 tsp. Lawry's Seasoned Pepper
- 1/2 tsp. onion powder
- 1/2 tsp. garlic powder
- 1 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tsp. soy sauce
- **I.** Place the steaks in a 1-gallon Ziploc bag. Sprinkle both sides with dry seasonings; add the sauces.
- **2.** Squeeze the air out, and zip the bag closed. Place it in your ice chest for at least 2 hours.
- **3.** Let steaks get to room temperature before putting them on the fire.

**4.** For medium rare, and depending on the size of your fire, most steaks will need to cook about 5 or 6 minutes per side

#### Rick's Venison Stew

- 2 Tbsp. bacon grease
- 1 Tbsp. olive oil
- 2.5 lbs. venison, cubed
- I tsp. Lawry's Seasoned Salt
- 1 tsp. Lawry's Seasoned Pepper
- 1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 8 cups beef broth
- 12 medium golden potatoes
- 1 tsp. Tony Chachere's Original Creole Seasoning
- 1/2 tsp. garlic powder
- 1/2 tsp. onion powder
- I large, sweet 1015 onion
- 4 celery stalks, diced bite-size
- 1 8-oz. bag petite carrots, sliced bite-size

- 1 10-oz. can Ro-Tel tomatoes, regular or mild
- 1 14.5-oz. can green beans 1/2 15.2-oz. can corn (optional) Salt and pepper, to taste
- **1.** In a large stock pot, combine grease and olive oil.
- **2.** While it heats, season the cubed venison with salt, pepper and Worcestershire sauce.
- **3.** Cook over medium-high heat until done. Add the beef broth; cook at a low boil for about 30 minutes, to start tenderizing meat.
- **4.** Meanwhile, wash potatoes. Leaving the skin on, cut into medium bite-size pieces. Add to the boiling meat mixture; simmer for another 15 minutes.
- **5.** Add remaining seasonings, vegetables and canned goods and fast simmer 20 minutes.
- **6.** If desired, use flour or corn starch to thicken it a little.
- **7.** Salt and pepper to taste, and enjoy!

#### Steve's Nanner Pud

- 5 3/4 cups cold milk
- 2 large boxes instant vanilla pudding mix
- 1 1/2 14-oz. cans Eagle Brand condensed milk
- 1/2 stick butter
- 1/2 box graham cracker crumbs
- 1 1/2 boxes vanilla wafers, reduced fat variety
- 3-4 ripe bananas I large tub Cool Whip
- **1.** Combine milk with pudding mix. Stir in condensed milk, a little at a time, to avoid clumps; refrigerate.
- **2.** Melt butter and mix with graham cracker crumbs. Spread crumbs on bottom of bowl or aluminum pan, saving some for decorations, if desired.
- **3.** Put down a layer of wafers and sliced bananas.
- **4.** When pudding is firm, fold in the Cool Whip, so the pudding has white streaks all through it. Save some Cool Whip for decoration.
- **5.** Pour a little less than half of the pudding mix over the wafers and bananas.
- **6.** Repeat the layers and end with all bananas covered, or they will turn brown.
- **7.** Stand wafers up all the way around the edge of the bowl.
- **8.** Sprinkle with crumbs, and add dollops of Cool Whip.
