

swatting us with the flat side of a yardstick. I'm almost sure my brothers received more swats than I did, but my memory on swats could be a little cloudy after all these years.






Raiford Adams remembers when he got his first set of glasses. He was just a child who needed them for clear vision, but they opened an opportunity for him to experience bullying. "In fifth grade, I had to start wearing glasses, and kids laughed at me," Raiford recalled. He turned to writing for comfort. It was a trait handed down from his mother, who would also often write stories for the enjoyment of herself and her family. "I used to make up stories about different characters," he said. "One of my favorites was about an alien who landed on earth. He needed a part for his spacecraft. He fixed it, but before he did, he made several friends, and then he left.

"My stories relaxed me," he admitted. "They gave me comfort and confidence."

Now, as a 52-year-old adult, Raiford is passing that same opportunity on to other youngsters. His children's book, *Tommy Turtle Visits the Eye Doctor*, published in November 2015, is based on his own experiences as a child.

Raiford had never been published before. Like his mother, the stories were for himself and family. However, at the encouragement of friends, he made the bold move. "I took it to work and was showing it to people. They said,

'You should get it published,' so I did," he said, also mentioning that it's doing well on Amazon. The book is available in a variety of ways. Along with Amazon, it can be obtained in places such as iTunes, Google, Kobo and Barnes & Noble online.

But it's not about the money for Raiford. In fact, he's donated many copies of the book to area schools. "The librarian at one of the schools told me that some of the kids still hide glasses in their backpacks," Raiford said. "It's hard to believe it's still happening!"

Raiford is working on several other animal books. Shirley the Squirrel is based on his best friend in elementary school, Joyce Luther. "She told me not to let others bother me," he said. "She sat in her car and read the story of Tommy Turtle right after it came out. A whole bag of ice melted, she got so into it."

He's also working on a story about a ladybug teaching colors and numbers. However, he's not sure what characters to use for trips to the dentist and doctor. "I'm thinking of Buster the Bear for the doctor," he said. "Children relate to

animals better than people. It's a lot easier to adjust to different things when it's an animal."


Raiford has no children of his own. However, he does have some nieces and nephews and friends he's tried his stories out on to great responses. "My roommate's niece was excited about











it, and that also made me think about publishing," he said. "The second and third books are easier to get published because people know you, but that's only if the first one is good."

His first book passed that test. Other authors and publishers are excited to see more from him. "Raiford hit well in his book [with the message] that just because you're a little different there's nothing wrong with you," said Anita Dickason of Mystic Circle Books. "His ability lies with taking a very simple message and putting it in terms children relate to."

Fellow author Charlotte Wright called Raiford "an exceptional storyteller." She said, "His book captures the fear of being different. I think it's safe to say a great deal of children and adults have faced and do face this. This book hits home to the never-ending story of acceptance but also teaches us, as parents,




that we need to build up our Shirley Squirrels, too. Just an ounce of kindness replenishes the soul. I look forward to more of these stories from Mr. Adams. His future is bright, and as a fellow writer, I'm pretty excited for his journey."

Raiford often still reflects on his mother's writings and how they lifted him up. Though she only wrote for enjoyment, he said he's certain she could have been a great published author. "She wrote a funny story about a girl going on a trip. She took the sleeves off her coat to make it lighter," he said with a smile, noting that it also made the little girl colder. "She did have a song published, once."

He is considering an audiobook version of Tommy Turtle Visits the Eye Doctor. He's also looking at possibly creating an interactive version that can be read and participated with on a computer. Also, when people order the book, they can get a personal message from Tommy Turtle sent to their children. All they need to do is make that request. "Children love that," he said. "It makes it more personal to them."

Raiford works at Walgreen's Distribution Center in Waxahachie. He's been there for 10 years, but ideally, he'd love to devote more of his time to his full-time passion — writing. "I'd like to be able to quit work and write [for] the rest of my life," he said. "I have a great job, but I want to do more to help make life better for children, and I just love writing. I don't know if I have a novel in me, but I definitely have a lot more stories for children." NOW



For Emily Camarena, education is so much more than curriculum, tests, school books or a building. It's an experience. It's a gift. Education is something that must be both earned and rewarded. A graduate of Waxahachie High School, Emily was a popular student-athlete with strong personal drive and leadership qualities. She attended Texas State University in San Marcos (known as Southwest Texas State University, in the mid-'90s) to study exercise science, with a minor in English, but quickly realized that something was missing from her college experience. "The school has a wonderful campus, and I met friends pretty quickly," Emily explained. "It's a big Greek school, but when the rush season came around, none of the sororities fit my own personality, background and culture."



Specifically, she found that the college (and sororities) lacked any real support network for Latinas. In her junior year at college, she and 10 other Latina friends determined to make a change. "We were first-generation college students in our families," Emily said. "We wanted other girls similar to us, who were also firstgeneration college girls, to have a strong network for women." At that time, only 10 percent of Hispanics graduated from



college. "I wanted to be a good statistic," Emily said. "I wanted to be a role model for my little sisters and cousins. My parents had a great work ethic and were so wonderful, but they did not know about college or the college experience."

This is the reason why and how Emily and her friends founded the first Latina sorority at Texas State, Sigma Delta Lambda Sorority Inc. on September 26, 1996. With the motto, "Together We Rise through Education, Loyalty and Pride," the sorority offered workshops on scholarships and financial aid for at-risk youth, but more importantly, the sisters served as strong role models. "We were not exclusively Latina," Emily explained, "but we wanted to capture culture and empower others, Latina and otherwise." With the goal of empowerment, Emily got her wish, and within a very short amount of time, Sigma Delta Lambda established new chapters on other college campuses.

The sorority's motto became Emily's personal mantra. Upon graduation, she landed a job in Dallas as an English teacher and coach. Awarded District Coach of the Year in two different years, Emily proved to also be a very successful teacher. She was urged to continue her education for more of a leadership and administrative position. "I did it the hard way," Emily said with a laugh. While many opt for online classes for continued education, Emily attended The University of Texas at Arlington in the evenings, while working full time during the day. After earning her master's degree, she became an assistant principal in the Irving and Duncanville school districts before becoming dean of instruction for the




Young Women's Leadership Academy in Grand Prairie.


Everything she wanted for and demanded of education played out before her and because of her. Her dream of instilling leadership skills, greater opportunities and empowerment for her young charges was now a daily occurrence. It was why she went to college, why she helped create a sorority, and it was why she then left that school to come home again.

At a conference in San Antonio, she learned of some of the great things happening in the Waxahachie school district. As she listened, she realized, This was what I was trained to do. "That night, I went back to my hotel room, got on the











WISD website and saw the openings and applied that same evening."

In 2016, Emily began the new academic year as the principal of Dunaway Elementary School, one of WISD's bilingual campuses, yet her goals have never changed. Education. Loyalty. Pride. In fact, now as the mother of a young son, she believes even more in the importance of education.

"I want my students to want to come to school," Emily said. "Every day when they leave school, I tell them I can't wait to see them tomorrow. I want them to know, 'I'm going to be waiting for you!' Our teachers have done such an amazing job letting our kids know how important they are to us and how much we care for them. For some of these kids, we may be the most important people in their lives. I want them to know they are safe here, that we care for them."

Just as she has done in every other aspect of her life and academic career, Emily's actions are louder than her words. "She's never in her office," said Donna Kruger, the school's secretary. She is in the hallways, in the classrooms, in the library and in the gymnasium. The teachers praise Emily for listening to them, while the office staff marvels at how often she will sit at the front desk to answer phones or speak to a concerned parent who has not yet mastered the English language. "You can see the relief that comes over a parent's face when she starts talking to them in Spanish," Donna added.



As for the children, the mere mention of their principal's name brings many, many smiles. "She loves us!" is the overwhelming sentiment given, with added endearments that describe Emily as funny, fun, caring, awesome and cool. Surprisingly, the topic of dancing and being "energetic" are also popular among the students.

"I think they would say I was a good dancer," Emily said when asked how her students might describe her.

"She's a funny dancer," said one third-grader.

"Oh, she's very competitive," Donna said. Known to run "victory laps" around the school, Emily doesn't just play Castle Ball, volleyball, basketball and soccer with her students. "She plays to win."

"It's one of the things that makes her so perfect," said Yuliana Gutierrez, an office assistant. "It's her attitude. She is always smiling. She loves harmony."

Emily begins every staff meeting by asking for everyone to share something positive about their lives. It is a positive, team-building exercise that fosters greater energy and camaraderie. For her students, however, being in the hallways offering praise and support, being in the gymnasium busting out a dance move or making a free throw and being in the classrooms admiring artwork and reading essays with earnest enthusiasm is the kind of "show and tell" they most understand. Emily is not merely a figurehead in the school or a threat of "seeing the principal." She is their role model. She is their leader. She is their "show and tell."

"She has such a passion for learning," Donna said. "One of her main goals is to make sure that every child, every child, fits in. She wants them to feel safe and to know they're a part of all of us."

"I think, well, I hope students would say I care about them, that I am always there for them," Emily admitted. "And, I am a good dancer." NOW












meant renting an apartment during construction, working with the contractor, designing and refining.

"That we were able to make it our own is my favorite thing," Brooke shared. "We even inscribed Scriptures on the studs, so that each room has a special verse."

The home's Texas-style exterior is a dramatic mix

of dark brick and light stone. Adding to its charm is a three-peaked roof line and exquisite landscaping. "Corey does all of the landscaping, and he also designed the backyard space," Brooke said.

The living room, with its huge stoneclad, wood-burning fireplace and plenty of seating for family gatherings, provides an open view to the dining area and a lovely turquoise-colored sideboard. In the Kitchen With Steve Randle and Rick Hensley

Avid hunters and longtime NOW Magazines employees, Steve Randle and Rick Hensley, cook a lot in their homes and at their respective camps. At 5 years old, Rick began helping his mom in her kitchen, and then he was happy to man the grill or fire pit once he started hunting in his early 20s in Nacogdoches, Texas. Steve and his three sons have hunted turkey and deer in Comanche and Mills counties for over 30 years. Starting a brisket and a campfire Friday night, their pit and the camp fire smokes all weekend.

The recipes he and Rick share here are so simple, but they earn compliments from their friends and families. "And they're great," Rick said, "for sitting around a camp fire on a cool fall evening after you've been out hunting." **NOW**

Rick's Cajun Rib Eyes

Best prepared before you go out for the evening hunt.

- 2 1.25-inch-thick prime or choice rib eyes, bone-in or boneless
- 1 Tbsp. Tony Chachere's Original Creole Seasoning
- 1 tsp. Lawry's Seasoned Pepper
- 1/2 tsp. onion powder
- 1/2 tsp. garlic powder
- 1 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tsp. soy sauce
- **I.** Place the steaks in a 1-gallon Ziploc bag. Sprinkle both sides with dry seasonings; add the sauces.
- **2.** Squeeze the air out, and zip the bag closed. Place it in your ice chest for at least 2 hours.
- **3.** Let steaks get to room temperature before putting them on the fire.

4. For medium rare, and depending on the size of your fire, most steaks will need to cook about 5 or 6 minutes per side

Rick's Venison Stew

- 2 Tbsp. bacon grease
- 1 Tbsp. olive oil
- 2.5 lbs. venison, cubed
- I tsp. Lawry's Seasoned Salt
- 1 tsp. Lawry's Seasoned Pepper
- 1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 8 cups beef broth
- 12 medium golden potatoes
- I tsp. Tony Chachere's Original Creole Seasoning
- 1/2 tsp. garlic powder
- 1/2 tsp. onion powder
- I large, sweet 1015 onion
- 4 celery stalks, diced bite-size
- 1 8-oz. bag petite carrots, sliced bite-size

- 1 10-oz. can Ro-Tel tomatoes, regular or mild
- 1 14.5-oz. can green beans 1/2 15.2-oz. can corn (optional) Salt and pepper, to taste
- **1.** In a large stock pot, combine grease and olive oil.
- **2.** While it heats, season the cubed venison with salt, pepper and Worcestershire sauce.
- **3.** Cook over medium-high heat until done. Add the beef broth; cook at a low boil for about 30 minutes, to start tenderizing meat.
- **4.** Meanwhile, wash potatoes. Leaving the skin on, cut into medium bite-size pieces. Add to the boiling meat mixture; simmer for another 15 minutes.
- **5.** Add remaining seasonings, vegetables and canned goods and fast simmer 20 minutes.
- **6.** If desired, use flour or corn starch to thicken it a little.
- **7.** Salt and pepper to taste, and enjoy!

Steve's Nanner Pud

- 5 3/4 cups cold milk
- 2 large boxes instant vanilla pudding mix
- 1 1/2 14-oz. cans Eagle Brand condensed milk
- 1/2 stick butter
- 1/2 box graham cracker crumbs
- 1 1/2 boxes vanilla wafers, reduced fat variety
- 3-4 ripe bananas I large tub Cool Whip
- **1.** Combine milk with pudding mix. Stir in condensed milk, a little at a time, to avoid clumps; refrigerate.
- **2.** Melt butter and mix with graham cracker crumbs. Spread crumbs on bottom of bowl or aluminum pan, saving some for decorations, if desired.
- **3.** Put down a layer of wafers and sliced bananas.
- **4.** When pudding is firm, fold in the Cool Whip, so the pudding has white streaks all through it. Save some Cool Whip for decoration.
- **5.** Pour a little less than half of the pudding mix over the wafers and bananas.
- **6.** Repeat the layers and end with all bananas covered, or they will turn brown.
- **7.** Stand wafers up all the way around the edge of the bowl.
- **8.** Sprinkle with crumbs, and add dollops of Cool Whip.
