

When Charlie and Debbie Ray retired and moved to the Lake Richland Chambers area, they were anxious to meet people and get involved in their newly adopted community, so they joined Lakeside United Methodist Church. However, Charlie and Debbie did not anticipate that, following a Barn Stompers demo dance at Lakeside, they would become square dancers. 'Lake people are mostly Type A personalities trying to relax and retire," Charlie said, laughingly explaining how they became the current co-presidents of the Barn Stompers.



"When we first started learning how to square dance, there were 10-12 couples from the lake area," said Sharon Largent, another Barn Stomper who lives at the lake. Participation by lake residents has continued to grow. "It's a great way to meet people," Sharon added. Her dance partner is her husband, Lee. Members also include residents of Corsicana, Mexia, Teague and Fairfield. Barn Stompers enjoy traveling to other clubs located in Athens, Palestine, Jacksonville and the Dallas area and hosting them in return.

There are other reasons and benefits to joining this lively group. "It's a wonderful sport," Sharon said. However, a dancer does not have to be completely physically fit or especially talented.

"If you can get up and move, you can square dance," Debbie said. "We have all kinds of health situations — hip and knee replacement, heart conditions and surgical rehabs. You can wear a sign saying such things as 'Do not spin' if you have a health condition." Dancers can take breaks, if needed, and line dancing is offered between "tips" (several square dances), just for a change of pace.


There are no age restrictions. The club has members ranging in age from 12 years old to people in their 90s. Families and single people are welcome. "Families start their little ones early," Debbie said.

"The kids learn fast," Charlie added, "and they are so cute and energetic." But he revealed what he considers four of the best reasons to join Barn Stompers. "You don't have to be graceful. It's inexpensive, only \$6 per person for a dinner and dancing. College scholarships are available for members at the state and local levels. And when the girls sit down, their petticoats fly up!"

Members sometimes wear traditional square-dancing costumes, where the man's shirt color matches the woman's skirt. Women can also wear long prairie skirts, and club members have "club" clothing. "I said I would never wear a short skirt, but...," Sharon revealed. "My granddaughter asks me now, 'Nana, can I have your square dance skirts?' She loves them."

Square dancing is uniquely American, having its roots in New England. The origins of the dances trace back, however, to the schottische, quadrille, jigs, reels and the minuet — dances that were brought to early America by the first settlers and

immigrants who followed. Hardworking pioneers, needing rest and relaxation from their toils, as well as a way to meet neighbors, looked to the barn dance. Over the years, the needs have been kept simple: music, a solid floor and a caller.

No longer just a rural night out, square dancing has evolved with modern times into an urban activity with a Texas organization formed 51 years ago. Barn Stompers is a member of the East Texas Square and Round Dance Association and the Texas Federation of Square and Round Dancers. Members enjoy participating in conventions held by these two organizations annually.

Another way square dancing has evolved with the times is the manner in which people can learn the specialized lingo and calls. There are Internet sites that explain the unique vocabulary and demonstrate calls. Saddlebrookesquares. com, www.tamtwirlers.org/tamination/, and YouTube.com are commonly used sites. Some of the younger members, especially, have been spotted using their smartphone apps even as they are



dancing! "It's pretty cool the ways you can learn now," Debbie said.

Barn Stompers also provides the traditional "learn from your neighbor" lessons. Classes are held on a regular basis with one beginning this January. It is a win-win for potential dancers, since there is no charge for the first three sessions. "People can see if it's something they want to continue to do," Debbie said. For those who love to line dance, they are led by Carolyn Hinchcliffe.



Square dancing lessons start with the basics and "angel" members of the club make up half of each circle to help neophytes. "Having angels gives new folks a lot more confidence. We have a lot of great angels," Sharon said. "When the call comes, if you don't immediately see it in your head, someone will help you." The basic and mainstream call indices







include 70 calls, while the plus call index includes another 30 calls. If the square breaks down completely, the caller will notice and straighten everybody out with the next call. "Plus lessons," which are more advanced, are available to members who wish to try the more complicated calls. "The goal is to get back 'home' with your partner. When you do, it's, 'Yea!" Sharon exclaimed.

Callers have danced for a while, and can get advanced training in college-level programs, such as the one located in Hot Springs, Arkansas, where the Barn Stompers caller, Kenneth Melvin, formally trained. Occasionally, members enjoy guest callers and, of course, callers from other clubs when visits are made.

It was a caller, Billy Lewis from Barry, who helped start the Barn Stompers in 1973 by teaching the first lessons to a group of 36 local residents. Billy owns a dance hall in Silver City. "It has a lot of history," Charlie said. Star Hall, in Corsicana, is an occasional host to the Camping Squares, another group to which some Barn Stompers belong.

While live callers are mainly used, square dancing clubs can also use music and callers that are recorded on CDs. This enables clubs to do demo dances at schools, senior citizen centers, churches, assisted living and nursing homes and special events, such as festivals. "We welcome invitations to dance," Debbie said.

Barn Stompers' dances are held on the second and fourth Saturday evenings each month. Members share a pot luck dinner which fuels them for both the square and line dancing. True hospitality abounds. Visitors are welcome to eat or just watch and/or try dancing. Debbie added, "We have great cooks. We love people and love to share our passion for dancing." NOW





At Home With Michael and Judith Steely

Michael Steely, a Corsicana High School graduate and native son, remembers his days of growing up in Corsicana. "I know Corsicana well," he said. He can easily identify with the statement a longtime friend once made, "I've known people so long, I can't remember meeting them." Michael, a fifth-generation Corsicana resident, is friends with people he's known all his life.






Little did Michael know during his early years that his yet to be chosen career would take him to several different countries, and he would meet and marry Judith, a native of Manchester, England. Their marriage and many of their home's furnishings have lasted for 41 years through many moves, two children and a granddaughter. "Getting married once was enough," Michael said laughingly.

"And they said it wouldn't last!" Judith quickly added.

Following high school graduation, Michael attended Navarro College and later accepted a position with Methodist Hospital in Dallas. Meanwhile, across the Atlantic Ocean, Judith was packing









her bags for a nursing position in Biafra, Africa, when fate stepped in, and she decided to come to Dallas to accept a position at Methodist Hospital. And as the saying goes, "The rest was history." Judith worked as a nurse at Methodist for four years before the couple relocated to England in 1975. When they returned to Dallas, she worked at Parkland Hospital for the next 13 years.

During that time, the couple's daughters, Sarah and Jessica, were born and Michael's parents, who were still



living in Corsicana, passed away. In 1987, the family moved to England so the kids could be near Judith's parents. The couple continued their work in hospital and health care management, and Michael, who had graduated from Dallas Baptist University, went to law school in England.

In 1999, Judith was recruited to work as a quality manager for the government of the United Arab Emirates. So once again the family packed and moved — this time to Abu Dhabi, the capital and second largest city in that country.

Judith's position entailed implementing a quality framework and mentoring Emirati students who had studied abroad and returned home to work in the new, modern hospitals that were quickly being established.

During the six years the family resided in Abu Dhabi, Michael worked as a consultant with the premier hospital as they developed primary care clinics, and he taught English as a Second Language. Sarah and Jessica pursued their education, traveled and worked summers in a veterinarian clinic.

As empty nesters and parents of college girls, Michael and Judith returned to Corsicana, but travels to foreign postings still called. After only six months in Corsicana, they went to Singapore as hospital consultants.

On return to Corsicana in 2007, Judith worked for an area hospice. Today, she owns her own company: Home Staging By Judith. Michael is using his legal knowledge by doing title research for an Austin law firm. They were charter board members of the Corsicana Preservation Foundation. Judith serves on the Corsicana Parks and Recreation Commission, and Michael serves on the Animal Services Board.

Grandparenthood demands this couple travels abroad, since Sarah and her husband, Mark, gave birth to Ivy Elizabeth last year in England, where they reside. Sarah followed her parents into health care as a doctor. The couple enjoys Skyping to keep up with Ivy's days when they can't be in England holding her. The trips also allow Judith, a cancer survivor and British citizen, to continue her checkups with her doctors.

Jessica inherited Michael's interest in law and graduated from law school in England. She now lives and works in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Michael and Judith enjoy visits with Jessica and her Boxer, Kheya.

Their home, the second house the couple has owned in Corsicana, was built in 1970 by a man who wished to entice his wife to return to Corsicana. "She loved her house in Midland, Texas, so much, he promised if she would move, he would build the exact same house for her here, and he did," Michael explained.

The wide, tree-lined street, redbrick exterior and circular drive work together to give a very proper British background to the many furnishings Judith enjoys staging in their home. "The home had great fittings," Judith said. "Everything has been painted and refinished from the floor up, and the kitchen has been completely refurbished."

The living room, painted in a soft blue, is home to a plate collection, sideboards and Judith's mother's table, which was bought for her wedding in 1941. Judith's mother got into trouble with her father, because she bought it cash-on-delivery, instead of paying for the item upon purchase. The gold-framed mirror over the fireplace reflects pieces the couple has owned a long time. "They have been on the high seas a lot over the years and through many moves," Judith stated.

Other family keepsakes include china and figurines, watercolors, family Bibles and prayer books and, of course, a tea set. "We are very much into keeping and preserving things. Someone in the family will want them," Judith said.

The living room flows into the dining room, which overlooks the yard. The kitchen countertops are granite, and Judith designed a movable kitchen island, which is a focal point in the room. She used the original cabinets and scrubbed the original handles personally. An art corner features Sarah and Jessica's childhood creations and a little tea pot reminiscent of "The Teapot Song" the kids loved.

From the den, multiple picture windows afford a full view of the backyard complete with fig and pomegranate trees. "We love the gardens and watching the birds and squirrels," Michael said. The den features a full, lighted bar and comfortable seating for entertainment, and a photo of their smiling daughters graces a sofa table.

Two bedrooms and a master bedroom and bath are accessed from a hallway with enviable storage. One bedroom contains a cedar chest with packets of treasures for both daughters, and the other bedroom is being readied for Ivy's first visit — complete with Ivy's closet of clothes and toys. Among the art they have collected from many countries, are Judith's favorites — two drawings by Joy Adamson, author of the book Born Free.

Corsicana welcomed Judith. "People in Corsicana know you, and when the chips are down, they will support you," Judith said. With windows still opened onto the world, Judith and Michael are very much at home here in Corsicana. NOW










Be realistic.






Monitor your progress.





lost," Breanna said.

Not that there are many losses. In their 2012 season, the Kerens Lady Cats volleyball team went 19-13, and they were Bi-District Champs. In 2013, after an impressive 27-6 record, they were Area Champs. The 2012-13 Lady Cats basketball team had a 26-6 record.

The girls' individual honors are numerous. Leaders on both teams, Marqueshia and Breanna both made the varsity teams every year, starting with their respective freshman years. Marqueshia, who blocks and hits, and Breanna, a middle blocker who plays all around the court, were named to the 2012 First Team All-District 14-1A Volleyball Team, and they both played in the post position in Austin at the state basketball tournament. Breanna was named the Golden Circle 2013 Basketball Co-Offensive Player of the Year for area high schools and 2013 Co-MVP and All State volleyball player. Marqueshia was named Blocker of the Year in 2013 for volleyball. The girls have repeatedly earned most valuable player honors in both sports. "They are so mobile. They can do almost anything. They are threepoint champions," Coach Lincoln said.

Breanna, who plays on the Golden Circle Elite AAU team in Corsicana, has been described as the "go-to girl" on the team. Marqueshia also trains during the summer in an AAU league in the

Both girls excelled in track last year, as they represented Kerens and the Class 1A-Division I on the Kerens 800-meter relay team at the 2013 UIL State Track & Field Meet. Breanna also competed in the high jump at the same meet, and she plays on the Lady Cats softball team.

"You have to go spiritual to understand it," Marqueshia explained. Marqueshia, active in her church where she plays drums, follows her favorite Bible verse: "For we walk by faith, not by sight" (II Corinthians 5:7). The team prays before every game and at meals, while holding hands around the table.

With their competitive spirit, it would be easy for these two teenagers to envy one another, but such is not the case. "They have never been jealous of each other," Coach Lincoln said.

"Marqueshia and Breanna swap honors. They are both so good and so alike. When we had senior night for the volleyball team, Breanna asked to speak about Marqueshia. Her speech gave me chills," Coach Lynch remembered.

The girls' friendship began when Breanna joined the varsity volleyball team as a freshman. "I was nervous, but Marqueshia came over to me wanting to partner and helped me so much," Breanna said. "From day one, as a freshman, the coaches said, 'We are a family."

Coach Lynch and Coach Lincoln are also close friends. "In a lot of schools, there's an attitude of, 'It's my sport, her



sport," Coach Lynch explained. "Here at Kerens, coaches go to every game." When Coach Lincoln had to undergo knee surgery recently, she was still on time at the next volleyball game, crutches and all, ready to keep the stats book. Just as in the saying, "When momma isn't happy, nobody is happy," Marqueshia noted, "our coaches can't have troubles [with each other], because we look up to them."

The boys' coaches deserve a lot of the credit for the successes the girls' teams have achieved. "We play against the men coaches," Coach Lincoln said. "We all share well and help each other."

Breanna added, "Coach Priddy and Coach Kinney hit hard. We couldn't have gone this far into the season without their help."

This foursome can laugh over their superstitions. For instance, Breanna always leads off during warm-ups, with Marqueshia guarding the rear. Breanna loves to listen to certain songs before play. "The team wants me to wear the same thing and have curly hair as I did during a winning streak," Coach Lynch revealed.

While the successes and participation at the state level are to be celebrated and remembered as high notes over lifetimes, losses and injuries are a part of Marqueshia and Breanna's sports careers. The girls have suffered their share of concussions, sprained ankles and aching muscles. "It's hard to come back to practice after a loss," Breanna said. The 95-90 loss to Slocum in the 2012-13 basketball Region III-1A quarterfinal game was especially hard. That loss, one that went into double overtime, cost the Lady Cats a repeat

trip to Austin. "I mentally overcame that loss by telling myself to play and practice harder," Breanna said. Life skills are taught and learned at this level of competition — cooperation, friendship, how to handle a loss and how to celebrate victories. "Athletics teaches them that life is not fair," Coach Lincoln said. "As 17- or 18-year-olds, some of these lessons really are hard."

But support is available. "People here are really nice and family oriented. Everyone is for you," Marqueshia said. Both girls count their families as their biggest fans. "My family instilled in me to do well," Marqueshia said. Breanna's dad requests the gym to be open so that Breanna gets in extra practice time.

The girls, however, do spend time in other pursuits. Marqueshia helps at her aunt's day care and at her church. Breanna, who has been named to the academic honor roll several times, helps her dad and fills her days with cheerleading, student council, Beta Club, Spanish Club and Fellowship of Christian Athletes. "I never get to sit down and eat in the cafeteria. I always have a meeting to go to," Breanna said.

Scholarship offers are coming the girls' ways. Marqueshia wants to study fashion designing in college, and Breanna is dreaming of playing basketball at a Division I university in the future. No matter what their futures hold, the girls will take with them the life lessons learned from their coaches. Marqueshia, who will graduate this spring to go forth to another level of playing, reflected, "School and Kerens are part of my family now, too."



A friendly smile and enthusiastic greeting is what Corsicana and area residents, as well as the many travelers passing through Corsicana on 7th Street, can expect when entering the Valero and Shell convenience stores located a few blocks from each other. "We don't treat you as a customer. We treat you as a friend by getting to know you by your first name," said Chris Mazrooee, one of the "sons" of ESM & Sons.

Owning the convenience stores was a dream of Chris' father, Essi Mazrooee, a mechanic who owns a car repair shop in Dallas. "Everyone in the family worked in the shop," Chris remembered. Essi began to diversify by purchasing the stores in Corsicana. Chris oversees the stores, while two of his brothers

fill positions of president and CFO, and a third brother fills in wherever needed.

The stores provide standard convenience store items — gasoline, groceries, lottery tickets, snacks, ice and propane. But, that's where the industry standard stops and great customer service begins. Chris believes in going the extra mile. "I don't treat this as a job. I treat it as a hobby, something I enjoy doing day in and day out. We have to be different from other convenience stores and that difference is our customer service," Chris said.

Total quality is also important to Chris and his family. "I am not here to save money by not offering full service, safety and quality products," Chris stated. "We don't cut corners." He cited just one example — all coolers are kept at the lowest temperature possible. "This practice doesn't save us money, but it does insure each customer that his or her drink will be chilled and the food will be safe." Chris said.

The stores are members of Better Business Bureau and Independent Buyers' Coop. Additionally, the state of Texas and the city inspect all aspects of the business regularly as required by law.

Chris and his wife, Sandra, are parents of toddler daughter, Vida, and are expecting another child. "Vida is like her name — full of life," he said proudly. With his parents living only a few houses away, the couple has built-in babysitters.

"Our customers are the best. They make all the difference in the world," Chris said. This multilingual manager, with degrees in electrical engineering and computer science, enjoys serving people well in every way.

Tiramisu Toffee Trifle Pie

- 1 1/2 Tbsp. instant coffee granules 3/4 cup warm water
- 1 10.75-oz. frozen pound cake
- 1 8-oz. pkg. mascarpone or cream cheese, softened
- 1/2 cup powdered sugar
- 1/2 cup chocolate syrup
- 1 12-oz. container frozen whipped topping, thawed (divided use)
- 2 1.4-oz. English toffee candy bars, coarsely chopped
- 1. Stir together coffee granules and water until granules are dissolved; cool. Cut cake into 14 slices; cut each slice in half diagonally.
- 2. Place cake triangles in bottom and up sides of a 9-inch, deep-dish pie plate.
- 3. Drizzle coffee mixture evenly over cake.
- 4. Beat cheese, sugar and chocolate syrup on medium with electric mixer until smooth.

- **5.** Add 2 1/2 cups whipped topping; beat until light and fluffy.
- **6.** Spread cheese mixture evenly over cake.
- **7.** Dollop remaining whipped topping around edges of pie.
- **8.** Sprinkle with candy; chill 8 hours.

Sausage and Egg Brunch Bake

- 2 cups herb croutons
- 1 lb. bulk sausage, cooked and drained
- 4 eggs, lightly beaten
- 2 1/2 cups milk
- 1 tsp. dry mustard
- 1 1/2 cups cheddar cheese, shredded
- 1 10 3/4-oz. can cream of mushroom
- 1. Line bottom of greased 9x13-inch glass baking dish with croutons; cover with sausage.
- 2. Combine remaining ingredients; pour over sausage. Run knife crosswise through

mixture to create marbled effect.

- **3.** Cover; refrigerate overnight.
- 4. Preheat oven to 325 F; bake uncovered for 1 hour and 15 minutes, until firm in center and browned.
- 5. Let stand 5 minutes before cutting into squares.

Peanut Butter and Jelly Pizza

Pizza dough Creamy peanut butter, to taste Grape or strawberry jelly, to taste

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 F; bake pizza dough until brown.
- 2. Cool dough; add peanut butter, leaving about an inch uncovered around the outside
- 3. Bake pizza until peanut butter is hot; add jelly and serve.

Tammy's Famous Chicken Enchiladas

- 1 Tbsp. butter
- I medium onion, chopped
- 4 cups cooked chicken, chopped
- 1 8-oz. pkg. cream cheese, softened
- 1 4.5-oz. can chopped green chilies, drained

Salt, paprika and pepper, to taste 8 8-inch flour tortillas

- 2 cups whipping cream, not whipped 16 oz. Monterey Jack cheese, shredded
- I. Preheat oven to 350 F.
- 2. Melt butter: sauté onion.
- 3. In a bowl, combine chicken, cream cheese, onion, green chilies and seasonings.
- **4.** Spoon 2-3 Tbsp. chicken mixture onto each tortilla: roll tortillas.
- 5. Place rolled tortillas into 9x13-inch baking
- **6.** Pour whipping cream over tortillas; sprinkle with cheese and bake for 45
