collegiate or alumnae. A grade point average of 2.7 must be (or have been) maintained for those graduates who are accepted. Community service is an absolute must, as is recommendation by a member. Initiation fees and dues to both the local and national chapters are required. "The women are expected to learn the history of each of the 22 founders — their backgrounds and goals. They also commit to memory each of the national presidents and their initiatives and programs. Each local and regional chapter member learns the history of the local directors," Sharon stated. "It's a rather erudite discipline, but you can ask any Delta, and they can tell you everything about our history."

"We're all very proud and honored



to be Deltas," added Dr. Thalia Matherson, whose doctorate is in education administration. "In high school, I considered becoming an interior decorator, but I got my teacher's certification, majoring in English and French from Huston-Tillotson College [now Huston-Tillotson University] and, later, a Master of Liberal Arts from SMU. I loved teaching school and being a principal during my 34 years with the Dallas ISD." Though diminutive in stature, Dr. Matherson apparently never thought twice about taking on maledominated fields — women were gaining recognition. After all, Deltas had cut their teeth on women's suffrage. Delta Sigma Theta was the only African-American women's organization that marched in the 1913 parade on Pennsylvania Avenue.

Dr. Matherson taught junior high and high school, took the required year off while pregnant, returned to integrate an all-white middle school, became assistant principal, then principal and moved to the administrative offices, before retiring in 1998. She applied for an executive director position with the South Central Jurisdiction of the UMC, a position previously held only by white male clergy. She was hired and held that job for six-and-a-half years before moving into real estate and multiple volunteer positions. "Yes, I volunteer — even more so in retirement," she noted. "But I've been a Delta since college. All the women I admired were Deltas, and the requisite academic emphasis sparked my desire to meet and maintain that mark."



Sharon graduated from Lufkin High School and, later, from Stephen F. Austin State University with a degree in elementary education and special education. "I wanted to be a math teacher," she admitted. She volunteered at the state school in Lufkin. When she moved to Dallas, she completed her master's in special education, with a diagnostician certification and principal's certification at Texas A&M University-Commerce. "My first job was helping kids with drug problems through the Catholic Charities. Teachers would go into the facilities where the teens lived to teach core academics. Later, I taught special education in a middle school in the Dallas ISD. I spent five to six years with emotionally disturbed children whose behavior was out of control — that really affects their ability to learn."

Sharon has spent the last six years of her 24 years of teaching as special services supervisor for the hospital/ homebound program of the Dallas ISD for children in Dallas hospitals, Timberlawn, Hickory Trail and the juvenile division of Lew Sterrett Justice Center. Sharon especially enjoys working in the Delta programs for children. "Our program for both boys and girls ages 2-8 is called Gems and Jewels. The group is comprised of children or grandchildren of Deltas," Sharon explained. "We like introducing them to the idea of community service at a young age. They do things like provide socks and scarves for people in nursing homes, and they plant vegetable and flower gardens." The Delta Academy is made up of girls ages 9-14. "We are mentoring at this age with the goal of teaching them to help each other."

Delta G.E.M.S. (Growing and Empowering Myself Successfully) are young women, ages 15-18. They are involved with service projects, salons, social action and serving as deputy voter registrars. "We work closely with the League of Women Voters, and we want our young women to carry on the vision and heritage of women's suffrage," Sharon remarked.

Bertha, who was born and spent most of her childhood in Georgia where her father was a sharecropper, graduated from high school in Canton,





Army veterans Tommy Brock and Jerry Hall will never forget returning to America from the Vietnam War and the negative public opinion returning soldiers faced at that time. With increased threats of protests at the funeral services of fallen soldiers following September 11, 2001, they both promised they would not let that happen again. Both joined Patriot Guard Riders, a nonprofit organization which ensures dignity and respect at memorial services honoring fallen military heroes, first responders and honorably discharged veterans. "Coming home from Vietnam was difficult on soldiers," Jerry said.

Jerry joined PGR shortly after the organization formed. He and his wife, Janice, began traveling to funerals whenever their work schedules allowed. Many of the funerals were local, but the Halls would travel as far as Austin sometimes to escort a fallen soldier. "At first I had a smaller motorcycle, but it wasn't keeping up with all of




our traveling," Jerry said. "I ended up buying a trike to keep up with the other riders. Janice rides with me to most of the funerals."

Tommy had just retired when he learned about PGR in 2011. He was at a bike shop talking to a guy about finding something to do with all of his newfound time. The guy happened to be a member of PGR and invited him to come along.



His 14-year-old granddaughter rides with him whenever she can. "Joining the PGR just felt like the right thing to do," Tommy said. "We are there to pay our respects, and I wish I could go to all of them. In the beginning, I was told to set a radius and stick with it. If not, I'd be at funerals all day."

Riders must be invited by the family of the deceased in order to attend. What began as a way to protect the grieving



from protestors now serves more as a gesture of support and respect. Some funerals have as many as 200 riders show up to escort. "We are not there to remind people of what it means to make a sacrifice to this country," Jerry said. "We are there to show the families of our brother or sister in arms that they have our support."

When a soldier is killed in action, PGR is with the family from the time the plane lands until he or she is laid to rest in the cemetery. After the soldier is escorted off the tarmac, PGR then travels to the funeral home, returns for the visitation,



escorts the soldier to the funeral and finally to the cemetery. "I remember the first time we went to the airport to bring a soldier home," Janice said. "If you have never been a part of that, I recommend it. Showing the family we

respect the soldier's sacrifice is one of the many things we can all do. It is the most emotional thing, and one that will change your life."

What began with the American Legion Riders chapter 136 from Kansas stepping in to stop a funeral protest in 2005 has turned into something larger than anyone could imagine. From the placards on their bikes and cars to the large flags adorning their bikes, PGR members are recognized by the community even when they're not attending funerals, but it took a while for this to be the case. "Often when I'm filling up my bike at the gas station, I will have someone come up to me and thank me for what I'm doing," Tommy said. "It still surprises me when someone recognizes I am with the PGR."


Thousands of riders, young and old, now ride and spread the word about their efforts. Not all riders are veterans, but all are brought together by their love of country. With hundreds of services happening each day across the country, PGR needs more and more volunteers. "We're looking for more people to join us all the time," Jerry admitted. "Even if you can't ride a bike, there is a place for you."





volunteers takes a serious and respectful tone. Riders do not "hoop and holler" down the highways. They are reverent and silent. Their attitude says it all for 51 weeks out of the year. However, one week a year, PGR members drop everything to help the children of fallen soldiers at the Snowball Express. The mission of Snowball Express is to bring together for one week children from all over the world who have lost parents in the military. American Airlines flies the children in on special planes. They stay in a hotel and have a week filled with fun events. One of the things the children remember each year is PGR with their vests and bikes. Many remember them from a parent's funeral, and this is a way for them to reconnect.

"We live for this week each year," Janice said. "What we do on a day-to-day basis for PGR can be heartbreaking, but seeing these kids light up each December makes those hard times worth it. One year, Jerry Jones let the Snowball Express use Cowboy stadium. Activities were planned for all of the children, and PGR was allowed to ride onto the track around the field as a surprise for the kids. They all loved it!"

The impact PGR has made on the families of fallen soldiers is great. Children of fallen soldiers remember the day members of PGR were there with their big bikes and flags. Both Jerry and Tommy know there will always be a need for them at PGR, and they plan to ride until they no longer can. "I can't imagine not having joined the PGR now," Tommy said. "I would do this all day every day if I could." NOW









Keeping Your Financial Resolutions

Each January, many of us start the New Year off with New Year's resolutions such as losing weight, eating healthier, exercising or saving money for retirement. While I can't offer advice on the first three resolutions, I can suggest an easy way to save money. Consider an Individual Retirement Account (IRA).

An Individual Retirement Account allows you to put money away for you retirement either tax free or tax deferred. There are two types of IRAs: an Individual IRA or a Roth IRA. For both the Roth IRA and Individual IRA, you can contribute up to \$5,500 if you are under age 50 and \$6,500 if you are age 50 or older. However, the Roth IRA is subject to income limits.

How does a Traditional IRA work? If you contribute to a Traditional IRA your contributions are tax deductible. That is, if you contribute \$1,000 and you are in the 25 percent tax bracket, you can reduce your taxes by \$250. You can invest your money in many types of investments: stocks, bonds, mutual funds and annuities. As your investments grow, taxes on the growth will be deferred until you withdraw

them. You can withdraw your money any time, but if you do so before age 59 1/2, you will have to pay taxes and a 10-percent penalty. When you become 70 1/2, you must begin withdraws from your Traditional IRA.

How does a Roth IRA work? Contributions into a Roth IRA are not tax deductible. Therefore, a \$1,000 contribution will not lower your taxes. Like the Traditional IRA, you have many investment choices. While you do not get the initial tax break from the Roth IRA that you get from the Traditional IRA, the Roth IRA grows tax free. Like the Traditional IRA, you can withdraw your money any time, but doing so before age 59 1/2 may result in taxes and a 10-percent penalty.

Setting up an IRA and funding it is easy to do. And it will be one less resolution you have to worry about keeping.

Meatloaf

- 1 1/2 lbs. ground meat
- 1 Tbsp. each onion and garlic powder
- 1 1/2 Tbsp. Slap Ya Mama seasoning, or to taste
- 4 eggs
- I large onion, chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- I cup whole oats
- 3/4 cup barbecue sauce (any dark variety)
- 1/4 cup Italian bread crumbs
- **I.** Preheat oven to 350 F.
- 2. In a large bowl, mix meat, seasonings and eggs. Add vegetables, oats and barbecue sauce. Form into a loaf; place in large pot/ pan. Sprinkle with bread crumbs.
- **3.** Bake, uncovered, for $1 \frac{1}{2}$ to 2 hours.

Jalapeño Cornbread

1 1/2 lbs. ground meat

I large onion, chopped

Salt, to taste

1 Tbsp. thyme

I box Jiffy combread mix

 $1 \, 1/2$ Tbsp. each salt and baking soda

1/2 cup oil

3 eggs

1 can creamed corn

 $1 \, 1/2$ cups milk

16 slices jalapeño peppers

1 lb. sharp cheddar cheese, grated

- **I.** Preheat oven to 475 F.
- 2. Brown ground meat; add onions, salt and thyme; cook until onions are translucent. Drain off grease; set mixture aside.
- 3. In a large bowl, mix remaining ingredients,

except jalapeños and cheese, until well-blended.

- **4.** Spread just enough cornbread mixture to cover bottom of greased 9x13-inch pan. Cover with ground meat mixture; top with jalapeños and cheese. Cover with remaining cornbread mixture.
- **5.** Bake for 25 minutes. Serve with green

Shrimp Creole

- 4 green onions, chopped
- 3 cloves garlic (or 1 rounded Tbsp. jarred garlic)
- I small bell pepper, finely chopped
- I stalk celery, finely chopped
- 1/3 cup fresh parsley (or 1/8 cup dried)
- 1 15-oz. can tomato sauce with onions
- I small can tomato paste
- 2 lbs. shrimp, peeled and deveined
- 1 1/2 tsp. Tony Chachere's **Creole Seasoning**
- 2 Tbsp. sugar
- 2 Tbsp. butter
- 2 cups water
- 1. In a large skillet, cook vegetables in small amount of oil for about 10 minutes. Add tomato sauce and paste; mix well. Cook on low for about 10 minutes.
- 2. Add shrimp, Tony Chachere's Creole Seasoning, sugar and butter. Stir well. Add water; simmer for 20 minutes. Serve over rice.

Cream Cheese Pound Cake

- 2 sticks butter, softened
- 1 stick margarine, softened
- 8 oz. cream cheese, softened
- 3 cups sugar
- 1 tsp. vanilla (optional)
- 6 eggs
- 3 cups flour, sifted
- 1. Cream together butter, margarine, cream cheese, sugar and vanilla. Add eggs, one at a time. Add flour: mix well.
- 2. Pour into greased and floured tube pan. Bake at 325 F for 1 hour. Cool for 10 minutes. Invert on rack; remove pan; cool completely.
