Brian Caudell has found his niche in theater and acting, and he loves sharing it with others. "The biggest passion I have is theater," he said. "It's what I've done year after year."

Brian has lived in the Red Oak area for 11 years and graduated from Ferris High School three years ago. During the day, Brian can be found remodeling homes, but most of his free time is spent working with Waxahachie Community Theatre participating in plays and musical productions for Ellis County.

At age 14, Brian began acting through an individual program before beginning to work with his personal acting coach, Darla Bicknell. His first push into the world of theater came from his parents. "My parents have always told me I'm dramatic. One day, they said, 'Go try this,' and I did and loved it. I couldn't get away from it," Brian confessed.

As Brian begins his fourth year working with WCT, he looks forward to becoming even more involved with the productions. "I help with any show I can. When I'm not on stage, I end up doing a lot of the tech work and stuff like that," he explained. "It's been a lot of fun."

Brian recently finished a run as the male lead in the production of the famous Broadway musical, *Gnys and Dolls*. "My favorite role, so far, has been Sky Masterson, and it has probably been my most challenging," Brian explained. "It's the one that stretched me the most." However, Brian is not just an actor or singer. He has also directed a show, served as an assistant director for several shows and does technical work for almost every production. "The way I was taught growing up with this whole acting thing is if you don't know every part of drama, you're not an actor," Brian said. "I thoroughly love every part of it."

The adrenaline rush of being on stage is one of Brian's favorite parts of acting. The wonderful feeling of making someone laugh is another special part of acting for him. "Hearing laughter is beyond compare to anything you could ever ask for," he said. He compares the feeling he gets when he hears laughter

to the rush of being at the summit of a roller coaster when you begin to descend. For Brian, the ability to bring joy to others is what makes all his hard work worthwhile.

According to Brian, community theater is important to the actors and the audience alike. "First and foremost, for the actors, it is our escape from our life outside. It gives us something to do. It keeps us busy," he said. "But the second part is the escape it gives the audience. A lot of frustrations take place during the day. I can't speak for everybody, but in my mind, one of the most influential things that can happen in your life is the ability to take a breather and just laugh, cry or pay attention to something else, and put your focus off of the daily routine. I think that's how theater benefits the community."

Brian seeks to inspire not only audience members who see him act but other actors as well. "I'm also a personal acting coach and vocal trainer. I've seen a lot of people come and go who think they're just not good enough," Brian said. "It's not about how good you really are at the beginning. I mean, it matters more as you progressively get into it, but when you're first starting, no one expects you to be perfect." Brian understands many people fear speaking in front of crowds and insists working with a theater group promotes personal confidence in all aspects of life - from a professional interaction with a boss to a personal conversation with a friend. Brian believes in the positive effects of theater, and that it is a cause which should be supported.

There are many ways citizens in Ellis County and the surrounding areas can support community theater. "Come see a show," Brian said. Ticket sales are important for the theater to have a budget to continue putting on productions. Each of their major shows see several hundred in attendance, but Brian hopes ticket sales and show attendance will continue to grow in the coming years. "The most important thing is to come see the show," he explained, "because we don't really have a show without an audience."

The 2013 season, so far, has included the play *Taffeta Memories*, the musical *Guys* and Dolls, the children's showcase show *The Mysterious Case of the Missing Ring* and



Rodgers and Hammerstein's *Cinderella*. The Christmas show will be *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever*.

Another way the community can support its actors is by recognizing their effort and hard work. "One thing that sticks out in my mind is when I would walk through Wal-Mart and people would stop me and say, 'I saw you in that show. Can I have your autograph?' Just letting us know, as actors, that you recognize us and you see us —that gives us the courage to get into another show," Brian admitted.

Theater brings culture and creativity to a community in a way that many activities aren't able to do. WCT has been putting on productions for 34 years and, with the support of the community, will continue to do so. Brian encourages aspiring actors and singers to take a risk and believe in themselves. He also emphasizes the importance of personal courage. "There's one line that comes to mind, from the movie We Bought a Zoo," Brian said. "It's stuck with me ever since it came out." The quote from the 2011 movie directed by Cameron Crowe and starring Matt Damon is: "Sometimes all you need is 20 seconds of insane courage. Just literally 20 seconds of just embarrassing bravery. And I promise you, something great will come of it."

"All you need is 20 seconds of courage to change your life," Brian reiterated. "It's beyond true. I'm living proof. If you're an aspiring actor or singer, take a risk. The only risk you'll ever regret is the one you don't take." **NOW**



"Beauty is really such a minor part of pageants. On a 100-percent judging scale, it can be as little as 10 percent," Haley explained. "Tve discovered pageants are really looking at who you are overall — your poise, personality, platform. And they're as much about teaching the contestants to succeed as anything else."

After the first pageant, Haley's mom, Stephanie, decided to enter her daughter in All Star Kids, a national pageant that consisted of a weekend of kid-friendly activities."There was an interview and talent competition, but it was really about the kids just having fun." Up against 53 contestants in her division, Haley won the overall title and \$2,500 in what was only her second pageant. "I've always been outgoing and ready to try anything, so I just went to experience it," Haley said.

After competing in various pageants, Haley decided to be a Lone Star Princess for the Miss America organization, a group that promotes self-confidence, not competition. together eight days in a hotel with no phone or computer really made us all focus on our activities and rehearsals. I made wonderful friendships," Haley said.

With multiple categories including private interview, lifestyle/fitness, talent and evening gown, Haley competed all week. She earned \$600 in scholarship money by winning the Alpha (first-year) and overall fitness in her group, and placed Top 20 in the pageant. "I really wanted that fitness award. I worked out constantly!" she stated.

Haley also felt strongly about her platform — helping those less fortunate. "It's something you can do in so many different ways, at any age. I'd volunteered for North Ellis County Outreach and saw the difference they make," she said.

Breast cancer research is another issue Haley considered championing. "My mom survived breast cancer and taught me to treasure every day. It is obviously such an important cause, but I thought it would be too emotional for me to talk about it effectively," Haley said.

Turning 18 in September, Haley grew up in Red Oak and attended local schools since kindergarten. She graduates in 2014 in the top 8 percent of her class. Her dedication to schoolwork stems from Stephanie, a retired school teacher, and Walt, a very hardworking dad.

"He always stresses that no matter what I am doing, to do it the best that I can — to reach for your highest potential in everything," Haley explained.

As a result, Haley first showed

determination by enrolling in ice skating classes at age 6 and joining ISI Skating Institute, which quickly consumed her weekends. She competed for years, ultimately winning a World ISI Ice Skating competition when she was just 12 years old and taking second place in her division.

"I loved ice skating, but it got to the point where it was either continue ice skating or choose to have a social life and other hobbies. I quit ice skating in seventh grade, because I had started noticing the cheerleaders in middle school and decided I wanted to give that a try," Haley said.



Haley trained in tumbling with a National Cheerleading Association coach before trying out for the eighthgrade team. Then, as a freshman, she made team captain. "It was challenging transitioning from elegant, smooth skating moves to sharp, firm cheer motions," Haley stated.

In her last year as a varsity cheerleader, Haley believes she made the best choice by leaving skating to cheer. Today, some of her other hobbies include: traveling, fishing and hunting with her dad, watching football and shopping. She has also enjoyed her sporadic but successful pageant career, and looks forward to fulfilling her Miss Twin Rivers Outstanding Teen obligations through January 2014.

co-workers and neighbors. Even when it isn't Christmastime, Darrell and Sharon are known for throwing a good bash when called upon. They even hosted their daughter's wedding reception in their backyard. The backyard is full of amenities for party hosting, from the pond with a waterfall to the covered patio that holds an outdoor cooking kitchen and seating area. "We have hosted a couple of surprise parties out here," Sharon admitted. "And there were lots of people at our daughter's wedding reception. Lucky for us we have nice neighbors who don't mind people parking on their property."

Darrell and Sharon came to Ovilla from Arlington. They had lived five houses down the street from each other but did not know it until they met at their part-time jobs in high school at Rangers Ballpark in Arlington. Sharon sold gifts and souvenirs, and Darrell worked on the ground crew. He didn't believe she lived on the same street until he did some investigating, and they have been together ever since. Both wanted a house in the country and chose Ovilla. "Twenty-five years ago this was still the country," Darrell said. "It's grown up around us."

When Jennifer was a child, Darrell built her a dollhouse. Strangely enough, the house he designed for the family looked just like the dollhouse. This spring, Baylor Health Care System broke ground on the 299,000-square-foot Baylor Medical Center at Waxahachie, on 52 acres at the intersection of I-35E and Highway 287, as leaders recognized rapid growth in the area and a need for expanded patient services. The new hospital is being built according to Leadership in Energy & Environmental Design standards, allowing Baylor to be even better stewards of the environment. It is initially designed to accommodate 129 beds upon opening in November 2014, with plans for future expansion.

"We want the new space to be flexible and efficient, so we can continue to use it effectively for many years," said Jay Fox, president of Baylor Medical Center at Waxahachie.

Baylor Medical Center at Waxahachie dates back to 1914, with the

opening of Waxahachie Sanitarium. In 1965, it was renamed W.C. Tenery Hospital, and for another 18 years it was an independent entity, until joining Baylor Health Care System in 1983.

Last year, more than 39,000 patients were seen in its emergency department. In 2009, it became the first hospital in Baylor Health Care System to use robotic telemedicine to provide advanced pulmonary and critical care services. With that innovative spirit toward advances in medicine, the new campus will house Baylor Charles A. Sammons Cancer Center, allowing patients to receive cancer treatment close to home. Additionally, the increased space will accommodate Women's Services, including Labor and Delivery.





Chocolate Gravy

 cup sugar
