

As volunteers for the Habitat for Humanity Festival of Trees, their brainstorming begins soon after the two-day event comes to a close. "Her little girl kept telling her to up her bid. It was a great deal for both of them." The mom, who had little time to decorate, took a completely decorated tree home, as well as a daughter who had a smile on her face.

The second year, John and Diane once again used Beanie Babies, but concentrated on 35-40 of the many birds in Diane's collection. They also added wooden birdhouses, themed ornaments and more twinkling lights. The "Beanie Bird Tree" was placed in one of the large picture windows at the event's venue, Waxahachie Bible Church.


Just last month, they delivered their donated creations to the church. This year's themed trees were Beanie Bears with an addition — plush, adorable teddy bears. Several small Beanies and teddies were placed strategically on a small tabletop tree, perfect as a dining room centerpiece or a focal point on the living room mantel. Many individuals take part in the Festival of Trees, creating one-of-a-kind ornaments, wall decorations, wreathes







and trees of all shapes and sizes, some traditional and so many others full of eclectic whimsy. "People love getting involved when it's for such a good cause," Diane said. Children enjoyed activities throughout the day on Saturday. They shared cookies with Mrs. Claus, and had their photos taken with Santa. Wood crafts, story time and laughter made for some great holiday memories.

Cheree Barrett is a proud mother and wife of men who have served in the U.S. military. Her husband, Rick, who served as a Navy Seabee, is a secondgeneration veteran. Rick and Cheree's son, James, served as an Army sergeant and was honorably discharged in 2013. Cheree serves in her own way as president of the Bluebonnet Blue Star Mothers, a chapter of the state and national organizations of Blue Star Mothers, Inc. "The camaraderie of the mothers is a joy felt by all of us," Cheree said.

It's not just an organization for mothers. Stepmothers, grandmothers, foster mothers, godmothers and female legal guardians of children serving in the military, National Guard, military reserve branch or of military veterans are welcomed. Cindy McCain, wife of Senator John McCain, is the national spokeswoman of the organization, since she is a former military wife and mom of two sons serving in the U.S. Navy. The Blue Star Mothers' mission is to never forsake U.S. troops, veterans or families of Fallen Heroes. "We are a nonpartisan, nonpolitical and nonsectarian organization," Cheree said.

When parents raise a son or daughter who is inspired to serve their country through joining a military branch, that parent is full of pride and apprehension. Studies have shown that supportive parents play an important role in how their son or daughter reintegrates into everyday life at home following deployment. Some of the most supportive parents of military service men and women are the Bluebonnet Blue Star Mothers.

"Our local chapter has 25 members from locations as far away as Snyder toward the west, Southern Dallas County to the north, Corsicana to the south and Mabank to the east," Cheree explained. Trenda Thompson of Waxahachie became a member in 2014 and has already become very active in the chapter's work. Her son, Colt Thompson,



"We are allowed to go to the gate to greet service men and women," Cheree said. Chapter members receive help with their activities. "We work with the Patriot Guard Riders, and area churches and Crafty Scrappers in Waxahachie are collection points for donations that are packed into the gift boxes. "The Boy Scouts of America troops

help pack boxes," Cheree said thankfully. The scrapbook is especially important to members, since each mom has a page dedicated to her military child or children.

Some duties are very hard on members emotionally but are essential in order to carry out the chapter's stated mission of support. Chapter members presented a Waxahachie mom with her Gold Star flag signifying the loss of a child while serving in the military. "Thank goodness that isn't something we do often nor do we want to have do it," Cheree said. Members were interviewed by WFAA-TV, Channel 8, while standing on the route Chris Kyle's burial procession took. "That was a sad day for everyone," Cheree remembered. A Hutchins-area mom's son received a traumatic brain injury from an IED while in a mess hall, and the chapter members were able to help the family through his recovery in the Dallas VA Medical Center. He is successfully continuing to serve in the Army National Guard. "We have found that families deal with death and injury in many different ways," Cheree revealed.

to be entwined, one with the other. This process calls for patience and plenty of time to do it properly. As you entwine the two, you will touch each small limb on the garland strands, merging them together as you work from one end to the next.



Niños Mexican Restaurant has been a Waxahachie tradition since 1982. "My parents, Phillip and Diana Downs, operated Niños for 27 years before retiring the business," current owner Nicole Chambers shared. The restaurant was closed to faithful customers for four-and-a-half years before Nicole and her husband, Jason, were in a position to reopen in September 2013, as the new owners of Niños Mexican Restaurant.

It was amazing how many of Jason's thoughts for the reopening mirrored Nicole's. They continue to stand firm in the decisions they made at the beginning of their journey. "We quickly decided, Why change what's worked for so long?"' Jason said in reference to Niños' first 27 years.

They have been at their new location since February 2015. Although they may have downsized in overall square footage, Niños

will seat 96 customers, and parking is no longer an issue. Nicole and Jason are on the premises all day overseeing the restaurant from opening to close. They work side-by-side with their employees to lead by example and be able to say, "There is nothing we won't ask you to do that we wouldn't do."

The staff they manage is made up of 15 part-time individuals. Nicole hires high school students as a way to give young adults an opportunity to work. "A first job is very important. "Just like my parents before us, we are helping these young adults build a firm foundation, while also teaching them positive character traits."

Some may work only one day a week because that's all their school schedule will allow. Nicole and Jason are conscious of extracurricular school activities and church functions when it comes

to their younger employees. "The mantra we live by is God first, family second and other activities third," Nicole admitted, as Christian music played softly in the background. "We have always encouraged them to be busy at school and at church."

Although many things have changed in the restaurant business since Nicole's parents first opened Niños Restaurant, one thing has definitely stayed the same ----Niños hot sauce. The recipe dates back over 30 years. "My dad made a mistake with the wrong size spoon," Nicole confessed. "He put more spices in than the recipe called for." By accident, Phillip created an entirely new recipe that customers have come to expect and enjoy. "The recipe has not changed over the years because of its lasting popularity," Nicole stated. The French dressing is also a Niños mainstay. "It has a wonderful taste alone or mixed with the hot sauce," Nicole added.

Niños Mexican Restaurant serves delicious Mexican combination plates, but rib eye steaks, chicken fried steaks and burgers with all the fixings are also available. The Tuesday menu offers "all-you-can-eat" dinner plates, while Fridays are reserved for fajitas and game day specials. "Municipal workers get a discount any time they dine with us," Nicole said. "Half price lunch for city employees is Tuesday." These are just a few of the many ways Nicole and Jason give back to the community that's brought them success as one of many "mom and pop" businesses in the area.

The hometown atmosphere at Niños is another carryover from the early days, which allows for the relaxed family dining that patrons have come to expect. As Nicole and Jason look to Niños' future, they are actively discussing the possibility of a delivery service. But, regardless of what may come next, they will continue to walk proudly in the footsteps of the past. NOW

Time to Harvest Your Losses?

The fourth quarter is a good time to determine if harvesting your losses would be an effective tax strategy.



The fourth quarter is a good time to review your overall asset allocation to ensure it is both tax efficient and aligns with your financial goals. Since some investments generate more taxable distributions than others, it's important to evaluate your investments, after-tax returns, portfolio turnover ratio and historical distributions to get a sense of your annual tax liability. Especially at year end, you have the opportunity now to take steps to help minimize this year's tax liability.

One way to diminish your 2015 tax burden is to harvest capital losses in order to offset realized gains. The deadline to sell securities to realize a gain or loss is December 31, 2015. However, be aware of the "wash-sale" rule. This rule will not allow you to deduct capital losses on the sale of a particular security if you initiate a similar position within a 61-day period (30 days before the sale date and 30 days after the sale date). Note that these rules apply to both taxable and nontaxable accounts. So, for example, you can't liquidate a position in one account and establish a similar position in your IRA within that timeframe.

Tax-loss harvesting dos and don'ts

Do: Sell depreciated investments that don't fit your strategy. **Do:** Research your records and cost basis carefully before you sell any investment. **Don't:** Undermine long-term investing goals for tax purposes. **Don't:** Buy a substantially indentical security within 30 days before or after the sale.

If your capital losses are more than your capital gains, you can claim a capital loss deduction. You may use your total net loss to reduce your income dollar for dollar, up to the \$3,000 limit per year.

If you have a total net loss that is more than the annual limit, you can carry over that unused portion to next year and treat it as if you incurred it in 2016. If part of the loss is still unused, you can carry it over to later years until it is completely used up.

Here's an example of how to claim the capital loss deduction. Let's say Earl and Samantha sell securities at the end of this year. The sale yields a capital loss of \$7,000, and they have no other capital transactions. On their joint tax return for 2015, they can deduct \$3,000 of the \$7,000 loss. Next year, they can carry over the unused part of the loss, \$4,000 (\$7,000 - \$3,000), up to the limit for that year.

It's important to work with your financial and/or tax advisor to determine if harvesting your losses would be an effective strategy to help reduce your 2015 taxes.

Straighten Up

"Stand up straight!" How many times have you heard that in your lifetime? It could've been from your mom, your teacher, dance instructor or a friend. Depending upon who gave the order, you may or may not have tried to accommodate them. But who wants to stand straight when a good slouch seems to work just as well? And, what about that cozy curl into the big chair? Why sit up straight when the opposite feels so right and comfortable? Here is an inconvenient truth: Unless you have been taught and encouraged to practice good posture, you probably need some encouraging reminders.

The correct posture follows the natural curvature of the spine. A good standing posture starts with holding your head up, shoulders back, stomach tucked, knees relaxed, not locked, and your feet a shoulder's width apart. A good sitting posture begins with your buttocks touching the back of the chair. Have your back and shoulders straight and feet planted on the floor. Your weight should be equally distributed. Use an arm rest. If you need to turn while sitting, do not twist. Turn your whole body. Practice good computer posture by sitting with good posture and keeping your arms and wrists parallel to the floor. Make sure the computer screen is at eye level.

Posture plays a big part in your overall health. One of the areas impacted is your breathing. There is a reason programs such as yoga and Pilates place so much emphasis on breathing. For the brain to function properly, it is critical for it to receive the oxygen it needs. This improves your critical thinking. Proper posture facilitates that. When you use good posture, your muscles, ligaments and joints are aligned as they should be, and this alignment allows internal organs to be positioned properly inside the body. When your organs are compromised because of bad posture, they can't function as they should, and that sets up other issues, such as digestion or respiratory problems.

There is less wear and tear on the skeletal system when you maintain good posture, thereby lessening the prospect of injury. Going against this can set you up for arthritis, back pain and body fatigue. Good posture equals a more efficient system. Other considerations would be to invest in a good mattress for the good of your spine at night and an orthopedic pillow. Wear quality footwear. Sit in a solid chair that gives your back the support it needs. There are good reasons for all of this attention to posture. In addition, you will look better and exude confidence when you stand and sit up straight! NOW

In the Kitchen With Sue Allelo

Sue Allelo was once intimidated by the ease and perfection of her father's baking and cooking. "His food was always prepared without the use of recipes," she shared, "and he rarely measured the ingredients. His dishes were oozing with love." Now, Sue loves trying new recipes. She tweaks and experiments to create delicious meals for her family and friends. "I use ingredients that are fresh, healthy and colorful," she added. "I replace the bad stuff with healthier choices."

Sue finds inspiration by searching for new ways to add better nutrition to the meals she prepares at home. "I love learning from other cooks," she admitted. "I have encouraged our daughter, two sons and now our 8-year-old granddaughter to cook." Sue has made cooking a fun activity for the whole family.

Coffee-Brown Sugar Rubbed Beef Tenderloin or Rib Eye Steak *Serves 12.*

- I trimmed beef tenderloin or 2-inch thick rib eye steak
- 3 Tbsp. olive oil
- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 3 Tbsp. finely ground coffee
- 1/2 tsp. cayenne pepper or red pepper flakes
- 2 tsp. smoked paprika
- 2 tsp. garlic powder

I. On a large sheet of plastic wrap, brush meat with oil on all sides. In a medium bowl, add remaining ingredients and mix. Rub this mixture onto all sides of the meat and wrap. Place in the refrigerator for 4 hours.

2. Preheat oven to 450 F. Remove the meat from the plastic wrap. Place on rack in roasting pan filled with a couple inches of water. The meat should not touch the water but simply roast above it.

3. Cook for 40-50 minutes, or until desired doneness. Medium rare is 145 degrees.

4. Let meat stand on cutting board at least 10 minutes before thinly slicing. (Rib eyes may require more rub.)

Elena's Pumpkin Chocolate Chip Pancakes

Makes 18-21 pancakes.

- 3 cups Krusteaz pancake mix
- I cup pumpkin (can substitute with mashed banana or blueberries)
- 2 cups water
- I cup milk chocolate chips
- 1/2 cup walnuts or pecans
- 1/8 cup flaxseeds, ground or whole
- 1/8 cup chia seeds
- l tsp. cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla
- Pat butter

I. Preheat griddle. Mix all ingredients, except butter, in a large bowl. Add more water, if necessary, a little at a time.

2. Put butter on the griddle. Add pancake batter. Let pancakes bubble before flipping to the other side.

Aunt Betty's Chicken & Dumplings

Chicken: I whole chicken I 32-oz. carton chicken broth I2 cups water 4 stalks celery, diced 5 carrots, peeled and sliced I large yellow onion, diced I tsp. rubbed sage 2 bay leaves I Tbsp. dried parsley I Tbsp. poultry seasoning 3/4 cup cooled broth I cup peas (optional) Salt and pepper, to taste I egg

Dumplings: 2 cups flour 1 tsp. baking soda 1 pinch salt and pepper

I. For chicken: Rinse chicken, empty cavity and place chicken and broth in a large soup pot. Cover with water.

2. Add all veggies, except the peas. Add seasonings and bring to a slow boil until chicken begins to fall apart.

3. Remove chicken from the pot once the meat begins to fall off the bone. Allow it to cool somewhat, so you can remove all the meat from the bones.

4. Set aside 3/4 cup of the stock, allowing it to cool. Continue to allow the broth and veggies to simmer for an additional 30 minutes, adding meat back into the pot. Add peas.

5. Beat egg into 3/4 cup of cooled broth, set aside.

6. For dumplings: Put flour, baking soda, salt and pepper in a large bowl. Add the broth/egg liquid. Mix well. Add more flour, if needed.
7. Roll out the dumpling dough. Cut into bitesize pieces. Drop them into the simmering pot, one at a time. Drop a few and wait, then drop a few more. This keeps them from sticking to one another. Stir gently. They will float to the top.
8. Allow dumplings to cook another 10 minutes, and then taste. You may need to add more salt and pepper at this time. If possible, allow to cool; place in the fridge and reheat and serve the next day for flavors that really jump.
