

Rosemary Trojacek married into a huge Czech family in Ennis a year ago. It was no secret that Rosemary's mother, Amy Wright, had been adopted at birth, and with her mother's blessing and her mother-in-law, Connie's, encouragement, Rosemary sought to discover more about her original roots through a DNA test and a lot of research with Ancestry.com.

Even the Trojacek's home is a tribute to the family that came before them. Rosemary's husband, Kaleb, smiled as he related, "This was my grandfather's house. He and my grandmother raised my father and his seven siblings here."


The home appears much larger in the interior than from the street view. "A couple of walls have been removed, and the side porch was taken in to expand the living area. The master bedroom was also added on, but it is still hard to imagine 10 people living here," Kaleb said.

Rosemary wanted to know more about where she came from, as well as whether her medical issues might impact her children. "My medical issues are not genetic. If they were, doctors say there would be a 50-percent chance of passing them on to my children. Since they are not, it drops to less than 5 percent," Rosemary revealed.

Rosemary's journey of discovery started last Christmas, when her mother-in-law gave her an ancestry kit. "When I first got it, I was scared to do the test," Rosemary related. "I took the test in April, and then we began to dig in to the results."

Kaleb interjected, "Don't be afraid of the truth, but you don't know where it will lead you. It has been an amazing experience, to say the least."







After the test results were received. Connie pushed them to investigate. Soon some connections were made. Stacks of ancestry records appeared and they had to "do the math" to see how one result might be related to another. Birthdates from the records were compared to see which person might be a possible sibling of Rosemary's mother or a possible uncle, aunt or cousin.

Adopted at birth, Amy had no feeling of remorse or regret. Her adoptive parents loved her and told her, "We chose you. We picked you out!" They had the resources to see that she received a quality education, and she loved them as any child would love their parents.

As the story unfolded, it was revealed that Amy's biological mother was sent from her home in Houston to the Edna Gladney Home in Fort Worth when her family learned she was pregnant. She related that the home was a very good place. They took good care of her and provided for her prenatal appointments and the delivery.





However, the identities of the birth mother and father were disguised and sealed from the adoptive parents. Records had names and even the gender of the child blacked out.

Pursuit of Rosemary's biological grandmother continued with cautious optimism. Amy had indicated that if they found her birth mother through their investigation, she would like to have any pertinent medical information, and she would like to say thank you to her for making the difficult decision of giving her up for adoption.


For a DNA test to yield results, some other relative that could be anywhere in the world would have also have had to take the test. The connection Rosemary originally found was a first cousin. Amy's biological mother's brother had a daughter named Allie who had done a DNA test. The next connection was with a first cousin of Allie, Holly, who is a daughter of Amy's biological mother, and therefore Amy's half-sister.

It was soon discovered that although Holly and Amy's mother, Sharon, lives in Ohio, Holly is much closer, a resident of Austin, Texas. "We found Holly on Facebook," Rosemary related. "Soon we arranged a meeting with her in Waco. That was just this last May, and in July, we met again in Waco with Sharon; Chuck, her half-brother; and Amy. This was the first meeting between my mother and her birth mother. It was very emotional for both of them."

Kaleb added, "Sharon was very quiet, not as emotional."

The relationship between sisters Holly and Amy has grown to the point

that they talk on the telephone weekly. Rosemary was surprised at how much her mother resembles her half-sister. "They favor in the way they talk with their hands," she said.

"I married into a huge family, and now it is even bigger," she continued. "I have found a grandmother, two uncles, an aunt and several new cousins."

Rosemary continues to credit her mother-in-law for encouraging the pursuit of her family, and also for all of the work that she did on the computer researching the ancestry. While records may be hard to come by and many things were hidden in years past, DNA matching has increased opportunities to connect families. "Holly was told at age 18 that she had an older sibling who had been adopted at birth," Rosemary said. "She had looked at the Edna Gladney files and thought all along that it was a brother because the gender was blacked out in the file. Since it had four letters, she assumed it was 'male.' The four letters actually spelled 'girl.'

"We were not sure what these additions to the family would be like, or if they would be open to a relationship with us," Rosemary went on. "They have been very open. We have talked about having a big family reunion sometime in the future, but there is a lot to be worked out, such as would we have it in Texas or possibly in Ohio where Sharon lives?

"You have to be willing to accept all of the possibilities that could result from what you find. We are pleased to say it has been a positive experience for our family," she continued. "And yes, there will be new additions to the Christmas card list this year!" NOW

A visionary, per Webster's Dictionary, is a person with original ideas about what the future could hold. 

Indoors, one Santa finds his place in





Zivan Zuniga remembers the day he went to Sam Houston Elementary School to learn about becoming a Cub Scout. He was 8 years old, and he knew he wanted to join so he could "shoot a BB gun." He remembers the initial disappointment he felt early on in his 10 years as a Scout. "I found out that I wouldn't be able to shoot a BB gun until I was much older," he said, looking back on the overall experience with a smile. "I wanted to get out many times, but I'm so glad I stuck it out and stayed the course."

Scouting taught Zivan many life lessons that he will carry into adulthood. The first time he went on a camping trip was an experience he'll never forget. "I was in a tent with one other Cub Scout," Zivan explained. "The other boy ran to his dad because he was scared. I wanted to run, too, but I stuck it out." This once traumatic camping trip is now one that

Zivan looks back on, realizing how it didn't just make him stronger emotionally, it also grew his self-confidence.

His favorite thing about Scouting was hanging out with his fellow Scouts. "In the beginning, we came from different elementary schools in the district," Zivan shared. "Once we were older, we all attended Ennis High School." He also has fond memories of all the merit badges he earned as a Boy Scout in Troop 210 — memories that have made him more resilient in life.

Meetings are still held at Ennis' First United Methodist Church. Young boys are still becoming men as they earn those same merit badges, go camping and give back by volunteering in their community.


As a senior in the class of 2018, Zivan wanted to earn the prestigious Eagle Scout ranking by giving something back to the community. "I wanted to do something that would represent all I'd been through as a Scout," he admitted. "Once I started thinking seriously about it, I came up with miles markers for Kachina Trail, the nature trail located in Ennis at Lake Clark."

Zivan quickly put his plans to paper, mapping out each phase of the mile marker project. He knocked on many doors to get the financial backing he needed to see the markers come to fruition. It wasn't long before the actual labor began. "I led the project, but I had lots of help from a group of fellow Scouts that included my younger brother, Zabian, as we dug holes and prepared the land for the granite markers," Zivan shared. "There is a total of five markers — three mile-markers, one donor plaque and a final marker with an arrow that points to the lake." Zivan also added a permanent bench at the beginning of the trail with his name and the completion date of November 11, 2017, engraved on it.

The community came together to help Zivan make his dream a reality. The list of those who helped is engraved for Kachina Trail visitors to see. Those names include the Ennis Garden Club, JTekt, Blackland Lumber, the City of Ennis, Zabian Zuniga, Elliott Electric and Giles Monument in Waxahachie. "The Indian Trail Master Naturalists also played a huge part in the project," Zivan noted. "They donated the site, giving me the opportunity to do something for more than a few people. I was able to create something for the entire community."

As a freshman at The University of North Texas-San Marcus, Zivan is taking a full class load, and he's still making straight A's. He's personable and polite. He's a son that his parents, Hector and Angelica Zuniga, are quite proud of. The skills he learned as a Boy Scout leadership, perseverance, will-power and confidence — will keep him moving in the right direction as he continues to stay the course set before him. NOW





Creamy Mushroom Chicken

- 4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts, pounded to 1/2-inch thickness Salt and pepper, to taste
- 1 cup milk
- 1 8-oz. packet of powdered mashed potatoes
- 1 Tbsp. olive oil
- 3 Tbsp. unsalted butter
- 10 oz. cremini mushrooms, thinly sliced
- 1/2 medium yellow onion, diced
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/2 tsp. kosher salt, plus more for seasoning
- 1/4 tsp. freshly ground black pepper, plus more for seasoning

- 2 Tbsp. all-purpose flour
- I cup half-and-half or whole milk
- 1/2 cup chicken broth
- 1/2 cup finely grated Parmesan cheese, plus more for serving
- 2 Tbsp. fresh parsley leaves, chopped
- **1.** Thoroughly dry chicken with paper towels. Generously season with salt and pepper. Pour milk into a bowl. In a second bowl, pour powdered mashed potatoes. Dip chicken in milk and then batter in powdered mashed potatoes. Repeat until all chicken is battered.
- **2.** Heat oil in a 10-inch or larger skillet over medium-high heat until shimmering. Add chicken and sear 5-7 minutes, or until deeply browned on bottom. Flip with tongs and sear

- 5-7 minutes until browned. Transfer chicken to plate: set aside.
- **3.** Reduce heat to medium; add butter. Add the next 5 ingredients. Stir occasionally for about 7 minutes, or until tender. Add flour and stir to evenly coat vegetables; cook for 1 minute.
- **4.** Stir in cup of half-and-half or whole milk and chicken broth until no lumps from flour remain. Boil and reduce heat to a simmer; stir in Parmesan. Return chicken to pan and simmer about 2-3 minutes, or until sauce is thickened and chicken is cooked through. Sprinkle with additional Parmesan and parsley before serving.

Chicken Bacon Fettuccine Alfredo

- 8 strips bacon, chopped and trimmed of all fat
- 2 large chicken breasts, diced into 1-inch pieces
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tsp. kosher salt
- 1 tsp. pepper
- 6 1/2 cups milk, whole or half-and-half
- 1 lb. dry fettuccine pasta
- I large head broccoli, cut into florets, stem removed
- 1 cup Parmesan cheese, freshly grated

Fry bacon in large saucepan or pot over medium-high heat until crispy. Add chicken, and sauté until cooked through. Add garlic; fry for about 2 minutes. Season with salt and pepper.
 Add milk and stir. Bring milk to a gentle simmer; reduce heat immediately. Add pasta; stir occasionally for 5-6 minutes, or until pasta begins to bend and soften. Add broccoli; stir and cover with lid. Cook about 7 minutes, stirring occasionally, until pasta is cooked al dente.
 Add Parmesan cheese and stir until cheese has melted. The sauce will continue to thicken if not served immediately. Add more milk, if needed. Serve with extra pepper and Parmesan cheese.

Chris' Burger

- 2 strips bacon or 1/8 cup bacon bits
- 1/2 cup onion, finely chopped
- I clove garlic, minced or I tsp. garlic powder
- icgg
- 2 Tbsp. Tabasco sauce
- 2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 1 lb. ground beef, 70/30 for grilling or 80/20 for stovetop
- 12-15 Ritz crackers
- 1/4 cup parsley, finely chopped
- 4 slices processed American cheese or cheddar cheese, halved diagonally
- 2 slices pepper jack cheese, halved diagonally
- 4 hamburger buns, split and toasted
- **I.** Chop bacon into very fine pieces; cook until crispy. Add onion and garlic about 2 minutes before the bacon is done to sweat vegetables. Set aside to cool.
- **2.** In a small bowl, add egg, Tabasco and Worcestershire; whisk well.
- **3.** In a large bowl, add ground beef. Use your hands to crumble the Ritz crackers into the bowl of ground beef. Add parsley and egg mixture to beef. Mix together with hands. Add bacon mixture; mix until ingredients are combined. Shape into four patties.
- **4.** Grill patties, covered, on a greased rack over medium direct heat for about 4 minutes on each side for well done. During the last minute of cooking, top each patty with two triangles of American cheese and one triangle of pepper jack cheese. Serve on buns. If desired, top with lettuce, tomato, onion, bacon and ketchup or mustard.

The City of Lights

Natchitoches is known for many things — its culture, cuisine and hard to pronounce name (Nack-a-tish). Named after a Native American Indian tribe, Natchitoches translates to "pawpaw eaters," a fruit tree once plentiful in the region.

From its roots as the oldest settlement in the Louisiana Purchase, Natchitoches was established in 1714 by French explorer Louis Juchereau de St. Denis as a French Outpost along the Red River. After the river changed its course in the late 1800s, Cane River Lake was created, a 33-mile long section of the Red River that is now landlocked. The downtown Historic District is nestled along the banks of this picturesque body of water.

"The City" is known as the filming location for Steel Magnolias, as the Bed and Breakfast Capital of Louisiana and as a popular tourism destination. Nicknamed "The City of Lights," Natchitoches is best known for its six-week Christmas Festival of Lights, featuring more than 300,000 lights that make the town twinkle with magic. Starting the weekend before Thanksgiving with a "Turn on the Holidays" celebration, the festival continues through January 6. The official Natchitoches Christmas Festival Day is the first Saturday in December. A Christmas parade winds its way through downtown. Vendors sell fresh meat pies, and bands perform through the night. 2018 marks the 92nd annual celebration.

While this is the most popular festival, there's a plethora of events to enjoy year-round. Enjoy a day of competition, and cheer on rowers at the Dragon Boat Races, held annually at the beginning of March. In April is the Melrose Arts and Crafts Festival, where more than 100 vendors sell

their wares beneath the canopy of oak trees at Melrose Plantation, just 17 miles south of Natchitoches. And the Natchitoches Jazz R&B Festival is held annually in May with four stages playing a variety of music from jazz to rock.

For 39 years, the Natchitoches/NSU Folk Festival has been held annually in July in the air-conditioned Prather Coliseum on the Northwestern State University Campus. Browse through vendors and demonstrations, and listen to an eclectic variety of musicians.

Both the Fall and Christmas Tour of Homes offer sneak peeks inside some of the town's historic buildings, presented by the Natchitoches Historic Foundation and the Association for the Preservation of Historic Natchitoches. Also in the fall, stroll the streets and look under the hoods of antique autos at the annual Natchitoches Classic Car Show.

Each October, prominent figures from Natchitoches' history come to life at History Among the Tombstones: Stories from the American Cemetery. And the Grand Ecore Visitors Center, Los Adaes State Historic Site and Fort St. Jean Baptiste each offer unique programming throughout the year from lectures to demonstrations and re-enactments.

Stroll through downtown shops like Kaffie Frederick — Louisiana's oldest general store. Bring a boat and cruise Cane River and Sibley Lake for some of the best fishing spots around, or grab a kayak and take it slow. Whatever adventure you have in mind, Natchitoches will welcome you with its true Southern charm and hospitality.

Questions to Ask Your Financial Advisor
