Protecting Those Who Cannot Protect Themselves

The Humane Society is a place of refuge and salvation for the little creatures that cannot protect themselves. Marcia Longo, the secretary for the Humane Society of Navarro County, began her career with the Corsicana Animal Shelter by volunteering when she first arrived to Corsicana over 11 years ago. "I saw an article in the Corsicana Daily Sun talking about an overload of animals in the shelter; so I offered my time to walk the dogs, talk and play with the animals and just spend time with the little fellas that would come into the shelter," Marcia explained. She volunteered for the shelter for a little over two years.

As Marcia became more and more involved in the shelter, she became acquainted with Diane West Short, the former 17-year veteran manager of the animal shelter, and listened to the various animal issues in the county. They literally tugged at her



heartstrings. When Diane requested her presence on the shelter's board of directors about four and one-half years ago, Marcia accepted the position with great pleasure and enthusiasm.

The shelter began as the Navarro County Humane Society under the umbrella of the Humane Society on May 25, 1972, when it was established to operate for a period of over 50 years. In 1987, the name was changed to the



Humane Society of Navarro County. The original signers were Norma Hammonds, Sylvia Gordon and Sheila Creasy, and Diane Short continued to hold an important place at the shelter. "She ran the shelter as a volunteer for over 17 years with limited funds available from the city. She managed to successfully and continually raise money through donations throughout Navarro County," Marcia pointed out.

After Diane left her position, deciding with her husband to move out of Corsicana, the city took over the shelter. This technically separated the shelter from the Humane Society's management. The shelter is currently maintained and operated under the police depart department with city protection and funding.

"When the change occurred, the Humane Society Corporation was reformed under the guidance of Abe Stroud, Gary Cooley, Debra Pennell, Lynn Gatlin, Bob McNutt, and me as of four-and-a-half years ago," Marcia explained. "Soon after, we were fortunate to gain the strengths in our ranks of Julie Maupin and Stephanie Elkins."

"In less than 4 years, we have managed to bring the Humane Society from an operating capital of less than \$2,000 to over \$16,000," Marcia stated with great pride.

The Humane Society has many goals and objectives for the animals around and within Navarro County; however,

their primary objective is to control animal overpopulation through ongoing spaying and neutering opportunities for pet owners. "The other concerns and goals of the Humane Society aside from overpopulation are to monitor the abandonment level of animals; place ... animals in good homes; and maintain a close and working relationship with the shelter," Marcia said. "Our main focus right now is to stay working closely with city officials, business and the citizens of the county to secure any available land that might be available for purchase or donation and to find funding for a new shelter facility."

"The reason we are so desperate for a new facility is the current one really isn't large enough to house all the animals that come to us. In addition, the ventilation system wasn't designed to work in an animal shelter. So, therefore, when one animal gets sick, they all typically wind up sick," Marcia explained. "But we certainly

are trying to make headway to get our new facility underway. In fact, we have contracted an architect to draw up some preliminary plans for us, and they look fantastic."

The Humane Society does everything they can to assist and support the shelter and the local animals. They offer assistance to those who cannot afford to have their dogs or cats spayed or neutered in addition to any veterinary costs they may not be able to afford, such as shots, medications or minor surgeries. "The Humane Society also helps the shelter with any miscellaneous needs they may have or can't afford," Marcia said. "But say, if a family finds a litter of puppies or kittens and they decide to keep them all, the Humane Society truly appreciates their love, instead of them having to enter the shelter; so the Humane Society will assist them with food and vaccinations, to help get them started with their new family."

"Since the shelter is so limited with their means and funding, that is where the Humane Society steps in. We are the ones who really get out there to promote all the adoptions and care of the animals. We provide the marketing and public relation connections, but the shelter does all the actual paperwork and adopting of the animals," Marcia commented. "There are numerous



programs that the Humane Society offers in order to help the special animals find the homes they deserve."

The most popular program offered is remote adoptions. The Humane Society will provide a huge trailer filled from floor to ceiling with kennels for people to visit and see the animals, in hope that they will take one home to add to their family. Remote adoption days typically take place during Derrick Days and one day in November.



Another program known as Warm Hearts for Cold Noses, allows businesses from around Navarro County to place their ad in the Corsicana Daily Sun while featuring a loving animal that desperately needs a home. "Probably the most effective program is offered by Kaufman County — the Kaufman County Animal Awareness Project, better known as the Critter Cruiser. The Cruiser comes the last Friday of each month to Navarro County. The pick up station is at 7:00 a.m. in the First Baptist Church parking lot, and your pet is returned there at 7:00 p.m. During their time away, your pet can receive health care, primarily spaying and neutering surgeries, for a reduced price. But this should not replace your regular veterinarian visits," Marcia added.

The Humane Society has done so much for Navarro County's canine and feline residents. With people like Marcia and the other board members helping and volunteering, we can know that animals that need love and safe homes are being cared for in our city's animal shelter.



At Home With Kerri Anderson Donica

in the home believed to have been built in the 1920s, or at least the original portion was.

Walking through the home which appears much smaller from the outside, visitors can see where each new addition began and ended. "I'm still amazed at the enormity of it all," she said, referring to the 3,600 square feet of living space. "The overall size of the home is deceiving from the road." The front section includes the formal living and





dining areas, the boys' rooms and the kitchen. The style is Old World European, except, of course, for the rooms occupied by Hunter and Heath. "Heath's room was a soft green when we purchased the house," Kerri said. "It's now predominantly navy with red and white accents." 
When Susan Crane Productions announced that they would be going

Walking into Billy Harlan's office is like entering a shrine dedicated to Texas A&M University and its baseball team. On one wall hangs a photograph of the Aggie baseball team winning a game and cheering with excitement. Posted on the opposite wall is the 2007-2008 Fighting Corsicana Tiger baseball schedule.

Billy is a well-grounded person, and even with all of his life experiences, he will still stop to give you a hearty "hello" if he passes you on the street. As a product of the Corsicana Independent School District and a 1989 graduate of Corsicana High School (CHS), this newly appointed head coach of the Tiger baseball team bleeds blue and gold.

IN THE KITCHEN WITH CHARLOTTE TANNEHILL

C harlotte remembers "flouring the cutting board for momma," as early as 4 years of age. She still has the round tin can her mom used to cut the biscuits. "Cooking was for family, tradition and the healing of hearts and bodies," Charlotte said. "We just didn't learn to cook by measuring anything when I was little. I remember deciding I must learn to fix the traditional Christmas dinner and momma taught me that there was no recipe, just a pinch of this and a dab of that, then you taste."

Today, Charlotte's favorite and most requested dish is the nearly 40-year-old chicken soup recipe that heals everything. "It'll cook and keep for those days you just need to feel better," she said.

HOMEMADE CHICKEN SOUP

(This freezes well. Keep on hand for flu season.)

- 3 cups diced potatoes
- 1 large yellow onion, diced
- 1 bunch green onion tops, diced
- 1 cup copped celery (leaf tops included)
- 2 Tbsp. vegetable oil
- 1 14-oz. can chicken broth
- 3 12.5-oz. cans chicken breast in water
- 2 tsp. chopped parsley
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1 14-oz. can Carnation milk

Coat vegetables with oil; cook on medium heat in large cooking pan. Add chicken broth and bring to a boil. Reduce heat, cover and simmer approximately 30 minutes until vegetables are tender. Add chicken breast, parsley, salt and pepper. Remove from heat and add canned milk. Serve hot.

GREAT RICE DISH

1/2 green bell pepper, chopped
1 medium yellow onion, chopped
1 cup chopped celery
6 Tbsp. butter
1 1-oz. jar pimento, undrained
1 6.5-oz. can sliced mushrooms, undrained
1 1/2 cup fresh white rice, uncooked
1 1/2 cups chicken broth
salt and pepper to taste

Sauté vegetables in butter until tender. Add pimento and mushrooms. Add rice and stir until rice is golden brown. Add chicken

broth, salt and pepper. Simmer until vegetables are tender.

GRANDDAD'S BARBEQUE SAUCE

(Great on grilled hamburgers)

1/2 lb. margarine
 2/3 cup vinegar
 1 cup sugar
 1 cup ketchup
 1 Tbsp. Tabasco sauce
 3 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce
 3/4 cup Heinz 57 Sauce
 1 tsp. dry mustard

Add all ingredients to saucepan and heat thoroughly while stirring. Allow to simmer 15 minutes.

GREAT POTATO SALAD

POTATO SALAD: 3 large potatoes 7 eggs 1 medium white onion 1 cup diced or cubed cheddar cheese

DRESSING: 3/4 cup Hellman's mayonnaise 1 tsp. mustard dill pickle juice to thin to desired consistency salt and pepper to taste

POTATO SALAD: Boil potatoes in skins until tender, then let cool and dice. Boil eggs then peel and mash with fork. Dice onion. Place all in large mixing bowl. *DRESSING*: Mix ingredients together. Add to vegetables, mixing well.

2 lbs. ground chuck or ground round
2 Tbsp. margarine
2 8-oz. cans tomato sauce
salt and pepper to taste
1 small yellow onion, chopped
1/2 cup sour cream
1 cup cottage cheese
1 8-oz. package egg noodles
2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
Brown ground meat in margarine and drain.
Add tomato sauce, salt and pepper and mix

Add tomato sauce, salt and pepper and mix well. In separate bowl mix onion, sour cream and cottage cheese. Layer noodles, ground meat and sour cream mixture in that order alternating until all ingredients are used. Top with cheddar cheese.

GOOD MEAT LOAF

 eggs
 3/4 cup ketchup
 tsp. Accent
 1/2 cup warm water
 envelope dry onion soup mix
 3/4 cup finely chopped bell pepper
 8-oz. can tomato sauce

Mix all ingredients together and form meat loaf. Place in a pan and bake 1 hour at 350 F.

Blooming Trees for Springtime

- By Nancy Fenton

Hopes for spring are around the corner, and all those pretty blooms are more than a sparkle in the eye. Did you plant for spring color? It is a bit late for this year, but you can put in some small ones now for a burst of color next spring. Look around and decide which ones you like best and get to it!

The showy white blooms on the 12 - 20 foot sprawling trees are dogwood. The roughleaf is a good variety for our area. Those orchid-shaped white, pink or burgundy colored flowers are signs of the desert willow, a sure thing for our alkaline, dry soils. Bright pink flowers on a 12 - 20 foot tree will indicate Mexican or red buckeye, Mexican plum or redbud. While most of these are under-story trees, growing best in the dappled shade of our old oaks, the more sun the better for the desert willow and buckeyes. All of these smaller trees have bright colors that shine through while the larger trees are just beginning to bud out and contrast nicely with the golden daffodils and multicolored crocus on the ground. By the time the trees leaf out fully and the temperatures rise, they are ready to rest awhile and grow more branches for bloom the following spring!

Vitex is one of the versatile plants which can be as large as you want it, and it can be pruned into a large tree or a large shrub. Its vibrant purple or pink blooms resemble a lilac and droop much like a lilac. One of the largest I have seen is in Waxahachie's Getzendaner Park, directly across from the new restroom facility. There are several large vitex hedges around the town if you know what you are seeing. Those showy small bushes that are covered with many blooms in yellow, pink and cranberry are probably japonica. There are several varieties, but they are all beautiful in the spring.

Look with fresh eyes as you drive around and decide which ones fit into your yard and then start looking for the plants. You can plant containerized trees anytime of year, but fall and spring are best. Just remember to plant those trees high so that as the ground settles the root flare will still be visible, mulch them heavily, and water once a week for at least the first year. You, too, can be the envy of your neighborhood with beautiful spring-blooming trees! **NOW**



In recent months, it has been impossible to open a newspaper or listen to a news broadcast that you do not hear about "a new superbug" causing illness or death or a school being closed for cleaning due to an infectious outbreak among the students. Many people have wanted to know how to protect themselves from infection.

The most effective means of preventing the spread of infection is to wash your hands! Most of us do not think about what germs might be "lurking" on a doorknob, but in public places hundreds or thousands of people may have touched that door since the last time it was cleaned. All of us have bacteria that live on our skin at all times, and each time we touch something, we transfer bacteria from our hands to that surface. At the same time, bacteria and viruses that are living on a surface are picked up by hands. We then might scratch our nose, or rub our eyes and transfer those bacteria or viruses to those areas.

It is important that you wash your hands with soap and water, or use an alcohol-based sanitizer before

eating, after using the rest room, after coughing or sneezing, before preparing food, after being around someone that has been coughing or sneezing, or after emptying the trash. Proper handwashing involves brisk rubbing of the hands with soap for 15 seconds, making sure to clean well around the fingernails. An easy way to remember how long 15 seconds is by singing two choruses of "Happy Birthday" or one verse of "Old McDonald" with one animal. By washing your hands more frequently, you will stay healthier, prevent colds and flu and prevent the spread of illness. So love yourself, and those around you — wash your hands. MOW
