Firefighters learn to respond instantly, even from a sound sleep, to the station's alarm bell. Before a civilian could figure out what the noise is, the firefighters are wide awake, in their gear and halfway to the ladder truck. Retired with distinction from the Ennis Fire Department last June, Freddy Santos has been answering that bell, in one way or another, for more than 40 years.

First, Freddy has answered by making the most of opportunities as they arise. Beginning in October 1971 when, upon completing his U.S. Navy service, he pursued a new job. Having read of an opening for a Ennis sanitation operator, he met with Thelma Gooch, the city secretary at the time, to apply for the job. Instead, she sent him to see then Chief D.D. Day about an opening in the Fire Department. He still laughs about one of the chief's first questions: whether Freddy was tolerant of smoke and fire. "I told him I was raised around smoke and fire," Freddy smiled. "We had lived in several homes that used cast-iron, wood-burning stoves for cooking and heat. So there were days we would be run out of the house by smoke."

He was hired on a trial basis that month as a hose man, gaining permanent status in June 1972. The following summer the fire department took over the ambulance service — before then, funeral homes provided the only emergency transportation to hospitals — and Freddy trained as one of Ennis's very first Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs).

A second way Freddy has always answered the bell is to do his best work, whatever the job. As he did, he rose through the ranks to make captain in 1977. Then, in 1999, he was transferred from firefighting to the Building Code and Code Enforcement program, under the direction of Fire Marshal and Chief Building Inspector Buddy Markham, who just recently retired on December 31, 2011. "I will always believe fire prevention is the backbone of the fire department's service," he said. His promotion to the inspection department allowed him to channel his energy into this top priority.

While Freddy takes fire prevention and safety very seriously, he appreciates humor and knows the value of having fun. During his firehouse days, he enjoyed the inevitable ribbing and practical jokes as much as anyone. But the magnum opus of the prank repertoire happened to every brand-new recruit early in his probationary period.

All the other firefighters would get up in the small hours one morning, tiptoeing out of the bunkroom to avoid disturbing the recruit. Then they would climb into full firefighting gear and pull the ladder truck out. The elaborate preparations included smearing soot on their faces and jackets and having someone start **( (** Though I made many mistakes, the mark of a good person is not his downfall, but his rebound. **)**

washing down the truck as if they had been on a call. When the stage was set, a couple of the men would clatter into the bunkhouse, waking the recruit and then act surprised to see him still there. "Man, you missed a fire!" they would exclaim.

A broad smile creased Freddy's face. "You should have seen the looks on their faces they just knew they were going to lose their jobs. It was all in fun, of course. We never did any harm, and when the bell did ring — well, we were all business." Later, of course, the victim would enthusiastically help pull the same prank on the next recruit.

Besides seizing opportunities and giving his best effort, Freddy answers the bell through his fierce loyalty and respect for his many colleagues, regardless of rank. He would rather tell you about their leadership and



assistance over the years than talk about himself. In fact, since retirement, he said, "The most important thing I miss is the camaraderie of the people I worked with."

He is grateful to every member of the inspection department and the firefighters, both paid and volunteer. Each one has had an impact on his life, especially Buddy, under whom he retired. "We worked side-by-side for over 35 years," he said. "I would put Buddy up alongside any fire marshal and any building inspector in Texas, as far as knowledge of the job, and he would come out on top." He smiled and added,



"I'm not bragging — it's just the truth." Freddy also singles out the fire chiefs who have led the fire department, from D.D. Day through Rocky Harber and Mike Seeley, to current Chief David Hopkins. All have contributed to its growth. Of Chief Hopkins, he

said, "I've always thought of him as a visionary. When he first came [in 1986], he implemented the 9-1-1 system — the greatest thing that could have happened to Ennis."

Freddy reserved his most eloquent praise for Lisa Laza, Ennis Fire Department's secretary. "We served side-by-side for nearly 13 years, with never a bad word between us. She was my right arm, always willing to assist in every endeavor."

The flip side of that loyalty and gratitude is Freddy's humble sense of who he is. Despite the many awards and commendations he has received, including several Firefighter of the Year awards and the Medal of Valor, he refuses to take those accolades personally. Instead, he focuses on the department's motto: "Protecting the Past ... Preparing the Future." He also points to those who made his success happen, high among

them his wife, Mary. "I would not be the man I am today without her by my side," he asserted.

But Freddy gives even more credit to Jesus, whom he said he serves first. The Serenity Prayer plaque on his desk "reminded me daily of how much God loves us." And he viewed his city vehicle as both pulpit and prayer station, praying each morning for wisdom and direction to do the best job possible.

The answer to that prayer was evident at his retirement celebration, where he received great honor and many gifts. One retirement gift sums up Freddy's service: a miniature fire bell, now displayed in his curio cabinet, engraved "Always Answering the Bell." Freddy still answers that bell, even in retirement, as he looks for new opportunities and challenges.

To young people considering a firefighting career, Freddy offers this advice: "Talk with some firefighters and make sure it's the career you want." As for himself, he is proud to have served. "Though I made many mistakes, the mark of a good person is not his downfall, but his rebound.

"It's been a long journey," he mused, then read the motto from the commemorative shadow box he also received at retirement. "It's important to have an end to the journey ... but it's the journey that matters in the end." **NOW**



# Portrait of a

An artist who's lived in big cities and traveled the world now calls Palmer home. She enjoys every minute of time spent with her husband, their feline menagerie and the canvas and brush that record her view of the world and its people. An Atlanta native, Lois Nightingale moved to Ellis County with her Britishborn husband, Roger, in 2005. Although they were a part of the social whirl of Washington, D.C. and North Dallas, they haven't loved life more than they do now in their gracious home overlooking the distant, wintry valleys of Bristol. "We always thought we'd live in the country eventually," Lois said. "But the chance came sooner than we thought!"

The view from her second story studio is fittingly pastoral, and while she admits to drinking in inspiration from the sunshine and greenery, especially in spring when the hills are drenched in the hue and spirit of the bluebonnet, Lois is not a landscape painter. "My passion is portraiture," she explained. "I love the human face. I also like rendering animals, like our cats, and I do some still life. But painting people is what I do best. It's intriguing because of the bond you form with your subjects. After a time you kind of fall in love with them a little bit."

Painting came late for Lois. As a teenager she tried her hand sporadically, producing a few canvases, including one watercolor of a tiger, now grimacing on the family room wall. Yet a decade passed before she found the incentive to create full time. "I knew I had a natural ability, but I never thought I'd have an opportunity to really hone it," she said.

Always drawn to the visual, she studied design at the University of Georgia, afterward supporting herself as a graphic artist. But her busy life held no time for painting. That changed after her husband, an engineering manager in D.C., received







a lucrative job offer in Texas, allowing her to retire. "Roger said, This is your time to paint,' so finally I had the time to work on it and to realize that it's what I want to do in life."

Moving to Dallas in 2001, Lois attended an exhibition by DeDe Barr whom she contacted and studied with later. "It all started then," Lois said. "I loved her style and learned so much. She's been the biggest influence on my painting." Her work with DeDe continued after Roger decided to purchase a local manufacturing business and the pair left Dallas for their current home, located seven miles from Ennis nestled in the countryside just outside Palmer.

Happy in her new house, Lois concentrates on her canvases, creating in pastel, watercolor and oil. She is modest about her talent, choosing to ascribe credit to her former teacher. But the artist's own imprint of personality and taste is unmistakable, illuminating the portraits of friends, family members and commissioned sitters lining the walls of her studio loft and in rooms throughout her home.


Her penchant for the color blue, particularly tones of periwinkle and turquoise, is a recognizable favorite in the moody scenes she specializes in. Typical subjects are a range of beautiful, tranquil women, one of whom is her sister, another a historical lady based on a John Singer Sargent classic; still others are sitters from her days as a pupil of DeDe Barr. The feeling of serenity in Lois' portraits is expressed primarily in the languid pose of her subjects, often caught in a pensive moment, some


depicted in a reclining position. Each placid picture is enhanced by a suggestion of mystery in the fascinating play of light and shadow that is another hallmark of Lois' contemplative, romantic style.

The artist prefers to paint from life, but she has done subjects based on photographs, such as a piece she's currently working on for a civic charity, and one she created some time ago that left a deep impression on her. "I once painted a teenage girl in a bridesmaid dress from a photo her mother submitted," Lois recalled. "The girl had died in a car accident so there was a lot of emotion caught up in doing a portrait. As I painted her, I felt a spiritual connection and I completed the picture very quickly. It was like it was painting itself. I'm not a New Age kind of person, but I have to say it was an experience I've never had before. It was very moving."

Traditional inspiration for Lois stems from her family – her very first portrait was a pastel of her mother which she gave her for her 80th birthday. She has also painted her stepchildren and hopes to record for posterity all her eight brothers and sisters. Lois doesn't know where she finds her energy and commitment to the art she loves. "It's just a strong need, a passion. The feel of the paintbrush, seeing the paint taking form, is so absorbing. And since I don't have biological children of my own, I see my pictures as a legacy, a tribute to my family."

In her work, Lois also takes cues from the great masters she adores. Apart from Sargent, she is motivated by late 19th century French Impressionists. "They weren't known for portraiture," she admitted, "but I love their style."





# Common Cold

It is that time of the year again. The common cold virus is everywhere. Even though viral upper respiratory infections can occur at any time, when it gets cold, we expect the sniffles to follow. Although it is easy to blame catching an infection on the change in temperature, the increase in colds during the winter is more likely from people being indoors together more and having more of an opportunity of passing germs between them.

Colds are caused by hundreds of viruses and are easily spread by direct contact. Anyone who is ill and sneezes or coughs in the air is releasing a multitude of viruses capable of infecting another person. Because there are so many viruses that cause the infection, you can become ill multiple times in a season. Your best course of action would be to try to prevent becoming sick.

High on everyone's list of prevention is to wash your hands frequently. If water and soap are not available, use a hand sanitizer. The cold virus can live on surfaces. If you touch an area that has been contaminated, you can easily transfer the virus to yourself. In that light, try to keep your hands off your face. If there is a member of the household who is ill, you can avoid getting sick by practicing good sanitation methods and disposing of contaminated tissues in the proper manner. Guard your health by drinking plenty of water and avoid smoking, even secondhand smoke can be detrimental. Smoking irritates the nasal passageways, which interferes with its ability to filter out foreign substances. Try to get enough restorative sleep. Eat a balanced diet and take a multi-vitamin. Vitamins help your immune system. You cannot always tell if someone is sick so never drink after anyone. Just be on guard and avoid people who are sick.

If you do catch a cold, the bad news is there is no medication to make it go away. However, there are remedies to try to make your illness more bearable. Gargle with one-half teaspoon salt in eight ounces of warm water for your sore throat. Sucking on throat lozenges can help also. Drink plenty of fluids to help flush out impurities, to loosen mucus and to avoid dehydration if fever is present. Over-the-counter medications are usually sufficient for the symptoms of cough, runny nose, stuffiness and fever. A cold will usually last anywhere from 4 days to a couple of weeks. Although there are things you can do to feel better, try to not get sick by practicing good health. **NOW**





## My Daily Green Salad

 $1 \ 1/2$  cups mixed salad greens 1/8 cup crumbled Blue Cheese 1/8 cup Emerald glazed pecans 1/2 Granny Smith apple, diced 1 tsp. extra virgin olive oil

I. Toss all ingredients and serve.

### **Beef Bourgounione**

2-3 lbs. stew meat 1 10.5-oz. can cream of mushroom soup 1/2 to 3/4 pkg. dry onion soup mix I cup red wine 1 pkg. fresh mushrooms or sliced mushrooms, to taste Rice or noodles, your choice Sour cream, desired amount

**I.** Place beef on bottom of casserole dish, then add soups, wine and mushrooms.

2. Cook covered at 300 F for 3 hours. Serve on top of rice or noodles. 3. Top with sour cream.

#### Mediterranean Seafood Stew

- 1 medium onion, finely chopped  $1 \ 1/2$  tsp. garlic, minced (divided use)
- 1 Tbsp. olive oil
- 1/2 lb. plum tomatoes, seeded
- and diced
- I tsp. lemon peel, grated
- I tsp. red pepper flakes, crushed
- I cup clam juice
- 1/3 cup white wine or additional clam juice
- 1 Tbsp. tomato paste
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1 lb. orange roughy or red snapper fillets, cut into 1-inch cubes
- I lb. large shrimp, uncooked, peeled and deveined
- 1/2 lb. sea scallops

#### 1/3 cup fresh parsley, minced 1/3 cup reduced-fat mayonnaise

I. In a Dutch oven or large saucepan, sauté onion and 1/2 tsp. garlic in oil until tender. **2.** Add tomatoes, lemon peel and pepper flakes: cook and stir for 2 minutes. Add the clam juice, wine or additional clam juice, tomato paste and salt. Bring to a boil. 3. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 10 minutes or until heated through. 4. Add fish, shrimp, scallops and parsley. Cover and cook for 8-10 minutes or until the fish flakes easily with a fork, the shrimp turns pink and the scallops are opaque. 5. Combine mayonnaise and remaining garlic. Use one dollop for each serving.

## **Classic Ganache**

1/2 cup heavy cream 8 oz. pkg. bittersweet, semisweet, milk or white chocolate, chopped 2 Tbsp. butter Nuts, coconut or powered sugar, if making truffles (optional)

I. In saucepan, bring cream to a boil. Pour over chocolate; let stand 1 minute. 2. Stir until smooth. Add butter; stir until melted. Cool.

3. Serve as a sauce over ice cream or whip up a wonderful frosting by using an electric mixer and beating until fluffy. Then frost your favorite cake, cupcakes or cookies.

4. For bite-sized truffles that are bliss: chill sauce until firm. Take 1 Tbsp. of Ganache and shape into 1-inch balls; roll in chopped nuts, coconut or confectioner's sugar.

## **Brie Puff Pastry Appetizer**

1 sheet Pepperidge Farm puff pastry, thawed

- 1 8-oz. Brie cheese round
- 1 egg
- 1 Tbsp. water

I. Heat oven to 400 F. Unfold pastry sheet on floured surface. Place cheese in center. Fold pastry over cheese to cover.

2. Trim excess pastry and press to seal. Reserve pastry scraps for a bow or leaf decoration on top, if desired.

3. Beat egg with water. Brush seam of pastry with egg mixture. Place seam side down onto baking sheet. Brush with egg mixture. 4. Bake 25 minutes or until golden brown. Let stand 20 minutes.
