





Her love of the game started early when she exchanged ballet slippers for cleats. "I grew up in an athletic family, so I was encouraged to do sports. I thought I would try soccer, and I just really enjoyed it," she shared. "I kept going to the next level, and it just blossomed into something I love to do."

The fast nature of the game keeps her going. "I love the tempo of the game. You have to make a fast decision, so you don't really plan it out. You just read the other team. I really like that," she explained. Hands down (literally), her favorite part of the game is heading the ball. "I just feel powerful when I head the ball," she smiled. After her elementary years, she continued soccer by joining a select team. She started on the Dallas Texans, a second-tier club team, but moved over to Sting in the seventh grade. McKayla credits this move to developing into a stronger player. "It was a challenge at first, working my way up to playing a lot. But, it's cool to look back at where I was and where I am now," she

explained. During this time, McKayla began thinking about her future as a soccer player.

Being on Texas A&M University's soccer team was a longtime dream of hers. She regularly attended A&M soccer camps during her middle school summers. "Back then, I didn't really see it as a possibility," she shared. "I just thought, Oh, that would be so awesome to go there. But, not until I really started to



come into my own as a player did I think it was a possibility."

During her freshman year of high school, however, McKayla decided to go after her dream. With emails and phone calls to the Texas A&M coach, she developed a relationship with the collegiate team. She was determined, even at an early stage in the recruiting process. "I just knew I needed to get a jump on it. Texas A&M is pretty competitive as far as soccer goes, and the more elite schools are, the earlier people commit. They want to grab the best players before anyone else can," she explained.

Before long Texas A&M made an offer to McKayla, but they weren't the only ones. "I was torn between Baylor University, Rice University and Texas A&M, because I received offers from all three of them," she said. Ultimately, however, she decided on Texas A&M, her dream school.

14th in the nation. Although McKayla recognizes the fierce competition, she's confident she will learn and grow as a player. "It's a little intimidating, but I'm excited, and I know it's going to be great," she shared.

McKayla credits this confidence to walk into the college team largely to her faith. "I'm a strong Christian, and I feel God's glory when I'm on the field. I enjoy playing with that purpose," she said.

Her confidence also stems from her time as captain of her high school team. As only a sophomore, McKayla was voted the captain and has continued this role until her senior year. "It was pretty intimidating, because I was still an underclassman," she remembered. "I didn't want to step on toes or go over boundaries. I was leading by example and gaining respect on the field." McKayla used her sophomore year to learn about leadership and earn trust with her fellow teammates.

The following year, however, McKayla blossomed into a more vocal leader. Her leadership style changed a lot during her junior year. "I gained enough respect so I could branch out to being more vocal to people on the field. I'll tell them, 'Good job,' or 'Hey, try this next time," she described.

Thanks to the support from her coach, family and friends, McKayla has high hopes for her future. "I was listening to a sermon about when God called Moses from a burning bush. God told Moses to go out, and Moses didn't think that he could do it. That whole sermon was about God putting tasks in front of people they aren't necessarily up for," she shared. 

He finally popped the question, and you said, "Yes!" Now it is time to plan your wedding. When you sit down to plan, you may be overwhelmed trying to figure out where to begin. Several things should be considered: the date, the location, the cost, etc. But one of the major tasks to think about is finding the dress. No matter how long the engagement, it is never too early to start shopping for your wedding attire.

One of the first things to decide regarding the perfect dress is budget. A good rule is to budget 10 percent of the overall wedding fund for the dress, accessories and alterations. Wedding dresses can cost anywhere from \$400-\$4,000 depending on the store and brand. Larger bridal stores will have less expensive dresses, whereas the bridal salons will have pricier designer dresses with handmade details. If your wish is to have a custom-made dress, expect to pay more. When you decide what your dress budget will be, factor in the cost of alterations. Alterations for your dress can cost \$100 or more. Remember, most dresses don't come with a bustle, so you will have to pay an alteration fee.



Another thing to consider when shopping for a wedding dress, is your body type. Some brides make the mistake of planning to shop for a dress when they have lost weight or ordering a dress in the size they plan to be for the wedding. It is best to shop early and purchase a dress based on your current size. You can always have the dress altered later if you lose weight. Body type is more than just dress size, you need to think about your body shape as well. Are you shaped more like an hourglass? A triangle-or pear-shape? An apple-shape? Or a rectangle-shape? Knowing your shape can help you determine which dresses will accentuate your best features and mask the ones you like least.

Shopping for your dress may be stressful, but it should be fun and exciting as well. Consider bringing a close friend or family member with you while you shop. Second opinions can help when you are trying to narrow down your











choices. Then there is the added bonus of having someone who isn't working on commission tell you how beautiful you are. Of course, you can bring more than one person with you while you browse, but don't feel obligated to bring everyone who expresses a desire to go with you.



Whatever dress you decide to wear, make sure you love it. Begin shopping early to allow time to look at multiple stores with plenty of time for shipping your dress. With many bridal store options available, you are sure to find the dress that fits your budget and your body type perfectly. Don't be afraid to go back and try a dress on two or three times. After all, you will be gracing the aisle, and you'll want to feel good about how you look.



For more help with planning your wedding, here is a timeline to keep you on track:

12 Months Before:

- Select a date.
- Think about the wedding type formal or informal.
- Set a budget.
- Hire a wedding planner, if desired.
- Reserve ceremony and reception sites.
- Select attendants.
- Select and book caterers, photographers, videographers, florists, musicians, etc.
- Begin compiling guest list.
- Shop for wedding dress and accessories.
- Start planning honeymoon.

Nine Months Before:

- Order your dress and accessories.
- Create a wedding website.

Six Months Before:

- Send save-the-date cards.
- Sign contracts and place deposits for wedding services.
- Reserve rental equipment tables, chairs, tents, etc.
- Meet with officiant to go over ceremony details.
- Choose attendants' attire.
- Order wedding cake.
- Book honeymoon.
- Begin planning rehearsal.

people here in Mansfield." The nonprofit has since morphed into a fundraising organization to benefit other charities in the area.

In the beginning, Mansfield Cares offered food vouchers to families who shopped at the former Winn-Dixie grocery store in Mansfield. In order to reach these families, the team partnered with the Common Ground Network, another nonprofit organization. "The vouchers were cards we paid for in advance and brought to the Common Ground Network. They had already taken applications from people who needed assistance at Thanksgiving or Christmas," Chuck described. "Common Ground put the vouchers in the hands of people who needed them."

From the vouchers, the group met another need — back-to-school items. "We started a back-to-school program to help pay for school supplies and expanded it to help buy shoes for the kids also," he said.

The more Mansfield Cares dug deeply into the community, the more needs emerged. Many single parents approached the organization asking if they could provide affordable/free child care. With the help of one board member, the organization was able to provide free child care at a local Montessori school for single parents who needed to leave for afternoon job interviews.

In 2000, the organization decided to raise funds with their first ever charity ball held that November. The event has grown into a glamorous social event, which has raised thousands of dollars. "We have always been really good stewards of the money collected.

And now, we've expanded to many other things," Chuck remarked.

From the generous donations Mansfield Cares received, a new medical center called The Nix Family Caring Place was born in 2009. "The Nix Family Caring Place was a concept that started as a round-table discussion," he recalled. "At one of our board meetings, we asked the question: What is our mission? We can keep raising funds, but that's not enough.' So we came up with the concept of a nofee clinic, where people who don't have health insurance or had been turned away from the hospital could go."

Dr. Wendy Collini, a geriatric doctor and Mansfield Cares Board member, agreed to help the organization get the free clinic open and graciously donated hours of her time on Thursday mornings to see patients as soon as the original clinic opened in 2002. "Dr. Collini made arrangements with the owners of a building to provide a suite for us free of charge," he said. For nearly 10 years, Dr. Collini was the only doctor on call at the clinic. Then Dr. Barry Cole, a dentist,





and Dr. Kyle Cook, an ophthalmologist, joined her. Now, with the Nix Family Caring Place open, patients have a wider variety of nocost services available. Dr. Cook even works to help children get glasses, should they need them.

Eventually, with the generous donations from donors and board members, the organization was able to purchase 3 acres of land, plus they received a

donation of 2 acres from Randy and Valerie Hague, to construct the Caring Place. They knew they would be able to find more services to fill the building, and an opportunity quickly presented itself. Mansfield ISD approached the organization about using some of the space in the center's building for a site-based clinic with John Peter Smith Hospital (JPS). "JPS has site-based clinics where students who need medical attention and don't have insurance



won't have to go all the way up to Fort Worth," Chuck explained. "The clinic was already set up in Mansfield, but MISD just needed the space. We thought it was a great idea to partner with them, so they came into the building in November 2010."




A few years after JPS came into the building, another organization approached Mansfield Cares for assistance. Harvesting International Ministries, a Mansfield nonprofit that offers free food for families in need. was losing their lease on their property where they had been located. Two local businessmen and supporters of Mansfield Cares approached the organization about using some of Mansfield Cares' property to build a new facility for their food bank. "They asked us, 'If we give you some seed money, would you raise the rest and help us build the food bank?' We did and dedicated it on October 8, 2013," Chuck smiled. The food bank is now located near The Caring Place. Although Mansfield Cares owns the building, Harvesting International runs the food bank and its day-to-day operations.

Throughout the 15 years that Chuck has been dedicated to the organization, he has found great satisfaction in coming alongside both people in need and nonprofits. "She couldn't work because she was having to take care of her kids, but we helped her get on her feet, get a place to stay and get money in her pocket," Chuck recalled. "Now, she's working full time. She has her life on track. You can't buy that."

Vincent Quilantan has
experienced life in a way that not
many people have. In 2006, this
young man's world changed in
more ways than one — he lost his
father, but he gained his identity.
At the age of 15, his father
passed away, and Vincent made
the conscious decision to selflessly
forgo college. He made this
altruistic choice in order to take
care of and provide for his sister,
Vanessa, and his mother, Emily.

Vincent set aside his ambitious dreams of going to a big university to study astronomy. He relinquished the visions of prestige and monetary success. Quite simply, he placed his family and their needs before his wants and desires. He decided to step up and help his mother provide for the family. He decided to take care of business. "Not once did I realize I would reap any sort of reward from this experience," he admitted humbly.

After the death of his father, Vincent found himself approaching his high school graduation. And leading up to this monumental point in his life, he had considered many career paths ranging from astronomy to graphic design.

Having taken both art and astronomy during his high school career, he knew that art would remain a constant in his life regardless of his career direction. He also knew producing art by way of a career was not what he wanted. And while he did not pursue college, he did pursue work which provided him income and time to hone his craft.

Even at such a young age, Vincent knew art as a job would kill his passion, so he avoided that route like the plague. "I knew I didn't want to turn my art into business so I could make money," he said. "I wanted to keep it personal. I do it for fun now, but had I made a career











out of it, it probably wouldn't be any fun at all."

Despite the fact he didn't pursue a career in the field of astronomy, he never gave up his love for the sky either. The stars and the solar system have proven to be a great source of inspiration for his artistic outlet. It all began with a few crude self-designed stencils, a couple of cans of spray paint and canvas. What resulted was something amazing, original and quite unique.

Through the trauma and all of the unexpected tough life decisions, Vincent found his purpose in life. He found













meaning. He found art. "Art has allowed me to express myself in ways I didn't know I could. It's given me focus — well, refocus in life."

In order to manage his grief and stress, Vincent turned to stencils, paint and canvas for therapeutic release. And over the years, his talent has evolved into a thoughtful and skillful technique, a passion. It's something that has transformed from therapeutic beginnings to conferrals of kindness. "I have never made money from my paintings," he confessed. "For me, just seeing the reaction of the person for whom I paint something is worth it."

Now the stencils Vincent designs and uses are layered and extremely intricate. Vincent captures an image then uses computer software to transform it into layers. Each layer is then printed off one-by-one onto card stock. Next, he carefully cuts out each layer using an X-Acto knife to ensure precision. Once all of the layers are complete, painting begins. Placing one layer of the print at a time on the canvas, Vincent uses spray





paint to recreate the larger image. He manipulates the paint to create interesting colors, unique textures and inventive effects. The finished masterpiece is something of pure originality, and as Vincent says, "My most freeing form of expression. Art is my release."

He specializes in "planetscapes," but he also does portraits. Basically, he can and will paint anything. To date he has done about 80 to 100 different pieces, all of which he has simply given away. His work isn't about monetary gain, but rather sharing his gift, his vision. Each painting represents far more than a deconstructed image put back together again with great care, layer by layer. Each painting is a piece of Vincent and extension of his gentle and loving nature.

While it isn't exactly painting, one of the most impressive and imaginative works of art is his bedroom. Vincent spent countless hours covering every square inch of surface space with pages




from comic books using découpage. The ceiling, the ceiling fan blades, the wall, the mini-blind slats, literally everything is covered in images of classic animated super heroes in action. "It was definitely a labor of love."

Although painting is Vincent's primary area of expertise, it isn't the only art form he's passionate about. Music is another ability he has spent time learning and producing. Specifically, Vincent plays the drums. With roots in punk rock and Bob Dylan, diversity is his muse. And although he only plays for fun, it is something he has enjoyed learning how to do. "I got a drum kit from a friend of mine," he shared, "and I haven't stopped playing."

But the fascinating thing about all of this is Vincent is self-taught. He has never had a formal lesson in either painting or music. Sure, he took the standard art course in high school where he was able to experiment with various forms of composition and types of mediums, but his designs and paintings are 100-percent original and authentic. Clearly, his talent exceeds his present artistic passions.

Somewhere along the way, he picked up yet another constant in life — coffee! It's safe to say concocting the perfect

















cup of joe is very much an art form in and of itself. From the right amount of flavoring to the perfect temperature to the espresso-to-cream ratio, it takes a skillful hand to achieve the ever-popular artistic concoctions. Currently, Vincent works in the Tom Thumb Starbucks as a store manager/barista. "I love my job. One of the things I love about working there is interacting with the customers. I've done it for so long now I don't even have to think as I make the drinks. I really get to enjoy the customers. It's really not even like work."

However, making coffee and homespun art isn't what Vincent envisions for the rest of his life. He still imagines the possibilities for the future. Considering his diverse array of talents, his possibilities are endless. From making fancy coffee to experimenting with music to producing original paintings, Vincent has both a wide palette of talents and impressive artistic flare. 

Banana Bread

1/2 cup oil

1/4 cup buttermilk

2 eggs

2 ripe bananas

1 Tbsp. ground cinnamon

1 1/2 cups whole wheat flour

1 1/4 cups brown sugar (or powdered Stevia)

1 Tbsp. baking powder

1/2 tsp. salt

1/2 cup dried cranberries or raisins

1/2 cup dark chocolate chips

1/2 cup pecans or walnuts, chopped

I. Lightly grease one loaf pan; preheat oven to 325 F.

2. Mix oil, buttermilk and eggs in a bowl. Once thoroughly mixed, add remaining ingredients. Mix until wet, but do not

overmix. Pour into greased pan.

3. Bake for 40-50 minutes.

Italian Turkey Meatloaf

1 lb. ground turkey

3/4 cup tomato juice

1/2 cup quick (or old-fashioned) oats

1/2 cup onion, diced

I egg, beaten

I tsp. celery salt

1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce

1 Tbsp. dried Italian herbs

1/2 cup marinara sauce (divided use)

1. Lightly grease 1 loaf pan; preheat oven to 350 F.

2. Mix first 8 ingredients and 1/4 cup of marinara sauce in a bowl. Pour into loaf pan. Top with remaining marinara sauce.

3. Bake for 50-60 minutes. Let cool for 10 minutes before cutting and serving.

Better Choice Macaroni and Cheese

I oz. butter (or oil)

1 oz. flour

2 cups low-fat milk

2 oz. reduced fat cheese, shredded

1 cup whole wheat elbows, cooked 1/2 cup frozen peas, thawed

Salt and white pepper, to taste

1. Heat butter or oil in pan over medium heat. When melted, add flour and stir for 1 minute. Cook the flour, but do not brown.

2. Add milk quickly, while stirring constantly. Flour will thicken. If there are lumps in the sauce, strain them out.

3. Sprinkle cheese into sauce while stirring; allow to melt but do not boil. Once cheese melts, mix in elbow noodles and peas. Season with salt and pepper.

Crispy Chicken Fingers

1/4 cup flour

Salt, pepper and paprika, to taste

2 eggs

1/4 cup water or milk

4 slices of whole wheat bread, toasted, crumbled

Italian dried herbs, to taste

1 lb. chicken tenders or boneless breasts, cut into strips or chunks

I. Preheat oven for 375 F.

2. Mix flour, salt, pepper and paprika in

3. Beat eggs with water or milk in another bowl. Put toast crumbs and Italian herbs in third bowl.

4. Dredge chicken through flour, shaking off excess. Dip chicken into egg mixture; allow excess to drain. Place into seasoned crumbs and press onto chicken. Place breaded chicken on lightly greased baking sheet.

5. Bake for 15 minutes or until chicken is cooked through.
