



Happy Valentine's Day!





Ralph Cooke has long been a hidden treasure in Waxahachie. His friend, Brown Street Church of Christ elder Glenn Perryman, believes it is time for that to change. "Ralph recently celebrated his 90th birthday," Glenn said. "He's a true craftsman and artist whose work has rarely been seen beyond his family and friends. By trade, he was a carpenter yet so much more, and it is truly an honor to know him."

The works Glenn refers to are Ralph's wood carvings. Some, like his musical instruments, are exquisite. Others are whimsical, primitive or intricate. All are simply breathtaking. His subjects range from stringed instruments, bowls and plates, birds, horses, children and historical figures to word-by-word Bible verses and historic speeches. He gets his ideas from things he sees. It may be something he's seen in a magazine or, sometimes, an idea that pops into his head. "Then, sometimes, the wood tells me," Ralph shared.

Ralph's workshop is behind his house. He goes to it every day. On the way, he passes a picturesque boulder-bordered pond with a waterfall and wooden water wheel. "It used to be a ditch filled with cans and stagnant water," he said. "I cleaned it, put a dam across one end and installed a pump to pull water from the creek." The water is now clean, the waterfall soothing and Ralph's handmade water wheel is unquestionably the perfect touch.

Stocked with tools, boards and beams, the large, dark and low-ceilinged workshop speaks of days, months and years of concentrated work. "Most of my wood comes from scraps or old logs," Ralph explained. Except for the ebony head of his walking cane on which he's carved the Waxahachie Indian chief, Ralph uses mostly Texas-abundant walnut, ash and boxed elder.

Carvings line a shelf above his main workspace. Two are easily recognized as historic Americans. "I saw an illustration of Abraham Lincoln delivering a speech," Ralph said. He was inspired to carve a depiction of President Lincoln in the same stance as the illustration and, amazingly, to etch the entire Gettysburg Address into the background. After completing Abe, Ralph remembered Robert E. Lee as one of America's smartest military men and proceeded to do a carving of Lee on his famous horse, Traveler. On another day, in answer to a special request from a granddaughter (one of his six grandchildren) to make something for her, Ralph looked at a calendar, saw a picture of children in a garden and replicated a carving just for her.

Apart from figures, Ralph also crafts finely fashioned bowls and plates by combining little right-angled pieces of walnut, mahogany and maple into intricately glued and lathed patterns. He also creates realistic horse and bird carvings that do justice to Mother Nature. One day, the workshop cat abruptly stopped, hopped up on the table, stared at and smelled a recently carved bird to assess it as possible prey.

Ralph's father loved music and, as a teenager, Ralph and his brothers had a bluegrass band. "Two of my brothers still play," he said. "I play some on the fiddle and dulcimer." So far, he has made six dulcimers, five mandolins, three fiddles







and a ukulele. "I had a real pretty piece of wood that wasn't big enough to make anything but a ukulele," he smiled. One dulcimer is double-necked and can be played by two musicians at once. Ralph even made a custom case for it.

Seventh of 12 children, Ralph grew up on his family's farm between Ennis and Waxahachie. "I've lived in Ellis County all my life," he said. For him, wood carving started when he was about 10 years old. "Like my daddy, I'm kind of a jack-of-all-trades," he grinned. "That's the way it was back in the Depression. If you needed something, you figured out how to make it."

Making things from wood became his direction and passion. He started building cabinets in high school wood shop and, whenever possible, watched and listened to experienced carpenters. "I learned mostly by seeing," he admitted.

When it was time to earn a living, Ralph became a carpenter. For many years, he built houses all over the county. "Carpenters were very different then," he explained. Before standards, codes and housing developments encouraged tradesmen to diversify and made contractors necessities, a carpenter could












largely be a one-man show. "I would cut the weeds, lay out the foundation, put up the walls, make the cabinets and basically build the house," he shared.

In fact, Ralph built the home just outside of Waxahachie where he and his wife, Juanita, lived for 36 years and where their two sons grew up. Seventeen years ago, he and Juanita moved to a home next door to their youngest son and his family and, naturally, Ralph set to work. "I turned the garage into an extra room and added a new garage," he said. He also refinished the kitchen cabinets and added an island.

More than 54 years ago, a mutual friend of Ralph and Juanita's, Wanda Pindely, arranged for the two to meet. His first wife had died three years into their marriage, leaving Ralph with an infant son. "Three years later, my family and Wanda decided I needed help, so they got busy," he grinned. "Juanita had grown up in Maypearl, but she was a



telephone operator so I had to go to Dallas to get her."

Today, his and Juanita's home is a picture of comfort and beauty. Most of the furniture was made by Ralph — including a large walnut entertainment center crafted from a tree that had to be removed from his church grounds. There's also a coffee table, cabinet, desk, headboard and a stunning cedar-lined walnut hope chest. "I'm most proud of the chest," Ralph said. "The wood is cut into pieces and inset." He was only 15 when he designed and made the chest for a brother and his wife.

When not in his workshop or at home with Juanita, Ralph can be found at Brown Street Church of Christ managing the Care Center two days a week. "He was a church elder for many years," Glenn shared. "Now, Ralph operates the Care Center dedicated to distributing food and clothing to people in need."

Beginning with a passion for the art of carving, Ralph ultimately became a carpenter to provide for his family. When the time arrived for him to forgo hard carpenter work, he returned to his art. "I can't get it out of my blood, I guess," he smiled. Surely, the treasures of this hidden treasure now stand ready to be shared. NOW

CHANGING LIVES

Young boys dream of action, adventure, inventions and a desire to go places they have never gone before. When the daunting question of "how" begins to fill their minds, it is the energized adults who take them further than they imagined. In the case of Waxahachie's Cub Scout Pack 681, the horizon is not the limit — it is only the beginning.



As the cafeteria at Shackleford Elementary buzzed with the hum of young men sharing stories of their day one Tuesday night, Pack 681 fostered a commitment to ideals dating further back than anyone in the room had been alive. The ideals live and breathe just as vividly as when Sir Robert Baden-Powell founded the Boy Scouts in 1908, and with leaders like Cub master John Knepler and committee chair David Turner helming Pack 681, the philosophy continues to impact the community through the annual Pinewood Derby in March.


"You will learn things from the pack opportunity that you cannot find anywhere else," John explained. "You reach a common goal with the help of others, and recognize responsibility in front of your peers and superiors. We learn about God and country in a peer-on-peer group."

Cub Scout Pack 681 is in the Southern Star District of the Circle 10 Council of the Boy Scouts of America. In fall 2013, the pack found itself depleted in numbers, with no money or resources. Rising like a phoenix from the ashes, the pack now is the largest in Ellis County, with fiercely loyal recruiting led by John and David. "We felt if we were going to run the most successful pack, we had a huge responsibility," John said. "There are smaller packs in Ellis County, and our commitment is to open all our events to the rest of the district. Five other units came to our Cub mobile race last April, and that's what we want to see with the pinewood derby. We want every dad and



grandpa who remembers racing to come and bring a car to the event and join us."

"We have fun activities with a whole lot of purpose," David noted, "which is part of the goal of the pinewood derby." The boys are given a lump of wood and fashion their own design. As they work, they learn patience, as well



as organizational and critical-thinking skills, on how to design a car that will run faster.

"This is really a feel-good event, and we want to do more with the community," John pointed out. "We love people to come out and reminisce about their derby days."

The Cub Scouts encompass ages 6 through 11 and grades one through five. As Tigers, Wolves, Bears, Webelos I and II, the members learn the skills and knowledge necessary to advance to the Boy Scouts. Along with that are the den leaders, parents and adult volunteers who spend hours in training, as well as in preparing for the activities and weekly meetings.

Wolves' member Andrew Davis, 7, knows when he comes on Tuesdays, he will have fun. "My favorite is the Cub mobile," he said with a huge grin lighting his face. "We got to build a car and race.





But I've learned a bunch of good stuff," Andrew added, citing a litany of flag rules, including not letting it touch the ground or get dirty.

The Pack stays busy year-round with camping, activities, community service and the annual popcorn sales. The Cub Scouts present the American flag at every



Waxahachie High School football game, as well as carry it in all the city's parades and at Veterans Day events. They collect canned goods on their Scouting for Food weekends in February, and pick up trash along the shoreline of Bardwell Lake during camp outings.

"Our philosophy is we're not just here to teach the boys," David emphasized. "We're here to be part of the community. That's why we invite everyone to the pinewood derby and the Cub mobile race. Every time we are out and about, the great thing about this community is the appreciation. There's been nothing but praise. The town really cares for us."

The Pack will be teaming up with the Waxahachie Rotary Club to put out American flags around town several times throughout the year. In the past, they have assisted the Waxahachie Running Club and the WISD with various charity runs, including the one after the fertilizer

David's wife, Susan, who is a member of the Waxahachie Running Club and serves as the Pack's re-charter membership coordinator, shared her thoughts: "It feels good to know we're helping children grow and become better citizens within our community. All boys are accepted for who they are. We teach them to love each other, be the best of pals and look out for one another." The

Cub Scouts are open to members with physical and/or mental disabilities. Susan recalled a mother of a new pack member, a boy with autism, who shared how her son's experiences with the Pack had helped him come out of his shell.

"This environment helps you become competitive and thrive," David shared. "But they're competitive within the group, not as individuals. No one is ever singled out, and no one is ever made to feel as if they let the pack down. There's a buddy system, and these boys stay together through the years."






(SAGU), Coach Moss started playing sports at the age of 4. He played them all until deciding to gravitate more toward basketball.






a lot of responsibility on their shoulders. Although there are eight teams in their district, they're not counting themselves out. Even if it brings their record down, they want to grow as a team. Coach Moss chooses a different junior or senior team member to lead the group each time, which helps the freshmen and younger players learn by example.
















As Coach Moss pushes and runs his team, he never deliberately puts all the emphasis on one player. Instead, he prefers to have a balanced team and encourages his players to use all their assets. Even when they do have one player who can make all the shots, he believes it's important to have a well-rounded team. He knows he'll always have players that do really well in one area, but to grow, his players need to have flexibility.







What You Should Know Before You Get an Oral Piercing


Many people in their teens and 20s want to get their tongue or lips pierced. This isn't like getting your ears pierced. Unlike your ear lobe, your tongue is a muscle with many blood vessels. To get your tongue pierced, a cork is placed underneath it. A long needle is punched through the sensitive tissue. Then a bar bell is inserted in the hole, and all of this is done without anesthesia. Soon after the bar bell is inserted, your tongue will swell. The swelling is significant and usually lasts for three to five days. Because your tongue is covered with bacteria, they can invade the wound and enter your blood stream. This can result in painful infections that ooze pus into your mouth and throat. If this happens, you need immediate medical attention.

The needle used in a tongue piercing is quite thick, and the sheer size of it can cause problems. If it hits one of the many veins in your tongue, expect heavy bleeding. The nerves in the tongue can be severed, resulting in permanent numbness. You can also lose the ability to taste.

The jewelry itself can present problems. The hard metal ball is constantly hitting the fragile tooth structure, much like a wrecking ball. People with tongue studs tend to habitually bite them, which increases the chance of chipping or scratching a tooth. If the ball becomes loose, you might inhale or swallow it, resulting in serious injury or death. Lip rings can also wear away the gums. This can lead to gingivitis and expose the tooth roots, which can make your teeth sensitive to hot, cold and sweet foods.

Because our goal is to keep your teeth and gums healthy, we do not recommend this fashion statement. If you must get an oral piercing, take some precautions. Make sure the piercing shop is clean. The piercer should be properly trained, follow OSHA guidelines for blood-borne pathogens, use only sterilized needles and equipment and take the time to explain the procedure and follow up care. You should also begin using a brand new toothbrush immediately after the procedure. Oral piercings are a trend that can cause lasting, severe damage, so please think twice before doing it. NOW

My First Pound Cake

1/2 lb. butter2 cups sugar5 whole eggs1 tsp. vanilla flavoring

1. Cream butter and sugar; add eggs and vanilla. Stir in flour. Beat with a wooden

spoon 200 strokes.

2 cups flour

2. Bake in a greased and floured tube pan at 325 F for 1 hour or until toothpick or wire tester comes out clean. Cool 10 minutes before removing from pan.

Sunshine Cake

Cake:

I box yellow cake mix

4 eggs

1/2 cup vegetable oil

11-oz. can Mandarin oranges with juice

Frosting:

20-oz. can crushed pineapple with juice4-oz. box instant vanilla pudding mix9-oz. Cool Whip or other whipped topping

Optional toppings: pecans, Mandarin orange slices, Maraschino cherries, pineapple tidbits or coconut

1. For cake: Combine cake mix, eggs, oil and oranges. Mix according to box directions.

2. Pour into 3 greased and floured 8-inch cake pans. Bake at 350 F for 20 minutes. Cool 10 minutes before turning out on wire rack to cool completely.

3. For frosting: Blend pineapple with pudding mix; let stand for 5 minutes before folding in whipped topping.

4. Frost between layers and on top. Decorate cake top with any of the optional toppings. The cake must be refrigerated and removed about 30 minutes before serving.

Sauerkraut Salad

1/4 cup vinegar

1/2 cup water

1 cup sugar

1/2 cup onion, chopped

1/2 cup green pepper, chopped

1/2 cup red pepper, chopped (may substitute with pimento)

I cup carrots, shredded

1 #2-can sauerkraut (cut strands, but don't rinse)

1. In a saucepan, bring vinegar, water and sugar to a boil. Allow to cool. Pour over remaining ingredients, mixing well. Cover and refrigerate overnight.

Chicken Sour Cream Enchiladas

Enchiladas:

I whole chicken or 4 large chicken breasts, stewed, deboned, shredded

I cup onion, chopped

8 oz. Monterrey Jack cheese, shredded

I Tbsp. shortening or oil (add more as needed)

12 corn tortillas

Sour cream sauce:

1/2 cup butter

1/2 cup flour

1/2 tsp. salt

2 cups chicken broth

1 cup sour cream

Jalapeño pepper slices, fresh or canned

I. For enchiladas: Mix first 3 ingredients together in a large bowl. In a heavy skillet, melt shortening. Heat tortillas in skillet, one at a time, for 2-3 seconds on each side to soften

2. Fill tortillas with chicken mixture. Roll up; place seam-side down in a 9x13-inch baking dish.

3. For sauce: Melt butter in medium sauce pan. Add flour and salt. Stir over low heat to blend.

4. Slowly add broth; stirring until thickened. Remove from heat; fold in sour cream. Pour sauce over enchiladas. Top with jalapeños.

5. Bake at 350 F for about 25-30 minutes to heat through. Can also be heated in microwave at 100-percent power for 10 minutes.
