


Hello Ennis,





Girl Scouts of the USA are 100 years old. Or rather the organization is, and local units affiliated with the Northeast Texas chapter are preparing to mark the occasion this month with an all-out festival, set to take place in Waxahachie's Courthouse Square. 'It's hard to believe it has been 100 years," admitted Teresa Watson, service manager of Ennis Service Unit 252 for the last four years. 'And we're excited to have a special day to celebrate."

The events in the county seat scheduled for March 24 will include a fashion show and involve units from across the region. Girls from Ennis, Palmer, Waxahachie, Red Oak and other cities will welcome vendors and the general public while participating in a variety of activities. "We're still putting final touches to the lineup," explained Teresa, a member of the organizing committee. "But we know it's going to be fun for everybody."

That's not hard to believe. The Girl Scouts and the communities that support them have been having fun all along. The public loves the cookies that have made the Girl Scouts famous, but members of the group love the delicious treats even more because funds raised from sales go toward the camping adventures and field trips they live for. "The girls all look forward to going to camp," Teresa said. "That's what Girl Scouts do." And they do it well, whether at the Whispering Cedars camp at Duncanville or closer to home at Bardwell Lake. "The girls are all for it and hold their own," Teresa added. "It's not just boys who can camp out. The members of our unit can be 'girly girls' when they want to, but they are also tough and have braved freezing temperatures and storms."

Walter Beasley agrees the young ladies of Unit 252 are as capable and resilient as any boy. And he should know. Ever since he took his daughter, Kimberley, to a Girl Scouts' meeting in 1978, and was asked to join as camp organizer, he has watched members reach their full potential indoors and out. "Seeing the girls grow up and make their way in life has been great," he explained. "I'm the dad who doesn't know how to say, 'No,' so

I don't regret a minute of being part of the Girl Scouts." After 34 years of volunteering, Walter's own favorite activity is



camping — where he helps teach survival skills, environmental responsibility and teamwork to the girls in his unit. "But it's mostly a time of togetherness where wonderful memories are made doing singa-longs, melting s'mores and telling ghost stories."

Teresa's involvement in Girl Scouts began 15 years ago when she enrolled her daughter, Samantha, in the local unit. Although Samantha is now a married woman, Teresa is as devoted as ever to her unit. "People have asked, "Why do you still do it?"" Teresa related. "I tell them I do it for the girls, as well as for me. I enjoy it as much as they do!"

Fun may be at the center of Girl Scouts' activities, but the

organization carries out important work, and members and their leaders are proud of their accomplishments. From earning badges and awards for levels of physical and intellectual skill sets to learning to compete with others with tact and grace, Girl Scouts learn valuable lessons for life and business. "Bringing young ladies together and seeing them learn what they need to know to sustain them in their adult lives is a blessing," Walter said.

Girls are taught goal setting, public speaking, financial independence and entrepreneurship. The group's annual cookie drive was actually developed to instill "business and economic literacy" in

all girls from first through 12th grades. "It's not about how many cookies are sold or which girl sells the most," a Girl Scouts of Northeast Texas press release stated. "It's about learning to create a business plan, how to sell and how to deliver on a promise." Do-Si-Dos, Samoas, Tagalongs, Thin Mints and other favorite cookie flavors enable the Girl Scouts to do just that.

But the girls go above and beyond their usual sales strategy by

distributing cookies to U.S. Armed Forces, both stateside and overseas. The Unit to Unit campaign is still going strong, with local contributions to the effort numbering some 30,000 packages last year. "Most of our soldiers have come home



from Iraq and Afghanistan, but there are still men and women on the ground there who need a taste of home," Teresa said. "I don't think the Girl Scouts will pull the campaign because the war is over. It's meant to serve our military wherever it is, here or in a foreign country."

The cookie drive and the Unit to Unit initiative have helped bring members of the Girl Scouts even closer together. "We're like a family," Teresa said. "That's how I have always thought of it and getting to work on so many big projects just pulls us together more."

With Ennis and Palmer units boasting more than 115 members, the family is

"An outreach for boys was put into place to make the scouting experience for girls more inclusive and family-oriented." He added that fathers are also encouraged to join. "Some of the girls in the different units



don't have an active dad in their lives," he said. "So father figures are needed."

Teresa's husband, David, has responded to the call, helping out with building floats for parades and volunteering during camping days, once heading up a group of boys in baking cakes. "We had a great time in the kitchen," David laughed. "The cakes didn't come out perfect, but we had fun anyway."

Walter agreed. "It's a great way to keep a family together," he said. "This way, when the girls get to go to camp, the boys aren't left out."

The Girl Scouts and their adult sponsors are anxious to celebrate the organization's upcoming 100th anniversary and are already looking forward to hitting camp again. "It's always such an exciting time," Teresa said. "The kids swim, they cook out and pick up tips on health and outdoor living. We can't wait." She and Walter insist the greatest moral the girls will learn is friendship. "That's what we sing about around the campfire," Teresa said.

Walter recited the lines of a favorite ditty: "Make new friends, but keep the old. One is silver, the other is gold." **NOW**




"My parents deeded the land to us," Kim added. "That was 11 years ago."







Grant's bedroom is decorated in blue camouflage, while the bedroom that Cooper and Jay share is done in shades of brown. The boys are involved in baseball and soccer, and as a family they are very active in their church, Refiner's Fire Ministries, International.

Most mornings, the master bedroom and bathroom becomes the hub of the home. As Gary gets ready to go to work as the newly promoted Fire Marshal at the Ennis Fire Department and Kim hurries to ready the boys for school before she heads out to Little Best Friends, the daycare facility she co-owns with Lisa Binford, the sounds of organized chaos abound. Before the morning ritual begins, Gary sits in an aged rocker in the corner of the master bedroom. With the ever-growing cross wall beside him, Gary takes time to study the Bible and reflect about the day ahead. "The wall is so pretty to look at,"

he admitted, "but it has such a deeper meaning. It offers comfort."

The collection started nearly four years ago with a cross Kim acquired at a ladies meeting she attended. It has grown now to include several more that were gifts to her from Gary, as well as friends and family. One very special cross was given to the family at Bobby's funeral. The poem, "I Am Free," accompanied the cross and now hangs beside it on the wall.





As a firefighter with 25 years of consecutive service to the community, Gary has also accumulated quite a collection of memorabilia. "They've endured it all," Kim said, as she pointed to the curio cabinet that still has a child safety latch in place. "And now that Gary is home in the evenings," Kim added with a grin, "maybe some of the projects I have for him will finally come to fruition."

Shevera and Jasper agree that a recent address made by Rick Warren puts the group in perspective. "This recovery program emphasizes personal responsibility," he announced. "We cannot control all that happens to us. But we can control how we respond. When we stop wasting time fixing the blame, we have more energy to fix the problem."

Jasper admits the group has helped him deal with his own past. Addicted to drugs, he lost friends, his job and ended up homeless. "God delivered him," Shevera said of her pastor, "and because of that, he knows he has a calling to help others in the same predicament." She points out that drug addiction or alcohol dependency are not the only issues that Celebrate Recovery can help with. "Low self-worth, anger, gambling ---- these are all troubles that can be mended," she said. "God meets us where we are, and we can be set free." All problems - hurts, habits and hang-ups, as she called them - can be dealt with. "The group gets to the meat of the matter, but without judgment or playing the blame game, and in the end forgiveness takes over, forgiveness of yourself and others." Shevera confessed her own struggle has been with food, but with the guidance of Celebrate Recovery she has learned ways of dealing with overeating and has lost 70 pounds.

According to the group's teachings, the 12 steps are critical to the recovery



process. Participants admit they are powerless over their addictions and compulsive behaviors, while believing that a power greater than themselves can restore them to sanity. They make a decision to turn their will and lives over to the care of God, as they make a searching and fearless inventory of themselves, their choices and their past behavior.

"It's important that they admit to God, to themselves and to another human being the exact nature of their wrong doings," Shevera explained. "They become entirely ready for God to remove all these defects of character by humbly asking God to remove all their shortcomings, making a list of all persons they have harmed and are willing to make amends to them all, whenever possible."

They move forward in the program by continuing to take a personal inventory, and when they're wrong, they promptly admit it. With prayer and meditation, they seek to improve their conscious contact with God, and having had a spiritual experience as the result of these steps, they seek to carry this message to others.

In addition to the 12-step portion of the process, Celebrate Recovery relies on a set of eight principles devised by Rick Warren and based on the Bible's Beatitudes. They realize and fully understand they are not God, but they believe God exists. They consciously choose to commit their lives and will to Christ as they openly examine and confess their faults to God. "Voluntarily submitting to every change God wants to make in their life is crucial," Shevera

added. "They must also evaluate all their relationships, reserve a daily time with God for self-examination and yield themselves to God to be used to bring the good news to others."

As Pamela Richardson, church administrator, has applied the steps and principles to her life, she has become a healthier, more whole person. "You learn to know yourself by God's truth, not yours," she explained. "You may think you are all right, that you don't need anything to better yourself, but the program brings to the forefront that you do have faults and that there is deliverance from them." Pamela added that she has "found such freedom in the Spirit of the Lord" through Celebrate Recovery and that she has "no façade now."

Shevera concurred, "You will find the love of Christ here," she said. "You will find hope. The group shines a beacon of light over all. God changed my life by 360 degrees. He showed me me."

Pamela and Shevera stressed that the Celebrate Recovery group at the Way, Truth and Life Church is open to the community in general, not just members of the congregation. "Everyone can come," Shevera said. "We consider this a community outreach. All races, all walks of life are welcome."

At a typical meeting, attendees share their thoughts in an intimate group setting with each person speaking for three to five minutes. There is no cross talk where individuals engage in oneon-one dialogue and no psychoanalytic suggestions are permitted. Anonymity and confidentiality are critical. "What is shared in the group," Shevera said, "stays in the group.'

Pamela hopes to see new members join. "They will be blessed, as I have been," she said. "God transformed my life and my family through this organization. Anyone can benefit from it. You can go to church all your life, going through the rituals, and still miss the Lord. Celebrate Recovery will lift your spirits and give you support and direction. You'll learn what being free really means."

"He who is free is free indeed!" Shevera added. NOW



Mother Really Does Know Best

You know the old adage that your mother always told you, "Make sure you finish all of your medicine"? Turns out she was right. As many as 82 percent of people taking antibiotics do not finish all of their medicine! They hold on to it and take it the next time they are sick. When they start feeling better, they quit taking the medicine. They think it is no big deal. This is a very dangerous practice that has, in part, helped with the evolution of antibiotic-resistant bacteria.

Antibiotics have a very specific purpose: to kill bacteria, or "germs." Bacteria give you symptoms, such as coughing, fever and/or tiredness, but you begin feeling better before all the germs are killed. If you stop taking the antibiotics, the infection could come back with a vengeance, making it harder to treat. This can result in time lost from work, the need for even stronger antibiotics or possibly a stay in the hospital to kill all the germs.

Another problem with not finishing your prescribed course of antibiotics is that you might have helped create a "super-bug." The best way to cause bacteria to become resistant to antibiotics is not treating them properly. When the bacteria are under treated, some of them may have enough time to mutate (change) and multiply. You then get a whole new generation of bacteria that no longer responds to the same antibiotics. This can cause problems for everyone!

The only exception to taking all of your prescribed antibiotics is if you

have a problem with the medication. For example, you are allergic or the medication makes you sick. In such cases, you need to call your physician for another prescription and inform them of a possible allergy.

Now that you realize the importance of taking all your antibiotics, and as prescribed by your physician, here are a few tips to help you remember:

1. If you are confused about how to take your antibiotics, when to take them or even why you are taking them, ask your doctor or pharmacist. Do not hesitate to ask questions.

2. Take your antibiotics at the same time every day. For example, if you are directed to take two a day, then take one with breakfast and one with dinner every day at the same time. Make yourself a note if you need to.

3. Use a weekly pill minder to help you remember. You will see immediately if you have forgotten a day or time.

To stop the evolution of new antibiotic-resistant bacteria, it is important to follow your doctor's instructions when you do need an antibiotic. Take all pills, even if you feel better before the prescription is finished. Get answers for any questions you might have. Help us help you!

Put Power of Tax Deferral to Work

As an investor, you may sometimes feel frustrated. After all, your portfolio seems to be at the mercy of the financial markets, whose volatility is beyond anyone's control. Yet you can control the quality of the investments you own and the diversification of those investments to improve your chances of attaining your long-term financial goals. One way in which to do so is to put as much as you can afford, year after year, into tax-deferred investments.

When you contribute to a tax-deferred account, your money has the potential to grow faster than it would if you placed it in a fully taxable investment — that is, an investment on which you paid taxes every year. Over time, this accelerated growth can add up to a big difference in your accumulated savings. For example, if you put \$200 each month into a taxable investment that earned a hypothetical seven percent a year, you'd end up with about \$325,000 after 40 years, assuming you were in the 25 percent federal tax bracket. If you put that same \$200 per month into a tax-deferred investment that earned the same hypothetical seven percent a year, you'd accumulate about \$515,000 — or nearly \$200,000 more than you'd have with the taxable investment.¹

Of course, you will eventually have to pay taxes on the tax-deferred investment, but by the time you're retired, you might be in a lower tax bracket. Furthermore, depending on how much you choose to withdraw each year from your tax-deferred account, you can have some control over the amount of taxes you'll pay.

Clearly, tax deferral can be a smart choice, but what sort of tax-deferred vehicles are available? One of your most attractive choices will be your employer-sponsored retirement plan, such as a 401(k). Your earnings have the potential to grow on a tax-

deferred basis, and since you typically fund your plan with pretax dollars, the more you put in, the lower your annual taxable income. If you're lucky, your employer will even match some of your contributions. Consequently, it's almost always a good idea to put in as much as you can afford into your 401(k), up to the contribution limits, and to boost your contributions every time your salary increases. In 2012, you can contribute up to \$17,000 to your 401(k), plus an additional \$5,500 if you're 50 or older.

Even if you participate in a 401(k) plan, you can probably also contribute to a traditional IRA. Your earnings have the potential to grow tax-deferred and your contributions may be tax deductible, depending on your income level. In 2012, you can put in up to \$5,000 to a traditional IRA, or \$6,000 if you're 50 or older. (If you meet certain income guidelines, you might be eligible to contribute to a Roth IRA, which offers tax-free earnings, provided you don't start taking withdrawals until you're 59 1/2 and you've had your account at least five years.)

Finally, if you've "maxed out" on both your 401(k) and your IRA, you may want to consider a fixed annuity. Your earnings grow tax-deferred, contribution limits are high, and you can structure your annuity to provide you with an income stream you can't outlive.

The more years in which you invest in tax-deferred vehicles, the better. So start putting the power of tax deferral to work soon.
