



photographers but did not enjoy the work. While out walking one day with a girlfriend, the two girls saw a sign, Uncle Sam Wants You. Carol's dad reluctantly, but finally, signed the papers, and she enlisted in the U.S. Air Force.

For three-and-a-half years, Carol enjoyed working and traveling for her country as a radar technician. Her service career took her to Lackland Air Force Base (AFB) in San Antonio, Keesler AFB in Mississippi where she received her initial ground radar operations training, Hamilton AFB in California and Ramstein AFB in Germany. However, it was at Tinker AFB in Oklahoma where Carol met her future husband, Tommy Randle, a fellow serviceman. "I recommend the service for anyone who wants to travel, meet people and make new friends," Carol said. "But back then, unlike now, I had to leave the service when we married." Yet her experience at reading radar screens, plotting courses backward on a map, has since helped Carol "see" her art.

Tommy, now deceased, and Carol settled in Dallas, where their five children were born — Lynne, Stephen, Tommie Ann, Mark and Laurie. In this year of commemorating the 50th anniversary of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, Carol recalls living across the street from Dallas Police Officer J.D. Tippit, who also died at the hands of Lee Harvey Oswald, and his family. "We saved our money, so we could get the kids to a smaller town and get into business for ourselves," Carol

> recounted. This lady with the artist's eye loved the pretty drive from Dallas to Corsicana, and it was in the Navarro County seat that the couple found a business and good schools for their children. "My husband opened a portable building business in Corsicana





30 years ago," Carol said. "Mark and Steve helped their dad." Carol was a stay-at-home mom. "We couldn't afford child care for five children!" she laughed. She made most of the kids' clothes and also started designing costumes for school plays and Halloween. Over the years, for the lucky children in her family, Carol has designed and created the Devil and the Pope, Lady Godiva on a horse and Raggedy Ann, Santa Claus, Elvis, Ninja turtles, Mickey Mouse, Medusa, E.T., and a half man/half woman for starters. "I just do a little of everything," Carol humbly confessed while going through photos of previous costumes.

Her prowess with needle and thread extends to making quilts, bumper pads for cribs and many other items for the home. Carol's work even spread to tarps on the garage floor of the family's home where she created each of her three daughters' wedding dresses, complete with veils and trains. "It was really fun," Carol reminisced with pride. "Most girls don't want their moms to create their wedding dress, but my girls did. They all loved their dresses." The biggest challenge

— two of the weddings were only three months apart, and Carol even created some of the bridesmaids' dresses!



to students at Corsicana High School. "I made most of my clothes when I was a teenager," she said. "I taught shortcuts to kids. I like to do things and get them done while putting my whole mind into the project." A granddaughter, Amanda, is following in Carol's footsteps by sewing for her family and others. While at

CHS, Carol also created murals and taught culinary arts. "The high school kids enjoyed my scenes and seasonal decorations," Carol smiled. She now works at Laurie's day care, Brighter Horizons, which sports murals created by the versatile artist.

outdoor toys and is home to the family's three Cocker Spaniels — Goldie, Penny and Cash.

following year, he returned to Corsicana.

Today Jody is a teacher and coach at Collins. How he was able to come back to the school that meant so much to him is a story unto itself. "This job came open in June 2013," he explained. "Coach Harlan called me to let me know about it. I met with Principal Darla Nolen, and she hired me to teach physical education and coach."



Principal Nolen took a special interest in Jody when he applied for the open teaching position. "I met with her and knew immediately what a great lady she is," he said. 
But he won't be leaving Corsicana, that's for sure. "My family's here and so are my friends," he said. "I've wanted to come back for the longest time."

find a way to successfully help students build on the fundamentals they learned in elementary schools to prepare them for the more difficult subjects and lessons in high school." Jody knows firsthand about those challenges and believes he can help students at Collins work their way through them. "Teaching is what I believe I was meant to do, and it means everything to me," he said. "It's important for me to teach the boys how to be better men and how to stay on the right path, and it's a continual process that must happen in the classroom, as well as the gym and football field."

Although there are difficulties every teacher has to face with middle school kids, Jody has learned that anyone in a position of authority can successfully affect a positive outcome with students of any age. "I tell my students to never, ever give up on their dreams," Jody explained. "If you find yourself in a bad situation, remember that hard work and effort will pay off. You can be anything you set your mind to be."

Practice has shown Jody that students intuitively know when someone really cares, a fact he reinforces when he's doing the work he's so passionate about. "We tell them all the time how much we want them to succeed," he disclosed. "I tell my seventh- and eighth-graders if they are in doubt about something, just don't do it! Watch out for your reputation and remember you are here in school to learn."

Having once been a student at Collins himself, Jody has an even deeper message for his own students. "I walked the same hallways that you walk," he tells them. "I would be at my locker and look across the hall into the coach's office where I now have a desk. This fantastic career happened for me, and it can happen for you, too."

Unlike contrary Mary of the classic nursery rhyme, you probably don't have silver bells or cockleshells in your garden. But as spring escapes winter's gloom, you're no doubt as ready as she for the bounty the season brings to your little patch of Mother Earth.

Robin Smith, an Ellis County Master Gardener, is poised to start her routine fired with the enthusiasm brought on by warm, blue skies and green leaves sprouting. "At this time of year, I find it hard to contain my excitement," Robin admitted, "and I tend to get ahead of myself a bit. If you're like me, a bit of restraint is in order."

Robin insists a checklist is a good method for prioritizing time and effort in the garden, even for experts. "It will allow you to have fun but still get great results," she explained. Items on Robin's list include pruning evergreens, summer flowering trees and shrubs early in March. "For trees and shrubs that bloom

in the spring," she cautioned, "wait until they have finished blooming, and prune fruit trees before bud break." She also advocates cutting back all groundcover early in the month, so it "looks nice and tidy when it sends out new shoots later."

Raising vegetables in small city gardens is increasingly common, and Robin has useful tips for those just starting out. "Don't be in a hurry to put out young pepper or tomato plants," she cautioned. "Wait until close to the end of the month to be sure all chance of frost is gone. And be prepared to cover them if temperatures dip low one night."





Joseph Masabni, assistant professor and extension horticulturist for the Texas A&M University System, also has words of advice for new urban gardeners. "Home gardening continues to grow in popularity," he wrote in the Texas Home Vegetable Gardening Guide. "One of every three families does some type of home











gardening." He ensures great results for vegetable and herb gardeners who observe basic, practical considerations. Joseph believes the following rules can make all the difference between a merely functioning veggie patch and one producing high-quality, delicious specimens year-round:

#### Choosing a Garden Site

The city offers limited space for growing herbs and vegetables, but a well-placed and tended garden can be a productive one. "The ideal garden area gets full or nearly full sunlight," Joseph specified, "and has deep, well-drained, fertile soil. The garden should be near a water outlet but not close to competing shrubs or trees."

#### Selecting Crops

Choosing vegetables suited to the size of the garden space is an important consideration. Vine crops like watermelon or squash require more room unless situated near a fence or trellis. For the small garden, beets, broccoli, onions, spinach, carrots and eggplant are ideal. For larger spaces, cantaloupe, cauliflower, pumpkin, okra and cucumber work well.

#### Garden Planning

The placement of long-term crops like Brussels sprouts or sweet potatoes, which mature in 80 days or more, shouldn't interfere with caring for and harvesting short-termers like leaf lettuce or turnips. "When you plant a new crop, it should be totally unrelated to the crop

it is replacing," Joseph cautioned. "This is called crop rotation. Crop rotation helps prevent the buildup of diseases and insects. For example, follow early beans with beets, squash or bell peppers."

#### Preparing the Soil

For top production, make sure the garden soil is aerated and drains well. Adding organic matter can improve soil that has a heavy clay or sand component. "Never work wet garden soil," Joseph advised. "And seeds germinate better in well-prepared soil than in coarse, lumpy soil."




#### **Fertilizing**

"Heavy clay soils can be fertilized much more heavily at planting than can sandy soils," Joseph pointed out. "Heavy clay soils and those with lots of organic matter can safely absorb and store fertilizer at three to four times the rate of sandy soils. For most soils, two to three pounds of 21-0-0 (ammonium sulfate) per 100 linear feet of row, applied in the furrow and watered in, is adequate."

#### **Planting**

For successful production, plant vegetables in early spring or early fall.











"Using transplants rather than seeds, when possible, allows crops to mature earlier and extends the productive period of many vegetable crops," Joseph shared. Beets, lettuce and cabbage are among easily transplanted crops. Carrots and pepper plants require more care while sweet corn and peas are hard to transplant without the use of containers.

#### Watering and Mulching

"Apply enough water to wet the soil to a depth of at least 6 inches," Joseph recommended. "For best production, most gardens require about 1 inch of rain or irrigation per week during the growing season." Organic mulches like straw, leaves, peat moss or compost, applied to a depth of 1 to 2 inches, are commonly used.

#### Weed and Pest Control

A long-handled hoe is the tool of choice for removing unwanted growth in a vegetable patch. To eradicate pests, use only approved chemicals.

#### **Harvesting**

"A vegetable's full flavor develops only at peak maturity," Joseph pointed out, "resulting in the excellent taste of vineripened tomatoes, tender green beans and crisp, flavorful lettuce. For maximum flavor and nutritional content, harvest the crop the day it is to be canned, frozen or eaten."

As home vegetable gardens continue to multiply, the influence of organic gardening methods has spread as well. That's a good thing, according to Robin. "The awareness of the environment," she concluded, "has opened up this earthfriendly approach, and it's another great way to enjoy gardening."



## **Urinary Tract Infections**

"Just drink some cranberry juice, and you'll feel better soon." This little piece of advice has weaved its way between family members and friends for many years for urinary tract infections (UTI). But, does it work? The answer is a resounding — maybe. Research shows that cranberry juice inhibits bacteria from sticking to the walls of the bladder. This is most helpful for frequent suffers of UTI. However, for infrequent sufferers, the findings are not so hopeful. In addition, not enough research has been done to determine how much to drink, how frequently and at what strength to get relief or even if cranberry pills would work just as well.

A UTI is an infection, usually bacterial, of the urinary tract system. The urinary tract system consists of two kidneys, two ureters, one bladder and a urethra. This system is the body's way of producing, storing and eliminating urine. A UTI usually begins with bacteria entering the body through the urethra and traveling into the bladder. Normally when bacteria or other harmful organisms enter the urinary system, the body quickly takes care of it by flushing it from the system. However, the invasion can take hold and overwhelm the body's defenses. Most of these infections occur in the bladder and are called bladder infections. If it is not resolved, the infection can travel up the ureters to the kidneys and cause a kidney infection.

Since cranberry juice is not a cure-all for a UTI, most patients must rely upon antibiotics, which are the best course of treatment for the infection. The type of antibiotic will depend upon the specific organism causing the problem. It is important to take all of your medication as prescribed. Increasing your fluid intake will help to flush out your urinary tract system. UTI can be painful, so your physician may prescribe an analgesic for comfort. Often a warm heating pad over the area can bring some relief.

One preventive measure that can help females avoid a UTI is to empty their bladder immediately after sexual intercourse. Females should also wipe themselves from the front to the back to avoid dragging germs from the rectal area to the urethra. Empty your bladder frequently throughout the day. In males, an enlarged prostrate will limit the ability to empty the bladder, and surgery may become necessary.

UTI can be stubborn to treat. Due diligence in following medical protocol is important to limit the infection and also to prevent one. If you think cranberry juice can help you then by all means, drink up.

## In The Kitchen With McKenna Watkins

"I have learned to cook from my great-grandma and love to cook with my Pops and B (grandparents Ronny and Barbara Watkins)," McKenna said. "My dad, Scott Watkins, is really great with meats. I get my love of sauces from him."

#### **Breast of Chicken on Rice**

- 1 10.5-oz. can cream of mushroom soup
- 1 soup can milk
- 3/4 cup uncooked white rice
- 1 4-oz. can mushroom stems and pieces
- 1 1.5-oz. pkg. dehydrated onion soup mix (divided use)
- 2 chicken breasts, split in half
- 1. Preheat oven to 350 F.
- **2.** Mix soup and milk; reserve half of mixture.
- **3.** To remaining half, add rice, mushrooms and half of onion soup mix.
- 4. Pour mixture into oblong baking dish.
- 5. Place chicken breasts into mixture.
- 6. Pour remaining soup mixture over

chicken; sprinkle with remaining onion soup mix.

**7.** Cover; bake 1 hour. Uncover and bake an additional 15 minutes.

#### **Tortilla Pinwheels**

Makes 60-70.

1 8-oz. pkg. cream cheese, softened1 7-oz. can chopped green chilies1 4-oz. can chopped ripe olives

Hot peppers, to taste

1/2 tsp. garlic powder

10 flour tortillas

2 2.5-oz. pkgs. chicken, turkey or ham, thinly sliced

**1.** Mix cream cheese, chilies, olives and peppers; add garlic.

- 2. Spread on tortillas.
- **3.** Cover mixture with 3 slices meat; roll up tightly and place in casserole dish.
- **4.** Cover with plastic wrap; chill for 2 hours.
- **5.** Slice into bite-sized pieces. Pinwheels can be served at refrigerator or room temperature.

#### **Grandma's Spicy Chex Mix**

- 1/2 cup bacon grease drippings
- 1 stick butter
- 8 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 6 Tbsp. Tabasco sauce
- 4 Tbsp. garlic salt
- 1 15-oz. box each wheat, corn and rice Chex Cereal
- Pretzel sticks, pecan halves, Goldfish, mixed nuts; all to taste
- 1. Melt and mix first 5 ingredients; set aside.
- 2. Mix remaining dry ingredients.
- **3.** Pour melted ingredients over dry ingredients; mix until well-coated.
- **4.** Spread mixture evenly onto jelly roll pans.
- **5.** Bake at 200 F for 1 hour; stir every 15 minutes until dry.
- 6. Cool; store in airtight container.

#### Crab-stuffed Mushrooms

1 lb. crabmeat

3/4 cup mayonnaise

1 tsp. Creole mustard

1/8 tsp. paprika

1/2 tsp. sugar

I tsp. lemon pepper

1 Tbsp. lemon juice

2 Tbsp. heavy cream

1 tsp. butter

2 Tbsp. minced green onion

2 lbs. large mushroom caps Italian bread crumbs, as needed Parmesan cheese, to taste

- 1. Mix first 8 ingredients.
- **2.** In butter, sauté onions for 1-2 minutes; add to mixed ingredients.
- **3.** Stuff mixture into mushroom caps; brush with butter.
- **4.** Top with bread crumbs; sprinkle with Parmesan cheese.
- 5. Bake at 350 F until cheese melts.
