

















moments when a person finally masters a new technique is such a joy," Dave declared. He is also directly involved with both the International Federation of Leather Guilds and the Lone Star Leather Crafters Guild.

Unfortunately, in 2010, Dave had to take another short sabbatical from leathering due to health-related issues. After countless tests and doctor visits, he was diagnosed with internal bleeding, major coronary blockage and esophageal cancer. A large tumor in his chest region was discovered by accident and, he believes, by the grace of God. "I am a strong believer in prayer," Dave said. "It's what got me through everything."

Dave had to have several surgeries and endured chemotherapy along with radiation as a preventative measure. During his recovery, he had to promise to stay away from sharp objects, which meant no leather craft. "The entire year-






long ordeal, including no leather work, was the hardest thing I have ever endured in my life," Dave confessed.


But during this time Dave also received the most prestigious accolade he could imagine. During his chemo treatments, he received a phone call



informing him he had received the Lifetime Achievement Award. "To be nominated by my peers for something so significant was just unbelievable," he said. Soon after his recovery, he was right back at it, hammering away at the leather with a delicate, yet firm hand. With all the years of practice and technique development under his belt, Dave can now make virtually anything, and it is no wonder that his work has earned him acknowledgement and awards throughout the leather crafting community.

"The only thing that limits a person is their imagination," Dave remarked. Some of his most creative and labor-intensive pieces include a leather log cabin and several ornately decorated saddles, one of which his daughter has claimed. Most leather crafters strive to make a saddle, so these pieces, in particular, were a huge

achievement for Dave, marking his level of accomplishment in his artistic abilities. Another piece in which Dave takes great pride is his intricately designed portfolio binder. The cover features beautifully detailed Sheridan roses and a horseshoe, inspired by one of his horses, with textured basket weave panel on the back. The binder took Dave about 20 hours to complete. "Every design begins with a drawing," he said, "and I am lucky to have lots of friends who draw up designs for me."

Once a design template is ready, the pounding begins. Literally, each impression upon the leather is formed by a specific stamp, but each strike of the




stamps is only a minute part of the larger design. Most pieces, like Dave's binder, require thousands of strikes to complete the design. Each stamp is hammered into the dampened leather hide using a mallet. If the stamp slips or the mallet recoils, striking the stamps twice, a permanent mark is left. "This is what sets hand crafted leather apart from machinepressed leather," Dave said. "Those little imperfections really end up giving the piece more character."

Currently, he is working on a copy of a piece created by one of his mentors,



Jim Linnell, titled The Heart of Texas, a complex featuring just about every design element possible. Dave has already spent over 100 hours working on his version, which includes three-dimensional features, coloring, layered pieces and intricate patterns. He admits he still has a long way to go. "It's a challenge, but I enjoy it," Dave said. "It's a sense of accomplishment to make something with my own hands. It's something I do that will last." NOW







are tremendous about bringing them to meetings and supporting their projects," she added. "We're so proud of these kids."

When the Green Team met for the first time, another important task needed to be done. For Lauren, it was essential that the group be biblically based, so they had to find the perfect Bible verse to go with



their perfect name. "Everyone came up with lots of choices," she said. "Finally, I said, 'Let's just vote.' So we put our heads down and each of us raised a hand for the verse we liked best." The winner and perfect verse was from Isaiah 65:18,

The Green Team's first project was a butterfly garden at Mansfield's First United Methodist Church. "The church gave us permission to plant the garden," Lauren said. Their interest in butterflies was partially inspired by a film called *Flight of the Monarch* and, also, by the expertise of Lauren's grandmother, Tommie Bosillo, whom Lauren calls Nana. "My grandmother is a gardener," she smiled. "She knows what to plant."


"We planted milkweed," said Green
Team member Nora Mooney. "We
learned aphids don't like milkweed, so
they won't come to eat the butterfly larvae.
We've seen the butterflies now and know
it actually worked!" she smiled. "The
butterflies have a great time, and they
come back every spring."

The Green Team is now 2 years old and includes 10 members. In addition to Lauren, Austin and Nora, the team includes: Catarina Silva, Emma Valenzuela, Alexandra (Alex) Tutor, Logan Tutor, Kayla Butler, Aubrey Burks and Grace Savering. "Most of the children are in fourth grade and live in Mansfield," Amy shared. "We do have a sixth- and a fifth-grader and members from Fort Worth and Arlington."

Starting with a shining star like Lauren and adding nine bright and eager friends, the Green Team was bound for action and success. Beyond the butterfly garden, they've adopted a portion of Broad Street from the railroad tracks to just before Main Street. "There's a street sign with our









name on it," Kayla beamed. "Three times a year, we're scheduled to meet with trash bags, gloves and trash grabbers to pick up trash so our street stays clean."

They also participated in the 2014 Pickle Palooza Parade. "Arianne Shipley has been a strong supporter of the group," Amy explained. "We first met her when adopting our street. Since she joined the water department in Mansfield, she's reached out to the Green Team for several service projects, including the parade, and the children have gladly obliged!"

"We got to be part of the Viking float," Lauren grinned. The huge boat represented the water department's theme: Don't Sail Past Trash. "We painted the boat, wore Viking hats and rode on or walked beside the float," she added. "It was great. We handed out magnets to remind people to be environmentally friendly by keeping trash out of our waterways!"

Last April, the Green Team was thrilled to contribute to a Disney fundraiser benefiting Earth Day projects. "With



help from families and friends, the kids bought a block of 50 tickets to the movie *Bears*," Amy said. More than a quarter of those tickets were sold by Emma — she was quite the salesperson! The movie was released just before Earth Day and a portion of ticket sales were donated to America's National Parks.

"The movie was about a mother bear and her two cubs and how they survived in the Alaskan mountains," Lauren shared. "We went to see it as a group and were so happy to have the chance to contribute."

Reducing waste, recycling and conservation are hallmarks of the Green Team philosophy. "Last Christmas, we made wreaths using recycled cans and a Christmas tree made from metal covered








AT HOME WITH Jon and Tanya Crippen

The couple then multiplied from two to four, welcoming daughter Morgan in 1999 and son Drew in 2002. "The two most meaningful memories of my family are the seven years we had together before kids and then the years with kids," recalled Jon with a smile.

However, everything changed on a trip to Jon's 20th high school reunion in Houston. Tanya jokingly said that she could see herself living in Texas one day, even after years of turning down the idea. Well, that was all Jon needed to hear! He immediately sent out résumés in the Dallas area, and within a two-week period, he had landed a few interviews. The move was destined to happen.

Jon and Tanya only had a single day to find a house after Jon landed a job. Jon, a district manager for Regions Bank, was focused on price, while Tanya, who works from home designing blinged-out shirts and apparel, was more interested in floor plans. One thing they agreed on was square footage. "We were used to having a basement in our homes in Nebraska," Jon said. "That's something we had to compensate for, that lost extra space."

The kitchen, located off the dining area, is another spacious room, with clean lines and a minimalistic feel. "We don't have an island, because Morgan likes to dance in here," Tanya said. The French bistro decor, accented by a chef figurine and window-paneled pantry door, makes the space cozy and perfect for Tuesday night family dinners. When Morgan isn't dancing across the tiled kitchen floor, she is cooking with her dad. One of Jon's passions is cooking. Another is family time.

Therefore, they often spend time watching movies and television together. The family room adjoined to the kitchen has seen many nights filled with laughter and joy. The space lends well to the warm, cozy feel of the house, featuring a second cross wall and fireplace



filled with beautiful decorative candles that glow softly. Off the family room is the downstairs bathroom, Tanya's home office and the garage access.

The family also spends time together playing board games on Friday nights in the media room upstairs. "Sometimes, we play Monopoly until 2:00

in the morning. I am always the banker, and I do not let them quit," added Jon with a smirk. In addition to the media room, the individual bedrooms are also on the second floor. Morgan's bedroom walls are adorned with inspirational quotes, mums, awards and countless photos of friends. Memories are important to Morgan, and she wanted to make that the focus of her room decor. Conversely, Drew's room demonstrates his infinite love of sports. When he isn't on the field or the court, he enjoys playing video games in his comfortable, personalized space. The master bedroom, complete with master bath, is Tanya and Jon's peaceful space. "We read in bed at night and have conversations," Tanya said. "Occasionally, we find a kid or two snuggled up with us on Saturday mornings."































Louie is president of his senior class and school choir. He sings baritone in both school and community choirs, is active across five different sports and is currently a Texas state senator at Boys' State and vice president at Boys Nation. He credits the source of his energy to his family and friends. "I've lived in the same house all of my life," he explained. "T've grown up with the same 11 friends since first grade and, although we have different interests, we're still close. I'm really lucky to have them."

According to Louie's mother, Janet Lombardo, the oldest of her three children has always been a performer and natural leader. "Last fall, while being introduced as one of the candidates for homecoming king during the varsity football game, it was announced that his plan for the future is to eventually be the president of the United States." He later showcased his vocal talent by singing the national anthem a cappella, and then reached for his helmet to hit the field as the Jaguars' receiver and cornerback.

"I've played football since the fourth grade," Louie added. "The team is my school family." His favorite professional football player is Hines Ward, receiver for the Pittsburgh Steelers. Legion youth activity, was initiated in 1946 for the purpose of teaching promising young men about government and leadership. (There is also a Girls Nation.) Last June, Louie was among the high school juniors selected to attend Texas Boys State, the first step toward possibly moving on to Boys Nation. "I was sponsored by American Legion Post 624 in Mansfield," he said. "We spent a week at The University of Texas at Austin learning about city, county and state governments." Participants accepted to Boys State must have demonstrated leadership, character, scholarship, loyalty and service in school and community. Louie not only met the criteria but by the end of his Austin program also emerged as one of two Texas senators to travel to Boys Nation in Washington, D.C.

Focused on national government, Boys Nation relies on each delegate to serve as a senator from his Boys State group. The 98 young senators hold caucus, organize into committees, conduct hearings, and ultimately, organize party conventions and elect a president and vice president

for each of two parties. "The group divided into two parties of 47 senators," Louie said. "Both parties were asked to create a party platform and to be ready to stand for the platform in a 45-minute debate with random questions from moderators." Louie successfully faced the Oklahoma senator. "I enjoyed the debate process and want to do more," he said. "We were given one night to prepare, and it felt good to work under pressure." At the conclusion of the debate, Louie was elected by his peers as the 2014 Boys Nation vice president.

The week spent at Boys Nation also included visits to national agencies, memorials, institutions and historical sites plus the chance for Boys Nation senators to meet their home-state officials. "I met Senators John Cornyn and Ted Cruz," Louie said. "Then all of us got to meet the president." The boys were invited to the East Room of the White House. "It was pretty awesome," he grinned. "When President Obama walked in, everyone was quiet." As it happened, the president shook Louie's hand first and ended up standing next to him in the group photo. "He talked to us about leadership and the fact that, at age 18, we are no longer the future," Louie said. "We are the now."

For one week in July, 98 exceptional boys were treated to an extraordinary experience. As he packed his Boys Nation blue polo shirts, khaki pants and vice president plaque for the trip home, Louie absorbed the impact of his week in Washington, D.C. Today, he's hoping to attend either Georgetown University in Washington, D.C., or The University of Texas at Austin to major in political science and economics and go on to law school. "Reaching the Oval Office is not necessarily the goal, although it would be nice," he smiled.

"We're very proud of him," Janet said. "After Boys Nation, his father and I realized that politics would be a good fit,

and that Georgetown or The University of Texas would be the right choice."



What?

Endless vegetables are easy to grow depending on the season of the year. If you are a first-time veggie gardener, keep things simple. Plant easy-to-grow vegetables or your favorites that have been recommended by neighbors or nurseries in the area. Spring and summer plant choices include all varieties of tomatoes, cucumbers, peppers, summer



squash, peas, beans, okra and nearly all herbs. Swiss chard is a green that will survive the Texas summer heat.

Where?

Most veggies require a sunny, welldrained area, but if that's not possible, try a potted garden or a hydroponic system in a sunny patio or balcony area. One patio tomato plant can produce a plentiful and continuous supply when planted in a pot. Local garden centers have a large range of pots. You can also create your own pot by cutting drainage holes into the bottom of a potted soil bag, splitting open the top of the bag, removing about half the soil, rolling the bag's sides down, and finally, planting a vegetable inside. Hydroponic systems are pricier but can yield produce for years to come. And since most vegetable



















plants blossom, they are attractive when incorporated into favorite sunny flower beds.

If you are carving a vegetable plot out of your backyard, have your soil tested. Use either a commercial kit or ask your county extension agent for advice. Almost any type of soil can be amended to give good plant growth. Your choice of mulch and fertilizer depends on soil type and available supplies.

What kind of watering system is available for your location? For small gardens or potted veggies, a watering can or diffused sprayer may work well. However, for larger plots, you may wish to lay soaker hoses on timers.

Invest in great time-saving gardening tools and keep them sharpened, cleaned and organized throughout the years to come. Simple hand tools are available, as well as powered tools.

When?

Planning begins now. However, planting out-of-doors needs to wait until the danger of a late frost or freeze is over. One of the best indicators of that date is when you notice buds on native-to-Texas pecan or mesquite trees. Vegetables, even tomatoes, can be started from seeds planted in starter trays purchased, along with quality potting soil, at your local nursery. Just follow the



directions on the seed packet. The trays are easy to set outside during warm days




and nights but move them to a heated location when temperatures dip down below 40 F.


How?


Now is the time to choose between organic or nonorganic vegetable gardens. Start a compost pile and investigate appropriate choices for fertilizer and pesticides that work best in your area. Your local garden nurseries, county extension agents and Master Gardeners are great resources for information that will help you whether you decide to go organic or not.

If your veggie garden is going to encompass more than a few square feet, rent or purchase a tiller from an area garden center or hardware store. Break the soil and turn the subsoil at a depth of about 6 inches. Remove rocks, make

furrows for proper drainage, plant seeds or seedlings and lay down a 3-inch layer of mulch for weed control and water retention.

Plan your plantings so mature, larger plants will not shade smaller ones. Larger plants, like tomatoes, may need to be



staked as they grow. To save space, beans, peas, melons and squash can be grown on easy-to-construct trellises, cages or A-frames.

Check your garden daily for insects and pull weeds that crowd your plants, taking water and nutrients from the soil. Water when moisture cannot be felt 1-inch deep into the soil and fertilize on



How Will Social Security Fit Into Your Retirement Income Strategy?

Have you given much thought to collecting Social Security? The answer probably depends on how old you are. But whatever your age, you'll want to consider the best way of incorporating Social Security benefits into your retirement income strategy.

Of course, if you have several decades to go until you retire, you might be wondering if Social Security will even be there for you at all. The basic issue is that the Social Security system is experiencing a sharply declining worker-to-beneficiary ratio. In plain English, this means that fewer workers are contributing to Social Security, while the huge baby boom generation is retiring and taking money out. Still, Social Security has enough money to pay full retirement benefits to every eligible American until 2038, according to the Congressional Budget Office. After that point, benefits would have to be reduced unless changes are made to the Social Security system.

And several changes have indeed been proposed. Given that we do have nearly 25 years until benefit cuts may need to be made, it seems reasonable that some type of solution could be reached to put Social Security back on solid ground. In any case, when thinking about your retirement income, you need to focus on those things that you can control — such as when to start taking Social Security and how you can supplement your Social Security benefits.

Depending on when you were born, your full retirement age, as far as collecting Social Security benefits, is likely either 66 or 67. You can start getting your checks as early as 62, but if you do, your monthly payments could be reduced by as much as 30 percent — and this reduction is permanent. Consequently, if you can support your lifestyle from other

sources of income — such as earnings from employment and withdrawals from your IRA and 401(k) — you may want to postpone taking Social Security until you reach your full retirement age. In fact, you can get even bigger monthly checks if you delay taking your benefits beyond your full retirement age, although your payments will max out once you reach 70. Keep in mind, though, that other factors, such as your anticipated longevity, should also enter into your calculations in considering when to take Social Security.

As mentioned above, your retirement income may also include withdrawals from retirement accounts, such as an IRA and a 401(k), along with other investments, such as a fixed annuity. And these other accounts are quite important, because Social Security provides, on average, only about 40 percent of retirement income for the average 65-year-old today. Consequently, in the years and decades before you retire, contribute as much as you can possibly afford to these other accounts. Given the advances in medical care and the greater awareness of healthy lifestyles, people are living longer than ever — which means you could spend two, or even three, decades in retirement. To enjoy those years fully, you'll need adequate income.

By planning ahead, you can determine how best to fit Social Security into your retirement income strategy. Every move you make to help secure your retirement can pay off for you in the long run.





Smothered Pork Chops With Gravy

Pork Chops:

4 pork chops
Salt and pepper
2 cups flour
Brown paper bag
I cup vegetable or canola oil

Gravy:

4 Tbsp. strained pork chop cooking oil 1/3 cup flour
1 1/2 cups of pork stock
1 small onion, sliced
2 garlic cloves, minced
1/2 cup fresh mushrooms, sliced
Salt and pepper, to taste

1. For pork chops: Wash meat thoroughly, season with salt and pepper; set aside. **2.** Put flour, salt and pepper (to taste) in brown bag; add meat and shake well. Make sure all the meat is completely covered.

- **3.** Heat oil in a large cast-iron skillet and place meat in carefully. Brown on both sides, remove from pan and place on a strainer with paper towels to absorb oil.
- **4.** For gravy: Strain all oil from frying pan, then place pan back on burner over medium heat. Add strained oil and flour to pan. Allow flour to brown.
- **5.** Add pork stock to mixture, stirring occasionally.
- **6.** Add remaining ingredients; reduce heat to simmer.
- **7.** Add cooked pork chops to pan, cover with lid and simmer until meat is tender and finger-licking good!

A Way to a Man's Heart Mac-n-Cheez

1 16-oz. box elbow macaroni, cooked1 can Ro-Tel, liquid only1 stick butter, melted2 eggs

I cup milk I cup cubed Velveeta cheese 8-oz. medium cheddar cheese Parmesan (optional)

1. Cook macaroni according to directions. Drain and place in a large casserole dish.

3 egg yolks

1 14-oz. can condensed milk

1 1/2 tsp. vanilla flavoring

1 11-oz. box of Nabisco Nilla Wafers

3-4 ripe bananas, sliced

Meringue:

3 egg whites 1/4 cup sugar

1/2 tsp. vanilla

- **I.** For pudding: Using a double boiler over medium heat, combine sugar and flour; slowly stir in whole milk until mixture thickens with no lumps.
