This is the type of individual John Wayne characterized in The Quiet Man. When it was necessary to speak and be counted, his character spoke, people listened and things happened. This type of person leaves a footprint wherever they go. Ferris City Manager Carl Sherman is that kind of person.

As he served DeSoto as mayor, Carl Sherman listened to the people. He knew that doing the same thing over and over would not result in a changed future. So, he found a new approach to community and business growth. The State of the City Address for DeSoto was an event not only honoring Carl's achievements, but also how he brought together the community, councilmen and businesses with dignity for DeSoto's success and growth. For a short span, he has held a dual position as mayor of DeSoto and city manager of Ferris. He will soon step out of his position in DeSoto and focus solely on the Ferris city manager position. The DeSoto City Council meeting on May 3 will officiate his stepping down. However, he will continue to serve in the mayor's role until May 17 when the newly elected mayor will take the reins. Though Carl is sad to leave DeSoto, he is hopeful that others will cultivate the seeds already planted there.



A man who is a visionary generally faces diverse obstacles, as destiny calls and his life journey shifts. Carl loved attending school in Ferris. In fact, he loved it so much that even though he was on target to graduate early, he really did not want to leave.

After he accepted the city manager's position, Carl has been asked, "Why are you here in Ferris?" as though his résumé might bring loftier goals or aspirations. "But we concluded it is a God thing for me to be here," he explained. "I love Ferris."

"As mayor of DeSoto, my public role is to set the course for where the city is headed. As city manager of Ferris, my role is to set the strategies for how to get the city where it is headed," Carl stated.

"Plans for Ferris are in the making. We are working on a catalyst project on I-45, with a four-story, Hilton branded hotel planned for about 90-odd rooms and in front, a restaurant, to go adjacent to the golf course," Carl said. "Our plans also include the development of much-needed, critical infrastructure like adequate water and sewer lines. These plans also include the reconstruction of the service roads. Economic development follows transportation, so there is a need for a robust thoroughfare through Ferris," Carl added. "We have a substantial commitment to bring Dallas



Water Utilities here with a \$6 million investment from Dallas County. We are appreciative of Dallas County's absolute backing for growth in our city, driven by the support of the city's Dallas County side," Carl said. "There is now solid commitment for high-speed Internet from Time Warner contingent on merger approval with Charter, of which I wrote in favor."

Carl reflected back to his first year in DeSoto. "We changed the way we did economic development. I believe we can do a similar thing here in Ferris," he said. "It's not the same city. We are posed for some really smart growth.

"Influence is a fleeting thing, because it is only as good as your reputation, and that reputation can be changed by the perception that your motives are not pure, and that there's some nefarious reason for what you are doing," Carl continued. "It is something I don't take for granted, because I understand that even in this position, there are



and can be people who think I came here to make a name for myself. Well, no. We are a small town. You don't go to a smaller town to make a name for yourself," Carl explained. "I see the opportunity to work for the city of Ferris and lead the workforce as an extension of my experience as mayor. I uniquely understand an elected official's perspective, and that makes me ready to take on the challenges we currently face.

"I want to make a difference," Carl stated without hesitation. "As a leader, you try to do your best, and a big part of leadership is just being there to do what you say you're going to do. Success begets success. It's based on trust."

Carl has been blessed with his wife, Michelle, two daughters and three sons, all who support him. Recently, his daughter who attends Lamar University called him. "She says she was talking about me being a mayor, a city manager and a pastor of two churches. She didn't get what I actually did until she had actually shared it with someone," Carl stated.

Carl's churches are totally different in culture — two different worlds. The contrasts between his two churches remind him of the differences between the cities of DeSoto and Ferris. "I consider it a blessing to have the opportunity I have to preach using two different methods, to make the message palatable so it will be received. It is truly gratifying to my soul, as I attempt to be pliable. I don't want to 'marry' a certain disposition or presentation, but be devoted to the Word," Carl conveyed.

Carl believes having a love for a city and its people carries a commitment and a passion that goes beyond just work. As the city manager of Ferris, he has returned to the place he once loved and still loves. His goal is to serve the city of Ferris with great responsibility and a vision for their future. **NOW**


SPACE OF HER OWN -By Jo Monroe

to showcase her keepsakes and preserve her home-style decor. An inviting wall of windows is met with a cushioned bench that reaches wall to wall just inside the arched sitting cove. A wedding anniversary keepsake is embroidered and hanging inside the cove, and the cove windows are draped with lace, as are the dining room windows.

Every detail has been thought through down to the dust ruffles on the bed and a quilt stand displaying her favorite throws and quilts. Mary's master bedroom is uncluttered, but there is a menagerie of figurines and photos of her children, grandchildren and greatgrandchildren. There are 38 children in all, and the photos include one of a little girl who will remind you of a baby doll. That grandbaby is now 29 years old.

There is an en suite just off the master bedroom. The room has a wall cabinet. Surprisingly, behind half of the doors are not towels and linens but photo albums. Mary has collected family photos back to her baby days. She laughed as she opened one of her treasured books holding photos of her childhood, school days and every event between. She found a photo she had been looking for earlier, in which she is wearing a special brooch. "I still have that pin," she said. In 1954, girls looked more like women, and some like movie stars. "Here's my favorite, and I'm not even wearing makeup," Mary grinned. Girls went naturally beautiful then, and Mary certainly was among them.

Mary offers some advice to women who are now over 60, single or widowed and still living in the large house in







which they raised their families. "Make your decisions while you can and stay active," she said. "There are more women over 60 still living in their own homes." Because Mary is a woman who always has a project going, or one in the making, she has found being active in the yard, gardening and making plans are great ways to stay healthy. "I am planning to do a raised garden this year," she shared.

After having a hip replacement and going to rehab, Mary was determined to go home, not to a nursing facility. She definitely wasn't ready for anyone to take care of her, because she had always been active. Now, with a new hip, she saw an opportunity to have a new start. It might have slowed her down for a while, but she had a plan to build a new home. "It isn't easy, but having your own place is worth it," Mary stated. "I love my family to death, but when you are sharing the same house, the same kitchen, you don't have your special items, not even to cook with," Mary shared. "I didn't even know where there was a rolling pin!" she laughed.




"I think I grieved leaving my home across the street, but the family helped in the transition. You can do it," Mary asserted, "but you should do it when you can make your own choices."

So, now, Mary has a beautiful new home, a familiar yard to garden in and a place where the family comes together. At 81 years young, Mary is busy this spring with a new beginning and a comfortable lifestyle in the same neighborhood she has known for so many years.



He has been involved in many things throughout the area, and that involvement includes serving as the chairman of the Ellis County chapter of Ducks Unlimited for over a decade. "There's no crazy story about it," he recounted. "I have been an avid hunter and fisherman all my life, so I knew about DU even as a kid. Fifteen years ago, I went to an event with a friend, and I started helping out." Helping out quickly turned into taking a leadership role with the organization. "About a year after my first event, the current chairman told me I should take over, and I've been the Chairman of Ellis County Ducks Unlimited ever since," he added.

Though it was his hunting background that originally got him involved, John is quick to point out that Ducks Unlimited is not just an organization for hunters.









"The group started in the 1930s to

conserve wetlands," he explained.

"We raise money that is spent trying to get laws to protect habitats from

development, designing new wetland areas and increasing awareness around

the nation." One of the things DU does is work with farmers and ranchers to

preserve their natural wetland areas. "For a lot of farmers, if they can plow it, they

will," John said. "We encourage them not to give up their land for development, and we also offer incentives not to fill in

engineers figure out ways to pump water in and out of areas during different seasons to increase land for ducks and other water fowl." The end result of the organization's massive fundraising and conservation effort is seen in their raw numbers. In the last 75 years, Ducks Unlimited has

conserved well over 13 million acres of land across North America and influenced another 118 million acres on the continent. One of their major works is protecting breeding areas, especially in the Northern United States and Canada. "The money we raise in Ellis County goes to the central office in Memphis, Tennessee, and they send it where it's needed," John explained. "A lot of the




funds go where the ducks are breeding, because if they don't have somewhere to breed, nothing else will matter."

Many people think of Ducks Unlimited as a hunting organization. Though that is not quite accurate, John admits that hunters and outdoorsman do typically support the organization. "By preserving wetlands, you increase habitats for ducks, but you are really increasing lands for birds, deer and other wildlife, as well as people," he described. One effect is an increase in animals for hunting, so it is not surprising that hunters are key supporters of Ducks Unlimited, and that's why John and the Ellis County group raise funds in the ways they do.

The committee's goal is to raise as much money as possible to send to Memphis each year. "We have two annual fundraisers," he said. "We sell a calendar every fall, and for 50 bucks, you become a member, you get the calendar, and you are entered into a raffle each day of the year. We give away over 700 guns, and two times a year, we give away fourwheelers." The big fundraiser, though, is the annual banquet the committee organizes every April.

"We may or may not raise the most money, but the Ellis County event is the biggest by attendance across the state of Texas," he boasted. When John took over more than a decade ago, their yearly banquet was hosting a couple hundred people. Thanks to his work and that of the rest of the committee, though, Ellis County Ducks Unlimited ranks near the top in the state and across the nation. "There are over 2,600 chapters nationwide, with 145 in Texas," he explained. "Ellis County was number eight in the state and in the top 20 for the nation in funds raised last year." They have routinely filled the largest local venue over the past few years with their annual banquet. "We couldn't have a bigger event unless we left Ellis County, but then we would lose some of the hometown feel," he added.

The banquet is typically the last Friday in April, and it has become a social event that joins family, friends and co-workers together to support a great cause. In addition to a meal catered by a chef that comes in from Louisiana, the evening is full of fun. "We do a 50-gun raffle, which everyone loves," he detailed. "We have dozens of packages from duck calls to a Heli Hunt package that will be offered in the live and silent auctions, as well as many other raffle games and door prizes."

While the yearly banquet largely attracts a crowd of hunters and outdoorsmen, the cause is about so much more. John and Ellis County Ducks Unlimited are creating and preserving wetlands, one banquet at a time.





In the Kitchen With Terri Marie Childers

Cooking shows and Girl Scouts sparked a flame of passion for cooking in Terri Marie Childers' heart. Through preparing Wednesday night church meals and catering retreats for her own ministry, she has been blessed with rising confidence in her skills. "When I was a young wife and mother, I prepared family recipes that have been handed down for generations," she recalled.

Terri takes special pleasure in cooking for her grandchildren. "Now that I am 'Nunny Bunny' to my four granddarlings," she said, "my favorite times in the kitchen are when a kid is standing on a chair beside me stirring batter or cracking eggs." Chef Craig Claiborne, author of *Craig Claiborne's Kitchen Primer*, once stated, "Cooking done with care is an act of love." "That is certainly true for me!" Terri admitted.

Tryst Kisses (Chocolate Truffles)

1/3 cup heavy cream6 oz. semisweet chocolate chips (divided use)White or milk chocolate, melted (optional)

I. Place a bowl in a saucepan, boiling 2 inches of water. Heat cream in the bowl until it simmers. Add half the chocolate chips to the cream on low heat, stirring constantly, until melted.

Transfer to another bowl, and place the chocolate mixture in the refrigerator for 2 hours. Remove chocolate from refrigerator; then roll into balls. Freeze until firm.
 In another pan, boil water and then turn

off heat. Pour remaining chips into the bowl and stir until melted. Using a fork, dip each frozen truffle into melted chocolate. Tap off excess chocolate, place on waxed paper and refrigerate. If desired, decorate with melted white or milk chocolate drizzle. Variation: for white or milk chocolate truffles, follow same instructions but reduce cream to 4 Tbsp. **4.** Remove from fridge 60 minutes before serving.

Peach Cobbler With Grandma's Pie Crust

Can be prepared in a pie dish or baking dish.

Crust: 3 level cups flour 1 tsp. salt 1 rounded cup shortening I egg I Tbsp. vinegar 5 Tbsp. ice water

Filling: 2 29-oz. cans peaches 1/2 cup sugar 1/4 cup flour 1/4 tsp. cinnamon Pinch of salt

 For crust: Combine dry ingredients in a bowl. In another bowl, combine wet ingredients. Mix wet and dry ingredients together lightly, until well blended.
 Divide dough in half and chill. Roll out each half to create a top and bottom crust.
 For filling: Drain peaches. Mix all dry ingredients together. Add dry ingredients to the peaches and stir lightly.

4. Place bottom crust in baking dish and prick well with a fork. Pour in filling mixture.
5. Top with second crust, sealing edges well. Cut a few slits to vent. Cover edges with foil and bake at 425 F for 35-45 minutes. Remove foil for last 15 minutes.

Elegant Pear Salad

Salad:

- 2 16-oz. cans pear halves
- 1 8-oz. pkg. cream cheese, softened
- 1 Tbsp. orange zest
- 2 Tbsp. sugar
- 1/4 cup walnuts, chopped

Dressing:

cup whole cranberry sauce
 Tbsp. sugar
 Tbsp. vegetable oil
 Tbsp. lemon juice
 Dash of salt

I. For salad: Drain pears, reserving 3 Tbsp. of syrup.

2. Blend cream cheese, orange zest, sugar and syrup together. Mix in walnuts. Fill pear halves with cheese mixture.

3. *For dressing:* Blend all ingredients together in a blender until smooth and drizzle over pears.
