How many people can say their best friend is a four-legged, yellow Labrador Retriever named Honey? Only one. Lexi Rendon and Honey became fast friends when Lexi traveled to The Seeing Eye in Morristown, New Jersey, the summer of 2016. Lexi is legally blind, and Honey is her first Seeing Eye dog. "It was June 29. That was the day Honey and I were introduced," Lexi remembered. "It didn't take Honey's anxiety long to subside after our introduction."

The pair trained in New Jersey from June 29 through July 21. The training was every day, all day. They kept a very tight schedule. Most of their morning sessions were held in downtown Morristown. "Honey was taught how to properly turn left and right with me by her side. As a couple, we learned about traffic, cars and people," Lexi explained. "Morristown is bigger than Ennis, but it wasn't a big city with a big city atmosphere."

The first two weeks of training consisted of learning basic commands. After that, Lexi and Honey were encouraged to take freelance trips geared

to the life they would share once they

arrived back in Ennis - a life that includes grocery shopping, eating out at restaurants and going to church, as well as attending minor league baseball games and regular CrossFit workouts. "We also took a full day and trained on the busy streets of Manhattan," Lexi shared. "The first few minutes in the subway station were a bit overwhelming, but I quickly realized that everyone was going wherever it was they go. They weren't worried about me and Honey. They had their own agenda."

And Lexi now has her own agenda ---an agenda that will cause her to spread her wings and fly with Honey by her side. As an EHS student, Lexi became a member of the National Honor Society her sophomore year, is the senior class reporter and is currently the "weather girl" for the EHS pre-filmed newscast. After graduating next month, Lexi will leave home in mid-August to attend college full time at Texas Tech University. Her focus will be on human development and family studies. "Before bringing Honey to school that first day, I explained the rules and regulations etiquette associated with a Seeing Eye dog," Lexi said. "Signs were posted around the school as reminders not to pet Honey while she was working. I made a promise that on the last day of school I'd take Honey off her leash and let her go." Lexi intends to keep that promise. She knows it will be good for her classmates, but equally as good for Honey, who will also be graduating in cap and gown with the class of 2017. Honey has a yearbook photo to prove it!

As she looks forward to embarking on a life outside Ennis with Honey, Lexi's parents, Alex and Dena Rendon, will release their daughter to the world with bittersweet encouragement. "I am a bit anxious," Dena said, "but I'm so proud

of who she's become. She's always been motivated and eager to do things for herself. She's ready to spread her wings."

"We're typical parents when it comes to the next chapter in life for all three of our children, but especially Lexi," Alex explained. "When you throw disabled in, that takes the anxiety up another notch. I'd much rather her be ready to go than to be clinging to family. Her disability gave her determination."

Lexi was labelled disabled at a very young age. She was 6 weeks old when her dad noticed a haze in her eyes. When he brought it to Dena's attention, she noticed it, too. After seeing the family's local optometrist, they were sent to Dallas to a specialist that same day, just one full week following Thanksgiving 1998. "That day, we learned that it's not good to have more than one doctor in the room at a time," Alex admitted. "We skipped school the next day. We were told news that no parent wants to hear. Lexi was diagnosed with retinoblastoma bilateral cancerous tumors in both eyes."

That weekend, Alex and Dena faced their fears as they questioned God and cried until they could cry no more. That emotional weekend gave them strength to take the journey to the Texas Retina Institute where the earlier diagnosis was confirmed. "I asked the doctor how he would proceed if Lexi was his granddaughter," Alex recalled. "We ended up going to the Wills Eye Hospital in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania." Her left eye was removed, thus saving her life. They saved the right eye with cold and hot treatments and chemotherapy, but her vision today in that eye is 20/400. Three years later, after monthly visits to Philadelphia, Lexi was released back to the doctor in Dallas who originally diagnosed her.

"Lexi's lack of vision has never held her back," Dena stated. "When she and Honey leave for college, their story will really just be beginning."

"Disabled" is not a word in Lexi's vocabulary. Others may label her that way, but that has never been the way she's seen herself. "I've never liked that word. All it means to me is closing off opportunities," she said. "I just work differently to get the same result." Lexi has always worked hard for those things that mean the most to her. She looks at life like one big challenge. "We all have at least one thing in life we need to overcome," Lexi said. "I'm an overcomer!"

As a family, Lexi, her parents and her brothers, Logan and Reece, stay fit and heathy, participating in CrossFit. Although the box jumps are hard, they don't stop Lexi from excelling. "You don't need vision to stay healthy," she said. "It's a one-size-fits-all sport."

Lexi and Honey are also very active in their church, The Avenue Church, Ennis Campus. She teaches the 4-year-olds in KIDZ Avenue. "I had to explain the rules about Honey, but at the end of each class, I remove her harness so the kids can pet her. If 4-year-olds can get it, why can't others? I don't mind the questions, but 'drive-by petting' is not cool."

Since she plans on living in a big city after college graduation, Lexi feels that training in a big city was a huge plus. "I will be able to move about and have more independence in a big city."

As Lexi looks forward to the future, she can't help but reminisce about the journey thus far. Like most teenagers, she cracks jokes about not being able to see. She wouldn't change a thing about her life. "I don't have any regrets because it's all I've ever known," she admitted. "Being legally blind will never be the end of the world for me."

Accountability has become a big word in Ruby Casillas' educational world, but she has always felt responsible for creating a classroom experience in which her students thrive and learn. "All children can learn. It's up to the teacher to find a way to make learning happen," she explained. "So many ideas come through my head. I've got a lot of tricks in my bag, and I believe in using them all."

It was early in her life when she called Victoria, Texas, home that Mrs. Casillas knew she wanted to teach. "In the third grade, I was a library helper. I must have been dependable because I ran the errands, and I was already reading to the first- and secondgraders who visited the library," she remembered. By her middle school days, Mrs. Casillas was teaching catechism at church, and as a high school junior and senior, she taught adult education and ESL through the Victoria Literacy Council. "When I was



growing up, I was the first person in my family who wanted to go into education, but now there are many educators in my family," she said.

She attended Victoria Junior College and was president of Texas Student Education Association. Next, Mrs. Casillas earned her teaching degree at Stephen F. Austin State University along with her husband, Candido Casillas, now an EISD trustee. Following her graduation, she taught for a semester in Victoria ISD, and then the couple married that June and moved to Henderson, Texas, where he taught biology and chemistry courses, and she taught secondary English and Spanish

courses for three years. It was while Mr. Casillas was working on his master's degree that he was recruited by the then Ennis ISD superintendent to teach chemistry and physics, and the couple moved to Ennis. Though Mr. Casillas eventually went into private industry and is now a retired chemical engineer, Mrs. Casillas continued her teaching career and earned her master's degree from East Texas State University (now Texas A&M University-Commerce).

The adoption of the couple's baby daughter, Cassandra, after the couple had been married for 14 years, was important enough to take Mrs. Casillas from her classroom for two years. "Ennis was a good place for Cassie to grow up," Mrs. Casillas said. Cassie met her husband, Ben Smith, while she was serving in the Peace Corps. They live in Australia, Ben's native country, and have a son and daughter. "We FaceTime every day, and this grandma has flown to Australia three times," Mrs. Casillas said.

During her 44 years of serving on the Austin Elementary faculty, Mrs. Casillas has gone through the renovation of the school, worked with four superintendents, four principals, many faculty members and taught several generations of Ennis' youth. "I just love teaching here that much. When someone wonders when or what has happened at Austin Elementary, they usually come to see me. At Austin Elementary, we are a family — a community that's there to educate the children. Parents like that."

Austin Elementary Principal Bobby White remarked, "So many children taught by Mrs. Casillas have grown up to be parents with their own kids in her class. Her experience in education and her dedication are huge assets to Austin Elementary."

Bilingual in English and Spanish and certified in elementary education, all-level curriculum supervision and





as a reading specialist, Mrs. Casillas teaches approximately 57 students in first through second grades in a pullout reading and writing program. "My students are usually not ready emotionally or academically to be successful, so I work to get them up to grade level," she explained. "When we prepare for STARR testing, I also work with third-graders. I'm very lucky to have a paraprofessional this year. We have five-six students at a time. She works with half of them on word work for 15 minutes, while I work with the others on writing and reading, fluency and comprehension. Then we switch students for 15 more minutes. I feel that I'm reaching the students that I was always meant to teach."

As the saying goes, reading is fundamental. "Students must have reading comprehension skills before they can write. Reading and writing are very important skills. That's just thinking and being able to express thoughts. My students need our small groupings and individualized attention," Mrs. Casillas stated. "I love to read, so when my students read silently, I read silently. I model writing, too. My reward is when students feel comfortable in my classroom, and a child's light for learning comes on. If my students read, they can do anything, can develop a lifelong love of learning and be successful in life." Over the years, Mrs. Casillas sees former students around Ennis and stays in touch with others - all of whom have achieved success. "That's when I see that I've made a difference," she said.

The district's Reading Intervention Program, in which Mrs. Casillas teaches, has offered her many challenges. "I like challenges and showing children, through pre- and post-testing, that they have the ability to learn but learning requires work on their part, too. I've taught selective mute and autistic children. I didn't know

much about autism. My first autistic student was brilliant but had behavior issues. I wish I had known more at that time about autism, but we as teachers do the best we can for children," she said.

She holds professional memberships in Delta Kappa Gamma Society International's Alpha Alpha Chapter, International Reading Association, Austin Elementary PTO, Texas State Teachers Association (life member) and the Ennis Retired Teachers Association. Mrs. Casillas was selected by fellow teachers to serve on the Superintendent's Committee and has been selected as Teacher of the Year several times. She volunteers through her church, St. John Nepomucene Catholic Church and Catholic Daughters of America.

As this school year, Mrs. Casillas' 48th year to teach, begins to close, she reflects on the many changes in education that have occurred in her career. "EISD is very progressive concerning technology and training. We have what we need, and the district really cares about its personnel. Techniques have changed. We've gone from learning to read through sight words to phonics and now back to sight words," she explained.

And this teacher isn't thinking about leaving the classroom just yet. Mrs. Casillas stated, "Teaching is very important to me, and as long as I'm effective, I'll keep teaching. Every student needs encouragement. I'll do whatever it takes for my students to be successful."







When You Retire, Where Can You Find Investment Income?

As an investor, your main goals will change at different times in your life. During your working years, you need to grow as many resources as possible for retirement. Once you retire, however, you will likely need to focus more on getting income from your investments. But what are your options?

There's no shortage of income-producing investments, of course. You might immediately think of bonds, which can provide regular interest payments and probable preservation of principal, provided the bonds are considered "investment grade." Still, if interest rates are low when you retire — as they have been for several years now — bonds might not provide you with as much income as you need. And just as importantly, the income you receive from most bonds won't rise over time, leaving you susceptible to inflation and the loss of purchasing power.

Consequently, you may also need to explore other types of income-generating vehicles, including dividend-paying stocks and real estate investment trusts (REITs).

Some stocks have not only paid but also increased their dividends for many consecutive years. These stocks have historically provided the potential for rising income to help combat inflation and are typically well-run companies that strive to reward their investors. Nonetheless, you need to recognize that even these stocks are not obligated to pay you dividends, and they are free to lower or discontinue them at any time without notice.

Now, let's turn to a second type of potential incomeproducing asset: Real estate investment trusts (REITs). Different types of REITs are available. For example, equity REITs invest in and own commercial properties, such as hotels and shopping centers, while mortgage REITs, as the name suggests, own and invest in property mortgages. Is one form of REIT better than another? There's no simple answer. On the one hand, mortgage REITs are considered riskier than equity REITs. However, mortgage REITs often pay quite large dividends, although the payout can be inconsistent. (Like all REITs, mortgage REITs must pay 90 percent of their taxable income to investors in the form of dividends. Due to this requirement, REITs generally need to raise capital to finance their growth plans, and this necessity can affect their share prices.)

Other factors, such as changing interest rates, will affect the value of mortgage and equity REITs differently. Specifically, rising interest rates will likely cause the market value of the property mortgages inside mortgage REITs to fall, whereas equity REITs, which own actual buildings, might actually benefit if the Federal Reserve raises interest rates, as such a move would indicate a strong economy, more jobs and greater demand for office space. In the short term, though, even equity REITs can react negatively to an interest-rate increase. But over the long term, this movement can be offset by the benefits of earnings and dividend growth driven by a growing economy.

Clearly, there's much to think about when considering potential income-producing options such as bonds, dividend-paying stocks and REITs. Ultimately, you will need to weigh the merits and risks of these investments — including interest rate risk, credit risk and market risk — and determine which of them, or which combination of them, are most appropriate for your needs.





Pie filling:

 9-inch deep-dish pie crust
 1/2 cups sugar
 Tbsp. cocoa
 Tbsp. flour
 cups milk
 eggs yolks, reserve whites for meringue
 cup pecans, chopped
 1/2 tsp. vanilla
 Meringue:

- 4 egg whites 1/2 to 3/4 cup sugar
