

Imagine yourself walking down the middle of town when every street was brick-paved, horse carriages passed you by with a slow clipity-clop and the drivers greeted you with a soft Southern, "Howdy-do?" Do you ever long for the days when each sidewalk in front of a house was neatly pruned, each flower box was beautifully filled and every wood-framed house was perfectly maintained and painted with the greatest of precision? Recapturing that feel is the primary objective of the Corsicana Preservation Foundation. "We really want to assist the community with the restoration process by bringing Corsicana back to its original state and focusing on its historical, aesthetic beauty," said Hugh Stroube, chairman of the Corsicana

ultimate goal is to help the community revitalize itself, which we feel in turn will increase our community's pride and stimulate economic growth through outside tourism."

As a newly established board, begun in January 2007, the CPF diligently strives to return Corsicana to its former glory. They want every wood-framed house to be renovated and updated, in keeping with its architectural period, and desire to assist business owners in returning the store-front facades to Corsicana's early days.

"I have only lived here for three years, and I have heard such fabulous stories of what the town looked like when the turn-of-the-century homes lining Third and Fourth Avenues stood grand and bold," interjected Frances (Fran) Townes, CPF treasurer. "But the one thing that did grab my attention was the downtown, and I would love nothing more than to help restore it to its original state."

The CPF may not be able to slow life down, remove the traffic, take away the cell phones and road rage,

but they are diligently working to make the community aware of sites needing work. They want to assist the home and business owners all that they can with attaining their preservation intentions.

"It originally began when a family, the Halls, contacted the mayor of Corsicana, C.L. "Buster" Brown, about the city purchasing the Halbert House located on Third Avenue in Corsicana,"

Hugh and Fran stated, recalling the exact inception of the foundation. Unfortunately, the mayor had to deny the family's request due to the fact that if the city rescued one house, they would be obligated to rescue them all. Unfortunately, there were not enough subsidies for that.

So at that point, the CPF was formed. Buster began talking to quite a few citizens whom he felt would be interested in not only preserving the Halbert House, but many other architectural structures around the area as well. "Once Buster got the word out, a group of grassroot citizens gathered together and started having meetings," Fran explained. "After the initial exploratory meeting of what the foundation was going to focus on and how we were going to help the community, we soon held another meeting to elect the officers, which really catapulted the foundation forward."

Visualized concepts were put into play. They plan to assist the preservation of specific landmarks by guiding people to the resources needed to save particular places or artifacts. For example, they may put a home owner in touch with a general contractor familiar with homes from the turn of the century; or they may help a buyer research and find the original plans of a home in order to fully restore it to its original, glorious state.

The Halbert House, built in the 1880s, is a great example of the research and connection process offered



by CPF. It is currently being renovated entirely by one individual, James Hale. James purchased the home after it went up for auction when a family needed to move their ailing father out. The home was dilapidated. CPF served as the middleman, putting James in touch with the Hall family, the previous owners of the home, so he could purchase and save it.

CPF wants to know about any project or facility needing

attention; they want to research and focus the appropriate awareness on the project. "It is not an overnight thing; we need several projects to really get the foundation up and running," Fran explained. "We are open to any suggestions or ideas that the community or board may have as far as preservation needs."

"We are proactively trying to educate citizens on what the Preservation Foundation can do for the community as far as economy, tourism and pure existence is concerned," Hugh stated. "Our goal is to draw visitors to Corsicana; we want to make this a



"We have to build an infrastructure before we can start marketing to the outside world," Hugh reflected. The



foundation's principal aspiration is to involve the entire community in the restoration and preservation of structures that were the result of this community being one of the fastestgrowing oil-boom towns at one time.

One of the ventures the foundation is considering is to restore and transport one of the original oil derricks from Tucker Town (the original oil-boom town next to the Corsicana Municipal Airport) to Petroleum Park (located near downtown Corsicana on the south side of Seventh Avenue on Twelfth Street). But in order to do that, the foundation has to get the funding to

relocate the derrick, find the proper engineers to do the work and acquire the actual physical labor to make the move occur.

The Corsicana Preservation Foundation is not desiring credit or recognition for all of their hard work; in fact, they are working closely with numerous other preservation societies in town, such as the Corsicana Historical Society, Pioneer Village (near Jester Park) and the Corsicana Heritage Preservation Commission,


which works closely with the Main Street Project, just to maintain the original aesthetics of Corsicana.

Gazing out her window, Paula McNeel, the elementary school principal for Mildred Independent School District (MISD), gleamed with pride as she talked about her anticipation for the completion of the brand new elementary school which is currently under construction. "According to the contractors, it will be ready for the 2008 - 2009 school year," Paula stated with great enthusiasm.

"Our school district has needed and wanted this facility for almost five years now," Paula said. "The bond was finally



passed in October of 2006, and we were able to break ground in August of 2007," she said, pointing to the hard hat and shovel resting in the corner of her office. "There is really only one word for me to describe my feelings for this facility, and that is *excited*!" she enthused.

Paula has watched the progress on a daily basis, which is easy for her to do with the construction going on just a few hundred yards from her office window. "Sometimes, when I haven't been down there in a while or need a bit of time to myself, I tell the girls in the office that I need some hard hat time, and they know that I will be out of the office for about 30 minutes admiring the new facility," Paula shared.

MISD caters not only to the town of Mildred, but the towns of Eureka and Navarro as well. The school board's decision to build a new elementary school excited both the educators and the parents. "By building this new school, we will have the space we need to spread out," Paula said, thrilled about the expansion. "Building an elementary school is much less expensive than building a high school or a middle school. You don't have to worry about things like expensive science labs or other accommodations at that level."

A product of MISD herself, Paula's pride for the district and the community is quite obvious. "There is a specific pride

to be found in Mildred," she stated. "All of our schools have the best and most dedicated teachers, in addition to an amazingly dedicated community."

After graduating from Mildred High School in 1967, Paula headed off to Navarro College and then went to the University of North Texas where she obtained her bachelor's degree. From 1972 to 1981 she split her time between teaching at the second and sixth grade levels and working on her master's degree. Since 1981, she has served as the principal for Mildred Elementary.

During her time as principal, Paula has seen changes and growth within her school district. The new, state-of-the-art facility will accomodate prekindergarten through the fifth grade and will







provide the latest technology for these elementary students. "Each room will have a computer connection and a television cable connection, if needed," Paula explained. She further explained that there will be three classes for each grade level, with around 20 to 25 students in each class.

Not only will this facility have the latest in all educational advancements, but its architectural plan has been configured to address two particular



problems. One of these problems is particular to MISD — the fact that the traffic on Highway 287 runs directly in front of both schools. "I feel the way the school has been designed is much safer for the children, and a lot more conducive to our traffic needs," Paula said. The second problem the architects addressed is a problem that most schools run into the need for expansion over time, without the use of portable buildings. According to Paula, the plans were ingeniously designed to allow for future physical expansion.

Paula went on to explain that her grade levels are not the only ones receiving a bit of attention from the bond passed in 2006. The high school and middle school are also receiving a few tiny face lifts. A majority of the portable buildings surrounding the existing school will be removed to enhance the aesthetics of the campus. Also, two distinctive buildings will be added to the campus - a new field house and a new facility for the band

# Golden Circle Volleyball -

Having graduated from Corsicana High School, Amy Starling had established roots strong enough to pull her away from coaching in New Mexico and draw her back to Corsicana. After returning two years ago, Amy and her husband, Joel, were soon involved in church, extra curricular activities and sports. With their four children, Annie, Abby, Aly and Josh, with ages ranging from 13 to 18, they are involved in many activities, but Amy's greatest love is volleyball. "I don't think there is anyone who loves volleyball more than I do," Amy said. "I have always loved the game!"

After attending their girls' volleyball games, Amy and Joel were shocked at the huge difference in the level of play between Corsicana and other teams. "That is when we found out that these other teams came from areas with established select clubs which have been around seven to 10 years," she said. Fitting in everyone's activities once the girls got involved in select clubs required a tight schedule. To save time and money, they realized the need to start their own select club in the immediate area. The Golden Circle Volleyball Club was created to meet this need.

The Golden Circle Volleyball Club is a member of the USA Volleyball Division of the Junior Olympics, and the North Texas region has over 3,000 girls participating in established clubs. The club's main objective is to improve volleyball skills for girls wanting to play at high school and college levels. "There has never been one like it in this area," Amy said. "If you want your daughters to improve at their game, they're going to have to do clubs." She suggested that girls around age 12 should start playing on select teams to stay on top of their game.

The Golden Circle's first season started in 2007. There was not enough participation in the Corsicana area, so they needed to pull from surrounding communities. After contacting 10 districts, they received interest from girls in Blooming Grove, Ennis, Fairfield, Rice and Mildred. "Even though we are pulling from areas we play against, it's beneficial for everybody," Amy explained. "The girls broaden their horizons by making new friends with the small area schools."



They currently have two teams consisting of their daughters' age groups of 14 and 17. Amy coaches the younger team, the Cyclones; Joel coaches the older team, the Elite. Even though they are only in their first season, they have surprised the North Texas region by already placing in both silver and gold brackets. In mid-March,

they made it to the highest level of competition, the championship bracket.

Both Amy and Joel have obtained the strict credentials required for all select coaches - passing both the USA Volleyball Coach Training Course and their background checks. Amy is also an experienced aerobics instructor and was a personal trainer for the National Academy of Sports Medicine. She utilizes her knowledge to train the girls in agility, speed and explosive movements. Amy requires the girls to individually keep up with their own cardiovascular training, and keep a calendar of their progress. "The calendar keeps them aware that an exercise routine must be a part of life," she explained.

The select teams play tournaments almost every weekend in the Dallas-Fort Worth area. They play double elimination, so it is possible to play 12 to 16 games in one tournament. Some tournaments can last two days, making it necessary to spend the night in a




The club's parents have admitted they can see the benefits their daughters have received. "Parents say they can see huge improvements in their girls," Amy said. Seeing her girls reach the

Patti Harlan Bowen has been teaching all her life. She did not wait until she graduated from Central Missouri State University in 1964 before she stood in front of a classroom of pupils. That would have been like putting her talent in a box. At the tender age of 6, her father saw something in her. "As far back as I can remember," Patti explained, "my daddy wanted me to be a teacher. He set up a little school room for me in the basement, so I guess you could say I've been teaching since age 6." Once her father got the chalkboard in place, Patti wasted no time choosing the "smartest" dolls in her collection. "I would put them in chairs," she said, laughing fondly at the memories, "and go to teaching."

Her father, Chester Snider, had family members in the field of education. To say he gently pushed his daughter forward would be true. "He wanted me to always be able to take care of myself if I ever had to," she said. "His push became my passion."

As the years went quickly by, the teaching "bug" instilled inside her continued to grow. With a bachelor's degree in elementary education, she journeyed to Navasota, Texas, where she taught girls physical education, remedial reading and coached the junior high cheerleaders and the high school tennis team, taking one young man to the State playoffs. "That was an unbelievable year," she said. "It was a good thing that I possessed lots of energy because my schedule was so full."





#### SIMPLE BREAD

2 pkgs. active dry yeast 4 cups warm water (110 - 115 F) 8 cups all-purpose flour (recommend Harvest King) 4 tsp. salt 2 Tbsp. sugar 1 Tbsp. melted butter

Preheat oven to 350 F. Dissolve yeast in 2 cups warm water. In a large bowl, combine room temperature flour with salt. Stir sugar into yeast mixture and pour over flour. Add remaining 2 cups of warm water and stir until all is combined. Cover and let rise in warm place for about 1 hour until dough has doubled in size. Punch down and divide into 4 balls on floured board. Let rest a few minutes. Liberally grease 4 1-quart casserole or oven-proof bowls with butter. Shape into 4 rounds and place in bowls. Brush each round with butter or leave plan. Let rise in a warm place again until doubled in size — about 1 hour. Bake for 45 minutes. Remove from pans/bowls. Serve warm if desired. Can freeze for up to 1 month.

#### ALMOND STUFFED DATES

1 lb. pitted dates

4 oz. blanched whole almonds 2 12-oz. pkgs. thinly sliced bacon

Preheat oven to 400 F. Stuff each date with an almond. Cut bacon strips into thirds and wrap around each date. Secure with a toothpick. Place dates on foil-lined baking sheet. Bake for 12 - 15 minutes until bacon is crisp. Drain on paper towels and serve warm. Dates can be stuffed with walnuts or pecans for an optional flavor.

#### PARTY CRAB DIP

1 bunch green onions (use entire onion) 1/2 cup chopped parsley 1 stick butter 2 Tbsp. flour 1 pt. whipping cream 1/2 lb. grated Swiss cheese 1 lb. crab meat 3 Tbsp. dry sherry salt to taste paprika for garnish

Sauté onions and parsley in butter over medium heat. Do not brown. Blend in flour; add cream and cheese until melted. Mix in crab, sherry and salt. Heat but do not boil. Serve hot, sprinkled with paprika and parsley. Fresh crab is expensive, so you may choose to use fake crab or drained, tinned crab.

#### CHICKEN CASSEROLE

6 - 8 boneless chicken breasts 1 2 1/2-oz. jar dried beef 6 - 8 bacon slices 1/2 pt. sour cream 1 10 3/4-oz. can cream of mushroom soup 1 cup sliced mushrooms parsley

Preheat oven to 275 F. Flatten chicken breasts and wrap around 2 pieces of dried beef. Wrap a bacon slice around each piece of chicken. Place in a casserole dish. Mix sour cream, soup and mushrooms and pour over chicken. Bake for 3 hours. Garnish with parsley and serve over rice.

#### PAULOUA PYRAMID

4 egg whites 1 1/2 cups fine sugar 1 tsp. white vinegar 1 level tsp. corn flour



# Who's Cooking

1/2 pt. whipped cream fruit to garnish

Preheat oven to 225 F. Place a sheet of buttered foil on an oven tray. Beat egg whites until stiff. Continue to beat egg whites while gradually adding half of the sugar. Fold in the rest of the sugar with vinegar and corn flour. (This gives a firmer meringue.) Tip onto foil. Form mixture into a circle about 8 inches in diameter and pile high in center. Bake for 3 1/2 hours. Turn oven off and leave mixture in oven to cool. Remove from foil before completely cool to prevent sticking. Cover with whipped cream and garnish with fruit of your choice.

#### SLIVERED ALMOND CRISPS By Leah Jones

- 1 cup butter 3 Tbsp. sugar 2 cups unsifted flour 1 cup slivered almonds 1 cup angel flake coconut 1 tsp. vanilla

Preheat oven to 275 F. Mix all ingredients together and then make into 3 rolls about the size of a 50 cent piece. Wrap in wax paper and refrigerate overnight. Cut slices 1/4-inch thick and place all cookies on 2 cookie sheets. Bake for 20 minutes. Rotate cookie sheets in oven placing top sheet on bottom and bottom sheet on top rack. Bake 25 minutes longer until coconut looks darker than cookie dough. Cool and gently roll in powered sugar.





# Health Anomia Types and Treatment

— By Dr. Patel

As the most common blood condition in the U.S., anemia affects about 3.5 million Americans. Anemia is not like a cold that can be "caught" at any time; it develops because of a genetic condition or specific circumstances. The condition develops when blood lacks healthy red blood cells, which transport oxygen to the body. Without healthy red blood cells, blood cannot provide adequate oxygen to all of the parts of the body.

• Anemia can be caused by three things: blood loss, destruction of red blood cells or inadequate production of

red blood cells. Each cause calls for a different course of treatment.

• Anemia from blood loss can be the result of heavy or irregular menstruation, childbirth or internal bleeding. It is not the result of a minor injury, like a cut or regular menstrual cycles. To treat the problem, a physician will identify the source of bleeding, stop it and address any additional symptoms associated with the anemia.

• Anemia that develops as the result of red blood cell destruction can be caused by internal or external factors. The body may not make red blood cells strong enough to survive the circulatory system, which is usually the result of an inherited condition, such as sickle cell anemia. External factors that may destroy red blood cells are certain infections, toxin build-up in the body, tumors, venomous bites or severe burns. To address this form of anemia, a physician will treat the external factors with medication, surgery, blood transfusions or a combination of therapies. Inherited conditions, such as sickle cell anemia, cannot be cured, but a physician can improve the quality of red blood cells through drug treatment and blood transfusions.

• The inadequate production of red blood cells can be caused by certain inherited conditions or by iron deficiency, vitamin deficiency or bone marrow problems. To treat this form of anemia, a physician will provide additional iron or vitamins through diet changes, injections or medication. Anemia caused by bone marrow problems is more serious and requires more intense treatment.

• The symptoms of anemia will vary based on the underlying cause and any compounding health problems associated with the condition.

The most common symptoms of anemia are:
