





When Centennial High School made its debut for the 2010-2011 school year, Ashlee stepped into the softball program with confidence to help build a strong presence in the community. She threw her first perfect game while at Centennial. When she was a sophomore, the Lady Spartans went undefeated in the district. During her junior year, Centennial and Burleson High were co-district champs, and the Lady Spartans went on to be regional qualifiers.

Ashlee, now a senior, has played softball ever since she was 4 years old. She grew up watching her older niece, Courtney, play, and she wanted to play softball, too. "I told Ashlee I would give her 25 cents each time she threw the ball into a basket," her dad said with a smile. "She almost broke me." When Ashlee was 9, her mom, Peggy, and dad, Phil, signed her up for fast pitch lessons with Jim Davis, and she has been pitching ever since. Jim teaches lessons at Living Water Church, where Phil is the pastor. The open park has a mound, batting cages and agility courses set up. "I asked Jim if Ashlee had what it took to become a good pitcher," Phil remembered. "He said she would be the next high school pitcher, and she is."

"My dad and Jim are best friends. I have an at-home coach and an on-the-field coach," Ashlee laughed. Jim teaches the mechanics required for producing spot-on pitches. There are many pitching techniques to master. The drop curve arcs down. The screw ball cuts inside. The curve ball cuts outside. The rise slopes upward. The back door



curve cuts right in front of the batter, often making the batter shrink backward. The change up is slower than all the others. "The trick is to deceive the batters for as long as possible during my windup, and spin the ball so it cuts at just the right time across one of the corners, as a strike," Ashlee said.

"It's a mind game between the batter, the catcher and the pitcher," Ashlee explained further. "Then there is the game as a whole. You have to be so focused." Ashlee believes the game is 80-percent mental, 10-percent talent and 10-percent heart. She credits her coach, Shannon Sullivan, for her physical and mental maturity, on and off the field.

Ashlee works hard to maintain her skills and concentration. When she has a bad inning, she goes to the dugout to regroup by practicing what is not



working. "I can't change the past. I can only work on the next pitch," she said. Jim always stresses, "The most important pitch is the next pitch."

"I remember after we lost a hard game, my dad preached a little sermon on Philippians 3:14 to us," Ashlee said. "The verse is about pressing on to the goal to win the prize." Phil encouraged the team to apply the verse to every game and press on even when it's hard. "It was the extra push we needed," she admitted. "The verse stuck with us, and we began yelling, 'Press on,' at all the games. I even have it on the back of my letter jacket," Ashlee continued. "Since my dad is my coach and pastor, he helps me physically and spiritually. He always leads us in a prayer before the games."

Phil and Peggy are huge supporters. Phil jokes he is the chauffer, equipment carrier, lunch and snack provider. "I'm at least 10 to 15 years younger because of Ashlee," Phil laughed. Peggy is known for having a little fun hooraying the umpires, but they have come to expect it and take it in stride. Ashlee also depends on her teammates.

"We are like sisters," Ashlee said.
"It will be hard to leave them when
we graduate and all go to different
colleges, but some of us will be in the
same region, so we will play against each
other." Thinking about the future is
bittersweet for Ashlee.

Ashlee also loves to bat. "I feel like I know what the pitcher thinks, because I am a pitcher," she said. "I try to read the spin of the laces and how the pitcher releases the ball at her hip and predict the



Some people hear a message, yet never practice it. Steve Black hears, does and teaches. A happy health nut, Steve's also a compassionate worship leader and a motivational music teacher at Mountain Valley Studios in Joshua. He cares a lot about wellness and is often asked to teach about staying healthy in community groups. Leading by example, Steve

teaches what comes naturally to him. And he'll keep singing, because he keeps moving.

On the 17th of this month, Steve will compete in the Memorial Hermann Texas Ironman Triathlon in the Woodlands. First, he will swim 2.4 miles, bicycle 112 miles and conclude with a 26.2-mile run. To help him recover, Steve finishes the month with a 65-mile bicycle ride through Johnson County on the Burleson Honey Tour.



and the Ironman. Each is a stylized vision of a head above the shoulders of the capital letter M, which he combined to form his own unique tattoo.

Steve's M could stand for music, and the fact that he promotes singing as a lifetime health benefit. In a talk he recently gave to the Burleson Kiwanis Club, Steve challenged members to find a professional singer, who walks with poor posture. "Singers have been trained to sing standing tall, bigger than life, and it carries into all their life," he said. Impressing his students with this reality, Steve shows them videos of strong, vital singers in their 70s and 80s who were professionals half a decade ago. Then he requires his students to stand and sing properly. Their workouts leave them just as tired as if they had finished a Pilates class.

Steve models the same posture while singing in church or with his barbershop quartet. Head held high and back, this 46-year-old stays fit by singing. He exercises to strengthen his core, in order to support his vocal expressions. "It's a whole lot more fun to sing than to lift weights," he said, cracking a grin. "It's fun to sing a pretty song to entertain your spouse, your family, your church and your friends."

For Steve, fun matters as much as honesty, faithfulness and compassion. So, despite his associate degree in drafting and design, he found he did not enjoy being in a cubicle all day, while working as a draftsman. "I have always sung in choirs at school and in church, even during my six years in the U.S. Navy, so



I looked for an outlet for my voice, in addition to church," Steve said. "When I found Barbershop Harmony Society, things started to shift."

Not long after joining BHS in Arlington, Steve was asked to help direct his chorus. Soon, he was encouraged to join a quartet. His ability to teach became apparent. "People wanted me to help them solve a problem, such as getting better at a particular goal with their voice," he said. To aid these shortterm coaching sessions, Steve bought recording equipment, and their technical aspects were easy for his math- and computer-friendly brain to conquer. Soon, people were asking him to give vocal lessons and to record their quartet. So, he created Your Sound Studios and got a position directing a chorus in Allen, where he met several students.

One of those ladies still studies with Steve, 10 years later, out of a desire to give her congregation the best voice she can. Every two to three weeks, Steve helps her adjust to physiological changes affecting her vocals. She is also gaining interest in learning music theory, which Steve teaches in his own hands-on style.

"I graduated from elementary school with more music theory than many high school or college graduates, because my music teacher, Mrs. Koen, was amazing! She happened to be the music teacher at my church, too," said Steve, who teases about having more time with Mrs. Koen than with his mom some weeks.

Steve credits his ability to teach to his student's ability and desire to learn. His passionate personality motivates



everyone he meets to seriously consider his message. "The students' responsibility is to practice after they've learned the concept. I explain what you need to *do* to accomplish the next step," said Steve, who takes something he knows a person is aware of and shows them how to think about what he's teaching.



"This is not a pep rally," he added. "After 20 minutes, you have to fall back on what you believe in your heart." During a recent wellness class, for instance, a woman announced that her doctor had just given her a clean bill of health. "Yet by the end of the class, it became apparent she was on several medications," Steve said. "What we eventually got to is, how healthy can you think you are, if you're taking drugs to stay that way? Our goal is to no longer rely on drugs by giving the body adequate nutrition, so it can create the ability to heal." The woman's aha moment translated into her commitment to look a little harder at her diet.

Get him started, and Steve can explain in detail how fresh salads, as well as







He had to learn, since he enjoyed strenuous physical exercise yet found his recovery time was declining. Using essential oils and nutritional supplements, Steve found a way to support healing of muscles that cramp in the 80- or 90-mile point of his 100-mile rides.





Physically fit and enjoying the way he feels, Steve believes every hour he exercises increases the amount of time he is going to be strong and vital as he ages. Rather than using a treadmill, Steve runs in the wind and the rain. "I get on the bike out in the fresh air," he said, "go swim in the lake where the water is free-flowing, and I can see stuff, feel things, enjoy all kinds of different stimuli." Steve combines that rush with oils and music, and creates joy he is passionate about passing on.

Steve plans to live beyond the century point and feel good on the journey. "One hundred twenty years is actually scriptural. So, I figure I'll claim it," Steve said. "I want to be excited about life when I'm 120, too!" NOW





The simplicity of a house built in 1960 set in an older neighborhood establishes the grace of the Thiebaud residence. Crossing the lawn on stepping-stones, a sense of coming home welcomes friends and family. From the street, the house seems rather small, but looks can be deceiving. often rode his bike, too. He always carried chewing gum for the children, who unofficially adopted him as Papaw. Ginnie remembered going with him to see a swing set he built and believes it was at the place she now calls home. 'I never dreamed I'd live in any of these houses," she said.

When they had five children, the couple put a down payment on the house and assumed the mortgage. "Times were different back then," Ross said. The Thiebauds gradually changed the interior, enlarging it to accommodate their growing family. At





one time, it provided comfortable space for not only Ginnie and Ross, but also their 12 children. Seven of the children still live at home. Discovering a cousin or a friend of the child sitting at the counter eating lunch isn't uncommon.

Most Sunday afternoons, Ross takes on the role of gourmet cook, serving his wife, children, grandchildren and his parents, Betty and Wayne Thiebaud. Sometimes, Ginnie's parents, Billy and Barbara Ellis, join the family gathering, to savor the meal. "He makes the best chocolate pie in the world," Ginnie said.

change, capturing moments when they aren't together.

The galley kitchen features granite countertops and many cabinets. "Ross is the real gourmet cook of the family," Ginnie said, although she cooks during the week. Spacious counters transform to extra dining spots for extended family on holidays.

Off the kitchen, a custom-built table with surrounding benches gives them enough room so the entire family can gather at mealtimes. Simple touches add color to the area, although you might spot a chart or two used for classes. Even with specified school times during the day, they seldom pass up an opportunity for teaching and learning.

To include more room in the kitchen/dining area, part of the garage was enclosed and is used for refrigerators. A closed-off laundry room is organized

In spite of all the improvements, the house isn't overly important to this amazing mother with a dozen children, who still enjoy spending time at home. "Our family is what makes our home," Ginnie said. She and Ross have made it an inviting one, where family comes first.

"With all the electronics out there, kids spend more time plugged in and less time interacting face to face," she pointed out. "But camp fosters an atmosphere that allows kids to build relationships with peers and their counselors."

Vacation Bible Schools

Another staple, yet ever diversifying, alternative for meaningful summer activity for children is Vacation
Bible School. Nearly every church sponsors a program blending faith-based instruction with challenging amusement, covering a range of ages.

Nora Beane, a contributor to the online clearinghouse Yahoo Voices, cites five good reasons for parents to consider VBS as a viable outlet for kids' entertainment and education:






Don't Let Spring Showers Leave You Soaked: What You Need to Know About Flood Insurance

We experience heavier rain during the spring months, and this increase in precipitation raises water levels and can lead to flooding. One way to prepare for wetter weather is to purchase flood insurance.

Flood insurance 101

- Flood insurance is offered through the Federal Government's National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). You can obtain flood insurance through local insurance companies.
- A standard flood policy covers the building and contents. Building Coverage protects the structure of your home or business. Contents Coverage protects your personal property, such as clothing and furniture.

Know the risks

- Floods and flash floods occur in all 50 states, including Texas.
- According to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), roughly 25 percent of all claims paid by the NFIP are for policies in low- to moderate-risk communities.
- Floods often happen when bodies of water overflow or tides rise due to heavy rainfall or thawing snow. Flash floods may occur without warning when a large volume of water falls in a short time.
- After fires, floods are the most common natural disaster in the U.S.
- Consumers should be aware that most homeowners, condominium, manufactured home, renters and business insurance policies do not cover flood damage. Property owners may need separate flood insurance coverage to protect against losses from floods during hurricanes, thunderstorms or any time of the year.

Getting coverage

- Consumers can request flood insurance through their insurance agent.
- Depending on where you live, the average cost of a \$50,000 flood insurance policy is slightly more than \$200 annually, about 56 cents per day, while a \$100,000 policy is about \$500 annually, or \$1.37 per day.
- In general, a flood policy does not take effect until 30 days after you purchase flood insurance. So, if the weather forecast announces a flood alert for your area and you go to purchase coverage, it's already too late. You will not be insured if you buy a policy a few days before a flood.

Costly consequences

- If a consumer is impacted by flooding and they do not have flood insurance, the cost to rebuild their lives could be in the tens of thousands of dollars.
- Flooding is the most costly natural disaster in the U.S., causing more than \$2 billion of property damage each year.
- Just 1 foot of water can destroy up to 60 percent of a home's contents.

What's the Right Age to See an Orthodontist?

One of the most common questions dentists are asked is: "What is the right age for my child to see an orthodontist?" The America Association of Orthodontists recommends that your child get a checkup with an orthodontist at the first recognition of an orthodontic problem, but no later than age 7. By then, your child has enough permanent teeth for an orthodontist to determine whether an orthodontic problem exists or is developing. Putting off a checkup with an orthodontist until a child has lost all baby teeth could be a disservice. Some orthodontic problems may be easier to correct if they are found early. A checkup no later than age 7 gives your orthodontist the opportunity to recommend the appropriate treatment at the appropriate time. If early treatment is in order, the orthodontist may be able to achieve results that may not be possible once the face and jaws have finished growing.

Most orthodontic problems (malocclusions) are inherited. Examples of these genetic problems are crowding, spacing, protrusion, extra or missing teeth and some jaw growth problems. Other malocclusions are acquired as a result of thumb- or finger-sucking, dental disease, accidents, the early or late loss of baby (primary) teeth or other causes. While your child's teeth might appear to be straight, there may actually be a problem that needs to be evaluated by an orthodontist. If you recognize any of the following

issues with your child, consider scheduling a checkup with your local orthodontist:

- Early or late loss of baby teeth
- Difficulty in chewing or biting
- Mouth breathing
- Jaws that shift or make sounds
- Speech difficulties
- · Biting the cheek or the roof of the mouth
- · Facial imbalance
- Grinding or clenching of the teeth
- Thumb- or finger-sucking

Calling an orthodontist may be one of the most important actions you can take to ensure your child's healthy and happy smile!

Brown Sugar Pecan Coffee Cake

Cake:

3 cups flour

4 tsp. baking powder

1 tsp. salt

2 cups sugar

1 1/4 cups whole milk

1 1/2 sticks butter, softened

3 egg whites, beaten until stiff

Topping:

1 1/2 sticks butter, softened

3/4 cup flour

1 1/2 cups brown sugar

2 Tbsp. cinnamon

1 1/2 cups pecans, chopped

1. For cake: Preheat oven to 350 F. Sift flour, baking powder and salt together.

2. In a separate bowl cream sugar and butter with a whisk.

3. Mix flour mixture and milk, alternating

until combined. Add in butter mixture; do not overbeat. Fold in egg whites with spatula.

4. Spread in a well-greased 9x13-inch baking pan.

5. For topping: Combine all ingredients in a bowl. Sprinkle over top of cake. Bake 40 to 45 minutes.

Spicy Pepper Chili

1 1/4 lbs. ground beef

1 yellow onion

I jalapeño pepper, chopped

I serrano pepper, chopped

2 cloves garlic, chopped

2 15-oz. cans tomato sauce

2 15-oz. cans beef broth

1 10-oz. can Ro-Tel tomatoes with green chilies

2 Tbsp. chili powder

1 Tbsp. ground cumin

1 Tbsp. cayenne pepper

1/2 tsp. each salt and pepper

1/8 cup Worcestershire sauce

1. Brown ground beef in a large pot with the onion, jalapeño, serrano and garlic. Drain.

2. Turn heat to medium; add remaining ingredients. Bring to a boil; reduce heat and simmer for 2 hours, stirring occasionally.

Buttercream Sugar Cookies

Cookies:

1/2 cup butter, softened

2 eggs, beaten

1/2 cup sugar

1 tsp. vanilla

2 2/3 cups flour

2 tsp. baking powder

Frosting:

1/2 cup butter, softened

1/2 cup solid vegetable shortening

1 tsp. vanilla

I box powdered sugar

Food coloring (optional)

2-3 Tbsp. milk (as needed)

1. For cookies: Beat butter, eggs, sugar and vanilla. Add flour, one cup at a time, along with the baking powder.

2. Roll out dough to desired thickness. Dip cookie cutters in flour; cut out cookies. Bake at 375 F for 6-7 minutes.

3. For frosting: Mix butter with shortening. Add the vanilla. Add powdered sugar one cup at a time; mix well. Add a few drops of food coloring, if desired. Add enough milk to give frosting a good spreading consistency.

Zesty Pork Chops

6 Tbsp. Italian dressing

3 Tbsp. soy sauce

I white onion, sliced

I cup baby carrots

1 bell pepper, sliced

Salt and pepper, to taste

3 pork chops

1. Combine first 5 ingredients in a bowl. Salt and pepper pork chops.

2. With heavy-duty foil, make a pouch for each pork chop and evenly disperse the vegetable mixture between chops.

3. Bake at 350 F for 45-60 minutes.
