

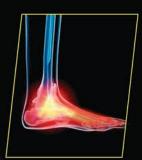



Happy Mother's Day!




mom is filled with sharp curves, high peaks, low valleys and everything imaginable in between.







RY DEDICATION

"We weren't looking for a film course, per se, but I thought it would be awesome to make documentaries," explained Grant, who has watched many through the years. As a photographer since the age of 8, it was a natural fit for him to take over cinematographer duties, even using his personal equipment in the early days of shooting.

Don's skill is socializing, and he is both narrator and script writer. The thought of making a documentary that might have a national impact was a selling point. "I love making change," he said. "If there is a problem no one is addressing, I want to get into it. I'm all about instilling change."

The team mapped out an action plan, practicing the project-based learning Global promotes. They listed places they wanted to visit, people they needed to interview, and created a storyboard for the flow of the documentary. They agreed the deadline for their 60- to 90-minute film was December 2015, so there would be time to send to festivals and competitions and reach a wider audience. "We have really had a crash course in learning how to do filming, fundraising, creating a budget and business plan and then promoting it," Grant explained.

"We have a strategy," Don added.

The first visit was to the Remember
Me Rescue stables, where they met the
retired racehorses, many of whom were
being rehabilitated. They interviewed
owners Dallas and Donna Keen and
filmed video of the operation. In March,
they attended the Battle of the X's,






The OTTB Trainer Challenge at Will Rogers Coliseum in Fort Worth, and shot footage of the thoroughbreds' versatility in a competitive environment. They also interviewed Jack Van Berg, who trained horses that won the Kentucky Derby, Preakness Stakes and Breeders' Cup.

The footage from the Battle of the X's became their first video, a teaser trailer they premiered at the Remember Me Rescue Gala at Lone Star Park in April. Not only was the trailer a hit with the guests, the students seized the opportunity to interview retired jockey Pat Day, who was inducted into the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame in 1991.

In June, the project moved into high gear, when the students began fundraising to purchase professional equipment. They used Twitter, Facebook and YouTube accounts to spread the word and conducted interviews with local media outlets. Additionally, they went to local businesses and individuals to pitch the film, with Don and Grant doing odd jobs and raking leaves. They were able to raise \$1,000. In late October, the students filmed a video explaining the goals,










risks and challenges of their planned documentary, which they debuted with the opening of their online Kickstarter fundraising campaign. The crew wanted to purchase a Blackmagic Cinema Camera and sound and lighting equipment. By November 25, they had reached their goal of \$3,500.

The group continued gathering information for the documentary, visiting horse therapy centers Serendipity Equine Haven in Fort Worth and Campfire Creek in Waxahachie. In December, they met Russell Thompson, a film producer who mentored them on live action shooting, final editing and getting into film competitions. On Russell's suggestion, Don and Grant created a "sizzle reel," a short, fast-paced creative pitch, which debuted in February on their YouTube channel. "He suggested we send it to companies who would help with a film on this topic," Don said. "We still have some camera needs, plus our travel and other support expenses."

New equipment arrived earlier this year, with lights, camera rig, microphones, audio setups, lenses, a slate and a gyro for stabilization — just what the students needed to move to the next step. "We'll finish filming at the end of this month, right around the end of the school year," Don said. "We plan on interviewing experts at Texas A&M University, major figures in the industry, jockeys, trainers, veterinarians and equine health experts, anyone who can talk to us about what retired racehorses can do." Most of the filming will be done in the Dallas-Fort Worth area, followed by final editing and post-production work, which means the documentary team still needs donations. All equipment purchased will be donated back to GHS. Because the students formed a nonprofit 501(c)(3), all donations are tax deductible.



"The community support has been wonderful," Tanya said. "Other Global students gave, because they want to see fellow students do well. Teachers donated, too. Our kids give back a lot in the community, so others give when they ask." Tanya just beamed with pride as she thought about Don and Grant. "Don is the big picture person, and Grant makes it all happen. Together they do everything, and they will make a great thing." NOW



degree while serving. Jenette didn't know anything about the military or any women in the military, but she joined the Navy anyway.

Entering as a medical corpsman, Jenette loved every minute. Watching the young doctors quickly changed her mind. They never saw their babies, and seldom saw their spouses. Besides, she figured doctors weren't the real healers. The nurses made the patients well. Nurses had the special touch. They encouraged and cried with patients and helped them through uncertainties.

Nursing really was what she wanted after all. As a strong Christian, Jenette believes God has a hand in the happenings of life. "If you're a Christian and belong to Him, then He's intervening



every day," she said. "Too many times we chalk it up to coincidence. We don't acknowledge His hand."

From a young age, she believed God had a plan for her life. In the circumstances of her early career, she saw His hand moving. "My naval career is a huge badge I wear with great pride," she said. The Navy introduced her to a medical career and took her many places in the world, both geographically and professionally. "I 'grew up' in Navy medicine, and I feel it has made me the nurse I am," she added. The Navy









provided confidence in new, unfamiliar situations and an ability to jump in quickly as part of a team.

In the Navy, nurses were given huge amounts of responsibility on day one, and with it came accountability. The experience taught her accountability goes hand-in-hand with any decision made.



"I must be willing to stand behind my decisions instead of making excuses for them," she said. After four years of active duty, Jenette remained in the Navy Reserve, but headed to Dallas Bible College, intent on pursuing mission work. Very content with going as a nurse, she still longed to serve God.

Jenette met her future husband, Rick, at a singles group Bible study. She had already signed up for a mission trip to Africa. She certainly wasn't looking for a husband. But the love of her life stayed around no matter how many times she tried brushing him off. The dilemma posed a question she had to answer. Why did she want to be a missionary?



With no family in the area and few friends, she came out of the Navy focused on school and herself. An emptiness settled over her. She realized God had given her a gift to serve others. The empty feeling came from lack of service. With no patients, family or friends, she started baking cookies for others — a simple solution, but the small act restored her fulfillment. Ultimately, she decided nursing provided the perfect way to serve others. She also determined being a wife and mother in a time when many said she was wasting her potential was the absolute best way to serve.

While finishing her nursing degree, she remained in the Navy Reserve. When

Rick's job transferred him to California, she went back on active duty, continuing her nursing career. With a military background and pay grade, the choice made sense.

Rick eventually joined the Navy. They chose to homeschool their two sons, so she worked for temporary agencies on days when Rick could be home early. Even as a civilian, most of the jobs she worked involved military hospitals.

When Rick retired in 2005, they decided to move back to Waxahachie, near his hometown of Midlothian. His family still lived there at the time, although they're no longer in the area. Her mother and sister, who both had physical disabilities, lived in Round Rock at the time. They moved in, and Jenette became the primary caregiver for her sister, until she passed in Oct. 2014. Her mother's health was good, and other than having bad knees, she was very capable. Following knee surgery that went very wrong, she needed Jenette more than ever. Today, she lives with Rick and Jenette, helping as much as possible. "She isn't demanding, expectant of special treatment or bitter," Jenette said. Rick helps care for her when Jenette is out of the house.

Besides caring for her mother, Jenette works in the nursing pool for Baylor Scott and White in Waxahachie. As part of the pool, she tells them what days she is available, and they assign her to different units, as needed. She is the only nurse who works every unit in the hospital. She loves the ER, but prefers working in all areas. Blessed with not having to work, she still loves nursing.

"I get to change lives through nursing," she said. The impact may be forever or for an hour. She interacts with patients and families who need her knowledge or shared tears. She gets to mentor younger nurses or help a seasoned colleague refocus. All of it brings her joy, pride and a sense of fulfillment from knowing she contributes a lot even without working every day.

When someone wrote about her and submitted it to the board for the Great 100 Nurses Award, she welcomed the validation of her contribution. "It would have been enough, just being submitted," she said. "Winning the award was incredible." She plans to support winners in the future by taking a group from Baylor







- New Waxahachie High School with core space for 3,000 students and new Career and Technical Education facilities
- New expanded facilities for Waxahachie Global High School on the former WHS campus
- New facilities for High School of Choice and Challenge Academy in the current WHS Career and Technology Education facilities
- · New junior high at the current Waxahachie Ninth Grade Academy campus
- · New elementary school at the current T.C. Wilemon campus
- · New elementary school at the current Turner campus

Since 2005, WISD has grown by nearly 2,000 students. Many facilities are currently at capacity or will be at capacity in the next three years; at the same time, WISD expects to add an estimated 883 students to district schools in the next five years.

The WISD School Bond 2015, a \$125,000,000 investment by the community, will provide classroom space that can result in smaller classes and address the growth that Waxahachie is experiencing.

HOW WILL HOMEOWNERS BE AFFECTED?

Homeowners will see an increase of approximately \$10.50 each month, or \$126 a year, for each \$100,000 their home is worth. Homeowners who have a valid over 65 exemption on file with the Ellis County Appraisal District would see no change in their taxes from the bond.

ideals are being put to the test, as Georgia attends Clift Elementary and the twins attend an in-home daycare and drop-in speech classes, also at Clift.



For many years, organist and pianist, Fred Stroop, played the melodies of worship and weddings, of musicals, parties, meetings and final farewells. "I liked farm life," Fred smiled. "I remember how Sundays were our cows' favorite times to get out, and my father and I would hurry to round them up before Sunday school."



Fred began piano lessons as a kindergartener and organ lessons in high school. Interestingly, by the time he was 15, he had also developed an affinity for typing. So much so, that he took top honors at the University Interscholastic League annual competition typing division. The year was 1949. He was a senior at Waxahachie High School. "That was 67 years ago," he grinned. "I don't recall a whole lot except that I enjoyed typing." Clearly, typing liked him. He placed first at the district level in Waco, second in regionals at Southern Methodist University in Dallas and, ultimately, first at the state level in Austin. 
piano playing probably helped, but then, one of the officials said, 'Sometimes it helps, and sometimes it harms.' So it stayed a mystery."



As high school graduation came and went, Fred was soon on his way to North Texas State College in Denton (now University of North Texas) to earn a bachelor's degree in music, with a major in organ music. The mystery and importance of the UIL plaque faded to a small degree.

With undergraduate work behind him, Fred made the brave and bold decision to head east to earn a master's degree in sacred music, with a major in organ music at the Union Theological Seminary in New York City. "I picked New York City because of its sights and programs," he shared. "It was quite a jump for me." As it turned out, his experience was so productive that he spread his classes over three years.

After earning his master's degree, Fred's first job was with First Baptist Church in Wichita Falls. Not only was it an opportunity to be back in Texas, but it was a chance to play a state-of-the-art pipe organ. "The church had owned the organ for a few years, but it was still new and the biggest one I've ever played," he smiled. While he enjoyed his work, the climate in Wichita Falls was challenging, and after a year of sinus and ear troubles, Fred eagerly returned to Waxahachie.











His remarkable musical journey was underway. Other than a break to attend Drone's Business College in Dallas and six years with the Small Business Administration, Fred's career has been dedicated to music. "I've always been fascinated by the different organs and organists," he said. "As a boy, I loved to listen and watch and am still drawn to the mechanics and sound."



For 15 years, he was organist at the First Presbyterian Church in Lancaster, and lastly, he was a pianist at the Bardwell United Methodist Church for 10 years. In and around those periods, he served a number of Waxahachie churches, including First Presbyterian on Main Street where he had first played as a high school student and, also, at Central Presbyterian. Fred was the organist at First United Methodist Church in Waxahachie for many years and spent three-and-a-half years at Waxahachie's First Christian Church.

"When I started, there weren't as many churches as there are now, so I think I played weddings at most all of them," he smiled. He was also popular at local club meetings and served as a member of the Rotary Club of Waxahachie for eight years. He was editor of the Rotary newsletter for over three years and named Rotarian of the Year in 1984-85.

A devoted resident of Waxahachie, Fred has lived in the same in-town apartment complex for the past 40 years. Twenty-six years ago, he was blessed by a new connection which has filled his days with abundant joy and friendship. Ultimately, this became the link to the old mystery. While playing at a service at Boze-Mitchell McKibbin Funeral Home, Fred was introduced to Pastor Bruce Zimmerman of Waxahachie Bible Church. "I was conducting the service,"

Gum Disease Can Kill More Than Your Smile

Half of American adults over the age of 30 have some degree of periodontal (gum) disease, according to recent findings from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Multiple studies estimate that between 48 and 50 percent, or approximately 65 million American adults, have mild, moderate or severe periodontitis, the more advanced form of periodontal disease. In adults 65 and older, prevalence rates increase to 70 percent. Literally millions of teeth every year are unnecessarily lost to gum disease.

Periodontal disease is caused by bacterial infections that attack gums, ligaments and bone caused by plaque below the gum line. The bacteria (plaque) create toxins which irritate the gums and bone and can eventually lead to tooth loss. More sobering, the bacteria and toxins that build up under the gum can enter the blood stream, travel throughout the body and cause serious health problems including: stroke, respiratory diseases, heart disease, diabetes, stomach ulcers, osteoporosis, arthritis, infertility, prostatitis and pre-term births.

Besides simply affecting your mouth, causing bad breath, tooth loss and embarrassment, periodontal disease can have wider reaching effects on the body. Women who are pregnant are especially at risk. Periodontal disease can lead to premature delivery, and worse, the potential for a stillborn baby. There is an old wives tale that you lose a tooth for each baby. This may or may not be true in every case, but the point is that pregnancy can cause an underlying condition to worsen. Seventy-five percent of women experience some level of gingival bleeding while carrying a child. In more severe cases, bacteria from periodontal disease can travel through the bloodstream, cross the placenta, enter the amniotic fluid and cause a neonatal infection. This infection can be what triggers a premature delivery or stillbirth.

In an Australian study conducted in 2011 that involved 3,416 women, the 26 percent of women with periodontal disease were not able to conceive a child for seven months, while the group without gum disease took an average of two months to become pregnant. Research is ongoing, but these results were definitely interesting. Periodontal disease can affect the ability to conceive.

For men with periodontal disease, a recent study published in the *Journal* of *Periodontology* found a significant connection between periodontal disease and inflammation of the prostate (prostatitis). Also, the National Cancer Institute states that men with gum disease have a 60-percent higher chance of being diagnosed with pancreatic cancer.

For both men and women, periodontal disease can cause faster progression of arterial disease due to systemic inflammation and heightened immune system response. Inflammation has been shown to prematurely break down arterial walls, leading to the plaque buildup that reduces blood flow, causing many associated diseases.

Some of the warning signs of periodontal disease are gums that bleed easily, red, swollen or tender gums, bad breath, gums that have pulled away from the teeth, loose teeth, and changes in the fit of partial dentures. With all of this bad news, is there any hope? Yes! Periodontal disease can be very effectively managed. Management starts with regular dental visits. Your dentist will do a thorough exam, diagnose your condition, prescribe the appropriate treatment and educate you on home care. Your health is worth it!

Mother's Pecan Chocolate Chip Cookies

- 2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour
- I tsp. baking soda
- I tsp. salt
- 2 sticks unsalted butter
- 2/3 cup Skippy Creamy Peanut Butter
- 1 cup sugar
- I cup light brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 2 tsp. vanilla
- 1 12-oz. bag chocolate chunk chips or 1 cup milk chocolate and white chocolate chips
- 1 1/4 cups pecans, coarsely chopped
- **I.** Preheat oven to 325 F. Combine flour, baking soda and salt in a medium-sized mixing bowl.

- **2.** Beat butter, peanut butter and sugars together in a large bowl until light and fluffy, about 3 minutes. Beat in eggs and vanilla until blended. Stir in flour mixture until blended and dough forms.
- **3.** Stir in the chocolate or chocolate chips and pecans. Drop cookies by the teaspoonful onto a cookie sheet. Bake for 15-17 minutes or until golden brown around the edges and lightly browned on top.

Bread Pudding With Whiskey Sauce

Serves 10-12.

1 16-oz. loaf French bread 2 cups milk

- 1 cup cream sherry
- 3 large eggs, lightly beaten
- 2 cups sugar

- 1 cup raisins
- 1/4 cup butter or margarine, melted (divided use)
- 2 Tbsp. vanilla extract 1/2 cup honey
- **1.** Break bread into small chunks. Place in a large bowl. Add milk and sherry; stir well. Let stand for 10 minutes.
- **2.** Combine eggs, sugar, raisins, 2 Tbsp. butter and vanilla. Add to bread mixture; stir well. Spoon mixture into a lightly greased 13x9x2-inch baking dish. Combine honey and remaining butter. Pour over bread mixture.
- **3.** Bake at 350 F for 45 minutes or until set and lightly browned. Serve with Whiskey Sauce. See recipe below.

Whiskey Sauce

Yields 3 cups.

1 cup sugar

1 cup milk

1/2 cup butter

1 Tbsp. cornstarch 1/4 cup cold water

3/4 cup bourbon

- **1.** Combine the first 3 ingredients in a heavy saucepan. Cook over medium heat, stirring frequently until sugar dissolves and butter melts.
- **2.** Combine cornstarch and water. Add cornstarch mixture and bourbon to milk mixture; bring to a boil. Reduce heat and cook for 1 minute, stirring occasionally.

Peach Cooler

Serves 4.

- 1 12-oz. bottle lemon-lime carbonated beverage
- 2 8-oz. cans peach halves
- 1 tsp. fresh lemon juice
- 2 scoops vanilla ice cream
- 1/4 cup crushed ice
- **I.** In a blender, combine first three ingredients until smooth. Serve as a topper over ice cream or in a glass of ice.


