Sitting at her desk in a small-town school, Dolores McClatchey, future educator, had many dreams. Not one of those dreams included becoming a teacher and receiving one of the highest honors an educator can receive — being the namesake of a new school. Such an honor seeks a person of high integrity who serves as a role model to the entire educational community. How appropriate that the new Midlothian school bears her name — Dolores Wood McClatchey Elementary School.



"It's not what's best for me or what's best for teachers. We kept the focus on kids and what's best for students."

"In high school, there was a basketball coach who was also the typing teacher," she shared. "I never thought I could go to college. He convinced me that it was possible. I was the first one from my family who went to college. My parents were very encouraging and had always said, 'You can do any and every thing you want to do if you put your mind to it!' I believed that."

Dolores graduated from high school in 1955 at the top of her class. Smiling, she noted that she was valedictorian out of a class of seven. "What I'm most proud of is that I never missed a day of school after I started high school. I loved school that much!" After graduation, she went to Stephen F. Austin State University in Nacogdoches. In three years, she earned her degree in elementary education. Dolores met her future husband, Clyde, in Nacogdoches, where he was working on his master's degree. They both returned to Dolores' high school where her husband taught, and they started their family with their son, Steapheon.

The couple moved to North Forest ISD in the Houston area and lived there for 16 years. Dolores taught second grade for four years and then moved to the central office into a position called Helping Teacher. "I held staff development for the teachers. I coached them, watched them teach and told them what I thought they

needed to do." She became director of elementary curriculum with 10 elementary schools for 12 years. It was during this time that their daughter, Jana, was born.

With a growing family, the couple's priorities changed. They wanted their children to have that grandparent experience, so they started a job search close to their parents. "We sent out 115 résumés and only heard back from one — Midlothian," she laughed. "There was a supreme being leading us to Midlothian. We knew we didn't want to go to a big city. At that time, there were 1,900 kids in the district. Signing our contract in 1975 was the best move we ever made."

Dolores taught two years as a sixth grade reading teacher, until she was promoted to the position of curriculum director and began to work with the principals. Her position evolved into an assistant superintendent, and she continued to work with the principals and develop curriculum with all the teachers in the district. She also provided staff development, interviewing and hiring qualified teachers. She continued in that position throughout her 30 years



in Midlothian. Meanwhile, her husband worked as assistant principal and special education director for Ellis County. Upon retirement, he went to Texas Youth Commission and worked as an education liaison.

In Midlothian ISD, Dolores' work with the teachers operated on the principle of staying on the "cutting edge of what research said about what is best for kids. It has been sort of our motto that everything you do, you run through the filter of the eyes of what's best for kids," she stated. "It's not what's best for me or what's best for teachers. We kept the focus on kids and what's best for students."



What Dolores is most proud of is the Literacy Program. "I had the opportunity to get training for teachers and develop a cadre of staff members who could carry on that training over the years to come. It is a guided reading library with level books located in an area separate from the school library," she explained. "It's like a book room. The teachers can pull from them to give their instructions. We trained all the first grade teachers and developed a library on each campus where teachers could place kids on their reading levels, and they could advance. The materials they needed were all right there. I feel like the program has made a difference, and it is continuing today."

Developing a program for teachers was representative of Dolores' work in the educational arena. "I love teachers!" she exclaimed. "I've always been a firm believer that the key to learning is the teacher. You can take technology or any kind of equipment or program and stick it in there, but it is the teacher who makes the difference. The basis of staff development is helping teachers know what research said about what was best for students and student growth, and then building on those materials and supplies to improve the reading skills of students."

Dolores still works part time in I Teach Texas, an alternative certification program. It involves working with teachers in Ellis County, who have a degree in a field other than education, but are trying to get the certificate to teach. "After they take course work through I Teach Texas, I supervise them for a year. While they are teaching, I go in and give them feedback on their teaching."

After 30 years of being in Midlothian, Dolores has seen many changes and growth in the community. "There are a lot of good things about it," she acknowledged. "When you grow, you are able to provide a wider range of opportunities for kids. You are able to build and expand on what you've previously developed and continue to develop new things. Growth can be difficult on one side because sometimes growth can happen so rapidly you have a hard time keeping up. You can't predict what's going to happen, particularly in the building of schools and in the hiring of personnel. Those two things are critical."

Very few communities can keep up with the level of growth and still maintain high levels of educational achievement for the students. "I think that's attributed to the growth that's here," Dolores remarked. "If you ask people on the street why they came to Midlothian, they say it's the schools. We've had excellent support for school growth. The parents and the business people in the community are there and ready to do what they can for the schools. There are quality people working in this district. There are principals who give their life to what they are doing and teachers who are dedicated to the service. I feel so fortunate to have been a part of that, and I like to call it a family developing what's needed for our students." NOW





This quote by Erma Bombeck is Clark Wickliffe's ultimate goal in life. A fourth-generation Midlothian, his "old soul" goes way beyond his 20 years. His talents are diverse, ranging from real estate and ranching to politics. He already knows where he wants to go in life, and he's making great strides to get there.

Clark grew up in a family that enjoys ranching and real estate. As Clark has watched his own parents over the years, he has been inspired to be the best he can be, wherever his interests take him. During his developmental years, he was presented with many opportunities to expand his horizons. In eighth grade he was accepted into People to People Student Ambassadors.



This program took him to Europe for 25 days. He toured several countries and lived with a family in Switzerland. He loved learning about the culture and being with the family in everyday situations.

Even though he has now enrolled in college, he decided to go straight into real estate when he graduated from high school. He remembers driving around with his mom looking at appraisals when he was a freshman. "I loved it," Clark said with enthusiasm. started real estate school. At his young age, he already has a thriving business.

He fancies himself a Midlothian historian, as he can tell many stories passed down from his ancestors, as well as recall many facts from his studies of personally owned documents from the past. His office is a room in what was previously his grandfather's Western Auto store in downtown Midlothian. It has been totally restored, right down to the rustic brick fireplace that was covered up by a wall so well that no one knew it was there until the renovations began some years ago.

Clark has two other interests that he takes even more seriously than those mentioned above - politics and ranching. These are equal passions in his life. Even though there may be seasons in which he has to choose one or the other, he feels deeply committed to both. He was the youngest professional ever to be included in the North Texas Leadership Commission Class. It consists of a group of 30 people assigned to design what they think the DFW area would look like in 2050. This has given him experience in city planning and working with others in the field, preparing him to possibly sit on the City Council of Midlothian some day with an ultimate goal of being a State Representative. "I want to be the one who is really representing the people, not getting caught up in myself or what I want," he said.

His latest endeavor has to do with his love of ranching. When he was 10 years old, his father gave him 10 head of cattle. By giving his father the profit from those cows for the next four years,





he was able to pay him back. As he has worked with his own cattle through the years, he watched his brother, Eric, grow his ranching business. This is where he learned about federal loans and grants to help ranchers get off to a good start. This past year, Clark applied for the USDA Grant for the Beginning Farmer and Ranch Development Program. "The paperwork was about this thick," Clark said as he held his fingers apart the width of an average phone book. It is a competitive grant program that provides training and education for beginning farmers and ranchers. Through this grant, Clark has learned many ways to "ranch smarter" through research and classes.

A concept that has truly added more usable acreage to their ranch is soil conservation. Clark said that ranchers used to lop the top of the trees and eventually they would grow back. The root system would also continue to demand water from the soil, taking it away from the



grass that would feed the cows, if it were only able to grow. He has now mastered clearing the land with a goal of producing more cows on less property.

First, he bulldozes every thorn tree. Then the brush is burned. The root of the tree must be killed. To do this, they put the necessary compounds into the root and over time it rots. After that, he plows the ground to level it and loosen the soil. "We have learned that turnips are great soil cultivators," Clark added. A lot of the land in this area is dirt on top with hard limestone rock underneath. The turnip grows down into the soil and right through the limestone. When the turnip is pulled up, a way has been made for the roots of the grass to go deeper and be stronger. Last, they seed the land with a mixture of grass and turnips. They use a machine they were able to acquire because of funding from the government called a No-Till. This machine injects the seed into the ground. It plows and seeds at the same time, while also helping prevent situations like the Dust Bowl of
















the past. After working a pasture full of trees, it becomes a lush garden of grass.

"Through government grants, we are also able to experiment with mixing various types of grass seed to create a hardy blend that proves good for feeding the cows," Clark explained. They report all of their findings from research to the government, which becomes beneficial to other ranchers and farmers.

Research to reduce the carbon print on the land is also being done. "Fertilizer makes the amoebas in the ground lazy," Eric said. "We are trying to find ways to make the amoebas grow in the ground to limit the need for fertilizer."

In all his endeavors, he still takes time for philanthropy. Clark invests in the Special Olympics program with Midlothian schools each year. This particular program is close to his heart because when he was in school, he was able to serve as a peer partner/mentor to students who were part of the program.





A home does not have to be a large, ornate house with extensive decorations and landscaping. For some, home is simply where they have their meals and rest their heads. Summer is here! With Texas' cool days vanishing rapidly, this month marks the beginning of the summer season. One of the best parts of Texas summer is going to the lake. Before you head out to hit the waters, there are some important things to remember to ensure you experience a fun-filled day.

## **BEFORE YOUR TRIP**

#### • Safety starts at home:

Boating is exciting, but there are many things you should know before getting on the water. The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department teaches safety classes throughout the year, as well as offering an online version of its course. For anyone born after August 1993, the safety course is required in order to operate a powered vessel.

#### • Know your equipment:

In addition to knowing the safety standards for your boat or personal watercraft (PWC, also commonly called a Jet Ski), you need to ensure you know the equipment itself. If you are renting a vessel, familiarize yourself with controls and features. If you own your own boat or PWC, check the oil and fluid levels the same way you would a car.

#### • As you are planning:

While Texas is somewhat lacking in natural lakes, there are a plethora of manmade spots to enjoy. For a perfect sunny day on the water, a local lake might be the place for you. But if you're thinking about a longer trip, you might want to consider traveling up north to Lake Texoma or exploring a lake in the Austin or Houston areas.

#### • When you pack:

Because you are constantly getting hit by the cool mist coming off the boat, you might forget to apply sunscreen or drink



enough water. Bring plenty of liquids and sunscreen to take care of your body's needs, inside and out. You want to remember your trip for the first time you waterskied, not the wicked sunburn you got spending 10 hours in the heat.

**ON THE LAKE** 

• Find the perfect spot:

If fishing is your aim, most of the lakes around Texas have local guides for
















a small fee, with all but a guarantee of a successful day baiting and luring. If your desires are more for speed and thrills, make sure to find a location free of heavy traffic or shallow water. Choppy waves are great for PWC use, and can be fun for general boating, but for waterskiing and wakeboarding, you will want flatter waters. One trick is to make passes about 20 yards away from, but parallel to, manmade shorelines that act as a natural wind blocker.





#### • Equip yourself:

Make sure you wear life jackets. Legally, adult boaters only have to have a life vest available, not necessarily on. But tragic, avoidable deaths happen every year because someone failed to use a life jacket. Children under 13 are required to wear life jackets, and they should also be closely monitored while the boat is underway. It is also prudent to take a wallet and phone on the lake in case

you have any mechanical or user-error problems on the water.

• Boat safely:

You should always pass other vessels on the left, or port side. When you pass another vessel, a person or an object of any type, you must be more than 50 feet away or slow to idle speed. Boats are allowed on the water at night if they have lights, but PWCs must be off the lake 30 minutes before dusk for everyone's safety. • *Know your limits*:

PWCs are fun and relatively simple to learn to use, but operating larger boats is much more involved, so do not try to take out more boat than you can handle. When it comes to getting maximum speed, or trying tricks on skis and boards, make sure you have someone who can help you if you overdo it.

• Keep your ears and eyes open:

You want a full day at the lake, but if waters are too choppy for skiing, or if storms are coming, it is best to be safe. Someone waving hello and someone waving for help looks similar from 60 feet away, so be sure to look for signs indicating that a fellow boater needs help. The Texas Wildlife Department has wardens patrolling the lake for everyone's benefit, so afford them the same courtesy and respect that you show highway patrolmen.



# **BEFORE HEADING HOME**

• Recheck your hitch:

Be careful to make sure your boat is securely hitched if pulling or secured on the lift if it stays at the lake. For a lift, make sure to raise the boat based on the highest possible water level, not necessarily the current level. Every year, boats fall off lifts and sink during storms because they were not lifted high enough off the lake level.


#### • Cleaning up:

There are organisms and bacteria in some water that will eat away at the veneer on a boat if left untouched, so make sure to give it a quick wash when your day is complete. If you travel from one body of water to another, make extra sure to clean the boat, as some organisms in one lake will attack those in another if they are allowed to spread.

It may seem as though there are a lot of rules to follow just to have a relaxing day on the water. But following these guidelines will help you be prepared for your day at the lake, as well as keep you and your loved ones safe.



Many of the recipes she uses today are from the goodness of that era. She loves passing those traditions to her granddaughters.

#### Mandarin Orange Salad

Salad: 1/2 head lettuce, chopped 1 cup celery, chopped 1 Tbsp. minced parsley 2 green onions and tops, thinly sliced 1 11-oz. can mandarin oranges, drained

Dressing: 1/2 tsp. salt 2 Tbsp. rice wine vinegar 2 Tbsp. sugar 1/4 cup oil 1/4 tsp. Tabasco sauce Dash pepper

**I.** *For salad:* In a large mixing bowl, toss all ingredients together.

**2.** *For dressing:* Mix together all dressing ingredients in a jar with a tight-fitting lid. Shake well before using.

#### Pat Hunter's Corn Casserole

1/2 cup sugar
3 Tbsp. all-purpose flour
2 tsp. baking powder
2 tsp. salt
6 large eggs, beaten
2 cups whipping cream
1/2 cup melted butter
6 cups frozen whole kernel corn, thawed

I. Combine first four ingredients in a large bowl; add eggs. Stir in cream and butter. Stir in thawed corn. Pour into sprayed 9x13-inch baking dish.
2. Bake at 325 F for 45-55 minutes.

#### Man-pleasing Lasagna

- I 12-oz. box lasagna noodles
- I lb. lean ground meat
- 1 15-oz. can tomato sauce

- 1 8-oz. pkg. cream cheese, softened
- I cup sour cream
- I bunch green onions with tops, thinly sliced
- 4 oz. shredded cheddar cheese

**I.** Boil noodles; drain and cover with cold water.

2. Brown meat; add tomato sauce.

**3.** Combine cream cheese and sour cream. Add onions.

**4.** In a large baking dish, layer noodles, cheese mixture, meat, ending with a second layer of noodles on top. Cover with shredded cheddar. Cover loosely with foil and bake 20-30 minutes at 350 F.

#### My Chocolate Pie

#### Filling:

 cup sugar
 1/3 cup flour
 heaping Tbsp. cocoa (or more if you like it darker)
 1/4 tsp. salt
 cups milk, scalded
 egg yolks
 Tbsp. butter
 1/2 tsp. vanilla
 9-inch pie shell, baked

Meringue:

3 egg whites 6 Tbsp. sugar 1/2 tsp. cream of tartar

**I.** For filling: Mix 1 cup sugar, flour, cocoa, and salt in a deep, heavy skillet. Gradually add milk, stirring constantly. Cook over medium heat, stirring until mixture thickens and boils.

**2.** Cook 2 minutes; remove from heat. Add a small amount to egg yolks; stir, and then stir into hot mixture. Cook 1 minute, stirring constantly.

**3.** Add butter and vanilla; pour into pie shell and let cool slightly.

**4.** For meringue: Beat egg whites and 6 Tbsp. sugar. Add cream of tartar to stabilize. Top pie with meringue. Bake at 350 F until light brown, about 10-15 minutes. Best served warm and fresh from the oven.


