




When you think of Ennis in May, the first thing that comes to mind is the National Polka Festival. This year's three-day festival will once again take place over the long Memorial Day weekend. The 51st annual event promises to be another wonderfully fun and colorful celebration of Czech culture and its rich heritage in Ennis. "Yes, the Polka Festival helps keep our Czech heritage alive," Michelle Slovak, longtime National Polka Festival Committee

member and Czech and Then Some band member, reiterated. 'It's such a significant weekend. My great-grandparents and my husband's grandparents immigrated here. Keeping all their stories alive is very important to future generations."

The fun begins on Friday night with a dance and a contest that's become quite popular and highly anticipated over the years — the crowning of the Polka Festival King and Queen. And the crowning couldn't happen without the musicality





Her dad and mom both played in polka bands at different times when Michelle and her siblings were young. This is also when the children in the family learned how to polka. She remembers her brother and fellow band member, Danny Zapletal, basically teaching her the dance. She was 5 at the time. Michelle was shy when she first took her place on the stage, but that is no longer the case. "I just like playing the music," she stated, as she remembered



the first trip Czech and Then Some made to the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, D.C. "That was such a memorable trip," she said. "We represented the Czech culture at that event."

Since forming the band in 1997, Czech and Then Some has traveled to and performed at many functions. They are always headlining at one of the three halls during the Annual Polka Festival in Ennis. They've also played the music they grew up listening to at Westfest, Accordion Kings in Stephenville, Texas; Heritage Festival at Six Flags Over Texas; Kolache Christmas; Oktoberfest in Fredericksburg; Kolache-Klobase Festival in East Bernard; Wurstfest in New Braunfels; South Texas Sausage and Polka Fest in Hallettsville, Kansas; Polkatennial; Denmark Polka Fest in Wisconsin; Starlite Polka Fest in Nebraska; Kolache & Sausage Fest in Oklahoma; along with many weddings, anniversaries and private parties. They have also appeared locally on Good Morning Texas and Good Day Morning Show.

Most of the band's members are of Czech descent, and they enjoy the music they play because it helps keep their heritage alive. The band plays everything from polkas and waltzes to country music. The band members are a talented group of artists. Michelle plays sax, clarinet and keyboards. Jennifer Slovak also plays sax and clarinet, as well as guitar and percussion. She, too, has been with the band since 1999. Zeke Martinez plays drums, guitar and sings, while the youngest band member, Josh Zapletal, plays trumpet and guitar. John Schumacher plays bass, drums and sings. David Czarnek has played sax, clarinet and guitar with the band since 2010. David Slovak, Michelle's husband, coowner of Czech and Then Some and one of its original members, plays accordion, piano, guitar, bass guitar, drums and sings. Danny Zapletal, the other coowner and original member, plays trumpet, keyboards, sings and arranges for the group. "We play between 20 and 30 shows a year, not counting the Polka Festival," Michelle said, expounding on the busy schedule the band keeps even



though every member works a full-time job and has family commitments. "Ennis is still the biggest three-day event around. It offers a happy atmosphere."

Michelle became a National Polka Festival committee member in 1994, several years prior to becoming a band member. Most of the work she's done over the past 30-plus years is done behind the scenes. As the acting secretary since 1995, she is responsible for organizing the bands each year and making sure contracts are signed, as well as helping promote the event through advertising





and securing sponsorships. "Committee members do lots of things together all throughout the year in preparation," she said. "We are obviously devoted to what the Polka Festival represents and what it means to us." Other committee officers include Director Jean Paul Beebe, President Keith Kapavik, Treasurer Greg McElroy and Danny Zapletal, forever board member in good standing. "We try to mix up the bands from year-to-year," Michelle added. "Brave Combo is always on the schedule, but we are continually looking for younger bands as they bring a new flow to the festival for the new crowd of festival goers."

The main goal is to keep the Polka Festival alive, and in doing so, sometimes new things, such as younger bands, need to be introduced. "We have to get the younger generation involved if we hope to keep the Czech heritage alive," Michelle stated. "We just can't let it die by the wayside."

January of this year marked 20 years that Czech and Then Some has been sharing their music. What originally began as a one-time job evolved into a family band that's made many wonderful memories over the years and now includes the next generation — David and Michelle's children, Josef and Isabella. "Josef has been playing drums with an out-of-town band for the past two years," Michelle explained. "And we all love dressing up in our authentic costumes."

Michelle has many costumes to choose from because she has a wonderful seamstress in West, Texas, who enjoys creating authentic kroje for her. When counting, Michelle said, "I have six full kroje now, but in the past I had more," she confessed. "I've shared a few over the years."

Michelle and Danny's father, the late Raymond Zapletal, was one of the original founders of the National Polka Festival. The atmosphere during the 51st festival will be just as fun as the 50 that came before, as it's energized by the many festival goers who, like Michelle and her family, have a strong desire to keep their Czech heritage alive. "We have met so many friends along the way," she added. "The fans of polka music have been so gracious to us. They've become a big part of our lives." NOW

AT HOME WITH FREDDIE AND BETTY LOPEZ




A college dance and a shared commitment to family brought Freddie and Betty Lopez together. They bought their Ennis dream-ofa-home online while still in California. The couple had talked about building a house but decided, instead, on their









There's ample space in the kitchen for family projects and cooking for family and friends. A pantry and butcher block island provide added storage and counter space, and a wine rack artfully decorates a wall.

The separate master bedroom and bath provide a restful retreat with a sitting area for this busy couple. Freddie's collection of sports caps rests in a built-in cabinet. "I've been a Los Angeles Lakers and Angels fan, but I'll always be a Dallas Cowboys fan," he said enthusiastically.

The kids' wing of the home reflects the individual taste of each resident. Alize, who is a student at Navarro College at Waxahachie, has decorated her domain in everything Marilyn Monroe. "I like her fashion influence," Alize explained. The black and white theme contrasts with her collection of colorful EHS homecoming mums. Alize is planning to attend a university, and she is majoring in marine biology with a minor in law.

Freddie III and Sebastian's shared bedroom is also decorated in black and white, including Freddy III's collection of photos that are artfully hung. The hall bath accommodates all three kids and is decorated in blue, white and greens.





Through the utility room and housed in the garage is Freddie's pride and joy — a 1951 Chevy Deluxe sedan. "It runs but is still a project," Freddie said. "Sebastian says it's his car. I bought it on a handshake. Only in Ennis could I have done that."

Ashley is in the process of working with a destination branding agency to rebrand Ennis. The outcome will include a new logo, brand story and a visual representation and tagline portraying the city's core values.

Ennis has always enjoyed healthy tourism, thanks to several festivals that occur throughout the year. April and May are perhaps the most popular months for tourism due to the blooming bluebonnet trails and festival and the National Polka Festival. While tourism is important, developing a city for the benefit of its citizens is critical.

In 2014, Ennis citizens were surveyed about what they would like to see happen in the city. Many responded by saying they wanted places to shop, dine and be outdoors. The city listened and began devising a comprehensive plan. "Sometimes, on the surface, it may seem like nothing is happening, but there is lots going on behind the scenes. All of the plans being enacted are aimed at improving quality of life for our citizens, as much as they are about enhancing the tourism experience," Ashley stated.

Nothing draws a crowd like a crowd, so the city aims to create a downtown experience where people are willing to gather together. "If locals aren't hanging out downtown, visitors aren't either," Ashley said. With that in mind, several downtown buildings have been restored and beautified. Since many of these buildings are historical, preserving their cultural character is paramount.

A key part of the downtown beautification is the work planned for Dallas Street. It will be a pedestrian street featuring parallel parking, handicap accessible sidewalks, beautiful red brickwork and flower planters. People will be able to enjoy walking up and down the street while they shop and dine.

Of course, the farmer's market, open from April to October each year, is a staple in downtown. "I take my kids here every weekend. I'm the poster child for

this place!" Ashley said with a chuckle. In the future, she would like to see events happening there nearly every weekend.

Currently, the Minnie McDowell Park is being constructed in the area where the farmer's market is held. Groundbreaking took place in December of last year. This public space will include restrooms, climbing and water features for children, a performance gazebo where concerts can be held and an art wall, which will provide a gorgeous backdrop for photo opportunities.

Parking will be available on the outskirts of downtown so people can stroll around easily during their visit. "Trust me, people are going to want to park and stay for a while," Ashley remarked confidently.

In keeping with the Information Age, a mobile app, Ennis Y'all, has been developed that includes listings of all restaurants, shops, hotels, attractions and events. "Every Ennis resident and visitor is encouraged to download it," Ashley stated.

Ennis has experienced some growth in recent years, which has caused the city to consider changes to the traffic flow. Currently, railroad tracks near downtown cause significant backups when trains pass through town. An aesthetically pleasing trestle bridge has been designed for this area so the train will pass overhead in the future, relieving congestion on the roads and making it easier for people to move from the west side to the east side of downtown. "We want people to feel comfortable moving about on foot in the downtown areas. Statistics show that walkable cities end up being safer," Ashley clarified.

Movement from the northern and southern sides of downtown will be essential because the city plans to erect shopping plazas in both of these areas. One of these will be where Plaza del Sol is now and the other where Safeway used to be. These plazas will be multistory, mixed use

developments that will include city offices, retail shopping and residential living spaces. The city hopes to attract some major department store chains to anchor the plazas.

A welcome center will eventually be installed on Main Street where the pawn shop used to be. The facade of the building will be restored to a historic appearance. The economic development team and inspections team will be relocated there. This facility will also serve to greet visitors, display exhibits and house what is being called "small business incubators." These spaces will have small amounts of square footage with reduced rental costs to help people start businesses. "It is scary to start a business sometimes. These spaces will give people the opportunity to test their business model and build clientele," Ashley explained. "These incubator spaces will give people a safe way to start a business before moving into a permanent home in one of the many re-developed buildings."

The improvement planned for Ennis demonstrates that the city is listening to its citizens. The upgrades and additions should help to improve quality of life for locals and give tourists a great place to visit in their free time. "As the city undergoes changes, we ask for our locals to be our biggest cheerleaders. Tell our story. Let everyone know what awesome things are around the corner for our beloved hometown," Ashley encouraged. "Continue to shop local and support local during this growth period. Come downtown and see all the progress that has already been made with new restaurants, shops, a pub and public theatre." The change in energy can already be felt and will only continue to propel the city forward with the support of the community. It is Ennis' time to shine. NOW





technique and strategy. While seeing kids that may eventually play for them is a bonus, schools do not limit attendance to those in their zones, so you can get football speed training from recent state champion coaches, or technical work from some of the most esteemed soccer coaches in the state.

• Check dates. With the number of studios, schools and private entities offering camps for all different ages and skill levels, you will want to spend some time looking for the right fit. Whatever else you do, though, make sure you know when the registration deadlines are. While some might extend registration with an added payment up until the day of the camp, staffing and equipment considerations may make others hold to a solid deadline, so do not let missing a postmark date keep your kid from the camp they want.



#### VBS, by many names.

- Look for schedules. With so many churches offering vacation Bible schools to the public, the first step needs to be looking for a calendar of the offerings. While you will not always find one codex with every option, you might call your city hall to see if they have something consolidated. You can also reach out on social media. There are Facebook pages where people throughout the area post their church's activities. VBS may be in the morning, afternoon or evening and, generally, goes for four to five days, with some churches using the following Sunday service as a grand finale.
- Ask your friends. There are literally hundreds of programs offered by local




churches throughout the summer. It is not difficult to schedule a different vacation Bible school every week for a few months, if you are so inclined. Ask friends which ones they have tried, and find out what types of activities each one offers. Some churches do simple activities in the park, and you can show up for just a few days. Others, though, will require registration ahead of time, as they have professional instructors in various fields come to make the activity portion as great as possible.

• Figure out the code. These days, different churches take different philosophies when it comes to VBS. VBX typically means the kids will have one specific activity that takes a lot of their time. Kids' Camp denotes more of a camp atmosphere, with varied activities mixed with the study portions. VBS in the Park is often an outreach seeking to bring in guests from nearby areas throughout the week. And traditional VBS normally blends Bible stories with songs, crafts and large group games.

#### Free is a great thing.

• Movies in different places. While many movie theaters offer cheap summer showings once a week, usually for films that have been out for a year or longer,

cities often run special movie days and nights throughout the summer, sometimes in local parks or at other outdoor venues. Most local libraries show movies as often as once a week in the afternoons. Because these city events are planned well in advance, they are advertised weeks before showings, so a quick check of your city's website will give you all the details you need.

- Libraries have more than just books. In addition to family-friendly movie showings, most public libraries ramp up a full slate of summer activities. From bringing in magicians and other performers, to presenting informational sessions on a variety of topics, your local library is probably a great spot for free family fun, while you get out of the sweltering Texas heat. If nothing else, you can grab a summer reading log and have your kids earn treats and prizes for opening books during their months off from school.
- Free events with memberships. If you have passes for local zoos, botanical gardens or museums, be sure and check out their catalogue of events. 
## No two days are ever the same at Camp FurBaby.

#### Estate Planning Tips for Blended Families

Most of us need to do some type of estate planning, but it's especially important if you are part of a "blended" family. And the best time to start is now — before these plans need to be implemented.

Estate planning can be complex, so you will need help from a qualified legal professional. But here are a few general suggestions that can be suitable for blended families:

• Update beneficiary designations — and think about multiple beneficiaries. Update the beneficiary designations on your retirement accounts and insurance policies to reflect the reality of your blended family. These designations can supersede the instructions you provided in your will. So, if your will states that your current spouse should inherit your assets, but you had named your former spouse, or a child, as the primary beneficiary of an IRA, then your former spouse or your child — not your present-day spouse — will indeed receive the IRA.

To ensure that "everyone gets something," you could name your current spouse as primary beneficiary and your children from a previous marriage as equal contingent beneficiaries. But the primary beneficiary will receive all the assets and is free to do whatever he or she wants with the money. To enact your wishes, you can name multiple primary beneficiaries and designate the percentage of the asset each beneficiary will receive.

• Create a living trust — and consider a professional trustee. A living trust can help you avoid the time-consuming and costly process of probate, while giving you great freedom to determine how, and when, you want your assets distributed. After you pass away, the trust, if structured properly, can provide your surviving spouse with income for life. Then, after your spouse dies, your children from an earlier marriage would receive the remainder of the trust.

So far, so good. However, issues can arise if you name your

surviving spouse or one of your children as the "successor trustee" who will take charge of the trust upon your passing. Your spouse, acting as successor trustee, could choose to invest only in bonds for income, but if he or she lives another 20 or so years, the value of the investments within the trust will probably have diminished considerably — leaving your children with very little. Conversely, if you name one of your children as trustee, the child could invest strictly in growth-oriented investments, leaving your surviving spouse with greatly reduced income. To be fair to everyone, you may want to engage a professional third-party trustee. This individual, or company, is not a beneficiary of the trust, is not entitled to share in the assets of the trust and, ideally, should have no "rooting interest" in how proceeds of the trust are distributed.

• Consider a prenuptial agreement. When it's time to settle an estate, a prenuptial agreement can help avoid disputes among members of a blended family. If you and your new spouse have agreed to keep your assets separate so that each of you can pass an inheritance to your own children, you need to spell out that separation in your "prenup," your will, your living trust and any other relevant estate-planning arrangements.

Above all else, share your estate-planning intentions with members of your blended family. You may not be able to satisfy everyone, but through open communications, you can help prevent bad feelings — and unpleasant surprises.

#### In the Kitchen With Jess Haupt

Jess Haupt developed a love for cooking early in life while watching his dad cook steaks for every family Sunday dinner using his special marinade. "I grew up in Manitowoc, Wisconsin, a mostly German community sprinkled with a little bit of Czech and Polish," Jess recalled. However, it wasn't until he grew up, married and met a new neighbor who enjoyed cooking that Jess made cooking his passion. "I've made homemade beer and tried my hand at cooking everything," he said.

The owner of "hundreds of cookbooks," Jess has taken some cooking classes, but is mostly self-taught. "I own every conceivable cooking gadget, knife and machine and a coffee roasting company, Buna Bean Coffee," he said. "Cooking relaxes me, allows me to be creative and is satisfying."

#### Rosemary and Goat Cheese Stuffed Chicken With Wild Mushroom Sauce

- I whole chicken
- 4 oz. goat cheese, room temperature
- I Tbsp. rosemary leaves, freshly chopped
- 3 Tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil (divided use)
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste (divided use)
- 2 Tbsp. butter (divided use)
- 1/4 cup shallots, chopped
- 4 oz. morel mushrooms, cleaned and sliced in half lengthwise, or 1 oz. dried morels, rehydrated
- 4 oz. black trumpet mushrooms, cut into 1.5-inch pieces
- 3/4 cup chicken stock
- 2 Tbsp. chives, chopped

- **1.** Preheat oven to 450 F. Remove the chicken backbone and wings.
- **2.** Press the chicken open like a book; carefully remove the bones, leaving the whole chicken intact with skin.
- **3.** In a small bowl, combine goat cheese, rosemary and 2 Tbsp. of olive oil; mash mixture together with a fork.
- **4.** Season the chicken with salt and pepper. Turn the chicken skin side up; gently loosen skin by inserting fingers underneath to make a pocket.
- **5.** Stuff the goat cheese mixture under the skin evenly over the chicken breasts and legs; tuck the skin over the chicken. Season both chicken sides with salt and pepper. Drizzle 1/4 Tbsp. of olive oil over the chicken; rub well.
- **6.** Heat a large, ovenproof sauté pan over high heat; add remainder of the olive oil to coat the pan's bottom. In hot, simmering oil, add the chicken, skin side down; cook

about 8-10 minutes, or until deep golden brown. Roast for 10 minutes, or until the juices run clear; remove chicken, but keep it warm.

- **7.** Remove all but 2 Tbsp. of fat from the pan; return to the heat.
- **8.** Add 1 Tbsp. of butter and shallots; sauté for 2 minutes, scraping the bottom of the pan with a wooden spoon to loosen the browned bits. Add the mushrooms; season with salt and pepper. Sauté for 2 minutes, or until the mushrooms begin to brown.
- **9.** Add the stock; bring to a simmer, and cook 5 minutes, or until mixture is reduced by 1/3.
- **10.** Stir in remaining butter; remove from the heat. Pour the sauce over the chicken; garnish with chives, and serve immediately.

#### Braised Brussels Sprouts With Bacon

- 8 strips bacon, chopped
- 2 large shallots, finely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 2 lbs. fresh Brussels sprouts, trimmed and halved through stem ends
- I cup low-sodium chicken broth
- 4 tsp. sherry vinegar
- 2 tsp. unsalted butter
- Salt and pepper, to taste
- **I.** In a skillet, fry the bacon over medium heat for 8-10 minutes until crisp; transfer to a paper towel-lined plate. Pour off excess grease from skillet.
- **2.** In the same skillet, cook shallots over medium heat for 10 minutes until soft.
- **3.** Add garlic; cook 30 seconds, or until fragrant; toss in Brussels sprouts; add broth, and reduce heat to medium-low.
- **4.** Cover; cook for 13-18 minutes, tossing occasionally until paring knife can be inserted into sprouts without resistance.
- **5.** Stir in vinegar, butter, bacon, salt and pepper; transfer to serving bowl.

2 small scoops coffee, chocolate or vanilla ice cream

Shot of expresse, or 3 Then, strong

Shot of espresso, or 3 Tbsp. strongbrewed coffee


