



years old and lives in Houston but still drives to see her mom. The son is 55 years old and lives in Midlothian. "He calls me every day," she said proudly, "and drives me to wherever I want to go. He and his sister are 16 years apart, and I always said that God knew what He was doing when He gave my son to me."

After she retired, Wanda wondered what she was going to do. "My family knows I just go, go, go and am busy all the time. My sister-in-law suggested I






make quilts, and I just love it! I would sit at the barstool," she recalled, while gesturing toward the kitchen area, "then I would cut everything out. A lot of people have machines or a roller you cut with, but I cut it out by hand. Afterwards, I take all the pieces to my sewing machine."

Wanda's sewing machine is over 50 years old. She has a newer model but never learned how to use it and never wanted to, as she prefers her older machine. "There is a quilting machine, but I do not like quilting that way," she informed. "The thread comes out of that machine so tight that when you get a quilt quilted, it's just like covering it with a piece of cardboard. You can feel the difference in my quilts. They are much softer."

For Wanda, quilting was serious business. She can no longer sew because she cannot fully use her right hand because of all the quilts she's made. But when she did quilt, her attention was laser focused on it. She couldn't have anyone talking to her. She would get lost in her work, and for her the time would just fly. "I would just start making quilts, one after the other. When my husband, Harold, was alive, I would sometimes work so hard that he would walk down the hall to my sewing room and suggest, 'Why don't you just come out, and we'll talk about your quilting for a while." Wanda smiled at the memory. It was his way of turning her attention back to him for a short time.

She has hundreds of quilt patterns and several dozen books about quilts. When she first started quilting, she sold her products and had a very good business. She used to take orders on quilt making but had to stop because she couldn't make them all. "I would find a pattern I wanted to make and just make it. If someone wanted to buy it then that would be OK," she stated. "A lot of people would bring their quilt tops, and I would put them together — the cotton and lining and complete the quilt for them."

Although she has sold her quilts, Wanda would also give many of them away. "I gave 12 away for Christmas to family members last year," she shared. She does have a quilt that she will never sell. It's the one her husband called her \$1,000 quilt. It is huge and took over a year to complete. The entire quilt was handstitched in the pattern of Grandmother's Flower Garden. "It doesn't really cost \$1,000," she laughed. "He just said that because it took so long for me to make it, and I could never sell it for what it's worth." Indeed, the labor in the quilt is very evident, in that every piece of cloth sewn together in intricate



patterns to make the top of the quilt is only about 1 1/2 inches wide for a quilt that would comfortably cover a queen size bed.

"Everyone asks me how long it takes to make a quilt, and I always give the same answer," she declared. "Every quilt is different. With baby quilts, it doesn't take any time to make them. They used to sell so fast that I would make four tops at a time and then start quilting." She also has many lap quilts she made over the years that were relatively easy and quick to make.

Wanda's quilts were made to have staying power. "Quilts stay with you," she remarked. "They will last if you take care of them. Take care when you put them in the washing machine and don't beat them to death. Wash them by themselves and when you put them in the dryer, watch them carefully. When the quilt is dry and fluffy, take them out of the dryer. Try not to let them spin and spin because that tears the threads." That's good advice from a woman who surely knows her quilts. When she first started quilting, Wanda had no idea she would stay with quilts so long. In 28 years of making them, she doesn't have an accurate count, but has easily quilted over 2,000. Out of the 2,000, she still has 40 left waiting for a new home. Her beautiful quilts have blessed so many that it easily stands as an incredible legacy for her. NOW

of the Reno National Air Races in bringing uniformity to the sport. Giant scale aircrafts are built by choosing a fullsize airplane and crafting an aircraft that is identical to it but scaled down to look exactly like the real thing. Jeff's airplane is modeled after a modified P-51 Mustang,





which was the third most popular airplane in WWII, and called Miss Ashley. "When we shrink the aircraft down to a scale version of the plane, we have to stay within the parameters of the scale," he explained. "You can't make it too small. You have to take it down to the smallest scale you possibly can according to the rules."

When Jeff began flying for his friend, the expenses were born by his friend so the class or category he flew in was Unlimited. When he began to fly and race on his own, he had to fly in a class he could afford, and that was Formula 1. "The cost to fly in Formula 1 was half of what it would be to fly Unlimited," he said. "That is the highest class. With Formula 1, the airplane was much simpler, and the cost was about \$5,000. It's very expensive building the airplane and traveling to the races. Miss Ashley, the airplane that won the world record, cost \$10,000." Another cost factor with Unlimited airplanes is you typically have to build a new one every year because their life span is so short due to midair collisions and airplane failure because of speed. Jeff's expenses are helped in part since his sponsor, Horizon Hobby, supplies his radio equipment.

The airplanes are built of carbon fiber and fiberglass and weigh approximately











25 pounds. What the aircraft looks like on the outside is one's personal preference but has to meet the design criteria for whatever class you're racing. "Airplanes are a giant shell of a plane that cradles the engine," he explained. "The outside of a scale airplane looks identical to the real size, but inside it is basically a flyable shell." Jeff's racer is a beautiful plane with a wing span of 9 feet. Some planes' wingspans exceed 11 feet. For such a large plane, it is deceptively lightweight. It has a radio controller that makes the plane go up, down, right, left, idle or full throttle engine power. It has retractable landing gear. Jeff can change the fuel mixture to make it slower or faster and has onboard GPS, so he can download the data. The racer doesn't fly inverted. It just goes straight and turns left. Jeff does have an aerobatic plane that can fly inverted. It took him a year to build it.

The races are held in California. For Jeff and his wife, Kevin, the trip is a fun family affair. He remembers from his childhood how much fun that can be. "Everywhere we went, mom and dad made a family deal out of it. We went to California all the time racing planes, and also to Kansas and Ohio." When Jeff's dad quit racing five years ago, Jeff became president of the Unlimited Scale













Racing Association for four years, vice president for two. Kevin is the secretary and handles all the paperwork, including insurance. They have together hosted the race for the last three years in California. They've had people from Japan, Hawaii, Australia and from other states in the U.S. The sport now has a Sportsman Class for youth to encourage younger participants to develop a love for the sport. In the future, they hope to add another race during the year in Ohio.

Jeff competed against nationally sponsored teams in the recent national Race of Champions giant-scale aircraft championship held in California. The Unlimited Scale Racing Association (USRA) 2016 Race of Champions proved, once again, how exciting giant-scale pylon racing can be with fast action racing and speeds that routinely exceed that of NASCAR and Formula One motor sports.

In 2015 Jeff won the Unlimited world record of 1 minute, 9.4 seconds. In 2016 Peter Goldsmith beat that record with a time of 1 minute, 7.8 seconds flying 246.8 mph in the Unlimited heat 2. Jeff came back on Saturday to beat Peter's new record during heat 3 with a time of 1 minute and 6.1 seconds racing at 247.6 mph. Another first he accomplished was for the first time he brought his airplane home without a single scratch on it. The world record plane is still perfect. "When I won the world record, it wasn't my best race, but I'd rather have the world record and speed than win a race any day. I have the fastest propeller-driven model airplane ever made. I have it!" His dad is sure to be proud. **NOW**

At Home With Chase and Ashley Bentley



Everybody needs a cause to fight for. Some spend their energy seeking justice and equality for groups that need help. Others advocate fiercely for children's welfare through adoption or the foster care system. In finding their own cause, Chase and Ashley Bentley are using a unique business model and their own beautiful home to give back and show God's love to the world around them.

Chase was born in San Antonio and grew up in Alvarado with his adoptive family. He spent his childhood playing sports and building homes with his father at his construction company. In 2002, Chase made his way to Texas Tech University where he earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in civil engineering. Since then, he's held various positions in structural, geotechnical, water/wastewater process and chemical/petrochemical engineering. Currently, he serves as partner/vice president of corporate development for NTACT Operations.

Ashley was born and raised in DeSoto and spent her days engaged in competitive cheerleading. She started at Texas Tech University in 2003 and earned her bachelor's and master's degrees in speech-language pathology. She's fulfilled her passion for helping children by working as a speech-language pathologist for various area school districts. As for her relationship with Chase, the couple met at Texas Tech, and the chemistry was less than immediate. Both Chase and Ashley were members of the Texas Tech cheerleading squad. "We were captains together, but we had different management styles," she explained. "We were 'frenemies.' For four years, we butted heads a lot, so when we started dating during graduate school, our friends were shocked."

They were married in 2009, and moved to Frisco, adding daughter, Callie, to their family in 2010. As they talked about growing their family further, they decided to move closer to family and came to Midlothian in 2012. A year later, they got pregnant again, and welcomed Zoey in 2014. "It made sense to get closer to our parents," she said. "Once we had Zoey, I became a stay-at-home mom, but the babysitting help is great." Chase and Ashley were pleased with their home in Shiloh Forest, but in 2015, they were given an opportunity to build their dream home in the same neighborhood they already loved.

"My dad has been a homebuilder for over 40 years, and I've been building with him for the past 20," Chase explained. "We bought a piece of land, but had no desire to build immediately. I've seen how that dynamic can put unnecessary stress on a marriage. However, after





bidding our plans and specifications to a few custom homebuilders, we decided to build ourselves."

Shortly after groundbreaking, Chase and Ashley had the idea to provide this same experience for other people. They opened Augusta Custom Homes to help others build the home of their dreams, too. "Everything is open book — cost, schedule, fees, everything," Chase shared. "At the end of each build, we give a

portion of our profit to each client to give to a nonprofit of their choice."

Chase and Ashley's home is lined by an expansive driveway that slopes downhill from the street toward a creek behind their property. Blue accents complement irregularly patterned rectangular stones for a façade that blends with the neighborhood, while at the same time standing out as an artistic outlier.

Inside the house, they have a truly open space, flowing freely from kitchen to dining area to living room, capped off with an ornate fireplace big enough for the girls to stand inside. Ashley insisted on cathedral beams in the living room, which complement the overall look. The decor style immediately evokes a sense of elegance and ease. "It's hard to describe, but I've tried to get a lodge-y cottage





The master bedroom is simple at first glance, but heavy trim along the walls and









technique and strategy. While seeing kids that may eventually play for them is a bonus, schools do not limit attendance to those in their zones, so you can get football speed training from recent state champion coaches, or technical work from some of the most esteemed soccer coaches in the state.

• Check dates. With the number of studios, schools and private entities offering camps for all different ages and skill levels, you will want to spend some time looking for the right fit. Whatever else you do, though, make sure you know when the registration deadlines are. While some might extend registration with an added payment up until the day of the camp, staffing and equipment considerations may make others hold to a solid deadline, so do not let missing a postmark date keep your kid from the camp they want.

VBS, by many names.

• Look for schedules. With so many churches offering vacation Bible schools to the public, the first step needs to be looking for a calendar of the offerings. While you will not always find one codex with every option, you might call your city hall to see if they have something consolidated. You can also reach out on social media. Others, though, will require registration ahead of time, as they have professional instructors in various fields come to make the activity portion as great as possible.







• Figure out the code. These days, different churches take different philosophies when it comes to VBS. VBX typically means the kids will have one specific activity that takes a lot of their time. Kids' Camp denotes more of a camp atmosphere, with varied activities mixed with the study portions. VBS in the Park is often an outreach seeking to bring in guests from nearby areas throughout the week. And traditional VBS normally blends Bible stories with songs, crafts and large group games.














An Itchy Situation

A couple of days after some serious yardwork, you start to experience intense itching with a rash. Thinking back, you wonder if that bothersome patch of weeds you pulled was poison ivy.

Poison ivy is a plant that contains an oil or resin called urushiol. Poison oak and poison sumac also contain this oil, and all three of these plants together produce more than 300,000 cases every year of allergic contact dermatitis. The resin can be found in every part of the plant: leaves, stems, roots or flowers. The problem comes from direct contact with the oil on the plant. This is not transferred in the air through sneezing and coughing or by touching the fluid

Within a few days after contact with the plant's oil, the skin develops an itchy rash. The rash, or hives, will progress to blisters. When the blisters burst, a crust forms over the lesion. You might also detect red streaks and swelling. Swelling in the face, mouth, eyes and/or difficulty breathing could turn into a serious condition. If this is a person's first contact with the oil, it generally takes longer for that first symptom to appear. If this is a repeated contact, then the rash appears within one to two days. Typically, the rash may last a couple of weeks but can last six weeks, if symptoms

Treatment for poison oak and poison ivy can usually be cared

for at home, if the rash is mild. Rinse the area with cool water for at least 10 to 15 minutes. Allow to air dry. Never use warm water as it causes your pores to open and more toxins could absorb into the skin. If possible, use an oil dissolving soap to clean the area. Do not scratch! If the oil is left on your skin, you can inadvertently spread it by scratching, thereby causing the rash to spread on your skin. Apply calamine lotion or hydrocortisone cream to help with itching. Change your clothes immediately. Wash them separately from other clothing, and don't forget to include any towels you may have used. With any swelling, contact your physician. Swelling in the face or airway requires an immediate trip to the emergency room.

The most effective way to avoid these complications is to stay away from these plants. Whether working in your yard or hiking through a wilderness, wear protective clothing, such as long pants, long sleeves and closed, sturdy shoes. Wear gloves when working on the ground. Learn to identify these leaves in all seasons to avoid contact, and remember a famous saying, "Leaves of three? Let them be!" NOW





You can easily substitute some of the food items called for in the recipes for ones you like best." She is writing a cookbook containing recipes her kids enjoyed when growing up. Peach Ice Cream

Serves two.

1/2 cup vanilla, soy, hemp or almond milk

3 large pitted dates

I cup frozen peaches

1/2 small banana, frozen

1. Blend all ingredients until mixed.

Spaghetti Squash

I medium-size spaghetti squash, halved lengthwise

2 cups water

I 15-oz. jar low-salt marinara sauce, homemade or store bought Kraft Parmesan or Dairy Free Parmesan Cheese, to taste

- **I.** Place two halves of spaghetti squash, cut side down, in a rectangular glass or ceramic dish; add water.

1 Tbsp. red pepper, crushed

1 14.5-oz. can beef broth

1 Tbsp. cornstarch

2-3 Tbsp. water (or beef stock)

1/2 cup sour cream

2 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce Parsley, to taste

1 12- or 16-oz. bag noodles, cooked

1. Brown beef quickly in olive oil; set aside.

2. In a large skillet, cook mushrooms, onions, carrots and crushed red pepper until tender and add beef broth.

3. In a small bowl, make slurry of cornstarch and water or beef stock and add to vegetable mixture. Let thicken and add sour cream and Worcestershire sauce. Stir; add meat. Sprinkle parsley on top and serve over cooked noodles.
