

Growing up, Tony McKinney enjoyed family campouts, but it was upon his grandfather's passing that his interest in the hobby was rekindled. "When my grandfather died, I discovered old Popular Mechanics magazines among his things. One of them featured a teardrop camper, and it caught my eye," Tony remembered. "I got online and found the history of the camper intriguing and decided I wanted one."

Tony is not alone in his interest, as teardrop trailers have experienced a surge in popularity over the last few years. Everything from T-shirts to home decor features the campers in their unique teardrop shape. The trailers evolved in the 1930s, becoming all the rage after World War II and the Depression when families had more disposable income and wanted to travel.

With a nod to the teardrop's heyday, Tony chose to build his first trailer with repurposed materials. "Original campers were built with surplus materials from the war. I'm really interested in recycling and being green, and I

"I looked on Pinterest and then ran with it!"

Made from 90-percent repurposed material, the trailer they named "TU-N-A-CAN," even features an 1865 steamer trunk inside as a battery and storage box. "When we go camping, people always want to look inside our trailer," Tony's wife of 29 years, Christina, said. "One woman got upset that we would use an antique steamer trunk for storage until she saw how nicely we'd done it."



"Depending on one's skill set, others could build a teardrop trailer given the right tools," Tony said. A skill saw, table saw and jigsaw, along with a speed square, drills, level and a hammer would be minimum necessities. "You need some general



carpentry experience. After that, you'd just need to be creative," Tony suggested.

"The sky's the limit on the design," Christina added. "The shapes, the sizes, the amenities are all up to you."

In the four years since Tony finished their trailer, the couple has taken six to 10 camping trips a year and joined two teardrop-specific groups, Texas Vintage Trailer Club and Southwest Teardrop and Vintage Trailer. "We've made friends in these groups that we take annual trips with, too," Christina said. "It's fun to be with the groups to see their creativity and get ideas."

The McKinneys already have plans for their next trailer. "We will make it bigger — a 5-by-8 instead of 4-by-8 footprint," Tony said. "We'll add a kitchen galley on back and probably a skylight. I'd like it to be like the old Woodie Wagon body style, stained and sealed."

Tony knows his second camper will be easier to build than the first, in part because he has developed a community of trailer enthusiasts online by forming the Creative Teardrop and Vintage Campers

And, anyone can see Tony's handiwork for themselves. "Tons of people want to buy our camper. I've turned down at least a half dozen really good offers," Tony said. "But I'll probably donate it to my daughter one day. I'd like to keep it in the family."

Passing on their love of camping to their children, Aleta, 21, and Ian, 23, is important to the McKinneys. "We both camped with our families as kids, and we think the peace and tranquility it offers is priceless. It's a great tradition and a way to just refresh your mind," Tony said.

The McKinneys also enjoy kayaking while camping, and Tony has found a way to make a little money with another hobby. "I'm beginning to sell my handmade lamps made of telephone glass insulator pipes with Edison bulbs," he said. The lamps will be online and at Annice Antiques Inc. in Duncanville.

With one camper build under his belt, a global online support system and dozens of camping buddies to call on, Tony has every confidence his second old-school trailer will be even better than his first. The McKinneys look forward to loading it up and heading to their favorite camping spot, Inks Lake State Park in Burnet, Texas. "It's on the Colorado River. It's hilly — just a great place to camp and kayak," Christina said. "It is our favorite. It's just really fun."

Ultimately, having fun is what the adventure is about for Tony and Christina. "You know, I took woodworking at Sunset High School, and I have loved doing things with my hands ever since," Tony recalled. "Building these trailers and camping is better than any medicine. It's therapy. It is really where I get my joy." NOW







wanted us to be here close to all of them. He really inspired me to make it happen," Shawn said.

They finally found the perfect house in Midlothian, or at least it was almost perfect. "There was a lot of work to do, actually, but we liked it," Martha admitted. The problem was the owners already had a full cash offer. "We wrote a letter talking about wanting to get into Midlothian to get our family with the rest of my family, and they took our offer!" she continued. "We had been looking for so long, we were really at the point that if we didn't get this house, we might have given up trying to get into Midlothian."

Now that they had the house, they had to get to work. "We redid the floors throughout, with hardwood in the living areas and tile in the kitchen and bathrooms," Shawn described. After closing in May 2016, they spent several months getting everything ready. "My family helped me, and we did it all ourselves," Shawn beamed.

Shawn's hard work mixes with Martha's decorating style, and the result is a great look throughout the house. The living room has beautiful wood floors and Martha's impressive cross wall. "Yeah, you could say I collect them," she laughed about the massive grouping. In the hallways and common areas throughout the house, there are family photos and medals from the boys' accomplishments.

"When I redid the master bathroom, I added light fixtures with stars to tie in that Southern theme," Shawn said. While most of the house shows off their balance of style and hard work, the bathrooms are where Shawn put in the most labor. "In our bathroom, there was this tiny shower in the front corner, so I took that out and replaced the tub with a large walk-in shower," he stated. The most impressive sample of Shawn's work, though, is a structure he built, wired and finished in the backyard — Martha's hobby house.

"I make wreaths," Martha explained. Inside the climate-controlled cabin, there is a cornucopia of ribbons, garlands and masses of wreath-making supplies. "We thought about having something smaller, but Shawn wanted me to have plenty of room to work," she said. Martha sells some wreaths around the holidays, but it is as much recreation as it is a side job.

From meeting online to almost giving up on finding a place in Midlothian, Shawn and Martha have spent more than a decade building a life and a home together. Taco the Town

When Braden Lawhead heard about a local art contest, he decided to push himself. The Midlothian Heritage High School student had been taking art classes since first grade and was inspired by this latest opportunity. Opening a new location in Midlothian, Fuzzy's Tacos looked to students for original art.

"I typically do darker drawings without color because I feel they present a feeling of strength. But the drawing for Fuzzy's mural popped into my head and was very different from my usual work," Braden explained, describing his brightly colored custom mural.

MHHS art teacher Jeremy Eggleston presented students with the chance to design for the restaurant, and Braden's work rose to the top. Select Art III/IV students brought Braden's design to life, painting logos of both local high schools, as well as images representing Midlothian fire and police departments along with the restaurant's history.

"I knew [this contest] could be something cool, so

I took advantage of it. I put serious meaning into the design, with the goal of representing a partnership between Fuzzy's, the community and the heroes that serve Midlothian," Braden explained. "I appreciate the students that spent a lot of time finishing that mural, and I think it turned out very well."

Students who painted the mural were Jordyn Baxter, Andrea Borondy, Shaun Brunick, Joe Hines, Hanna Kratsman and Ofelia Wallen. Now patrons can enjoy their craftsmanship of Braden's design that portrays Fuzzy's spirit. Braden's original sketch will be framed and displayed at the restaurant, as well.

"My favorite art pieces I've created in recent years were probably the newer *Star Wars* stippling drawings I did because of the darker pen and ink markings. There is also another art piece I'm proud of. I call it *Dystopia*, and it is the embodiment of fear and strength with a darker atmosphere than any of my other drawings," Braden said.

Braden's art expands beyond traditional drawing, however. "This past year or two, I've done a lot of pixel art for a modification of the videogame, *Minecraft*. I use that game as a basis to learning the JAVA [computer design] language because it's so easily modifiable," Braden

said. "I discovered this interest when I was 13-14 years old, and I have been creating several modifications over the years with my newest being the *Augmented Void.*"

His modification — or "mod" — adds new decorative pixel creatures, weapons and building blocks, along with custom artificial intelligence wandering the *Minecraft* world. In its first three months online, Braden's mod had more than 12,000 downloads by users interested in his creation.


"I worked with a team to develop this, but we all went off on different projects, so my plan is to save enough money to hire developers," Braden noted. "If I can grow a fan base, I might be inspired to master computer science and videogame design in college."

Beyond art and technology, Braden is also interested in biology for a personal reason. "My mom died of cancer in 2007, and that changed my family's life," he said. "Now I'm curious to know about the science of stopping cancer from taking more lives."

Besides his mom and dad, Braden also credits Mr. Eggleston as an inspiration. "I love his class and plan to continue in it each year of high school," he said. Braden is also involved in his church's Leadership Training for Christ, performing Scripture readings and dramatic skits, and he participated in mission works through an inner-city vacation Bible camp. The Fuzzy's mural was another chance to serve.

"I live in Waxahachie and go to school in Midlothian, so I love both communities. It was a privilege to do something for them, and I discovered it's meaningful to give back," Braden said. Getting to visit the restaurant to see his work on a regular basis is just an extra perk. "I like seafood and many other foods," Braden said, "but I *love* the tacos at Fuzzy's!"


of being able to connect people to resources because of all my years in advertising," Linda said. "I simply want to connect people in need with those who can help."

- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 cups low-sodium chicken broth
- 1 10-oz. can Ro-Tel Tomatoes and Green Chilies, mild
- 1/2 cup heavy cream
- 8 oz. penne pasta
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. pepper
- I cup Monterey Jack cheese, shredded 1/3 cup scallions, thinly sliced
- **I.** Add olive oil to an oven-safe skillet; heat over medium-high heat until just smoking.

- **3.** Add broth, tomatoes, cream, pasta, salt and pepper; stir. Bring to a boil. Cover skillet; reduce heat to medium-low. Simmer until pasta is tender, about 15 minutes.
- **4.** Remove skillet from heat; stir in 1/2 cup cheese. Top with remaining cheese; sprinkle with scallions.
- **5.** Broil until cheese is melted, spotty brown and bubbly.

Cheesy Chicken Spaghetti

24 oz. spaghetti 1 Tbsp. butter

- 1/2 cup celery, chopped
- 1/2 cup green onions, chopped
- I rotisserie chicken, chopped
- 1 10.5-oz. can cream of mushroom soup
- 1 10.5-oz. can cream of chicken soup 16 oz. sharp cheddar cheese, shredded
- (divided use)
- 16 oz. pepper jack cheese, shredded (divided use)
- **1.** Cook spaghetti according to package instructions; set aside.
- **2.** Add butter, celery and onions to a skillet; cook until soft.
- **3.** Add spaghetti, chopped chicken, celery and onion mixture, soups and 3/4 of the cheeses to a large bowl; combine.
- **4.** Put the spaghetti mixture into a casserole dish; bake for 25 minutes at 375 F.
- **5.** Top with remaining cheese; cook for an additional 10 minutes.

Quick Chicken Enchilada Casserole

16 oz. sour cream1 10.5-oz. can cream of chicken soup1/2 cup whipping cream2 Tbsp. salsa verde

12 corn tortillas (divided use)2 cups chicken, chopped2 cups Mexican cheese1 Jalapeño, sliced, or to taste

- **1.** Mix sour cream, chicken soup, whipping cream and salsa verde in a large bowl. Add a little of the mixture to a 9x I3-inch casserole dish (enough to cover the bottom).
- **2.** Spread 6 tortillas on top of the layer of sauce on the bottom of the dish. Add another layer of sauce on top of the tortillas.
- **3.** Spread chopped chicken next. Add another layer of sauce. Add the last 6 tortillas.
- **4.** Cover with the remaining sauce; top with cheese and jalapeño slices. Bake at 350 F for 20-25 minutes.

1-3 cucumbers, cut in 1/2-inch thick slices Lemon salt, to taste Pepper seasoning, to taste

I. Lay enough cucumber slices on a platter to cover the platter; sprinkle with seasonings.


Blackberry Crumble

1 qt. blackberries, slightly mashed 3/4 cup sugar
1 Tbsp. vanilla bean paste
1/2 heaping cup oats
1/2 heaping cup flour
1/2 cup brown sugar
2 tsp. cinnamon
1 stick butter (divided use)
Ice cream (optional)

- **1.** Preheat oven to 350 F. Mix blackberries with the sugar and vanilla bean paste. Allow to macerate while prepping the crumble topping.
- **2.** In the bowl of a food processor (you can also do this by hand), add oats, flour, brown sugar and cinnamon. Add 3/4 stick of butter cut into chunks; pulse until small pea-size crumbles form.
- **3.** Butter a shallow baking dish. Add berries to the bottom and top with crumble topping. Add the remaining butter; cut into small chunks, to the top.
- **4.** Bake for 35-40 minutes. Topping will appear to still be loose, but it will firm up when cool.
- **5.** Serve warm, on its own or with a scoop of ice cream.



Awakening in Charleston

A rich and colorful painting by acclaimed artist and South Carolina Lowcountry native Jonathan Green depicts a vibrant sunrise spreading across a tidal creek and marsh grass that is Charleston's iconic landscape. Entitled Awakening in Charleston, the painting captures more than the fiery beauty of sunrise. It also evokes the spirit of awakening Charleston experiences as it tells its story to the world — not just the postcard-ready version of cobblestone streets and historic plantations, but also the realities of enslaved people whose skills and labor built Charleston. Once a sleepy coastal port, today Charleston draws visitors to discover a vibrant, modern city examining its roots and teeming with high-tech job growth, a vibrant arts and culture scene and an awardwinning culinary destination.

Charleston boasts more than its share of award-winning "get-your-reservation-in-advance" dining experiences but

also entices with off-the-radar offerings. Felix, a hip and modern French café at the north end of the King Street Historic District, tempts visitors with small, savory plates of lobster deviled eggs and crab croquettes with crispy okra. For a quieter, more sophisticated dining experience, reserve your spot at the James Beard award-winning restaurant, FIG. Chef Mike Lata's cuisine is a simple, yet innovative, approach to Lowcountry food, such as baked golden tilefish with spring shallots. For something casual, yet no less mouthwatering, venture to the diverse North Central neighborhood. Strap on your appetite for James Beardnominated Chef Rodney Scott's legendary whole hog BBQ or sit outside at Leon's Oyster Shop and dine on charred oysters and spicy fried chicken.



MISD's M*Powered Vanguard Group includes teachers, leaders and support personnel dedicated to the promotion of integrating technology in classrooms. Participants increase








