



MHS Among Best in State and Nation

Midlothian High School is ranked in the top 10% among the best high schools in the state and nation by U.S. News & World 2014 rankings, which is based on student performance on state assessments and how well students are prepared for college.

The magazine analyzed academic and enrollment data from more than 19,400 public high schools and then placed selected schools into gold, silver, bronze, or honorable mention categories. MHS received a silver medal for its continued effort in academic excellence.

shared. When the Patriots were invited to the USA Baseball East Championship Tournament in Cary, N.C., Russell's performance during the tournament was the catalyst that eventually earned him the chance to try out for the national team that would represent the U.S. in the Pan American Games. The Pan-Am games replaced the Olympics for international competition in baseball.

The summer before he started eighth grade, Russell went to the USA National Development Program. "It was like a long camp where they had pros and some of the best kids in the country," Russell recalled. At the camp, players were kept busy with practice in the mornings and performing in inter squad games during the evenings. "I remember those practices," he said. "They had us practicing, running or throwing all the time. The games were really intense, because most of the guys out there were really good. That was one of the best experiences I've had with baseball. I learned where I needed to get better."

This past summer the national team tryouts were held. Russell competed against 39 other boys for a spot on the 20-man roster that represented the USA in









Barranquilla, Colombia, in August 2013. Russell was trying out for the position of pitcher along with 23 others



for just 10 spots. At the national tryouts, he admitted to being nervous. "I was just shaking before I went in," Russell recounted. "But I was able to relax a little bit before I had to go out and pitch." He was the second youngest person there trying out for a spot on the national team.

All the players who make it to the national tryout earn a huge advantage. Their exposure to the top schools is very important in scoring a scholarship. Some representatives from a few schools were interested in Russell and sent him letters. "I am a freshman now, so they really can't talk to me until September 1 of my junior year," he explained. "All they can do is send a questionnaire and tell us to stay in touch."



Another benefit of Russell's for reaching national tryouts was a renewed

> interest in education. He could see that mediocre grades could keep him from getting a scholarship. "One of the things I learned," Russell confided, "was that if there is a kid almost as good as you but he has a 4.0 GPA, they will probably go for the kid with the better GPA, because he will probably stay on the field. I didn't take that lightly and decided to hit the books this year."



It was while he was at the national tryouts that Russell realized the significance of the international game. "It sunk in more and more that I was trying to get a spot for my country," he shared. "It was humbling, and when I didn't make the team, I was bummed out. I got over it, but there will always be that question of, 'What if I could've done it.' Who wouldn't want to represent their country with USA across your chest?" At the tryouts, the organizers





This year marks her eighth year back in teaching — all at Longbranch. "I love it here," she stated. "It's like a family."

Kim went to Angelo State University in West Texas, which is now a part of the Texas Tech University System. There she earned her Bachelor of Science in education. Her master's degree in administration was earned at Texas Woman's University.

Kim attributes her love of teaching to her mother. "I was blessed to have a mother (now deceased) who was in education, and she was my biggest inspiration." In observing her mother throughout the years, Kim was impressed with what she saw. Their family was in the military, and although they had to move frequently, her mother was still a huge influence in the lives of others. Kim could see the impact educators had on the individuals they taught. "Students would come back years later to contact her. She would be invited to weddings and had some babies named after her. Even later in life, after I grew up, I could see lives she had touched — whether it was a word she said, a lunch she had given up so a student could eat or monetary contributions."






One of the things Kim's mom taught her was to embrace differences. People are not obstacles or hurdles to get over. "We need to look at them as gifts that were given and learn how to embrace that for the betterment of everyone involved with them. I think this is extremely important." Kim teaches this concept by getting the children to see that everyone comes with "their own box of special talents." A special talent could be something a person does in a different manner from the way everyone else does it. "If the children see it as being something strange or weird, I try and turn that around by helping the children see things in different ways," she explained. "I try to put such differences in a positive realm instead of a negative spotlight. We are all special in our own way, and that might be right down to physical handicaps someone might have. One thing that is so precious about young children is they are very accepting of differences in people."

Kim has taught different age classes












but really enjoys kindergartners. "I love them all for different reasons, but the little ones are like sponges. They give me a little energy boost every morning. They also bring me back to the simplicities of life. We get so busy and caught up in our schedules, and we forget about those things." Kim acknowledges the best part of being a teacher is getting to be a part of her students' lives. "I feel honored that I get to do what I do. They are the most precious gifts we've been given, and to be trusted by parents to help their children in the field of education is just beyond words for me."

Although teaching students is important to Kim, she also wants them to know what beautiful people they are. In order to do that, she tries to be involved in their lives outside of school. "I go to their soccer games, baseball games or dance recitals, because it helps me to know them and the things they like. I try to tie all of that into my teaching, so they can see the relevance of what they are learning."

Kim has advice for parents sending their children off to kindergarten. They should definitely work with their kids daily, and not just academically. Helping them develop basic learning skills is also important. Communication is huge to Kim. She encourages parents to sit down and talk with their children and have one-on-one conversations. "They need to understand about communication — about how we look in someone's eyes and how we speak to people. Definitely

work on those foundational things such as letters, sounds and numbers, but talking and language development is *buge* at this age."

Kim also advocates exposing children to many different things. "Share with them what's in our world today. I think technology has its place in the educational system and it's very good, but at the same time, we need to make sure our kids have a limited amount of time with games and other things like that." Kim also thinks it's important children have time away from mom and dad. It makes the transition into kindergarten a little smoother.

Teaching can be a very stressful occupation, and Kim takes note of that when she travels to different universities and speaks to education classes. "I share with the future teachers that it is very important to have the best balance they can. Unfortunately, we all know there is never a complete balance. One thing always has to give a little bit, so you just have to do your best." She also stresses how important it is to have a supportive family because of the amount of hours that are required in the field of education.

"I work with little lives, and I take that seriously. There are late nights and weekends when I am consumed with the work. I can't slide on that, because those children are someone else's world. It's important not to take this job lightly. I feel so honored and blessed to have this opportunity. No two days are ever alike and that's exciting to me!" NOW

For Tamy and the kids, moving and starting fresh has been a focus. "So it made sense for us to have this event in the new house," she admitted.



Inside, guests will notice the hardwood floors throughout the home. "I was thinking about doing something different to save money, but they really make the house," Tamy shared.


"I came by the house when she was gone one day, and they were done," Matt said. "I told her, 'I guess that makes that decision for you." The rotunda

and he will have the entire kitchen area at his disposal.








APPA also notes that autistic children tend to be more responsive when a pet is in the area, and children who have pets often perform better in school.



live longer and healthier. Medical care includes such basics as vaccinations, heartworm preventative (in Texas nearly 1-in-45 heartworm tests in dogs are positive), spaying/neutering and might also include microchipping, vitamins and pet insurance. Much, too, has been learned about the importance of dental maintenance.




Currently APPA estimates that, at most, 3 percent of dogs and 1 percent of cats are insured. Investing in pet insurance is on the increase, though, at an expected annual rate of 10 percent and may especially be pertinent for horse owners considering the cost of equine surgery. Annual medical expenses for a dog are generally just under \$1,000 and for a cat around \$650.

Annual costs of pet food, including treats, begin at around \$300. Where this investment ends depends on the sizes and quantity of pets in a household.

Grooming is also essential. Horses need farriers. Dogs and cats require regular grooming and nail clipping and some breeds are best groomed by a professional.

What is Asset Allocation and How Does it Work?

Asset allocation is a technique used to spread your investment dollars across several asset categories. Stocks, bonds, cash or cash alternatives are the most common components of an asset allocation strategy. However, others may be available and appropriate as well. The general goal is to minimize volatility while maximizing return (though asset allocation alone can't ensure a profit or eliminate the risk of a loss). The process involves dividing your investment dollars among asset categories that do not all respond to the same market forces in the same way at the same time. Though there are no guarantees, ideally, if your investments in one category are performing poorly, you will have assets in another category that are performing well. The gains in the latter will offset the losses in the former, minimizing the overall effect on your portfolio. Remember that all investing involves risk, including the possible loss of principal, and there can be no guarantee that any investing strategy will be successful.

The number of asset categories you select for your portfolio and the percentage of portfolio dollars you allocate to each category will depend, in large part, on the size of your portfolio, your tolerance for risk, your investment goals and your time horizon (i.e., how long you plan to keep your money invested). A simple portfolio may include as few as three investment categories, with a percentage of dollars divided among, for example, cash alternatives, bonds and stocks. A more complex portfolio may include many more asset categories or break down each of the

broader asset categories into subcategories (for example, the category "stocks" might be further divided into subcategories such as large cap stocks, small cap stocks, international stocks, high-tech stocks and so on).

Determining an appropriate asset allocation may be the most important single investment decision you make, because it will likely have more impact on your overall return than the selection of individual investments. Don't hesitate to get expert help if you need it. And be sure to periodically review your portfolio to ensure that your chosen mix of investments continues to serve your investment needs as your circumstances change over time.

Complexity in Lupus

Leslie Hunt, a contestant on the American Idol'TV show defines lupus as the biggest hindrance in her life. She is only one of the 1.5 million Americans with lupus. Lupus erythematosus is an autoimmune disease where the body targets its own cells for destruction. The cause of this devastating turn of events is unknown. Some scientists, however, believe any one or a combination of these triggers may precipitate it: hormones, stress, genetics, sunlight, some medications and the environment. Because it is an autoimmune disease and possesses the ability to occur and create havoc to any organ in the body, it is very complex in its actions, diagnosis and treatment.

When lupus manifests itself, common symptoms are: pain, swelling, fatigue, inflammation and a characteristic butterfly rash on the face. Other symptoms will be specific to the organ affected. Lupus can be a challenging disease to diagnose because of its possible wideranging effects. The disease can be mild or life threatening, short-lived or protracted. Some symptoms can have a rapid onset with a short duration, or there can be a progression of symptoms over years. If all of that were not challenging enough, the disease can be confused with other diseases, because early symptoms are not distinct enough and can mirror many other diseases or disorders. Symptoms also vary from person to person.

Diagnosis might be difficult, but it is not impossible. Being treated

by a physician who is very familiar with lupus, such as a rheumatologist or immunologist, is important. Your doctor will take an in-depth medical history and do a very thorough physical examination. This can establish a baseline for symptomatology for the disease, as well as give the doctor a clue as to what triggers or exacerbates symptoms. Some of the laboratory work done is a complete blood count (CBC), urinalysis, blood chemistry, tests for specific antibodies and erythrocyte sedimentation rate.

Treatment will depend on where and how lupus manifests itself. As symptoms progress, other clinical professionals may be called upon for assistance or consultation, such as a cardiologist if lupus is in the heart, a nephrologist if the disease is in the kidneys or a dermatologist for the skin. Other professionals who may be included on the health care team are psychologists, nurses and social workers. Your health care team will create the best treatment plan for your age, symptoms and your general health. Coming up with a plan will take much observation, tests and time. Putting a conscientious effort into finding a way to live your best life with lupus is the first step toward good health. **NOW**

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 F.
- **2.** Heat olive oil in a pan and add green peppers, mushrooms and onions. Sauté until soft; add garlic, oregano, salt and pepper. Stir together and set aside.
- **3.** In an 8x8-inch pan, add grilled chicken. Slather chicken evenly with Dijon mustard.
- **4.** Take warm bell pepper and onion mixture and top chicken. Cover vegetables and chicken with cheese.
- **5.** Cook in the oven for approximately 10 minutes until cheese is melted.


