
Vacation: a time of respite, a period of recreational activity ...

Driving down byways, we see them: once treasured and serviceable items now tossed as garbage on the side of the road. Katie Smith sees things a little differently. "I spend lots of time 'sourcing," Katie said. "The thrill of the hunt is fun."

Furniture mostly, but sometimes other formerly useful treasures, receive loving care in Katie's home garage workshop. "I source at auctions, thrift and antique stores and accept family heirlooms from individuals," she said. Katie's business, Alley Kat Kitsch, is a family affair. Her sister, Annie Cox, who conducts online auctions, helps with the sourcing. Katie's dad; her husband, Jake; and their two sons, Reese (18) and Jude (9), help with the sometimes-heavy lifting. "They are my muscle. Our sons are both diabetic. Being able to be at home, near Jude's school, and available has been a great help," Katie explained.

Becoming an artist or craftsperson hadn't really been on Katie's list of things to do until 15 years ago when she found a piece of furniture for Reese's room. "I wanted to paint it, so I had to learn the process, and I found I really liked being creative," Katie recalled. "When I see a piece, I have to be inspired by it. When that happens, I know immediately what I'm going to do with it. I know if it's going to be for a female or male and distressed or solid color paint." She has become adept in painting with chalk, latex, acrylic, craft and enamel paints. "I sometimes stencil or draw intricate designs. When I paint something that small, it's a big stress reliever," she added.

Her approach with each piece is different since the piece itself has a distinct flair and history. "It also depends on my attitude and feeling that day," Katie admitted. "Each piece speaks to me. I want it to be alive again, happy and productive. People throw away so much, and that's disturbing to me."

The restoration process begins with Katie cleaning the piece. "There's often dirt, spider webs and, if the piece was stored in a barn, there can be chicken poop!" she revealed.

Once cleaned, the piece is examined to ascertain what its needs are, including replacing any damaged or missing parts. Katie, sometimes with the help of her husband or father, cuts wood exactly to fit. Then she sands, cleans and attaches the new wood. The painting or staining of the piece is next. "If it's solidly painted or stained, then I seal it with polyurethane or other poly-based sealer," Katie said. "If I've distressed the piece, I age it with a wax or glaze finish."

Ideas come to Katie's mind, but she also explores Pinterest pictures. "If there aren't instructions, I just wing it and experiment until I've done well with the piece. I prefer things to look clean with clear lines and solid colors of shades of blue, green and gray," she said.

Often, however, individuals who bring items to her have a design in mind and offer photos for Katie to follow. "I don't usually go to the site where the piece will finally reside," she explained. "People usually know what they want." She uses the Internet to communicate with owners of commissioned pieces. "I can send them paint samples from manufacturers for them to select a color in the comfort of their home," Katie added.

While painting is creative, she draws the line at painting a vintage piece that is made from beautiful wood. "So many times, I've gotten a piece and had to go through lots of layers of paint, only to find it has a beautiful, but hidden, wood grain. Different family members had probably painted it to go with changing times and decor over the years," Katie said. "I won't ruin a good vintage piece by painting it."

Katie has been known to repurpose some furnishings. "I've turned a ladderback chair upside down into shelving and an antique sewing machine cabinet into a vanity," she said.



Challenges abound, such as loading and unloading heavy furniture, encountering critters who have taken up residence in Katie's finds, and having to create some of the aged or missing pieces, including broken glass and mirrors. As in the remodeling of old homes, Katie is sometimes surprised at how much work will have to be done. "I laugh at everything. My sister and I tell each other this is easy, but it has never really been that easy. We can't get too serious about anything," Katie said. "I step out of my comfort zone when doing this, and I encourage others to do the same. Be creative!"




While Katie admitted she's "not an artist who can paint a portrait," she enjoys sewing, making dream catchers and jewelry and buying thrift store framed pictures to create something unique with decoupaged photos added into the original to tell a different story.

A Ferris native, Katie lives in the house where she grew up. Her father and sister live next door on opposite sides of her home. Jake, Katie and their sons like to take family vacations to lakes or beaches while visiting other family members.

"I feel at home with a paint brush in my hand," Katie said. "I want to be part of the answer to our throw-away society — not the problem."

Jake jokes that he can come home from work any day and have a whole new home, since Katie can change the decor anytime. "I enjoy doing this, not because I have to, but because I'm proud I can take a piece that's in shambles and change it once again into a treasured piece in someone's home."



AT HOME WITH SHERRY DAVIS

Sherry Davis doesn't live in an art gallery. However, a tour of her home is certainly a cultural experience. Her love of art stems from as far back as she can remember. "I've just always had a passion for it. And whenever I buy a piece, I'm also interested in the artist." One example of this is found in Blue Monday, a piece displayed in her master bedroom. "I love that picture," Sherry admitted, "but more than that, I love that it is Annie



Lee's work." The image depicts a lady sitting on the side of a bed getting ready to face another week. "Sometimes, that fits my mood," Sherry said with a laugh.

Throughout the 2,800-square-foot, four-bedroom, three-bath home is art and memorabilia that emphasize Sherry's life, along with the lives of her children, 18-year-old Jaylen and 16-year-old Makayla. Sherry and her children moved to this home six years ago from DeSoto when seeking to shorten their commute to Life School, where her children attended elementary school. Now, they attend Red Oak High School, where they are both in band and are part of the Hawk Scholars program. Makayla enjoys cheerleading, and Jaylen is preparing to attend The University of Texas at Austin in the fall.

Upon entering their home, visitors' eves are drawn to a rather unique mirror on the dining room wall. It resembles a giant gold record like one might find hanging on the wall of a recording studio, only about four times larger than the size of an actual record. "Most of the stuff is timeless. There are pieces that are really old that I acquired when my kids were toddlers, and that mirror is one of them," Sherry explained.

Under the mirror are two lamps that look like they belong in a hotel, but she found them in a consignment shop. "Until now, I've only seen these types of lamps in hotels," she said, chuckling. It's this kind of unusual placement that gives Sherry joy.

One of the home's most interesting pieces is found in Sherry's home office. The canvas painting features a lady staring into space, as if she is waiting for someone to strike up a conversation. It's perfectly accentuated by the steel gray wall on which it hangs.

The foyer holds another piece of modern art on canvas, only this one is

more abstract, as it outlines the image of a man. Likewise, its dominant dark color perfectly matches the wall color. "The basic colors of this house are gray and wheat, and this is wheat," she said.

Like many, Sherry grew up with several favorite TV shows, and one of them is depicted in a print hanging in the downstairs hallway. It's a scene from the TV show, *Good Times*, done in a pseudo Ernest Watson style. "I loved that show. It was so funny," she said. "I've had that print a really long time."

Her taste in art extends well beyond the paintings and print variety, however. she said, referring to their four-legged family member.

A large cabinet in the living room is made of vintage wood and has classic key locks. Again, not art exactly, but blending right in with its own special meaning. movie-related art, such as a piece featuring an old-timey projector and another with a set of director's clap sticks. A miniature popcorn machine that still works resides in one corner.



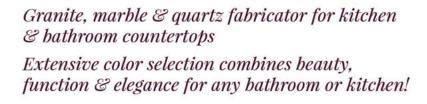



A Gem of a Library

Gathered around a small, round table at the Red Oak Municipal building, five determined women are busy planning upcoming events to support the Red Oak Public Library. They make up the advisory board for an organization called Red Oak Friends of the Library. Vice President Kim Hajek summed up the vision of the organization. "I love this group because there is so much camaraderie between us since we are working toward a common goal. Our desire is to raise awareness of the library and support its reading initiatives."

For the past three years, Red Oak Friends of the Library has raised funds to support the library and has increased community awareness of the vast services it provides with more than 16,000 materials and nearly 7,500 patrons. "Many people don't even realize this library is here," Secretary Pricilla O'Brien offered. "However, our efforts of spending time with people within the community are paying off, as more people are now discovering what the library has to offer."

Although the group is involved with several projects to benefit the library, one event seems to have resonated with the community — BUNCO night. Pricilla explained why the BUNCO nights have proven so successful. "Local businesses have been so generous in supporting our efforts through various donated items we are able to auction off and give away as door prizes."

President of the organization, Julia Easley, added, "Yes, local businesses have really bought into supporting the library, and we hope to see these partnerships continue to grow in the future." BUNCO has also been successful because of the fun environment. "BUNCO night is like a carnival or party. Everyone has a great time."

BUNCO, however, is not the only activity Red Oak Friends of the Library hosts. "We have had authors come and do book signings and speak, and we had many events that took place in February including Love Your Library month," Treasurer Nancy Childress explained. "We even had Elvis come to one of our events, and people paid to have their picture taken with him. Everyone just loved Elvis!"

Red Oak Friends of the Library helps support many literacy initiatives through the library. There are both summer and winter reading programs, as well as a book club, which encourages people to read more. "We really want to help expand literacy for children," Julia stated. "We feel having a strong public library is an important part of that mission."

"Everyone needs to read," Pricilla added. "We want to ensure everyone has access to a wide selection of books." The group is exploring new programs to add to help expand literacy within the community.

Red Oak Friends of the Library has experienced great success in supporting the library. "We have been able to buy a monitor for the library window to announce upcoming events. We have purchased a small robot that helps hold kids' attention during reading time, and we have contributed money to help support reading programs," Nancy summarized.

The women desire to see their membership grow in order to do even more for the community and the library. Founding member Sandy Galletta explained, "The city of Red Oak is going to continue to grow rapidly, and we hope one day to help contribute to adding more space for our library and maybe even offer an outside reading space."

The determination and commitment to their cause is evident on the women's faces. "Our library is a little gem in Red Oak many people don't know about, and the library staff is the best around," Sandy explained. "We want people to discover this gem because we believe it will add value to their lives." NOW

For a slice of Americana, Cedar Rapids, Iowa, beckons Texans with family fun, outdoor adventure, live music, shopping, museums and history. Enriched culture, evergrowing culinary and brewery scenes, beautiful art and a variety of sports entertainment are all within visitors' reach. Driving northeast from Fort Worth will take almost 16 hours and about \$150 in fuel. Or, the Eastern Iowa Airport is 9 miles from Cedar Rapids, where cultural immersion is easy, thanks to a community proud of its heritage.

For many years, Czech was commonly spoken in Cedar Rapids, and today, more people of Czech ancestry live in Cedar Rapids than in any other city in the world, except for the Czech capital of Prague. It is a proud aspect of Cedar Rapids culture, and the history is expressed through extraordinary exhibitions and experiences at the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library.

The museum isn't the only representation of the Czech culture. Czech Village/New Bohemia Main Street District was voted Best Cultural Attraction by the *Corridor Business Journal* in 2017 and was a 2016 Great American Main Street Award semi-finalist. It is home not only to incredible artists and world-class museums, but also some of the best dining, shopping and entertainment in the area.

One fantastic shopping area in the district is NewBo City Market, a year-round indoor farmers market. Visitors can taste local cuisine and brews and support local artistry, all while experiencing a unique and fun atmosphere.

One of Cedar Rapids' most famous local artists, Grant

Wood, got his start here. Cedar Rapids Museum of Art holds the largest collection of his works. The classic art piece, *American Gothic*, was painted in his studio home in 1930. His studio is located near downtown Cedar Rapids and is available to visitors on weekends from April through December.

Another historic landmark is the Brucemore Estate, former home to several history makers who played a large role in Cedar Rapids' factory industries, including Quaker Oats. The estate was donated to the National Trust for Historic Preservation in 1981, and today 43,000 people are drawn to the site every year. Brucemore Estate hosts signature events for the public, like the poolside Tahitian Party, Balloon Glow in the summer, Brucemorchestra in the fall and A Modern Salon in the winter. The house and incredible gardens are open for tours throughout the year.

Hundreds of other parks allow for escape into nature. Indian Creek Nature Center's grounds and trails are explorable at no charge. Families can hike scenic trails, see a concert in the amphitheater, participate in a yoga class or let their children play in the outdoor classroom.

Throughout spring and summer, visitors can join residents cheering on their Cedar Rapids Kernels baseball team, the Minor League affiliate of the Minnesota Twins, playing at the single A level. Fans get to experience firsthand future MLB talent, as top prospects from all over the world play for and against the Kernels. There are also hockey, indoor football and soccer teams competing in the winter.

At the end of full days, calm and cozy lodgings abound. People who need the comfort of a hotel will find every national chain has a key just for them. And those towing an RV will rest securely at campsites nestled close to the Cedar River.

Three Sweeties

They may be small, but they're getting bigger by the day. And that is sweet news. Twin sisters Ryleigh and Lauryn Casteel, age 10, and their 8-year-old sister, Lamaria Lewis, are the creators of 3 Sweet Treats. Their slogan is, "Who can eat a cupcake and not smile?" The young entrepreneurs got the idea from working with their mother, Suprina Casteel, in the kitchen. They've also watched her be a successful business woman.

"Sometimes when they get a large order, their eyes get big," Suprina said. "Sometimes I try to help, and they tell me it's *their* business." A typical order is about 24 cupcakes or a dozen cookies. However, they have gotten orders for as many as 300 cupcakes and more than 100 cookies for a church event.

Each girl has a clear role to play in the company and a favorite amongst the treats they create. Lauryn is the company's chief executive officer, and she likes the strawberry lemonade cookies, just because. Ryleigh is the chief financial officer and prefers good old-fashioned chocolate cupcakes. Lamaria is the chief operating officer. Her favorite is red velvet cupcakes. "It's a different kind of cupcake, and I like to try new things," she said. Along with appeasing appetites, the trio works to make life better for homeless people. They donate proceeds from funds raised at activities such as back-to-school and charity events. "On my Christmas letter (to Santa) I would always put, 'Please bring the homeless food, water and shelter," Lauryn said. "We see a lot of people living under the bridge."

They've also used money raised to purchase school supplies for needy children. "It felt so great to help them," Lamaria said.

The three bakers stay active in a variety of other ways. They love sports. They are Girl Scouts, and they enjoy learning, as evidenced by their placement on the A-B honor roll in school.

Their business began after they borrowed \$173 in start-up money from their mom. She told them they could pay her back at \$5 a month. "They've already paid me back. They even have employees — classmates who will help at events. They have meetings about what they can improve upon the next time they get together."

They always try to make orders the day before requested, so they can deliver them at their freshest, usually overnight by United States Postal Service. They've shipped to locations as far away as Cleveland, Ohio.

So, what's next? They want their own storefront. "I told them that's going to take big money, but they can do it," Suprina said. "They have big hearts."
