


EDITOR'S NOTE

Just over than a decade ago, Ricky Robinson discovered something. His sons are fast, and he wanted to help them get faster, along with teaching them to navigate through life. "We were at football practice, and Jaelyn wanted ice cream. I said wait, we're at practice now. We'll get some later," Ricky recalled. "Next thing, we looked up and he was running across the field after the ice cream truck. I don't know what he thought he was going to do if he caught it, but I knew right then he was ready for track."

Shortly after that day he began working with Jaelyn, then 3 years old, and 1-year-old Tamodrick in their backyard. That was in 2007, and they're still going strong with Jaelyn, now in the ninth grade, and Tamodrick, in the seventh. "I got advice from some elite trainers and applied it to them," Ricky said. "Over time, it's paid off really well, and I've learned a lot, also."

The boys run for Mercury Elite Track Club of DeSoto. They've made several trips to compete in the Amateur Athletic Union Junior Olympics and posted top-10 finishes in their age groups. This summer, both will compete in the Boys 13-14 division. "I started out teaching them how to run correctly," Ricky said. "Going from cone to cone, working into speed training. I knew they had it in them. I also wanted Jaelyn to be ready for football when he played his first year. He was only 4, and he was one of the fastest on the team."

Like their dad, both sons are sprinters, along with playing running back and defensive back in football, and Jaelyn has played some linebacker. Tamodrick loves track but prefers football, while Jaelyn said he can't choose between the two. "I like both the same. I couldn't choose if I had to," Jaelyn said.

"Mine's football," Tamodrick said. "I like being aggressive and physical. I love tackling."

Ricky was a multisport athlete himself. He was a running back on the 1992 Waxahachie state champion football team, though he regrets not finishing the season. He also ran track, competing in high school and the Texas Amateur Athletic Federation. "I learned a hard lesson, and I'm passing that on to my sons," he said. "I turned away from my dream, but I can help my sons and others see their dreams come true."

And he's doing exactly that. Along with working with Jaelyn and Tamodrick, Ricky started Smoke City Training Club, named after Jaelyn, whose nickname is "Smokey." He helps local youths who might not otherwise have the opportunity for training. "Some people don't have the resources, but they still need help,"

Ricky said. "And it's a blessing for me to help people."

Ricky comes from an athletic family. Also, his wife, Tamara Robinson, was a cheerleader and ran some track at Waxahachie High School. She will often help with the training of their boys, like timing and preparing for meets. But she admits the greatest thing that comes from it all is the family time together. "Time is precious. Family is precious, especially these days," she said.

"I love my family. Family means so much to me," Ricky said. "I have good kids, and I love spending time with them. Even when I'm at work, I'm thinking about them. And sports strengthen our bond, but we also talk about so much that often doesn't have anything to do with sports."

The boys understand the significance of this quality time, as well. They know it's more than training. "We're not always going to be kids. We want to enjoy this," Tamodrick said.

Jaelyn added, "I enjoy getting closer to my family and learning about their background."

"Growing up I didn't have my dad around a lot, and I especially needed him in junior high," Ricky

said. "In my adult years, my dad and I have been closer than ever, and he's close with my boys, but I know what it's like to grow up without a father. I don't want my kids to ever experience that."

Jaelyn and Tamodrick are close. Ricky is proud of that, having lost his own brother, three years younger, last year. "As I got older, I realized how much my brother looked up to me, and I can never get any of that time back," Ricky said, a tear forming. "My kids motivate each other, and I'm glad they are close. I teach them to enjoy their youth and each other, every second, as much as they can."

The boys said they appreciate this life lesson and many others from their dad. They know what they are learning now will serve them throughout their adult years, as well. "The people you hang around can affect you, and you can affect them," Jaelyn said.

"Appreciate your true friends," Tamodrick added. "You can't trust everyone, so work hard in life and


At Home With Derek & LeAnn Jones Accomplishing the Extraordinary – By Virginia Riddle



"I like being back where I graduated," she said. "It's cool to walk back through the hallways where I was a student as a teacher. Sometimes, it is a little nostalgic during football season or when Charmers have a spring season." She also enjoys teaching alongside some of her former teachers, seeing each other in a new light. "They view me as an adult because now we are colleagues." Elizabeth's first year as a teacher was smooth, with few bumps along the way. The first year is often notorious for being difficult, mentally and physically, as long hours and learning your own style of teaching can be draining, but Elizabeth feels like hers was a success. "I came in mentally prepared for long nights and tears. I had heard multiple horror stories in college, so I knew things would be challenging," she reflected.







For a slice of Americana, Cedar Rapids, Iowa, beckons Texans with family fun, outdoor adventure, live music, shopping, museums and history. Enriched culture, evergrowing culinary and brewery scenes, beautiful art and a variety of sports entertainment are all within visitors' reach. Driving northeast from Fort Worth will take almost 16 hours and about \$150 in fuel. Or, the Eastern Iowa Airport is 9 miles from Cedar Rapids, where cultural immersion is easy, thanks to a community proud of its heritage.

For many years, Czech was commonly spoken in Cedar Rapids, and today, more people of Czech ancestry live in Cedar Rapids than in any other city in the world, except for the Czech capital of Prague. It is a proud aspect of Cedar Rapids culture, and the history is expressed through extraordinary exhibitions and experiences at the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library.

The museum isn't the only representation of the Czech culture. Czech Village/New Bohemia Main Street District was voted Best Cultural Attraction by the *Corridor Business Journal* in 2017 and was a 2016 Great American Main Street Award semi-finalist. It is home not only to incredible artists and world-class museums, but also some of the best dining, shopping and entertainment in the area.

One fantastic shopping area in the district is NewBo City Market, a year-round indoor farmers market. Visitors can taste local cuisine and brews and support local artistry, all while experiencing a unique and fun atmosphere.

One of Cedar Rapids' most famous local artists, Grant

Wood, got his start here. Cedar Rapids Museum of Art holds the largest collection of his works. The classic art piece, *American Gothic*, was painted in his studio home in 1930. His studio is located near downtown Cedar Rapids and is available to visitors on weekends from April through December.

Another historic landmark is the Brucemore Estate, former home to several history makers who played a large role in Cedar Rapids' factory industries, including Quaker Oats. The estate was donated to the National Trust for Historic Preservation in 1981, and today 43,000 people are drawn to the site every year. Brucemore Estate hosts signature events for the public, like the poolside Tahitian Party, Balloon Glow in the summer, Brucemorchestra in the fall and A Modern Salon in the winter. The house and incredible gardens are open for tours throughout the year.

Hundreds of other parks allow for escape into nature. Indian Creek Nature Center's grounds and trails are explorable at no charge. Families can hike scenic trails, see a concert in the amphitheater, participate in a yoga class or let their children play in the outdoor classroom.

Throughout spring and summer, visitors can join residents cheering on their Cedar Rapids Kernels baseball team, the Minor League affiliate of the Minnesota Twins, playing at the single A level. Fans get to experience firsthand future MLB talent, as top prospects from all over the world play for and against the Kernels. There are also hockey, indoor football and soccer teams competing in the winter.

At the end of full days, calm and cozy lodgings abound. People who need the comfort of a hotel will find every national chain has a key just for them. And those towing an RV will rest securely at campsites nestled close to the Cedar River.

Did You Know ... *Texas Wildflowers* Are Always Blooming? _By Derk Jones

Driving through Texas in spring, it is not uncommon to find vehicles parked along the roadside and families taking pictures among the waving seas of bluebonnets and Indian paintbrushes. Snapping photos among the wildflowers, particularly bluebonnets, is a favorite Texas tradition.

The city of Ennis, south of Dallas, was designated as the home of the Official Texas Bluebonnet Trail in 1997. The trail itself is a mapped series of country roads, which takes the driver through 40 miles of fields covered



in bluebonnets. Whether viewing bluebonnets along the official trail, or just traveling between cities and towns, there is no shortage of opportunities to view these amazing wildflowers during springtime. As the bluebonnets emerge from their winter slumber, families will once again flock to these roadside destinations in hopes of the perfect spring photo.

The bluebonnet has been the official state flower of Texas ever since it was adopted by the state legislature in 1901. It was not until the creation of the Texas Highway Department in 1917, now known as Texas Department of Transportation, that there was a systematic program to ensure the sustainability of bluebonnets and other Texas wildflowers near roadways. According to TxDOT, part of the conservation program involves prohibiting mowing alongside the highways until wildflower season is over.



TxDOT has expanded its wildflower program even further, now buying and sowing 30,000 pounds of wildflower seed each year. Thanks to these initiatives, Texas wildflower enthusiasts will be able to enjoy the spring bluebonnets and wildflowers alongside the highways for generations to come.

TxDOT has been instrumental in preserving Texas wildflowers, but perhaps no other name is as synonymous with wildflowers as that of former First Lady of the United States, Lady Bird Johnson. As First Lady, she was able to apply her passion for beautifying the nation's highways and cities and political influence to help pass the Highway Beautification Act in 1965. Because of her influence and involvement, the bill is informally referred to as, "Lady Bird's Bill." Thankfully, she had the foresight to know making the nation a place of beauty also makes it a better place to live.

Part of making the nation a place of beauty requires focusing on native wildflowers and creating environments in which they can flourish. After her term as First Lady ended, Mrs. Johnson returned to Texas. Living in Austin, she partnered with actress Helen Hayes in 1982

to create the National Wildflower Research Center. Later, in 1997, the center was renamed The Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center.

Through the efforts of the research center, native plants and flowers of Texas are being restored in areas where they had been wiped out due to development. Today, The Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center stands as a legacy to a woman who devoted her life to adding a bit of color and beauty to the Texas landscape.

Although Texas may be famous for its fields of bluebonnets and Indian paintbrushes, the state is also home to many other unique wildflowers. For example, another

favorite is the sunflower. The contrast of the bright yellow against a clear, blue Texas sky creates a breathtaking image and, like the bluebonnets, is worthy of family photographs. As with bluebonnets, these Texas favorites reach their peak in the spring before the heat from the harsh Texas sun withers them. Whether a favorite color is blue, red, yellow or a combination of these, the wildflowers of Texas do not disappoint.

For Texans who truly love wildflowers and have a discerning eye, spring is not the only time worthy of viewing. During any season or month, there are a variety of wildflowers blooming and flourishing. The Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center website is a valuable tool for finding information about these lesser known wildflowers. For example, the website lists 20 wildflowers growing during the freezing temperatures of January and 24 examples growing during the heat of July.

The extremes of Texas weather only serve to create great diversity among the wildflowers. Institutions such as The Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center, the Dallas



HealthNOW Taking a Vacation? Make It Easy on Your Feet.

Although rest and relaxation are the goals for most vacations, they usually involve a lot of walking, and a lot of walking usually involves sore feet. Walking is great exercise and one of the most reliable forms of transportation. But if your feet aren't in the best shape or you don't have the right shoes, too much walking can cause foot problems. Good foot care is essential if you plan to subject your feet to long periods of walking.

Some simple foot care tips include:

- Wear thick, absorbent socks (acrylic instead of cotton).
- Dry feet thoroughly after bathing, making sure to dry between toes. Use powder before putting on shoes.

- Nails should be cut regularly, straight across the toe.
- Bunions, hammertoes or any other serious foot problems should be evaluated by a foot and ankle surgeon.

The right shoe is also important for healthy walking. The ideal walking shoe should be stable from side to side and well-cushioned, and it should enable you to walk smoothly. Many running shoes will fit the bill. There are also shoes made especially for walking. Walking shoes tend to be slightly less cushioned, yet not as bulky, and lighter than running shoes. Whether a walking or running shoe, the shoes need to feel stable and comfortable.

Warming up exercises to help alleviate any muscle stiffness or pulled muscles are also advised before walking. Loosening up the heel cords (Achilles and calf) and thigh muscles before a walk is especially effective. If you're not accustomed to long walks, start slowly and rest if your feet start hurting. And above all, have fun.
