Calling Dr. Camp

For over 50 years, 'going to the doctor,' in Corsicana, as likely as not meant you were going to see Dr. Campbell. Dr. Lowell Campbell opened his office here as a general practitioner in 1954. His brother, Dr. David Campbell, began practicing here in 1957 and Lowell's son, Dr. Dale Campbell, has been a family practitioner here for 25 years. These much-loved and well-respected gentlemen have been tending the sick, celebrating the living and delivering babies for as long as many Corsicanians

Lowell retired three years ago, but every Thursday he volunteers in the in-patient surgery waiting room. "I attend to the family; see that they get what they need; chat with them, keep them entertained, keep their mind off the worry."

can remember.

David moved his office to the airport in 2003, where he still practices as an Aviation Medical Examiner (AME). "I think we are the only family of three



doctors all doing family medicine in the same town that are all AMEs." David said. "I am chairman of the Airport Board, and I do flight physicals." David has long been a familiar sight at Corsicana sports events, where he was the team doctor for 37 years. "I served

> on the State Sports Medicine Committee for about 10 years, and chaired it for five years in the '80s."

Lowell and David grew up in Crowell in West Texas and trace their decision to enter the field of medicine to an early age. "I was about 12 and he was about 8," Lowell recalled. "When

I was around Boy Scout age, we were doing first aid. On a farm, you can get pretty hot, pretty quick. Somebody got a little bit of heat exhaustion and tried to pass out. I got some cold, wet towels and gave them a bunch of water to drink, and the patient was

up and running and doing well. I said, 'Hey, that is fun; it is something I can do.' So, that is where I made up my mind." Lowell, being the

oldest, went off to the University of Texas at Austin for pre-med first. "That was interrupted by WWII," Lowell said. "I volunteered and was in active duty from 1944 to 1946 in the U.S. Army Air Corps." At the end of the war, Lowell was home on furlough, and caught a glimpse of a girl he had

known in high school. "I was in the drug store having a [soda], and I saw this really pretty lady walking by. I said, 'Hey! Is that Juanita? Give me my ticket; I've got to go!' I followed her, and we dated every day for the two or three weeks that I was there on furlough, and by the time I left, we were engaged." After he was discharged, Lowell and Juanita married, and Lowell finished his medical training.

While David was in medical school in Houston, he met his future wife, Peggy, at a party. "Growing up, I always wanted to be a doctor, and I wanted to be a flight surgeon. I spent two years in active duty in the Air Force, mainly Laredo Air Force Base. I practiced medicine there for two years," David said.

"Going into private practice was always my game plan," David said. So, at the end of the two years, he joined Lowell who had set up practice in Corsicana. They practiced with Dr. Barnebee, Dr. Grizaffi and Dr. Mayfield.





"I did a lot of anesthesia in the Air Force, so when I came here I did 800 anesthetics a year," David remembered. "I was doing anesthetics; I was doing surgery, delivering babies, seeing patients in the office and having a ball."

Lowell joined the Air Force Reserve when he was 57. "After they started Operation Desert Storm, they activated me within a week," he said. At age 65, he was thrilled to be sent to England

to staff a war-time hospital.

Lowell, 81 now, is taking a lot of pride in his son's work. "Dale has done probably more than the average family practitioner. He did obstetrics and surgery. He is still real busy doing family practice," Dr. Lowell said. "I am glad he went into medicine because he has been a good doctor. A lot of people brag on him, and I am just so proud of him."



Dale recalled two incidents that resolved the issue of becoming a physician for him. "In about the fourth grade, I had to write a paper about what I wanted to be when I grew up, and I chose a doctor," Dale said. "When I was a junior in high school, I started flying. One of my instructors was the pharmacist Jim Stephenson." Jim told Dale that if he was going to go to school for five years, not to go into pharmacology but to pursue medicine. Dale apparently

decided that Jim had more than good advice to offer. He went on to medical school and ended up marrying Jim's daughter, Kathy.

The Campbells treasure their many years of medical practice. "We came along at such a wonderful time, because general practitioners were treating everything," Lowell recalled. "I think it was better for everybody."

"There was a sacred relationship between you and the patient," David agreed. "Now, that relationship is influenced and overshadowed by third parties – government and insurance. There are too many other people besides doctors making medical decisions. Surgery patients are sent home too quickly. It is almost tragic the way things have happened."

When Dale set up a private practice in Corsicana in 1982, he did something that doctors are unable to do nowadays, he said. "It didn't matter what insurance

people had; they could see me. Now, in order to treat a patient, you have to be put on an insurance company's medical panel, which takes six months, so no one can set up as an independent and get started. New doctors have to join a clinic to practice."



"It was a wonderful time to practice medicine."

"We came here at such a good time. It was a wonderful time to practice medicine," David added. "Before the days when the insurance companies were in charge, it was just a marvelous thing. We treated multiple generations of the same family."

"We delivered 2,000 - 2,500 babies a piece," Lowell said. "Practicing in Corsicana has been fun. I wouldn't take a word of it back."

David and Lowell shared ideas and worked together. One idea, which David had, has inspired both of them. "We both still call our patients on their birthdays," David said. "I just always thought birthdays were special."

The personal touch runs in the family. "People want to know you care about them, Dale said. "My nurse gets frustrated with me because I spend so much time talking to my patients. The insurance companies want you to spend less time with patients, but if my patients are there, I am going to listen to them."



Paul and Lynda Green had been living in Barry for 26 years when family matters began pulling at their heartstrings. It became time to consolidate the family, and the Greens quickly realized they needed a house large enough to comfortably accommodate a full-time houseguest. "We wanted to move my mother in with us and move Lynda's mother into an assisted living facility," Paul said. "We had tried to sell the house in Barry many times before, but were never successful. 



Lifetime journeys are rarely predictable. The path we thought we were on changes abruptly, either by choice or circumstance. Then we find ourselves in a completely different endeavor, learning new things and being grateful for the detour.

The life journey of Faith Holt could be described as circular. She was lead away from Corsicana by her job and husband, yet the road always seemed to lead her back to her childhood home.

Faith is Navarro County's Precinct #2 Commissioner. She was appointed to complete the term of Olin Nickelberry,

after his untimely death in April 2005, and is the first African-American woman to hold one of the highest administrative jobs in the county. In 2007, the people of her precinct elected her to a four-year term.

Just who is Faith Holt, and why was she first chosen, then elected to such a critical position? To answer that question, you have to take a look at her life experiences. She is the only child of Mabel and Bob Scott, both of whom are morticians. Her mother was 24 years old when Faith was born in Dallas. After Bob's aunt passed away, the young family moved into her home directly across

the street from Scott Funeral Home. This home had been Bob's childhood home.

Faith grew up in a home where death was the family business. "I never thought that much about it," she said, "until Halloween night when my friends refused to come over!" When she was 12 years old, Faith built an unusual model of a cemetery. She made tiny headstones, and added trees and monsters. "After a few months, dust and cobwebs had settled on it," she recalled. "Nature did the decorating for me!"

With her unusual family business, you would think that Faith would be a quiet and reserved person. As any of her family and many friends will tell you, she is anything but. James Olson, the Precinct #4 Commissioner, works right

next door to Faith at the courthouse. They were in the last class to graduate from "old Corsicana High," which is now Drane Intermediate. "Faith was always fun in high school," James reminisced. "Now, I get to work with her every day!" His eye rolling at the ceiling made Faith reach back

and pull out a slim, hardcover book. "Oh no," James said, holding his hands up in mock desperation, "anything but that!"

Faith gave him a look that said, "You asked for it," while immediately turning to a photo of a young James, class of 1970. James told her to be sure to show her own picture, and she gracefully complied. "Behold – the Mod Squad," Faith laughed, as she pointed to herself 37 years ago. A young Faith smiled at the camera, her afro-hairstyle prominently displayed. Even in high school, Faith was not a shy person.

"My parents were strict, but loving," she said. "They demanded my respect." Faith thought for a moment, then added, "My mother has a favorite saying that I passed on to my girls. It goes like this, 'You don't slide your feet under my table, eat my beans, then disrespect me."

Faith went to work for Bell Helicopter in Fort Worth, got married and had two daughters. After 12 years, she and the girls returned to Corsicana and Faith continued to drive to Fort Worth every day. Two hours a day in the car gave her a lot of time to think

about her life and she decided to look for work locally. It was then she found her way home.

Leadership can be shown in many forms. Faith became a dispatcher for the Navarro County Sheriff's office. Her office was at the county jail and she quickly learned the different jobs required to smoothly run a prison facility. Faith became interested in law



enforcement and obtained her master's certification as a peace officer. She graduated second in her class of 28, becoming the first African-American woman to achieve that status.

Faith downplays her accomplishments. "I work hard; I study hard and I learn. Then I do my job," she stated with characteristic directness.

The attributes of hard work and persistence have served Faith well. She became a captain in the Sheriff's office and was assigned the task of running the county jail. But, handling the administrative details for 200 or more inmates for 22 years made Faith begin to think it was time for a change. She was planning to announce her retirement on May 23, 2005, but received her appointment to the County Commissioner's position one week earlier - on May 16, 2005. Faith laughed about the timing. "I was all set to retire, relax and have fun," she remembered. "The county still needed me, so here I am."

The main role of a County Commissioner is to take care of the county roads. "So far, I've never had to run a motor grader," she said candidly, but she certainly had to learn what it looked like. Her challenge was to acquire the knowledge and learn the







Growing up in the middle of a 1,000-acre ranch, he has lived first-hand the themes of God and country, love and family, hard work and fun that color the lyrics of his songs. His original music has been heard in clubs from Fort Worth to Dallas, where he has appeared at Gilley's and Adair's Saloon. Locally, he plays in Corsicana and Ennis on a regular basis. "Every one of my songs is a real-life experience; they are not made-up stuff," Ryan said. "Life is where I get the drive to write the songs." Ryan writes

from the heart, whether the song is about Texas, about

and I thank them for everything now."



Ryan's brand of country music opens doors for him. "The Texas sound is huge now," he explained. "Getting a gig is all about how you present yourself. You have to be professional from A to Z." But, once you are in the door, the music has to win the audience. "The big thing is



that people come out to see you play, and you better give them a show because that is what they want to see. When I play shows, I like to try and incorporate a lot of new songs. I like to pull something out that they are not expecting. If you can do your own music, and get people to like it — if




they have heard it on the radio station and they want to hear that song, and they request it – that is your payoff right there." Ryan's love song, "Me and Texas" has gotten some radio play.

Not only learning the values of hard work and responsibility from his family, Ryan also credits them with his musical heritage. "My dad is a musician. He plays acoustic guitar. I learned everything I know from him and from my grandmother, my mom's mom. My grandma is very musically inclined. She plays the piano and the organ. She played old country and hymns. As a young kid I played those same songs with her and she would teach me. My biggest supporter is my family. My parents never miss a show."

Ryan began taking piano lessons at age 10. He plays by ear, though, and he said his favorite teacher is the radio. "I grew up with country music. Bob Wills turned me on to the fiddle. Pat Green and Cory Morrow turned me on to the Texas scene." When Ryan went to a Rhett Akins concert in junior high, he met Akins and his road manager, Jeff Gossett. They invited him to their next appearance at Billy Bob's. "That is











where I really got the drive to want to do something on my own."

By the time Ryan was 15, he had started a band, 22 West, in which he played guitar, fiddle and sang. The band, made up of friends from high school, played together for three years



but dissolved when everyone graduated from high school and went their separate ways. "It was a great band," Ryan reminisced. "By the time we decided to break it up, we were beginning to get radio interviews."

While he attended Navarro College, Ryan played fiddle and guitar with the Kyle Hunt Band, traveling to gigs two or three nights a week. When Ryan moved on to SHSU, he began playing with the Randy Blue's Full House Band. This brought him full circle. "When I was a little kid, my parents and I used to go out to dances in Corsicana where Randy would play with his band. When I was 11 or 12 years old, I got up and played drums with his band at one of the shows."

Ryan focuses on original songs in his performances. Yet he makes time for a few from his favorite singers, Willie Nelson and Johnny Cash, always including "Folsom Prison Blues," which is the most requested song he plays. "I love playing in a band, but performing my own songs, playing acoustic - that is where the love is - me and my acoustic guitar and a lot of Texas music. I'm out there by myself – me and the lights and the crowd." NOW

There is a new athletic director in town who is eager to get started. Kerens High School graduate Russell Anderson is back after years of training and continued education, and he has great goals for his new students.

Henigan treated me very well. I learned a lot about football and the inner workings of a big school."







Albert Einstein once said, "Do not worry about your difficulties in mathematics; I assure you that mine are greater." Even a genius struggled with the universal language in which so many others proclaim deficiency. What a relief!

Students at Blooming Grove High School who are having difficulty understanding exponents and derivatives have a great teacher to help. Helen Albritton has been a math teacher for over 30 years. She goes out of her way to help her students understand and appreciate math. "I try to explain it in as many different ways as I possibly can," Helen said.

When asked how she became interested in math, Helen answered, "It has just always been so easy. When I was in high school, I had a friend who had trouble in math. I helped her."

After high school, Helen attended the University of Texas at Austin where she obtained bachelor's degrees in history and English. Her continued interest in math led her to achieve her math certification in Dallas. She taught at Corsicana High School for many years and led developmental classes at Navarro College as well. She has been at Blooming Grove High School for about three years. Her classes include Algebra I, Precalculus and TAKS math.

Some students have trouble in math largely because they cannot grasp the necessity of it or how it applies to real life. "It's important that they understand what you are trying to teach them, and why it's important to learn," Helen explained. "The future holds jobs we've not encountered yet,

computer-oriented jobs that require problem-solving skills. If you can get those problem-solving skills, you are ahead of the curve."

Most of Helen's students are ninth-graders, learning Algebra I. She believes that students must gain an understanding of Algebra I before tackling the rest of math. Algebra I is the basic math class at Blooming Grove, and it coincides with the TAKS curriculum.

It has been said that some students tend to excel in either mathematics or English, but rarely both. Helen once experimented with this concept. She was teaching math and English at the time.

"I've taught both subjects to the same group of students, in the same classroom," she explained. "Those who excelled in math and sat in the front of the math class were the ones in the back of the room in the English class." These dynamics are interesting. The same result held true for her English students. Those who excelled in English sat in the back of the math class.

Blooming Grove High School continues to strive for educational excellence. Each teacher has, on average, 16 years of experience. The average math class contains 15 students versus the state average of 20. Last year, Blooming Grove students ranked above the state average in math scores. Ninth-graders were 13 percent above average; 10th-graders were five percent above average; and 11th-graders were eight percent above average, as cited on the school district's Web site.

Helen is not only a skilled mathematician, but also a very talented artist. Her home is wonderfully decorated with elegant furniture and fixtures. Her magnificent artwork is prominently displayed throughout her



home. The downstairs alone houses at least 15 pieces, all of which are unique and filled with radiant color.

A painting of a grand Scottish landscape hangs above her fireplace. A portrait of one of their four grandchildren hangs across the room. Throughout the kitchen there are other works, including more landscapes and a floral print. She is clearly a versatile painter, who loves the medium of oil.

She has sought artistic instruction from the Creative Arts Center in Dallas and has taken several art classes in Austin.

So how is her left-brained job as a math teacher connected with her right-brained hobby as an artist? "One



1/4 cup tomato paste

1 bay leaf

1 tsp. Cajun seasoning

1/8 tsp. ground red pepper

1 - 2 tsps. olive oil

1 medium chopped green bell pepper

3/4 cup chopped onion

3/4 cup celery

hot pepper sauce (optional)

Combine rice, beans, ham, water, chicken broth, tomato paste, bay leaf, Cajun seasoning and red pepper. Bring to boil. Reduce heat to low; cover and simmer for 15 minutes. Meanwhile, heat oil in medium skillet over medium heat until hot. Add green pepper,

onion and celery. Cook and stir 5 minutes; add to rice mixture. Continue to simmer 10 minutes or until rice is tender or flavors have blended. If mixture becomes dry, add small amount of water. Despite our efforts at eliminating all the standing water, they are "doing well" here! Are you aware that there are hundreds of varieties of mosquitoes? They have been around longer than we have, and will continue to be. In Cuba in 1900, Dr. Walter Reed, for whom the Walter Reed Army Medical Center was named, did the pioneering work for understanding and learning to control the various illnesses caused by this pesky insect.


After learning that a female can lay up to 200 eggs every 10 to 20 days in standing water, it became critical that even


bottle cap sized pools be eliminated! Those little "wigglers" in the water promptly grow into bloodsuckers. This knowledge has given me a whole new perspective on the water in the saucers under my plants! I now empty them if the plant has not taken it up within 24 hours! No baby mosquitoes for me! I have even searched under my porches for the odd pot or saucer that might hold even a tablespoon of water. It is amazing how even the shelves of my potting area can hold a tad of water as can the lids to the five-gallon cans I use

to store potting soils.

If you use five-gallon cans to catch and hold rain water, put screens over them until you are ready to use the water. A drop or two of bleach in the water will also kill the "wigglers" and not hurt the plants. These early mosquitoes have not been observed to carry the really bad diseases we fear, but as the season progresses the "really bad guys" appear. It is better to try to prevent their breeding and biting than to worry about this age-old problem. Get rid of the standing water, and get out the insect spray for a mosquito-free summer!






