the walls of the same church since its beginning.

"My great-grandfather, Captain Charles Henry Allyn, and a devoted group of Episcopalians established the church in 1871," Robert, known as "Bobby," explained. "Captain Allyn was a Yankee. He moved down here after he met his wife while fighting in the Battle of New Orleans." When the railroad came to Corsicana, Captain Allyn soon followed and established



one of the many mercantile stops on the route from Houston.

Regardless of his allegiance to the North, the captain made quite a lasting reputation in the young town of Corsicana. Captain Allyn began the Episcopal Church in Corsicana in 1871, before there was even a diocese (an ecclesiastical district under the jurisdiction of a bishop) in Dallas. He was also instrumental in building and erecting the original Corsicana Country Club building. In 1908, he played a key role in the building of St. John's Church on the sight where it stands today.

The Lang family's dedication to the church is still apparent in every aspect of their membership and involvement in the church. "I remember going through training as an acolyte when I was 12 years old," Bobby said, recalling

the first time he became involved in the church. "Then it was also about that time that I began to sing in the choir, which led to my choral career in high school and college, through the service and on into dental school." After returning to Corsicana in 1955, with his dental degree and Beverly, his beautiful bride of now 60 years, Bobby rejoined the church choir full time. "Before I returned home permanently, I would pop in to sing with the choir on the weekends when I was in town visiting from college and dental school," he shared.

Bobby considers himself a bass singer, although he admitted his voice has changed over many years of singing. "I just love to sing, and I




always have music running through my mind," he said. "I very rarely miss a Sunday in church. It starts my week off right for me." Beverly added with a smile, "He is constantly whistling, but the thing I remember most about him was that he had a voice like Sinatra in college. He would always serenade the sororities."

The church has enjoyed many years of Bobby's singing, as well as many generations of Lang family devotion. "We Episcopalians are very sacramental people," he explained. "I have held almost every position in the church except priest. There have been many ups and downs in the church. We have










seen new members come and go, members pass away and members move away," Bobby continued.


The Langs' roots indeed run deep in their church. Like her husband, Beverly's involvement in the church cannot go unnoticed, as she was an active member in the church choir for over 16 years. "In fact, our granddaughter, Leslie, was married there in May of 2008. She was the fifth generation [Lang family member] to be wed in the church," Bobby said, beaming with pride. "It



just so happened to be the 100th anniversary of the church." While Bobby and Beverly were not married in the church because Beverly's father was a Methodist minister and they were wed in the Methodist church, the family members that were wed at St. John's include: Captain Allyn's daughter; Bobby's parents; Bobby's brother; Bobby and Beverly's daughter, Susan; their son, John; and their granddaughter, Leslie.

The Langs' dedication was even memorialized with three gorgeous stained glass windows that adorn the interior of the sanctuary. "One day, my cousin and her husband bumped into an architect at a function. As they sat and discussed the project [of designing a new church in Corsicana], the architect quickly sketched a design of a church on the back of a cocktail napkin. That design is actually the current design and layout of the church [St. John's] as

it stands today. So, for all of her efforts and hard work in getting the church designed and built, the church decided to immortalize my cousin in one of the beautiful stained glass windows," Bobby explained. "Then, there is my




grandfather, who was also honored with a window because of his allegiance to the church. He was the treasurer of the church and extremely involved in every aspect." Captain Allyn was also honored with the large circular window in the center of the church for his obvious commitment to the church.

It is quite apparent that Dr. Robert Lang is a man with dedication, a truth made apparent by his wonderful 60 years of marriage to his wife, his 70-year tenure in the St. John's church choir, his perseverance to graduate from dental school and his dedication to his children and grandchildren. Bobby is the type of man many people strive to be. With faith, honor and loyalty, he has managed to sustain the positive reputation and lineage that his family established at St. John's Episcopal Church. On March 8, 2009, the church showed their gratitude and thanks for Bobby's devotion and dedication with his very own embossed and dated choral notebook. On any given Sunday, you can visit the Episcopal Church to hear him and the rest of the choir sing some of their favorite hymns. One in particular is Robert's favorite — one he calls "The Navy Hymn." "I don't know if that's its official name, but that is what it is known as," he said.







Coming Home Again

When Kyle and Rockie Glicksman moved from Kerens to Corsicana, they were coming home again. Kyle grew up in Corsicana and has family here. Rockie was anxious to move into town where school for their son, Sloan, would be closer and family members could be neighbors. "We looked for a year for a house," Rockie said, "and then we heard about this house and Kyle said, "This is the one."

They sold the house in Kerens so quickly that they lived for a while at their camp house located outside of Kerens. "The camp house sat on a hill and had a great view of the lake and the land all around it," Kyle said. When the camp house was sold, most of the furniture went with it, so Rockie and Kyle's stepmother enjoyed the task of helping furnish and decorate the new house in Corsicana. A few pieces of furniture are family treasures, including a child's wooden rocker that belonged to a grandmother and an antique



wooden painted chest that holds Sloan's toys.

Built in the 1950s, the home appears from the street to be a standard single-story ranch house, but surprises wait inside. When you step through the front door, your eyes are drawn up to the two-story cathedral ceiling of a large room. The ceiling is supported with massive wooden beams. The walls are finished with wide mahogany









planking and a gun cabinet is built into the wall opposite a row of windows overlooking the patio. A massive stone fireplace extends floor-to-ceiling at one end of the room. The Glicksmans refurbished the floor and converted the gun cabinet into attractive display shelves.

Lewis Foster, the builder, included many custom features that were not typical of ranch houses built in his time. Before energy costs were a prime consideration in home construction, Lewis included three-zone electricity and double-paned windows. The narrow tan bricks on the exterior of the house are also an uncommon type of brick. The dark green square tiles in one bath have a glass tile finish that, atypical of the style of the '50s, is now popular in custom installations.

"Except for a new kitchen, only minor changes were made to the house," Rockie said. Some windows were replaced, but four



large picture windows were kept as desirable features of the home. The original floors were refinished and crown molding was added all over the house. The bathrooms were updated with countertops and fixtures, but the tile walls were untouched. "We gutted the kitchen," Rockie said, "replacing the metal cabinets and adding granite countertops and new appliances." At one end of the kitchen, a pleasant eating area brightly lit by windows reveals the patio and a beautiful new pool in the backyard. "We use the patio a lot in the summer," she added. "We needed a big table," Rockie explained, "because we often entertain our family and guests. A family holiday dinner means around 20 people will sit down to eat."

At one end of the house

is a bed/sitting room combination and bath, home to Rockie's mother, Sandra Lewis, a second-grade teacher. Along one wall, built-in painted cabinets and shelves provide storage. psychology and criminal justice. After graduation, however, her mother told her about a teaching position that opened up in the school where she was teaching second-grade students. "I didn't expect they would be interested, since I had no teaching classes or experience from college," Rockie said. She proceeded to enroll in the proper courses and soon received the necessary teaching certifications. "I got the job in the middle school, and I taught there for four years," she recalled. "I changed to teaching prekindergarten for another four years after that. I also had some training in the Scottish Rite program for dyslexia."

"We plan to enroll Sloan in the pre-K class at Collins Catholic School," Kyle said. "That's were I went








to school." With a laugh, he added, "I told Rockie to tell them Sloan doesn't act like I did in school, so they would let him in." Kyle must have behaved well enough to graduate, because he went on to earn a certificate in business at Navarro College, thus allowing him to start up various companies of his own. 


Regardless of your position, some goals are met and some, unfortunately, are nothing but dreams. John Preston Bentley is one of the

completely inspired by God to write this book," he stated.



- 3/4 cup mayonnaise
- 1 tsp. lemon juice
- 2 oz. cheddar cheese, shredded
- 1 cup soft bread crumbs or enough to cover top
- 1 Tbsp. or more butter, melted

Cook broccoli according to package directions in salted water until tender; drain. Pour into a greased 9 x 13-inch baking dish. Laver chicken evenly over broccoli, Combine soup, mayonnaise and lemon juice; pour evenly over chicken. Sprinkle with cheese. Combine crumbs and butter; sprinkle over all. Bake for 35 minutes or until thoroughly heated at 350 F. For added color, trim with pimento strips, if desired, Serves 8 to 10.

Arrange chicken in a lightly greased 13 x 9 x 2-inch baking dish. Sprinkle with stuffing mix: drizzle with butter. Pour orange juice over chicken; cover. Bake for 1 1/4 hours at 350 F. Serve with wild rice and Sweet Orange Sauce.

- 1 6-oz. can frozen orange juice, thawed and diluted
- 1/2 cup orange marmalade
- 2 Tbsp. steak sauce
- Combine all ingredients in a microwavable container. Microwave

on high for 6 minutes until hot; stir once

MEXICAN LASAGNA

- 1 lb. ground beef, cooked and drained (optional)
- 14-oz, can diced tomatoes
- 15-oz. can black beans, drained
- 1 clove garlic, minced 1/4 cup cilantro, chopped
- 4-oz. can green chili
- 14-oz. can corn, drained
- 2 green onions, chopped
- 1/2 tsp. cumin
- 1/2 tsp. oregano
- 8 corn tortillas
- 1 1/2 cups Monterey Jack cheese, grated

Combine first 10 ingredients; mix well. Grease a 2-quart baking dish; line with 4 overlapping tortillas. Spread half of mixture over tortillas; sprinkle with half of cheese. Repeat process with remaining ingredients. Bake for 15 minutes at 350 F: cut into squares. Top with sour cream. Serves 6.

FLUFFY PUMPKIN CHEESECAKE

- 1 pkg, cream cheese





Watch Those Summer Scrapes Antibiotic-resistant staph (MRSA) are on the rise

With the dog days of summer and warm-weather sports in full swing, it is important to pay special attention to cuts, bruises and rashes that occur along with the fun. Close contact with others, sports involving skin-to-skin contact and warm, humid environments are a fertile breeding ground for staph infections. Staph bacteria can live harmlessly on many skin surfaces, especially around the nose, mouth, genitals and anus. In fact, without knowing it, 25 to 30 percent of people carry staph bacteria without being infected by it. But when the skin is punctured or broken for any reason, the bacteria can enter the wound and cause an infection.

A more serious, drug-resistant version of staph known as MRSA (methicillin-resistant staphylococcus aureus) can lead to dangerous, life-threatening infections. Both staph infections and MRSA are on the rise, and health experts attribute the increase to improper hygiene and overuse of antibiotics, among other factors. Most staph infections are minor and can be treated with oral antibiotics; however, others can be very serious and cause wound and bloodstream infections and

pneumonia. MRSA is even tougher to treat than most types of staph infection because it is resistant to some of the commonly-used antibiotics.

MRSA infections are particularly common among young children, prison inmates, military recruits and high school, college and professional sports teams and other athletes who frequent health clubs — namely, individuals who are in close contact and have an opportunity to share contaminated personal items.

MRSA often starts as a small lesion, cut or boil that fails to heal, then gets progressively worse. MRSA can live on surfaces such as handrails, tabletops and skin. It can spread by skin contact or by sharing items such as pencils and sports equipment with an infected person.

One of the simplest — and most effective — prevention techniques is proper hand-washing. Washing hands with soap and warm water or using an alcohol-based hand rub, is key, especially after physical contact and before meals. Keeping skin abrasions and wounds covered and avoiding contact with open wounds also helps prevent the spread of


infection. You can also prevent infection by maintaining a clean environment by cleaning surfaces with anti-bacterial products. Sharing personal items such as clothes, towels or razors is not recommended, as infectious bacteria can spread on these surfaces.


MRSA is generally treatable if caught early, so it is important to know how to recognize an infection and get treatment. An infection on the skin's surface looks like a pimple or boil that can be red, painful and full of pus that must be drained. These can progress into deep, painful abscesses. Seek medical attention immediately if skin symptoms last longer or are more painful than common bug bites. Seek medical attention anytime you experience a fever of more than 104 degrees as an adult, or when an infant experiences a fever of more than 100.4 degrees.

Because medical practitioners may not immediately recognize an infection is caused by antibiotic-resistant bacteria, it is important to seek medical attention if prescribed antibiotics have no effect after four days.

Crape Myrtles the Lilacs of the South

It is July already! I hope you have driven through the area and admired the beautiful crape myrtles. They have been called the lilacs of the South, and they are blooming like mad. If you do not have any, it is not too late. They bloom for three months or more and are available in many colors and sizes. They love the sun and are perfect for a hot, dry spot. They need water the first year or two, but after that, they do well on their own. A little nitrogen in the spring and fall will support the growth and give you fat and sassy blooms.

The main problem with the crape myrtles around here seems to be the powdery mildew, which gets on the new growth and turns the leaves gray to white. You can always spray with a good fungicide if you already have it, but the best solution to this disease is prevention. Sun and lots of air circulation will help, but choosing a variety that is resistant is even better. The good guys at Texas A&M, in conjunction with the good guys at Louisiana State University, have come up with a list of varieties that are extremely hardy and disease resistant for our area of the country.

Their favorites are as follows

- h Natchez a gorgeous plant with "weeping" branches reaching 30 feet tall with white blooms
- h Basham's Party Pink upright to 30 feet with lavender-pink blooms
- h Tuscarora upright to a height of 25 feet with coral pink blooms
- h Muskogee upright plant reaching 20 feet with lavender blooms.
- h Sioux vivid pink blooms reaching to 15 feet
- h Tonto smaller plant reaching 12-14 feet with deep red flowers
- h Acoma smaller "weeping" plant with white blooms reaching to 14 feet.

Notice all the different sizes. This will help with the need to prune and prune and prune. Crape myrtles do not need a lot of cutting back if the plant is the right size to begin with. I like mine upright so I lop off the suckers at the bottom as soon as I see them. Like many other plants in my garden, anywhere the branches rub on each other is a good place to consider pruning. The severe cutting back in the spring is not needed to promote blooms nor is the trimming of the spent blooms. This is my kind of plant, one that loves the heat, blooms and does not require much other than my admiration.






