



Promoting Deserves

Prior to becoming the economic development director for Corsicana and Navarro County nearly a year ago, Bill King spent years away from Texas, the land of his mother's birth, gaining experience in military and private sectors that he now uses to attract businesses to this area. "I missed Texas, the weather and the people," Bill said. "Texas is a great state, since it is business friendly, with no state income tax and few onerous regulations." Born in Germany and reared as a U.S. Army "brat," Bill never lived close to Texas as a child, but visited family members in the Lone Star State. Attending 10 schools in 14 years, including four high schools in four years, Bill and his siblings grew up without having a hometown. But they had the advantage of experiencing life in many parts of the world. "I have a spirit of adventure and caught the travel bug early," Bill confessed. In fact, he has lived on five continents. "I've gotten to experience cultures and people by living in different places," he said.

After graduating from Alamo Heights High School in San Antonio, while his dad was stationed overseas, Bill attended Texas A&M University in College Station. "I majored in the Corps," he said. His parents were stationed in India during those years. He learned financial responsibility since it took weeks for mail, with another check enclosed, to reach him. His travels "home" for the holidays were always exciting. "We even celebrated Christmas in the Himalayas once," Bill remembered.

After graduating from A&M, Bill began his military career of 23 years. "Half of that time, I was single and willing and able to move," Bill explained. He enrolled in graduate school, through the Army, at Johns Hopkins University's School of Advanced International Studies, with a focus on Latin American studies. Bill attended this Washington, D.C., graduate school with fellow students working in government, international business and global finance. "It was a really interesting

mix of people," he said. Bill also has attended the University of Oklahoma's Economic Development Institute.

As an Army captain, Bill spent two years in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, where he became proficient in speaking, reading and writing Portuguese. Another interesting post for Bill came when he served on General Norman Schwarzkopf's staff during Desert Storm. He retired from military service at the rank of lieutenant colonel.

"My mom taught us that when you meet someone new, focus on what you have in common," Bill related. "Then branch out from there and embrace your differences." That advice works anywhere, he maintained. Not a day goes by that he doesn't find someone with whom he has something in common. "Since I've lived all over," Bill reflected, "I constantly encounter people who have been at the same place, often at the same time."

Linda, Bill's wife, joined him for some of the 21 moves that he made while in the Army. As one of 14 children who grew up on a Missouri family farm, the Army life was quite a change for her, as was having children born in Italy and Florida. Bill and Linda moved their family to Nacogdoches where Bill was an economic developer before coming to Corsicana. The couple has two sons, Tim and Ben, who are soon to graduate from Stephen F. Austin State University and a daughter, Maggie, who just graduated from high school in Nacogdoches and will attend Texas A&M this fall. "She will be Maggie, the Aggie," Bill quipped proudly.

An apartment in Corsicana is Bill's home during weekdays, but he travels to Nacogdoches for weekends to be with his family. A move wasn't practical when there were so many graduating seniors in the family last year! Linda works part-time at Glass Castles, a stained glass studio and shop, where Bill joins her on



Saturdays. "We enjoy creating in stained glass," Bill shared. "It's therapeutic."

A career in publishing for 15 years as a magazine editor and writer also gave Bill an outlet for creativity, as well as a chance to gain experience in the private sector. "I was helping businesses evaluate communities," Bill said.

Getting to know people in Corsicana and Navarro County has been an enjoyable experience for Bill. "Everyone has been so welcoming," he enthused. "With its proximity to the Dallas/Ft. Worth Metroplex, Corsicana is an easy place to attract businesses. Hardly a day goes by that I don't hear from at least one real estate broker looking for property for a commercial client. Most want to go into existing facilities, since time to market is important."



Another plus for Corsicana and the surrounding area is Navarro College. "Compared to universities, colleges are nimble and flexible," he pointed out, adding that their mission is adult education, vocational training, supporting local businesses and economic development. In his estimation, Navarro College performs that mission well."

"The country has been experiencing tepid growth, with lots of pent-up demand," Bill related. "Once the national economy picks up, I project a steady march south down Interstates 45 and 35 from the Metroplex will begin in earnest.


Taking care of current businesses is also a top priority. "We have to help our existing businesses and industries. If there's a problem locally, we need to help fix it."





swim lessons. "For as far back as I can remember, I have always swum," she said. "I love the feel of the water, and I really love the speed when I'm swimming." While Valeria did not compete with the school's swim team at CHS, she was a senior lieutenant for the Calicos dance team. She also worked with special education students during her senior year. "Some kids can't get up and run," she said, "so for me, being an athlete is something I really appreciate in my life."

Based on her experiences working with the special education department at CHS, Valeria also excels as a swim instructor. She knows how to focus on





Caught in the Food Crosshairs

The evening ended as a memorable affair — just not the way the hostess envisioned. Within a few hours after eating, one by one, the guests began to feel ill with nausea, vomiting and diarrhea. Only those who ate the salad became sick. In looking for what might have caused this, it was discovered that the salad ingredients were chopped on the same cutting board on which the raw chicken had been prepared. In cleaning the cutting board after using it for the chicken, the cook thought a quick rinse was good enough, but it was not.

Cross-contamination of food is a public health concern. Food cross-contamination is the act of transferring germs from one object to another. Using the same cutting board in the kitchen for raw meats, bread, fruit and salads is an accident waiting to happen. To be safe, save one board for raw meats and another one for vegetables and fruits. Considering the distressing consequences, it is a relatively easy thing to do to help protect your health. Even under the strictest cleaning practices, juices from raw meat can be harbored in cracks and tiny crevices on the board. Toss a board that has too many scars on the surface. When cleaning your meat board, use hot soapy water, follow up with a disinfectant and rinse thoroughly.

The quest to avoid cross-contamination of food begins even before the food ends up in your kitchen. If you use re-usable grocery tote bags, keep them clean. In tote bags and plastic bags, try not to carry your fresh produce in the same bag you carry raw meat. In other words, don't package your hamburger meat with your tomatoes.

After rinsing your fresh produce, store it in a clean container rather than returning it to its original container. As always, wash hands thoroughly before preparing food. Another precaution is to wear gloves if you have a wound on your hand. The gloves protect you by providing a barrier to keep your wound from becoming contaminated, and they prevent germs from getting on your food. Storing eggs can be risky business. They should be kept in the original container and placed on refrigerator shelves, rather than in the egg containers on the fridge door. The constant opening and closing of the door jostles them and exposes them to fluctuating temperatures which reduces their quality.

When grilling this summer, employ the same rules you use in your kitchen. Never put cooked meat on the same plate or pan that held uncooked meat. Keep grilling utensils separate between raw food and cooked food. And remember, always wash your hands after handling raw meat. **NOW**

1 tsp. onion powder
1 Tbsp. butter
1 pkg. of 8 sesame seed
hamburger buns
Lettuce leaves
Toppings, as desired

Snickerdoodle Cookies

See low-sugar option in the instructions below.

- 1 3/4 cup sugar (divided use)
- 1 Tbsp. ground cinnamon
- 2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- I tsp. baking soda
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 8 Tbsp. unsalted butter, at room temperature 2 large eggs

I. Preheat oven to 375 F; line two baking sheets with parchment paper.

2. Combine 1/4 cup sugar (or 3 Tbsp. Splenda Sugar Blend) with cinnamon; set aside.

3. Whisk flour, baking soda and salt together.
4. Beat butter and 1 1/2 cups sugar (or 3/4 cup Splenda Sugar Blend) together on medium speed until light and fluffy, or about 3-6 minutes. Beat in eggs, individually; thoroughly mix for 30 seconds.

5. Reduce mixer speed to low; slowly add flour mixture; thoroughly mix for 30 seconds.

6. Form dough into balls 2 Tbsp. in size; roll balls into cinnamon sugar mixture.
7. Set balls 2 inches apart on baking sheets.
8. Bake one sheet at a time until edges of cookies are set and just turning brown, about 10-12 minutes. Centers will look raw.
9. Cool for 10 minutes; move cookies to wire rack; cool to room temperature.

Granny's Potato Salad

5-6 potatoes

- 3 eggs
- I Tbsp. sweet relish
- 1 Tbsp. mustard
- 2 Tbsp. Miracle Whip
- l tsp. salt
- l tsp. pepper
- 1/3 cup onion, chopped
- I. Boil potatoes until tender; drain.
- 2. Hard boil eggs; peel and chop into
- small chunks.
- 3. Mix all ingredients well; chill.

I cup fine sugar or powdered sugar


- 2 cups orange juice
