learn marksmanship training and earn qualification to shoot a rifle. Phase three is the culmination of their training, where they endure a demanding 54-hour course called The Crucible. Once recruits complete The Crucible, they are no longer called recruits, but Marines.

For workshop participants, however, the experience is condensed to an educational week. Although they aren't put through

the full experience, drill instructors put the incoming students through a normal boot camp experience as soon as they arrive. "When we got off the bus, there were yellow footprints we were supposed to follow.





And the drill instructor was yelling at us while we were lining up. Then, they taught us how to march and took us into the contraband room," he remembered. At this point, recruits had to give over any contraband before entering boot camp.

After the contraband room, recruits made one last phone call. "It's a scripted phone call. I had to yell at the top of my lungs and say, 'This is Recruit Bethel. I have arrived safely in San Diego. You will



receive written communication from me in one to two weeks. I love you. Goodbye," he said.

For the sake of the workshop, a colonel broke the boot camp intensity of the contraband room to welcome the participants. Over the course of the next several days, the participants learned about obstacle courses, military



history and more from their drill instructor, Staff Sgt. Akira Givings.

On that first day, participants were taken to a long obstacle course all recruits must complete, as well as a water survival pool, where recruits endure tests to learn how to stay alive if in a crisis in the water.

Their day finished with a lecture on military education and the Combat Fitness Test, which Karl participated in. For the fitness test, recruits must prove they are physically capable of enduring war-like scenarios. Recruits must run a half mile as fast as they can, lift a 30-pound ammo can above their heads for two minutes, run 25 yards, crawl on their bellies for 15 yards, crawl on their hands and knees for another 15 yards, then run zigzag for another 15 yards. After that, recruits then pick up another

recruit who is lying on the ground and carry him on their shoulders back to where they started. Two ammo cans are waiting for the recruit. He must pick them up, run 60 yards, then pick up a hand grenade and accurately hit a target. After that, they must do three push-ups, pick up the ammo cans again and race back 60 yards. The goal is to complete all of this in two-and-a-half minutes.

The next day, Karl and the rest of the group traveled to Marine Corps Air Station Miramar, where Top Gun was filmed. "We were told if anyone stationed at Miramar mentions the movie or recites. a line from it, they're fined \$5, because they don't want to be known for the movie," Karl laughed. While there, the students saw B-22 Osprey and F-18s. "We were on the flight deck, and these planes were taxiing and taking off every which way. It was really cool," he explained.

Afterward, participants heard from female Marines. "We had a great conversation with them about being a woman in the Marines. They talked about the opportunities they have there. Right now, the Marine Corps is comprised of 9-percent females, so they are wanting to increase that number," he shared. In addition, the group learned about the vast number of educational opportunities offered to the Marines. "There are over 700 jobs in the Marine Corp. Many Marines get their bachelor and master's degrees, while on active duty, for free, because the Marines pay for it," he explained.

Students went to Camp Pendleton the following day to shoot rifles. Recruits learn how to shoot from 100, 200, 300 and 500 yards. The students also experienced a small part of The Crucible. "The Crucible is a 54-hour event, where recruits only get four hours of sleep a

night. They are only given three meals to last them the whole 54 hours. They participate in hikes and activities to test leadership, strength and teamwork. At the end, there's an insane hill they have to go up with 60-pound packs. Afterward, they come up to this plateau, where the drill instructor talks to them about the Marine Corps and the honor in becoming a Marine. That's when they're called a Marine and are given their eagle, globe and anchor," Karl explained. The students participated in a few of the leadership activities recruits undergo during The Crucible.

On their last day, the workshop students and drill instructors celebrated with an awards ceremony. "Everyone was given certificates of completion, but I got the Gung Ho Award," he smiled. "I tried to do everything they offered to us, and since they had made me the 'guide' for the week, I had to keep up with everybody. I wasn't expecting to get it!"

Karl learned a number of valuable lessons during his time at MCRD San Diego. "The Marine Corps has their core beliefs and history, which they instill at every opportunity. And I think that's something that we need to be doing, too," he shared. "It's also encouraged me to offer students the option of going into the military. The military wants our top students because of the sophisticated work they do."

Leaving MCRD San Diego, Karl felt deep admiration for the military personnel whom he had met. "I had a strengthened sense of pride in our country. What they do with these recruits is incredible," he shared. "They take them and make them into a powerful unit. We have quality people in the Marines taking care of business." NOW

have both been with MCT since its infancy and plan to stick around for many years to come. "It's such a great community-focused group to be a part of," Heather remarked. The program's primary focus is reaching the community. Each year, they produce seasonal shows that are all open-audition style, as well as operate an educational-based summer camp for kids from grades three to 12. Camp is a two-week period where a group of about 20-30 kids work tirelessly each day learning, perfecting and ultimately performing a production. "The best thing about the camps is the amount of time we all spend together," Brandon said. "We end up being very family-like because of the relationships that are built. It's a really amazing experience to be a part of and to witness."

With titles such as Grease, Aladdin Ir., Cheaper by the Dozen and Steel Magnolias, individuals in the acting program demonstrate a wide range of ability and impressive scope of genre diversity. The beauty of the whole process is sharing the passion for and of acting. This sharing has had an impacting trickle-down effect, too. Some of the kids who were campers have returned to help conduct the camps. "It's exciting to see our kids come back to do things like choreography," Heather shared.

Both Heather and Brandon became involved with acting in relatively the same way via Marty Fredrick at First United Methodist Church and Walnut Ridge Baptist Church in Mansfield. Marty is credited as the one who encouraged



them both to pursue the stage. While Heather did not act in high school, she did in church productions and continued to dabble during college. She also remained in close contact with Marty during this time, helping with current productions and teaching here and there for the Art Institute of Mansfield, where Marty directed. Before long, Heather graduated from college and began her career as a middle school teacher, but she continued to be involved with AIM and Marty. MCT had been

created in the midst of this, and Heather was asked to come on staff to work specifically with children.

Six years later, Heather serves as secretary on the MCT board, as well as the educational coordinator and one





of the co-directors. This requires her to teach and direct, as well as decide and plan productions. Her job also entails heading up the summer camps and acting in the organization's various performances. However, she does not act alone. The other co-director, Chad Nichols, is her professional other half. Together the two have agreed to never take on a children's show alone ever! In addition to her work behind the scenes, Heather has performed in countless shows and has been acting

for a total of 17 years. "I do what I do because of my love for theater," she said, "but also because of my love of people and kids."

Brandon was young when he became involved with MCT, and Heather actually worked as his acting coach for many years. She has watched him grow and evolve over the years, while helping him develop and master his craft. "I am moved when I watch him in action," Heather said. When Brandon takes the stage, it's obvious to see he is at home.

To Brandon, acting is more than just an enjoyable hobby. "For me," he said, "acting is my life, my passion." In his lifelong experience, Brandon has been in a total of 14 performances with MCT and over 60 in his career, ranging from comedy to drama to musicals. His favorite of all these, though, was his most recent performance in *Cheaper by the Dozen* in which he played Frank. The role was a perfect opportunity for him to exhibit his ability to be serious and funny at the same time.

"He was simply amazing!" Heather enthused. "For an actor to be able to seamlessly move back and forth from humor to such seriousness is absolutely amazing."

terminal illness, something Heather had personally dealt with in her own life. "I was able to show such a gratitude for life by playing the role of Shelby even though she dies. I was there to tell a story and portray a beautiful message because of her character."

While Brandon enjoys drama, he also appreciates those works with a nice blending of comedy and drama, because "life is both." Without a mixture of both tragedy and comedic relief. life wouldn't be much fun, and that's the beauty of drama. This genre gives Brandon the perfect opportunities to exercise his acting dexterity and employ his instinctive ability to read a role and pull together the character. On the other hand, Heather prefers musicals, because they offer society a type of hope since they are uplifting and usually fun. "The society in which we live needs to be given hope and encouragement," she said, "and I want to give that back. I can do that through acting and directing."

When it comes to meaning in life, people seek out those things that help them grow as an individual, provide them with pleasurable experiences and result in a sense of both gratitude and pride. 

Andrea smiled. "As much as we love it, our house is really about family and all the people around it."

The first floor is largely dedicated to an open kitchen flanked by a breakfast nook on one side and a slightly formal dining area on the other, all facing an enormous great room. Custom floors are tiled in large squares of heavy porcelain, and the kitchen is essentially one long wall of cream-colored, chocolate-glazed custom cabinetry with granite countertops, stainless steel appliances, travertine backsplash and a built-in desk. 

"She wouldn't go meet people, but put her on the softball field, and she would shine," she smiled.














college games." Because Baylea only had a verbal agreement with TWU, moving over to A&M-Commerce was no problem.


The nautical theme doesn't stop with home design either. We have been seeing this trend transition into fashion for quite


















# Advantages of Being Over 50?

It is of some consolation to now be eligible for discounts for movies, travel and hotel expenses, as well as being able to order off the senior menu at the local café. There are some additional significant financial incentives for the over 50 set.

Beginning at age 50, you are permitted to make "catch up contributions" to your 401(k) and individual retirement accounts. In 2014, we're allowed to contribute an extra \$5,500 for a total of \$23,000 to our 401(k) or 403(b). IRA contributions can be \$6,500 or \$1,000 more than permitted for our junior workers. Estimates are that only about half of those eligible take advantage of the provision.

At age 55, if you retire, quit or are laid off, you may make withdrawals from your 401(k) without the 10 percent penalty (age 50 for public safety personnel). Prior to rolling your 401(k) into an IRA, you need to decide whether you will need access to these funds. Some 401(k)s allow for in-service withdrawals after a certain age. Your particular case will be detailed in your plan document or check with your plan administrator.

You are also eligible at age 55 to make an additional contribution to a Health Savings Account (HSA), if applicable. That is an extra \$1,000 for 2014. These funds may be used for

health-related expenses, now or later in life. Funds in an HSA have more advantages later, if they are not needed or used for health purposes now.

At age 59 1/2, you may start making withdrawals, penalty free, from most retirement accounts. If you are still working, max out contributions to your 401(k), since you can withdrawal funds tomorrow, if circumstances change. You are also exempt from the rule that requires funds converted to a Roth IRA to remain in place for five years.


You are permitted to withdrawal funds from your Health Savings Account (HSA) for nonmedical reasons without the 20 percent penalty, once you reach age 65. Of course, you will pay your ordinary tax rate on such withdrawals.

At Age 70 1/2, mandatory withdrawals begin to be an annual requirement. It has been allowed in the past to transfer funds from an IRA directly to a charity, but so far this provision has not been renewed for 2014.

# Caught in the Food Crosshairs

The evening ended as a memorable affair — just not the way the hostess envisioned. Within a few hours after eating, one by one, the guests began to feel ill with nausea, vomiting and diarrhea. Only those who ate the salad became sick. In looking for what might have caused this, it was discovered that the salad ingredients were chopped on the same cutting board on which the raw chicken had been prepared. In cleaning the cutting board after using it for the chicken, the cook thought a quick rinse was good enough, but it was not.

Cross-contamination of food is a public health concern. Food cross-contamination is the act of transferring germs from one object to another. Using the same cutting board in the kitchen for raw meats, bread, fruit and salads is an accident waiting to happen. To be safe, save one board for raw meats and another one for vegetables and fruits. Considering the distressing consequences, it is a relatively easy thing to do to help protect your health. Even under the strictest cleaning practices, juices from raw meat can be harbored in cracks and tiny crevices on the board. Toss a board that has too many scars on the surface. When cleaning your meat board, use hot soapy water, follow up with a disinfectant and rinse thoroughly.

The quest to avoid cross-contamination of food begins even before the food ends up in your kitchen. If you use re-usable grocery tote bags, keep them clean. In tote bags and plastic bags, try not to carry your fresh produce in the same bag you carry raw meat. In other words, don't package your hamburger meat with your tomatoes.

After rinsing your fresh produce, store it in a clean container rather than returning it to its original container. As always, wash hands thoroughly before preparing food. Another precaution is to wear gloves if you have a wound on your hand. The gloves protect you by providing a barrier to keep your wound from becoming contaminated, and they prevent germs from getting on your food. Storing eggs can be risky business. They should be kept in the original container and placed on refrigerator shelves, rather than in the egg containers on the fridge door. The constant opening and closing of the door jostles them and exposes them to fluctuating temperatures which reduces their quality.

When grilling this summer, employ the same rules you use in your kitchen. Never put cooked meat on the same plate or pan that held uncooked meat. Keep grilling utensils separate between raw food and cooked food. And remember, always wash your hands after handling raw meat.







# In the Kitchen With Micheal Cupples

A librarian, mother, wife and down-home cook, Micheal Cupples knows the importance of cooking. "I'm a good Southern girl, so cooking plays into almost every aspect of my life. Happy, sad, good or bad times, food is always a huge part," she shared. "Cooking is one of the ways I express myself, and it's definitely one of the ways I express love for my family."

When she got married, her father-in-law even put together a cookbook of family recipes through several generations. "He interviewed all the grandmas, aunties and cousins and gathered all kinds of great family recipes from both sides of the family. Lots of those people are gone now, but their treasured recipes remain with me."

#### **Chicken Bacon Ranch Salad**

- I head romaine lettuce
- 1 cucumber, peeled, sliced and quartered
- 1 container grape tomatoes, sliced in halves
- 1 1/2 cups sharp cheddar cheese, shredded
- 1/2 to 3/4 cup bacon bits
- 2 rotisserie chicken breasts, chopped
- I cup Hidden Valley Light Ranch Dressing
- 1/2 cup Paula Deen's Sugar Free BBQ Sauce
- **I.** Wash, dry and chop lettuce. Add to salad bowl or platter. Top with cucumber and tomatoes. Layer cheese, bacon bits and chicken on top of salad.
- **2.** In a separate bowl, mix ranch dressing with BBQ sauce. Add to salad and serve.

#### Not-so-plain BBQ Chicken

6 6-oz. chicken breasts Salt and pepper, to taste

1 bell pepper, sliced

- 1 onion, sliced
- I tsp. coconut oil
- 6 Tbsp. Paula Deen's Sugar Free BBQ Sauce (divided use)
- 6 Tbsp. bacon bits (divided use)
- 1 1/2 cups cheddar cheese, shredded (divided use)
- I. Preheat oven to 350 F.
- **2.** Season chicken with salt and pepper. Place chicken in skillet and grill for 10-15 minutes. Place skillet in oven for 15-20 minutes to ensure that they are fully cooked.
- **3.** While chicken is grilling, sauté bell pepper and onion in coconut oil until both are tender. Divide into 6 servings.

**4.** Place grilled chicken on a lined baking sheet. Top each breast with BBQ sauce, I tsp. bacon bits, I/4 cup cheese and I serving of bell pepper/onion mix. Bake 15-20 minutes.

#### Chicken Alfredo Lasagna

- 1 15-oz. tub ricotta cheese
- 2 tsp. Italian seasoning
- 1 tsp. basil
- 2 tsp. garlic salt
- 2 cups Italian-blend cheese, shredded (divided use)
- 2 rotisserie chicken breasts, cooked and chopped
- 1 15-oz. jar light Alfredo sauce
- 3 zucchinis
- **1.** In a bowl, mix first 4 ingredients with 1 cup Italian blend cheese; mix well.
- **2.** In another bowl, mix chicken and Alfredo sauce. Mix well.
- **3.** Cut both ends off the zucchinis, cut through the middle, then slice thinly long ways. Spray a 9x9-inch baking dish with cooking spray; layer some of zucchini on the bottom. Top with a layer of chicken and sauce mixture. Place another layer of zucchini on top. Top with a layer of ricotta mixture. Continue layering until ingredients are gone. Top with remaining cheese and bake for 45 minutes; uncover last 15 minutes. Serve.

#### Cheese "Crackers"

- 2 slices Kraft Deli Deluxe 2% cheese slices
- 1 Tbsp. favorite seasoning
- **1.** Divide each cheese slice into 9 pieces and place on parchment paper. This is very important because the cheese will stick if not on parchment. Top with seasoning of choice.
- **2.** Microwave for 65 seconds. Great with favorite salsa or guacamole!
