



Envision a long line of American flags, the red and white stripes gently flowing in the wind. Imagine the sound of hundreds of motorcycle engines revving and roaring in unison as they move in tandem, the ultimate patriotic procession. Sympathize with a family, standing proud and honored as they say their final goodbyes to their beloved fallen. Feel the reverence abound as the significant presence and purpose of the Patriot Guard Riders is realized — their mission, once again, successfully accomplished.

The Patriot Guard Riders is a nationwide nonprofit organization that was formed in 2005 when a group of individuals planned to protest funerals of fallen U.S. warriors. The goal was to prevent the tarnishing of fallen soldiers' memories by acting as a shield at funeral services. The idea was a popular one that reached the hearts of many, and eventually, despite meager beginnings, the organization grew to thousands of members with chapters in every state of the country.

Although the PGR is comprised primarily of motorcycle riders and military Veterans, these are not requirements for membership. Additionally, there are no registration fees or monthly dues. The only requirement is to possess a profound respect for the military and warriors who serve our country. Three members who share this respect, and a love for motorcycles are Mike Lowthorp. Ted Waldron and

motorcycles, are Mike Lowthorp, Ted Waldron and Mike Lambert.

In his youth, Mike "Mad Dog" Lowthorp, a
Mansfield resident and motorcycle shop owner, had
aspirations to become an Army man. He enlisted
to make a career for himself but, unfortunately,
suffered a severe knee injury that forced him
out after only eight months. So, he redirected
his life and began a career in the retail
automotive industry. Nearly 25 years later,
he then became an insurance adjuster,
which led him to the PGR. On a

which led him to the PGR. On a business trip, a friend told him about the group. Mad Dog was instantly intrigued, and after a little research, he joined in 2013. The chance to once again practice and demonstrate his deep patriotism thrilled him.

Mad Dog is a general member, meaning he rides his 2006 Harley Ultra Classic and stands in flag lines at Honor Missions. Initially, he joined because he wanted to act as a protective buffer at military funeral services, but over the years, it has grown into something much



more meaningful to the tall, brawny man. "Many families have no idea their loved one was a hero. When they see us, they realize how important that person was," he said.

Another Mansfield resident and current PGR ride captain is Ted "Coal Miner" Waldron. In the 1960s, he joined the Marine Corps and attained the rank



of gunnery sergeant while working as a weather forecaster. As a Vietnam Veteran, he experienced many painful occurrences, including poor treatment from his fellow Americans. "I returned home during an unpopular time. We were told not to wear our uniforms in public, because it was so bad," Coal Miner recalled. "We were treated with no respect."

However, Coal Miner's pride and beliefs were unshaken, and he then joined the Air Force, where he earned the rank of chief master sergeant and worked as a civil engineer for another 19 years. From these experiences, he learned well



the definition of camaraderie, as well as what it meant to serve his country. When he joined the PGR in 2013, Coal Miner once again had the chance to experience close relationships, as well as pay his respects to those who had risked everything by being in the military. "The



public's support of veterans and activeduty military has changed a complete 180 from what it used to be," he stated. "That's wonderful to see."

As ride captain, Coal Miner shoulders much of the responsibility for ensuring PGR members have the necessary information for missions in the area. "I coordinate with funeral homes, the family and the military. I search online and in newspaper articles to get the information I need to ensure everything is done," he explained. Atop his 2012







Can-Am Spyder trike, Coal Miner essentially leads the way, demonstrating his deep respect and pride, and assisting the Riders one mission at a time.

Mike "Gunner" Lambert, a former Mansfield resident, joined in 2008 as a general member. He rode on missions and stood in flag lines, but when he saw the opportunity to do more, he stepped up and became a ride captain. After two years, he once again took a higher rank as assistant state captain only to become the state captain another two years later. Now, he is the regional ride captain for the South/Central States.

Gunner rides a 2013 Stallion, a threewheeled motorcycle made exclusively in Texas. He also serves the PGR by overseeing the day-to-day operations in the Texas, Oklahoma, Kansas, Missouri and Arkansas regions. With a 22-year Navy career under his belt, the former combat search and rescue Vietnam veteran knows what it means to be a strong, fair leader. "The biggest thrill for me is working with riders and being in the position where I always feel like a proud parent," Gunner said. "All of these people are working for the same thing a smile or a pat on the back."

"I consider that our pay," Coal Miner added.

In honorable and sincere ways, the PGR gives dignity to those who have suffered and sacrificed for the nation's safety. As volunteers, not a single member is paid a penny for the missions they help execute. Missions include: funeral, memorial, internment and visitation services for veteran and

Like father, like son(s)

A strong sense of family has helped guide Munir, Mark and Roger E. Bishara to success in their careers and lives

he patriarch is a noted pediatrician who has treated roughly 15,000 children over a stellar career in North Texas. Among the offspring, one is a chip off the physician block, a celebrated and popular plastic surgeon. The other is a local attorney who consistently makes life better for a clientele roster that includes athletes and entertainers. All that noted, what they've accomplished is simply a reflection of who they are.

They are the Bisharas.

Specifically, they are father Munir and sons Mark and Roger. And while June 21st was the official day to celebrate one's relationship with their father, the Bisharas get to celebrate it practically every time the three men unite.

That happened again recently, and the celebration manifested in the telling of tales and in the trading of jokes and in more than a few warm smiles. Apparently, smiling is a trait that was passed from generation to generation.

The sons say the dad gets credit for that – as well as for setting all manner of examples of how a man should be. Munir Bishara is the sturdy trunk from which the branches sprouted, and it's easy to see how his success begat theirs.

He began to pursue medicine in Beirut in the early 1960s, and though he is officially retired now after some 35 years practicing at various Dallas medical centers, he hasn't stopped taking care of young patients. "I still fill in for some of my old colleagues when they go on vacation," Munir said with a gleeful smile. "I practice medicine about a month each year, if you add up all the times I fill in. It's something I truly love doing, so I hope to continue to doing it as long as I can."

Munir is now three generations into treating some families, as patients he met when they were children have brought him not only their children but their grandchildren to "make well."

Munir's passion to enhance people's lives was passed to Mark – even if the son has charted his own medical course. His practice, The Paragon Plastic Surgery & Med Spa, has grown to feature three offices – in Mansfield, Southlake and a new location in North Park. From each he helps both men and women realize potential they might not have recognized they have, through cosmetic and corrective surgery, hair restoration and invigorating spa treatments.

"When you can make positive differences in someone's

life, it's very gratifying," Mark said. "I also like the balance of being able to do so many things. I'm doing something different every day."

Roger is doing something different, as well – at least different from that for which the other two Bisharas are known. His law office at 2000 E. Lamar Blvd. specializes in corporate matters and contracts, especially with regards to entertainment law. As noted, he has clients from both the entertainment and athletic realms, helping make sure they have a legal compass to steer their careers in a successful direction.

"I started by handling the business end of Mark's practice," Roger said. "I liked the notion of helping others establish successful careers, and the practice more or less took off from there."

For all the three Bisharas have accomplished, it wouldn't be accurate to call theirs a "men's only" club. In fact, they said, Munir's wife Linda – Mom to Mark and Roger – deserves much of the credit for their collective success.

"She's the boss," Mark said. "She grew up on a dairy farm and had next to nothing. She wore burlap

sack dresses, literally. So she has a real appreciation of the wonderful life our family has today, and she's helped teach us to appreciate what we have, as well."

What the Bisharas have, among the many accomplishments and professional successes, is a family dynamic that serves as a model for others. And that's worth celebrating, regardless of the date on the calendar.

active duty deaths, as well as medal, dedication and memorial ceremonies. They also participate in both send-off and welcome-home functions, as well as Wounded Warrior home dedications. "Seeing the family members' faces and the appreciation they have for us makes the whole experience for each mission," Mad Dog stated.

In the past year, both Coal Miner and Mad Dog have ridden in about 15 missions in Mansfield. Coal Miner has coordinated nine in Mansfield alone. In total, the trio, in some capacity, has been a part of the hundreds of missions in the North Texas Region. According to them, it's truly a moving experience witnessing so many compatriots come together for a common purpose. "You eventually begin to wear your emotions on your sleeve," Gunner said.

"We all wear dark glasses, too. There's a lot of allergies out there," Coal Miner smiled.

Patriotism is defined as devotion to one's country. This is demonstrated through actions deeply rooted in culture, respect and honor. These actions range from flying an American flag to saluting veterans and active duty military members or riding with the Patriot Guard Riders. No matter the action, it's the reason behind it that matters most. When Mad Dog, Coal Miner and Gunner do what they do, it's undeniable why. With an exceptional appreciation for the military and an unwavering respect for fallen heroes, they prove their patriotism one ride at a time. **NOW**

Diving, however, was not the only challenge this Finnish student wanted to experience. "I wanted to cross the Atlantic Ocean to learn about a different culture and experience how people in the United States lived," Antti explained. He and his family found a student exchange organization, AFS, online and filled out the required paperwork. Since Antti was diving successfully in about five competitions a year in Finland, he hoped he would be assigned to an American host family that would be supportive of his diving.

Such a match was in the making in Mansfield. Jeremy and Annette Agor had made a decision to open their home to a foreign exchange student, so their 8-year-old son, Colin, would be exposed to another part of the world. "Colin has always wanted a sibling, and he's been diving for two years. After receiving information from AFS about Antti, we talked overnight about inviting him to come and decided to take a chance and do so, because we have the mutual diving interest. It's worked out well," Jeremy recalled. "Antti's a good sport. We drag him around to a lot of 8-year-old stuff, and he's very patient and methodical with Colin in helping him to learn more about diving."

"My life in Mansfield is much busier than in Finland," Antti admitted. However, he is accustomed to the

older brother role, since he has a younger brother in Finland who has also tried his hand in diving.

"Colin has learned a lot about diving from Antti. The first time Colin went off a board was at his tryout. It's been interesting having an experienced diver around," Jeremy stated. Antti's diving accomplishments this past year reveal that prior training and the personal progress he has made this past year. He earned an All-American qualifying score and his varsity letter, and he was named to the All-State Honorable Mention Team.

Whether in diving season or not, Antti stays fit by doing dry land training, which includes exercises for his abs and back so he can accomplish the necessary twists in dives. He also practices on trampolines and does a lot of leg exercises in order to build strength. In the water, Antti has discovered the ease that the bubble machine creates. "It breaks the surface











of the water, so divers don't get hurt so much," he revealed.

Antti's command of the English language has been very helpful in his studies. In Finland, students start learning English in the third grade at 9 years of age and, additionally, they learn Swedish and German. However, he did experience some challenges. "Everything here is bigger — like the school, for instance. Mansfield High School has about 2,000 students, and there are five high schools in Mansfield. In Finland, my city's one high school has about 800 students," Antti explained. "But everybody here is so nice all the time. In Finland, people focus more on their own lives and are more nonsocial," he added.

As a 17-year-old junior this past year, Antti had to adapt to school in the United States and keep up with daily diving practices, while still fitting in time to make new friends, participate in activities with his host family and practice his other passions of pencil sketching and photography. "I like working in pencil since I can always erase it," he said. He also likes to create graffiti-like drawings. "There are no rules — it's total freedom, so I can use my imagination and draw some incredible stuff that has meaning," Antti explained.

Music had been a part of Antti's life in Finland. He played drums in his Finnish school's band and plays the guitar for fun. "I was just an average musician, so I quit playing, since I wanted to focus on diving," he explained.

Antti arrived in Mansfield last August, and he will return to Finland in time to enjoy weekends of relaxation at his family's summer cottage. He will be a junior again in Finland, but the Agors are planning a trip to Finland to see his high school graduation. 

ceramic figures and a plethora of other mediums throughout the house by artists from all over the country, including local artist Eddie Phillips. "Angela's buying philosophy is if you find something you love, buy it, and you'll find a place for it," Dru grinned. "We find a lot of things we love."

Therefore, almost every square inch of wall space is occupied by something truly unique. Despite how much they own, the couple can recall the name of and purchase location for each piece. Camryn Samuel knows man's best friend can be a girl's best friend, too. An active 10-yearold, she loves playing outside with her friends, and her favorite subject at school is P.E. Dogs have always fit her lifestyle well. "Most people say they love dogs just because they're really cute, but I think it's because I like to be active, and playing with my dog is so much fun," Camryn said. 'We like to run around the backyard with Colby." Colby is the family's Vizsla pointer. In September, they lost Camryn's lifelong friend, Bo, the family's Schnauzer. 'We had him all my life, since he was a puppy," Camryn said.

When Camryn's 10th birthday neared, her mother, Kristen, suggested she donate money to a charity in lieu of gifts. Camryn liked the idea, and naturally, she decided she wanted to help dogs. "I was reading a book, and it had a story in it about a girl who did something really close to this," Camryn remembered. "I thought it was a really good idea, so we researched, and we decided to do Camryn's K9s." Camryn's K9s is a charity Camryn started to raise money to buy bulletproof vests for

police dogs. The dogs wear these vests when on duty, just like police officers, to keep them safe. "I've raised over \$5,000 so far, and I have enough money for at least six vests," she said. "Each vest costs at least \$700."

Camryn raises money in a variety of ways. This spring, she sold cookies shaped like paw prints as well as T-shirts. She also hosts fundraising events and uses her Facebook page to promote her cause. Every other week, she collects funds from donation jars set up at places like Creature Comforts Animal Clinic, Belinda's Pet Salon and Jo-Ed's Bombers sandwich shop. "It was kind of hard to do at first because I had never done anything like it. But it got easier and easier," Camryn admitted. "Now, I'm just used to having it in my schedule and doing all the work."

When Camryn raises enough funds to buy a vest, she delivers the money to a local police department, so they can order a vest for one of the dogs. "It has gone way beyond my expectations," Camryn said. "When we learned that the vest was not part of the dog's uniform, we were just going to donate to one dog. Then, we found out there were two dogs in Cedar Hill, where we first started. We didn't think it was fair to just do one, so we did both." In the first week, they had raised about half the donations needed to purchase the first vest. So far, Camryn has purchased vests for the Cedar Hill K9 Unit dogs, Titus and Ranger. She has also provided vests for Riko and Blade from the Ellis County Sheriff's Department,



and she has just finished raising funds for the dogs from the Mansfield Police Department, Bandit and Oso. The dogs in Waxahachie are next on her list.

Camryn believes it's important to protect police dogs because they do so much to protect us. "If the officers are going to inspect a building and there's crime inside, they have to bring the dogs in," Camryn said. "If the person doing the crime has weapons, it's really dangerous for the dogs to go in there." According to Camryn, protecting the dogs is the least we can do. "They put their lives in front of everyone, especially the officers," she said. "They go in for the officers, and they risk their lives for every single person." Camryn's statistics say 15 police dogs have been killed in the line of duty in the state of Texas, and three dogs have been killed since she started Camryn's K9s in September 2014. "One was stabbed, and the other two were shot," she said. "The vests are made so if they get stabbed or shot there, it's not going to hurt them."

Camryn's parents, Kristen and Bobby, and her sister, Cailyn, couldn't be more proud of what Camryn has accomplished. "When she brought this



idea up, I was a little shocked, because I had never thought of the dogs wearing bulletproof vests," Kristen remembered. "You think of the human officers, but not the dogs." Kristen assumed a charity like that already existed in the North Texas area. 

of hours. Because color can greatly influence mood, and since children are typically drawn to bright, bold colors, compromising on paint selections is crucial.

Take into consideration the size of the room. Lighter shades of blue, teal, purple and green can open up a smaller space, whereas darker, richer tones like plum, magenta, burnt orange and ruby can be overpowering, making the space feel even smaller and cramped. Lighting is another factor to consider. Natural light will show the truest color, whereas incandescent and florescent lighting will cast hues on the color, altering its appearance. 




Accessories























or curtain rods. Jerseys could easily be transformed into curtain panels or bedding. The trick is to be creative and allow your child the power of choice when picking accessories for their new space.





Women Business Owners Need Retirement Plans

If you're a woman who owns a business, you've got plenty of company. In fact, women own more than 10 million U.S. companies, and women-owned businesses account for about 40 percent of all privately held firms in the U.S., according to the Center for Women's Business Research. Clearly, the good news is that women like you are entering the small-business arena at a rapid pace. 
One way to help close this savings gap, of course, is to set up a retirement plan for your business. But for many women business owners (and male owners, too), the perceived cost of setting up and running a retirement plan has been an obstacle. However, the retirement plan market has opened up considerably for small business owners over the past several years, so you might be surprised at the ease and inexpensiveness of administering a quality plan that can help you build resources for your own retirement — and help you attract and retain good employees.

With the help of a financial professional, you can consider some of the myriad of plans that may be available to you:

- Owner-only 401(k) This plan, which is also known as an individual 401(k), is
 available to self-employed individuals and business owners with no full-time employees
 other than themselves or a spouse. You may even be able to choose a Roth option for
 your 401(k), which allows you to make after-tax contributions that can grow tax-free.
- SEP IRA If you have just a few employees or are self-employed with no employees, you may want to consider a SEP IRA. You'll fund the plan with tax-deductible contributions, and you must cover all eligible employees.
- Solo defined benefit plan Pension plans, also known as defined benefit plans, are still around — and you can set one up for yourself if you are self-employed or own your own business. This plan has high contribution limits, which are determined by an actuarial calculation, and as is the case with other retirement plans, your contributions are typically tax-deductible.
- SIMPLE IRA A SIMPLE IRA, as its name suggests, is easy to set up and maintain, and it can be a good plan if your business has fewer than 10 employees. Still, while a SIMPLE IRA may be advantageous for your employees, it's less generous to you, as far as allowable contributions, than an owner-only 401(k), a SEP IRA or a defined benefit plan.

As a business owner, you spend a lot of time thinking about what needs to be done today. But you don't want to forget about tomorrow, so consider putting a retirement plan to work for you soon.

Urinary Incontinence

Actresses Kirstie Alley and Whoopi Goldberg, using their comedic talents, have helped to make bladder leakage an acceptable topic for conversation. However, if you have urinary incontinence, it's no laughing matter. Urinary incontinence is the involuntary loss of bladder control. This inability to control the leakage of urine could be as minor as a small amount of leakage of urine escaping with a sneeze or cough to an uncontrollable urge to urinate and not be able to make it to the bathroom in time.

Depending upon the cause, this condition might be temporary or chronic. It can also occur from several sources at the same time. Some of the more common causes are pregnancy, prostate concerns, neurological disorders, age and weight. Hormones from pregnancy can weaken the pelvic floor support and cause the muscles to weaken. As the uterus grows, it will press against the bladder. If the sphincter muscles which hold the urine in are weak, leakage can occur. Treatment from prostate cancer can affect the ability to control urination. With neurological disorders, there can be a disruption of the nerves that control bladder function. Age-related changes could be attributed to a decline in the function of the bladder muscle. It's important to note that age does not cause incontinence but can predispose one to the condition. Extra weight can press down on the bladder, causing urine to leak with a sudden forced movement such as a sneeze, cough or laughter.

Urinary incontinence can also be affected by some drinks and medications, such as caffeinated drinks and diuretics.

If you suffer from urinary incontinence, it is important to keep yourself as clean and dry as possible to avoid rashes, open wounds and infections. Use barrier creams or ointments such as Vaseline, Desitin, cocoa butter or something similar to protect your skin from urine. If incontinence cannot be completely contained by medical or pharmaceutical means, protective gear such as pads or the use of catheters may be used.

Diagnosis and treatment will depend on what type of incontinence you have. Stress incontinence occurs with pressure on the abdomen. Urge incontinence, or overactive bladder, is when there is a strong urge to urinate followed by loss of bladder control. Overflow incontinence is a bladder that doesn't empty properly, resulting in dribbling of urine. If you are unable to get to the toilet because of physical or mental impairment, you have functional incontinence.

Urinary incontinence can be very distressing on one's social and personal life. However, check with your doctor to eliminate any underlying conditions that may precipitate the problem and ease your distress. NOW























In the Kitchen With Lesa Pamplin

Originally from Louisiana, her favorite and most flavorful dishes involve seafood, including: gumbo, étouffée and jambalaya. Cajun cuisine is her specialty and her version of comfort food. "I mainly cook for close family and friends," she explained. In addition to monthly Soul Food Sundays with the family, Lesa also cooks for the Dallas Cowboys tailgate parties she hosts. Not only does her food bring others delight, but preparing it gives Lesa the chance to unwind and enjoy time with those she loves.

Seafood Gumbo

Roux:

2 cups cooking oil2 cups all-purpose flour

Gumbo:

2 5-lb. bags chicken drumettes1 8-oz. container Tony Chachere's

Original Creole Seasoning

20 qts. water

3 bay leaves

2 large yellow onions, chopped

7 bunches parsley

8 green onions, chopped

3 celery stalks, chopped

10 jalapeño peppers, chopped

10 banana peppers, chopped

5 3-lb. pkgs. Eckrich smoked sausage, sliced

2 bags 30- to 50-count shrimp, peeled and deveined 10 to 12 crab legs

1. For roux: In a cast-iron skillet, add 2 cups of cooking oil and heat. Add flour, stirring continuously until dark-colored. Set aside.

I. For gumbo: Preheat oven to 375 E. Liberally season chicken with Creole seasoning, to taste. Bake for approximately 35 minutes. Once chicken is partially baked, turn broiler to low to lightly brown. Set aside.

2. In a 40-qt. pot, add water, bay leaves and half the container of Creole seasoning. Bring to a boil. Add roux, making sure to stir well.

3. Add all vegetables and sausage. Stir well. Cook for 30 minutes over medium heat.

4. Add chicken and some juice from baking process. Cook for 20 minutes.

5. Add shrimp and crab legs; cook for 15 minutes. Serve over rice and enjoy!

Beer Can Chicken

1 5-lb. whole chicken

3 Tbsp. olive oil Kickin' Chicken Finger Lickin' Spice Blend, to taste (may substitute spice blend of your choice)

1 12-oz. can beer, any brand

I. Remove giblets and any other internal parts of chicken; discard.

2. Thoroughly wash the outside and cavity of the chicken; pat dry the chicken with paper towels.

3. Preheat the oven to 350 F Rub entire outside of chicken with olive oil. Generously sprinkle spice blend both inside and outside of chicken.

4. Place opened beer can upright inside cavity of chicken; place on a baking sheet on the lowest oven rack.

5. Roast for 1 hour and 45 minutes to 2 hours, or until chicken is brown and crispy on the outside. The internal temperature should reach about 180 F when a meat thermometer is inserted into thickest part of the thigh.

6. Carefully remove the pan from the oven; let chicken stand for about 20 minutes. Use kitchen tongs and oven mitts to gently remove the beer can from the chicken; discard can. Slice and serve the chicken as desired.

Fried Ribs

3 slabs of ribs, about 2-3 lbs. each
Tony Chachere's Original Creole
Seasoning, to taste
Black pepper, to taste
I 15-oz. bottle Heinz yellow mustard
6 cups canola oil

1. Cut ribs individually. Season with Creole seasoning and black pepper.

2. Place ribs in a large bowl or long baking dish. Squeeze all but 3 oz. of mustard over the ribs. Using your hands, massage the ribs until they are well-covered with the mustard.

3. Allow the ribs to marinate 4 to 6 hours or overnight. Remove ribs and let stand for 1 hour. Add remaining 3 oz. of mustard prior to frying.


4. In a deep fryer or cast-iron skillet, heat oil to 300 F; fry ribs until thoroughly browned.
