



His success in the water includes a strong showing against some swimmers from Southern Methodist University in the Winter Speedo Nationals at Texas A&M University. In fact, if he chooses to swim in college, A&M is his choice of schools. However, the sports powersthat-be may have other plans for Levi. He could find himself playing baseball at McLennan Community College in Waco next season — or he could even be riding a bus in the minor league system of some major league baseball team.

Levi has been playing baseball since he was 5 years old and pitching since he was 9. The first time he pitched, he threw a complete four-inning game. At age 14, he was playing against 18-year-olds in select ball.

He is still a standout player who admits baseball is his favorite sport. He joined the Indians varsity team as a junior and as a senior became one of the state's most feared pitchers. "Every time I walk out on the mound at Richards Park, I get chills," he said. "There's really no place I'd rather be."

He pitched a no-hitter against Whitehouse, one of the state's top teams in Class 5A, early in the season. A week later, he threw a one-hitter against another top squad, Waco Robinson.

The right-hander has a fastball with a top speed of 93 miles per hour. His repertoire also includes a wicked curve and changeup. And when he's the one at the plate, he's one very dangerous hitter, batting third in the lineup. "He's obviously a talented athlete. He has a God-given ability, but he's also very driven," Waxahachie baseball coach, Tracy Woods, said. "I think he's got a chance to do some special things. I think he's just scratched the surface of what he can do. His dad has pushed him, but not in a bad way. He's motivated him. Levi was not coddled. He understands what hard work and coaching is."

Levi's father, Larry David, also played baseball for Waxahachie and is a 1989 graduate. It's where he's raised Levi and his two daughters. While he's been a strong supporting character in Levi's development, he does not take all the credit for what his son has become. "The daddy has to get out of the picture. He had to hear other voices for his future,"











Larry said. "He's very self-motivated and makes a lot of sacrifices. I would put him up against guys who were raised by professional athletes."

A typical day for Levi during his school year was getting up at 6:00 a.m., swim practice from 6:30-7:30 a.m. and then attending school. After getting out of school at 2:15 p.m., he'd go to baseball practice, get out at 4:30, head back to the pool at 6:30, and wrap up the day by doing homework. "He is an exceptional all-around athlete. Without a doubt, he could excel at many different sports," WHS swim coach, Tamara Pruitt, said. "Levi has an internal drive to compete like no other athlete I've ever coached. Each year, he would set goals for himself and then focus and work toward reaching those goals. Our season is longer than any other sport, yet Levi was always able to maintain the focus and determination late in the season when everyone else was tired and distracted. As a team captain, he led by example. He never needed to say much, because his example spoke for him."

Coach Pruitt said that although Levi excels individually, he is also a team player. To her, this was never more evident than after he won his regional swimming event and immediately asked if his good friend had placed second. "He wanted success for his teammates, also, and finding out that Max had, indeed, placed second and qualified made him very happy," she said. "As a coach, this is the type of leadership you look for in your athletes, and I was blessed to have him as a team captain. His potential in swimming is limitless."

Levi finished his senior season undefeated in the 50-yard freestyle. He won a second straight district championship, going on to win regionals in the 50- and 100-yard freestyles. Levi


is also a smart student, graduating 32nd in his class. He plans to study business in college, following up on his love of economics. "Levi is a quick learner," Coach Woods said. "He represents us well, in so many ways."

He graduated with a grade point average of 3.89. He was named an Academic All-American by the National Interscholastic Swimming Coaches Association and twice received Academic All-State by the Texas Interscholastic Swim Coaches Association.

In what little spare time he has, Levi likes to fish, hunt and play beach volleyball. Larry said he was getting him a boat as a graduation present. "My dad got me one, and now he's ready," Larry said.

As his days as an Indian came to an end, Levi admitted it was a bittersweet occasion. He has so many memories, but he also has so much life ahead. "At the end of each season, the seniors would always go into the dugout with Coach Woods, and the rest of us always wondered what he said to them," Levi said. "This year, that was me."

His state championship in swimming is, by far, his favorite memory. "My whole senior year was centered on coming back with a championship," he shared, "and it feels so good to have reached that goal." NOW





That help is important. "DeSoto had other departments and a lot of support staff," Chief Norton added. "Here, there's no administrative assistant. I'm 'chief cook and bottle washer.' I had been out of traditional law enforcement since '03, so my skills were rusty at first. But I have two full-time officers who work evenings and five reserve officers who help out quite a bit. I work days, and we are all experienced officers who know how to handle situations and talk to people." The department handles about 30 calls per month, and the officers write about the same number of traffic tickets. Maypearl officers depend on the Ellis County Sheriff's Department dispatch and jail for those services. "We work well with the other law enforcement agencies in this county," Chief Norton said.



Holding master police officer and basic instructor certifications and having had assignments during his career in patrol, criminal investigations, training, SWAT team and community policing, Chief Norton works to ensure everyone's safety in the community of about 1,000



residents. "That's a big thing. We want the public to live in an environment where they can feel safe and be happy. Maypearl, and its surrounding area of about 1,000 more people who identify with Maypearl, needs to be a pleasant place to live, be healthy and raise a family where there are good values," he explained. "This is a place where everybody knows everybody. When I first started here, I wanted to rebuild the community's trust in this department, so I'm picky about who I hire."

A native of Mabank, Texas, Chief Norton admits that in his youth, he could have "gone the wrong way" easily. After playing high school football, he dropped out of school at age 17 and joined the U.S. Navy, where he served from 1973-1977. He married his wife, Paralee, in 1975, and upon his discharge from the Navy, the couple moved to Dallas. "I was married and had two kids, so I worked as a security guard until I joined the Dallas County Sheriff's Department," he recalled.

After earning his GED, Chief Norton furthered his education. "I took a criminal justice class in college while on the GI Bill and got interested in the profession. My dad had been in federal policing, too," Chief Norton explained. He now holds two degrees in criminal justice: a bachelor's degree from The University of Texas at Arlington and a master's degree from the University of North Texas.

Over his long career, Chief Norton has seen many changes. "Police attitudes have changed since the mid-1980s. I got into police work when there was an 'us vs. them' attitude. Through programs

like the Neighborhood Watch and the Citizens' Police Academy, I learned in DeSoto that there were a lot of great people in that community. Police are now more professional. We recognize the need to make arrests for family violence," he said. Advances in technology have created significant changes in this field. "We now have dash cams, cell phones, mobile digital communication systems, TASER and other belt tools," Chief Norton said. "Crime scene techs, DNA and serology testing have made a huge difference." He sees more technological advances in the future, plus more retired officers being utilized as reserve officers.

Challenges still abound, however. "There are so many incidences going on in the world outside of Maypearl. What are police supposed to do without support of the public? We are fortunate here that a lot of people have come out in support of our department. People know me and my officers. Praise God, we do have very strong support here," he said.

Chief Norton has a memory full of the funny behaviors people can exhibit. "I can't even begin to tell them all," he said. He also recalls the worst of times on the job. "I was reserve officer in Lancaster when one of our officers was killed," the chief remembered.

He and other officers volunteer with the Maypearl High School mentorship program. "Some of these kids lack strong family support. We let them

know there's someone who cares about them," he explained. Chief Norton is also actively involved in training a local Community Emergency Response Team class. "We train citizens in first aid and search and rescue, so when disasters such as tornadoes or searching for lost kids occur, our volunteers are ready," he said. Additionally, he and fellow officers go beyond duty and help at community events like the Maypearl Clean-up Day.

"My family and I love this town. We moved here when our youngest daughter was in the fourth grade. It's a great place to raise a family," Chief Norton stated. He and Paralee have four children, six grandchildren and one great-granddaughter. "We're active in the Maypearl First Baptist Church, and we love to spend time with the kids and grandchildren," he said. Chief Norton is also a Mason, and in his "spare" time, he teaches college online criminal justice classes.

"Criminal justice is a great career," Chief Norton tells future officers. "I believe in what I do, but you must have fortitude to make a difference. It all depends on attitude and what that officer wants out of the profession, but with the right attitude, officers can do a lot of good."

With a career that has spanned so many years, Chief Norton has had the chance to see the good that he's done. "T've been able to work with some really wonderful officers and have had a great career," he said. "After so many years spent in DeSoto, I have met several people that I saw grow up there. It's great when I hear, 'Hey, Sgt. Norton, I appreciate you taking the time to make sure I turned out OK.' That's when I realize the impact we, as police officers, have on people."

At Home With Glen & Trish Null When Trish was a little girl growing up in Mesquite, Texas, she loved visiting her grandfather's RV Park in Colorado.

A lone travel trailer stands next to the Stagecoach Cowboy Church in Waxahachie. It is considerably smaller, dramatically smaller, than Glen and Trish Null's previous home, yet every inch speaks of quality, luxury, less-stress living and the wonders of a new adventure. Finding their way to a 39-foot Redwood RV is a tale of two loving hearts, of cowboy and cowgirl grit, of absolute faith and, yes, even of a child's wish.

"He called his renters snowbirds, and I always said I wanted to be a 'snowbird," she smiled.

A little over a year ago, Glen and Trish started researching recreational vehicles designed for full-time living. Their goal was to simplify, to downsize. "We did a lot of research and looked at lots of RV lots," Trish shared. The moment they stepped inside the pre-owned 2011 Redwood RV, they knew they were home.

Redwood specializes in trailers for "full-timers." Reportedly, the company was established in 2010, because of the demand for affordable "luxury Fifth Wheels" and growing interest in downsizing, especially among baby boomers. "Ours has a living room, kitchen, dining area, bath and bedroom,"



Glen said. "It came completely finished, including the furniture." Two extensions called "slide-outs" help widen the living area, while another allows the bedroom to accommodate a king-sized bed.

The entryway opens to the main living area and instantly tells of quality, efficiency and comfort with details like crown molding and a palette of cream, tan and rich wood tones accented by beautiful day/night roller shades and upholstered dining chairs. Custom double-paned windows line the left and back walls of the main room, while the other side is banked by solid maple cabinetry along the length of the media center and kitchen.

wanted a gas stove all of my life." Features also include solid-surface counters, a pantry and refrigerator, plus a good-sized island with hidden trash container. "I love the ease of everything and the special touches like the hidden vacuum hook-up and the suction vent for sweeping," she added. "I don't like to dust, so I've never really been a collector of things. The only exceptions are the glass-topped coffee table with mementoes of our son and some of our family photos."



Warm and comfortable also applies to the bedroom, which is large enough for a king-sized bed and two closets. The bathroom, which can be accessed from the main area and the bedroom, features a full-size shower. "Having our home here, next to the church, is another convenience," Trish commented. "The hook-ups were already here, and Glen's office is just next door."

"We're also blessed with wonderful neighbors," Glen added. "We keep our horses at a neighbor's place across the street."

It was April 2015, when the Nulls said goodbye to their previous home in Canton, relocating to 7.5 acres in the Falling Leaves area of Waxahachie. "Canton had been home for a good part of our 11-year marriage and was where we had raised our son, enjoyed horses and started a youth ministry. Glen and I already had children when we married, so our family instantly included seven kids," Trish explained. Her 11-year-old son, Clay, was the only child still at home. Just 6 when his father passed, Glen became the father he knew.

Life, then, was good for the Nulls. Glen was serving as an associate pastor and was also a welder and fence-builder. Trish was a busy hairstylist, plus mom and cowgirl, and both she and Glen loved being with each other, family, friends, the youth group and their horses.

Then, in June 2014, their world turned upside down. Nineteen-year-old Clay was killed in an automobile accident. Through faith and grit, Glen and Trish bore the heartbreak, while Trish paid tribute in a special way. "We had bought two horses, Boogeyman and Rip, for Clay," Glen explained. "Trish started riding Rip and, in Clay's memory, competed at the Extreme Cowboy Race in Hamilton, Texas. In November 2014, she was named the EXCA Novice World Champion." As a loving and faith-centered couple, and with support of family and friends, the loss of a child was made bearable.


In January 2016, though, the Nulls' world collapsed again. Glen suffered a cardiac arrest while team roping. "He fell from his horse, unconscious and not breathing," Trish said. Ultimately, doctors would warn that, because of the length of unconsciousness, Glen would likely not survive or would be brain damaged and that Trish should begin considering organ donation. "I told them that God has plans, and we would wait until all the medications and treatments were over to see if Glen would respond," she shared. She then invited friends and family to gather in the hospital room to pray.

It was a slow recovery. "I don't remember anything from two weeks before the attack until weeks after," Glen said. After two heart surgeries, healing time for non-functioning kidneys and the gradual process of regaining strength and weight, he was at last on the road to recovery and in sync with Trish's "snowbird" wish.

"We're enjoying a simpler life," she said. "We still have the horses and our two dogs, Miley and Jessie." Meanwhile, Glen is busy with the church, and Trish wears several hats with church work, plus her new role as an independent marketing representative. They also happily report they now have eight grandchildren and another on the way. "Our 5-year-old grandson, Tagen, visits us at least once a week," Trish said with a smile.

A small plaque hanging above the dining table reads: Because someone we love is in heaven, there's a little bit of heaven in our home. Sure enough, life at the Nulls' Redwood RV is lovingly simple, definitely blessed and pretty good these days. NOW

# Soccer Season Is Prime Time for Foot and Ankle Injuries

Soccer season is in full swing, and parents and coaches should think twice before coaxing young, injury-prone soccer players to "play through" foot and ankle pain. Skeletally immature kids, starting and stopping and moving side to side on cleats that are little more than moccasins with spikes — that's a recipe for foot and ankle sprains and worse.

Kids can play with lingering, nagging heel pain which, upon testing, turns out to be a stress fracture that neither they, their parents nor their coaches were aware of. By playing with pain, they can't give their team 100 percent, and they may make their injuries worse, prolonging their time out of soccer. Some parents want to see X-rays of fractures before they'll take their kids out of the game. And stress fractures can be subtle. They don't always show up on initial X-rays.

Symptoms of stress fractures include pain during normal activity and when touching the area, and swelling without bruising. Treatment usually involves rest and sometimes casting. Some stress fractures heal poorly and often require surgery, such as a break in the elongated bone near the little toe, known as a Jones fracture.

Soccer is a very popular sport in our community, but the constant running associated with it places excessive stress on a developing foot. Pain from overuse usually stems from inflammation, such as around

the growth plate of the heel bone, more so than a stress fracture. Kids' growth plates are still open and bones are still growing and maturing until they're about 13 to 16. Rest and, in some cases, immobilization of the foot should relieve that inflammation.

Other types of overuse injuries are Achilles tendonitis and plantar fasciitis (heel pain caused by inflammation of the tissue extending from the heel to the toes). Quick, out-of-nowhere ankle sprains are also common to soccer. Ankle sprains should be evaluated by a physician to assess the extent of the injury. If the ankle stays swollen for days and is painful to walk or even stand on, it could be a fracture.

Collisions between soccer players take their toll on toes. When two feet are coming at the ball simultaneously, that ball turns into a cement block and goes nowhere. The weakest point in that transaction is usually a foot, with broken toes the outcome. The toes swell up so much the player can't get a shoe on, which is a good sign for young athletes and their parents: If they are having trouble just getting a shoe on, they shouldn't play.

#### **Red Velvet Bundt Cake**

Cake:

Baker's Joy or another nonstick cooking spray and a dusting of flour

- 2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 cups sugar
- I tsp. baking soda
- I tsp. salt
- 4 Tbsp. SACO Cultured Buttermilk Blend Powder
- 3 1/2 Tbsp. unsweetened cocoa powder
- 2 eggs, room temperature
- I cup vegetable oil
- 1 Tbsp. white vinegar
- 1 1/2 tsp. vanilla
- I cup water
- 2 Tbsp. red food coloring

#### Frosting:

- 1 8-oz. pkg. cream cheese, softened
- 1/4 cup unsalted butter, softened
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla
- 1 1/2 cups powdered sugar
- 1/3 cup heavy whipping cream

- **1.** For cake: Preheat oven to 325 F. Generously spray a 10-inch Bundt pan with Baker's Joy; set aside.
- **2.** In a large bowl, sift together the flour, sugar, baking soda, salt, buttermilk powder and cocoa powder; set aside.
- **3.** Using a mixer and large bowl, combine the eggs, vegetable oil, white vinegar, vanilla, water and red food coloring; blend on low for 2-3 minutes until smooth.
- **4.** On low, slowly add the dry ingredients to the egg mixture until mixture is smooth; pour batter into the Bundt pan.
- **5.** Bake 50-55 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean; place cake on a wire rack to cool completely before removing it from the pan.
- **6.** For frosting: Using a mixer and medium-sized bowl, beat cream cheese, butter and vanilla on low for 2-3 minutes until fluffy.
- **7.** Continuing on low speed, slowly add the powdered sugar. Add the heavy cream; mix completely.
- **8.** *To decorate:* Put frosting in a zipper bag; cut 1/2-inch off one of the bag's corners;

decorate cake by piping frosting along the grooves of the Bundt cake, moving back and forth from the center to outer edge of the cake in a smooth motion.

**9.** Store the cake in an airtight container for 2-3 days on the counter or for 5-6 days in the refrigerator.

#### Pumpkin Pie, No Pie!

- 1 15-oz. can Libby's Solid Pack Pumpkin Puree
- 1/3 cup Truvia or 2/3 cup granulated Splenda
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. ground cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp. ground ginger
- 1/2 tsp. nutmeg
- 1/4 tsp. ground cloves
- 2 large eggs
- 1 12-oz. can evaporated milk, low fat Sugar-free Cool Whip, thawed, to taste
- **I.** Preheat oven to 350 F; in a large bowl, mix the pumpkin, Truvia, salt, cinnamon, ginger, nutmeg and cloves.
- 2. Beat in eggs; gradually stir in evaporated milk.
- **3.** Pour into a glass or ceramic baking dish; bake until a knife inserted near the center comes out clean.
- **4.** Cool on a wire rack; serve with whipped cream at either room temperature or chilled.

- 1 32-oz. pkg. frozen southern hash brown potato cubes
- 8 cups water
- 1 10.5-oz. can 98% fat-free cream of chicken soup
- **3-4 Tbsp. Knorr Chicken Bouillon Granules**
- 1 12.5-oz. can Swanson white chicken breast, drained

Salt. to taste

Pepper, to taste

- 1/2- to 3/4-cup fat-free half-and-half1 cup reduced fat cheddar cheese, grated (optional)
- **1.** In a stock pot, bring first 7 ingredients to a boil. Reduce heat to medium; simmer 25 minutes.
- 2. Stir in half-and-half; garnish with cheese.
