
This summer has been great. My husband and I went on a cruise to Mexico. I visited grandkids in Doral, Florida, and Albuquerque, New Mexico,



Billy Elias grew up living the kind of life portrayed in the book and movie, The Help. His single mom was a maid to a wealthy family in Kilgore, Texas, so Billy was left home alone a lot. He remembers entertaining himself by bouncing up and down on a mattress in the back room of his childhood home while singing. He sang so well that a neighbor lady told his mom, "Mrs. Elias, that boy can sing!" Billy's first public performance was in first grade when he sang in white tails and a top hat. Before long, he was performing on the local radio station. "I had to be on a box. I wasn't tall enough to reach the mike," Billy remembered.

His family moved to Corsicana where Billy graduated from Jackson High School. "I received a great education from great teachers," Billy

remembered. He showed his excellent work ethic as a teenage dishwasher at Roy's Café — an ethic that continues today. After moving to Dallas, Billy stayed in the restaurant business and learned how to cook kosher food, a knowledge that he put to use when he opened his own kosher restaurant later in Corsicana.

However, Billy kept hearing the call from God to preach. He first received the call in 1959 in Waco at Grace Gospel Church. "In Dallas, I ran down during an A.A. Allen tent meeting like I was running the 220 to answer that call," Billy remembered. He began preaching in tent revivals. "It's been a struggle — uphill and downhill," Billy recalled. Although he grew up going to church, and his mother read the Bible to him, Billy remarked humbly, "I didn't know much, so I've been learning for over 30 years.

"One day at work, God told me, 'Go to Corsicana. I'm starting a church.' I gathered boxes and kids and got away from Dallas so fast that I lost our best mattress," Billy remembered. The mattress blew off the roof of a car that wouldn't crank. Miraculously, that day it cranked, got to Corsicana and never ran again.

Billy started a ministry and formed a family singing group comprised of his 14 children, some of whom he delivered personally. The family made an album of their music. "I have seven girls and seven boys — all by the same wife,"

he revealed. He is proud of their accomplishments. A son serves at the Pentagon, and his youngest daughter just got accepted to medical school. "About 30 grandkids and seven great-grandchildren" make up the family today. "They keep coming so fast now, it's hard to keep up," he said, laughingly.

There were always books for children in his home. Billy emphasizes the importance of education. He has studied at Del Mar College, Johnson's Bible School, Criswell College, North Lake College and has taken computer and voice classes at Navarro College.

Since Billy does not ever pass an offering plate, he has depended on a number of different jobs to support his family and ministry. He has picked cotton, been "an insurance man," Department of Labor counselor, assistant manager at K. Wolens Department Store, a massage therapist, radio personality and minister. He retired from Oil City Iron Works after an injury but stays busy today with his street ministry, conducting funerals, doing community work, working as an election judge and serving as a McDonald's chaplain. "God didn't call me to gather money; he called me to preach. I work 21 hours a day. I have too much that I want to do," Billy said. He has built his ministry just like his home, brick by brick.

With minimal equipment, Billy can

be found preaching and singing at the corner of 1st Avenue (Rhone Road) and 3rd Street. There are no stained glass windows, air conditioning or softly cushioned pews. Instead, Billy preaches where he is needed to troubled souls who sometimes walk on the wrong side of the law. "People come crying. I tell them that tomorrow is not promised to you. You need to find a church and keep going. A lot of people have lost faith," Billy said. "So many people in the community have so many talents. I like to turn them around to being gainfully employed. I want to put families back together again," he added.





Concern for the children of the neighborhood is uppermost. "I tell parents to get their kids into a church and tell them that someday that child is going to give them grief, and they're going to wonder why," Billy recounted. Kids come by when they see him working in his yard. "They just start talking, and I start praying," Billy said. He dreams of building a learning center in the

neighborhood. "Kids can't read, so they can't read the Bible," he lamented.

Billy's ministry stretches outside of Corsicana's boundaries through his service mission trips to Mexico and his chaplaincy to McDonald's employees in Corsicana and Ennis through Market Place Ministries. Billy volunteers at the Salvation Army, has a jail ministry in Waxahachie and serves on the Corsicana Crime Commission. He enjoys the fellowship and food at Corsicana's First Baptist Church Good News Café each Monday.

An accomplished musician who played with Bo Thompson and jazz bands in Dallas, Billy plays the bongo drums, saxophone and clarinet and is often asked to sing at events around the Corsicana area. "Billy was one of the first young men we met when we came to Corsicana," Warner Redus remembered. "My husband used to stay up late to hear him and his family sing on their radio program. He has always been a favorite."

Carole Davenport invited Billy to sing the National Anthem at the Rotary Freedom Festival and at an Elderhostel program hosted by Navarro College. "I don't remember where I first heard Billy sing, but I was absolutely blown away. His voice was such a blessing to all who heard him," Carole stated. Billy has also performed at the annual House of Refuge benefit.

The challenges of his ministry, which is centered on John 3:16, sometimes are difficult for Billy to overcome, but he gives credit to God and his many friends around the area for encouraging him to continue. "He is such a humble and incredibly kind, Christian man. I am honored to call him my friend," Carole said.

"Every time I get down and out, someone comes along to give encouragement to me," Billy revealed. "I don't have a lot, but God answers prayers. He blesses me in every way." NOW



Head of the ass

When the call went out at Corsicana High School for students to nominate a favorite teacher, someone unforgettable who made an indelible and permanent impression, it didn't take senior, Cheyanne Pease, very long at all to come up with her choice. Cheyanne told her basketball coach it was Mrs. Thelma Lockwood, her third grade teacher at James L. Collins Catholic School, who had changed her life for the better.

Thelma, who starts her 32nd year of teaching this month — with 27 of those years teaching third grade at Collins — said the nomination was quite a surprise. "When I heard about Cheyanne nominating me as her favorite teacher, I was amazed. Because of that, I had to speak to the audience during a recent basketball game,

which was a bit scary, but I got through it just fine," she laughed.

Originally from upstate New York, Thelma said she lived in the East until 1983 when her husband, Harold, found a job at Guardian Glass. "We just love it here," she said. "My parents are still up in New York, and so are three of my four sisters, so we go see them each summer."

Looking back, Thelma said being an airline stewardess, not a teacher, was what she wanted to do when she was in high school. "When I applied to be a stewardess, they told me I was too tall,



so that didn't happen," she said. "Then I thought about majoring in sociology and psychology at the Oswego State University (now State University of New York at Oswego), but the statistics class that was required changed my mind in a hurry. The school counselor suggested I think about majoring in education, which I did, and the rest is history."

After graduation in 1973, Thelma taught remedial reading, and then spent the next three years teaching at Catholic schools in upstate New York. What followed were eight years where, after the birth of her boys, she didn't teach at all but worked in the retail industry. "I worked in a grocery store for a couple of years, and then after we moved to Corsicana, I opened Circus World, a toy store, at College Park Mall, and managed it for a while. A friend suggested I think about getting back into teaching and told me to check into James L. Collins Catholic School, but I wasn't certified to teach in Texas at that point. I went for an interview and was hired that day. Sister Patricia Gardner was the principal then, and she must have seen something in me that I didn't know was there," Thelma admitted. That was in 1985, and Thelma



has been teaching third-graders there ever since.

James L. Collins Catholic School, located on West Highway 22 in Corsicana, was established in 1955. It provides classes for preschool through eighth-grade students and emphasizes strong Christian and academic standards, according to the school's Web site. The school's mission statement indicates that the school seeks to "develop each child spiritually, academically, socially and physically, with education provided for boys and girls, Catholic and non-Catholic, from prekindergarten through eighth grade, with close and supportive student/ teacher relationships."

The school espouses a philosophy including the belief that "quality education addresses the whole person, so through teachers and staff, the school becomes involved in the lives of its students by assisting and supporting the family as the primary educator of the child." Thelma agreed, and described the teachers and staff at Collins as "family," always supportive and affirming. "It's the right size, so you know everyone, and interestingly enough, there are sometimes more non-Catholics than Catholics enrolled," she said. She added that there were 22 third-graders in the last semester's class, but Thelma has had as many as 30 enrolled in past semesters.

Thelma strongly believes every single student can be taught, no matter what learning problems or disabilities they might have. "I know from experience,




that as a teacher, you can make them successful at learning. You can determine what method will work best to teach any child with learning problems," she said, adding parents can and should play an

important role in the learning process. "If you show each child some dignity and respect, and if you make them feel good about themselves, you build their self-esteem. You just need to work with them until they get to that point," she explained.

Every now and then, Thelma sees kids who don't respect each other. They are often disrespectful to teachers, so she thinks teachers, to be effective, may need to be prepared to wear a lot of hats. "We sometimes have to be a parent, counselor







and psychologist in addition to being the teacher. I support my students outside the classroom environment by going to basketball, soccer, baseball and softball games, as well as dance recitals and plays."

The rewards of being a teacher, however, are unquestionably phenomenal. "My biggest reward for all of the hard work is when the kids come back after they are grown and tell me they went into education because of me," she said. "Tve gone to their graduations and weddings. Tve been teaching their children. It's great

to be able to see how the kids ultimately turned out, and to hear them come back and say that I really made a difference in their lives — that means so much."

When not wearing all those hats during the few months of respite from teaching each summer, Thelma and Harold dearly love to travel. "We've been all over the United States and would love to go back to Europe. We went to Italy three years ago and spent 10 days there. It was a fantastic time," she said.

When Thelma thinks about traveling, she also ponders retirement and to be honest, she thinks of it more and more these days. "I know for sure that when I do retire, we'll travel, of course. And I'll be doing a lot of volunteer work, because I am not someone who can sit around and do nothing! We will go see our sons and enjoy hanging out with the grandkids," she said.

Looking back on her own unique experience, Thelma has some solid advice for new teachers. "My biggest advice to new teachers is to be current on technology and keep your computer skills sharp. Also, remember you need to teach to the *child*, which will require putting in the necessary time to do that effectively," she said. "Most important, though, is dedication. 
Family photographs lie under glass





youth division of the Arabian Horse Association (AHA). For two years, 2010 and 2011, she won the AHA's Regional Team Tournament, joining other members of Team Suave in accepting the distinction. "Our team is made up of a bunch of friends who love horses and love competing," Megan said. "It's an honor to compete with all these talented people and to be selected among the top riders in the country. We all love the competition aspect, but it's also just fun to learn and give the best you can give."

Her membership in AHA has been an important cog in the wheel of success for Megan. The organization, whose registry for Arabian horses was founded in 1908, is the focal link for enthusiasts of the breed to enjoy contests and recreational activities nationwide. Currently, there are more than 40,000 members, and since the association's inception, over one million Arabian, Half-Arabian and Anglo-Arabian horses have been registered. Some 400 events are held annually to bring the Arabian horse community together, and the group offers the "premier marketplace" for buying and selling the breed.

Another organization crucial to

Megan's success is the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF), which is the national governing body for the sport. USEF was established in 1917 and is today the largest multibreed equine foundation, overseeing 2,800 contests every year. One of its bestknown programs is the training, selection and funding of the group's own team of riders for the Olympic Games.

This year, Megan has qualified to participate in AHA's regional and national shows, and she is hard at work preparing to display her finest form and skills. She credits her coach, Alene Esposito, for providing careful and compassionate instruction



and for reassuring her when she needs it. "Just being around Alene is a boost," Megan said. "She is the most amazing woman, almost like another parent. She's always been there for me in life as well as in my training. I can go to her about anything." A member of AHA and such state groups as the Bluebonnet Arabian Horse Club, Alene is well-known in Texas, arranging events and chairing committees. She is also frequently a main ring judge and trail judge for open shows across the state.

Alene has trained Megan in every facet of horsemanship. Megan has mastered English riding and is now just learning the art of barrel racing. This rodeo event, in which riders attempt to maneuver around a clover-leaf pattern of barrels in the center of an arena, is primarily a sport for women. The performance

is a difficult one to achieve and still maintain one's stability and grace in the saddle. Megan relishes the opportunity to display her abilities and her style of riding. Proficient in traditional English and more modern Western riding forms, Megan delights in both. "The English and Western disciplines are both great to know," Megan said. "I love the proper riding etiquette of the English style but also enjoy the more countrified Western type." The English discipline is varied but, basically, requires the use of both hands on the reins, rather than a single hand. English style riders often rise and sit in rhythm to the horse's stride. By contrast, riders of the Western discipline use only one hand on the reins and carry a lariat in the other.

Megan has learned much about her favorite breed through her involvement with AHA, which offers online forums to discuss aspects of Arabian horses, horsemanship, horse care and health. Home study courses are also available through the group, as is a judges and exhibitors school and scholarships.

Megan is excited about her future as a horsewoman and an educator. "I want to go to Texas A&M University and become an equine therapist," she said. She has decided on the vocation because it will be a way to continue her love of riding, yet help others overcome adversity by appreciating the beauty of the horse and the freedom of the sport. As a psychiatric discipline, equine therapy uses the horse to supply positive experiences that "promote emotional growth" in patients, often children with behavioral difficulties or who have suffered physical and emotional abuse. Students in equine therapy learn metaphorically about horse care, such as how to lead a horse - not by pulling a rope ahead of the animal, but by walking beside it.

The most gratifying part of riding for Megan is the trust and love that develops between horse and human. But the competitive side of riding is fun, too, and Megan looks forward to future shows in which she can demonstrate all she has been taught. "I really love learning how I can improve," Megan admitted. "I have been so inspired by my mother and by my coach that I want to be as great as they are. I want them to be proud of me, and I want to be proud of myself." **NOW**

Kerens, a quiet little hamlet about 20 miles west of Corsicana on Highway 31, is known throughout Navarro County and the state of Texas for many things. One is Big Tex, the giant icon seen every year at the Texas State Fair, who first appeared in Kerens during Christmas of 1949. Residents built a 49-foottall Santa Claus out of iron and papier-mâché to draw Christmas shoppers. In 1951, State Fair president, R.L. The cheer squad's sponsor and coach, Cristy Vaughan, is the primary reason for the squad's phenomenal reputation. "We have 11 girl cheerleaders and one mascot in the squad," Cristy said. The mascot is, of course, the famous bobcat, brought to life each game by another girl hidden inside the colorful costume.

The squad recently returned from their yearly summer camp, held June 25 through 28 at Tarleton State University at Stephenville, Texas. "We left Monday morning on the three-hour drive and came back Thursday evening," Cristy explained. "Prior to the trip, the girls did fundraising for about five months to raise the attendance fee of \$300 per cheerleader."

Kerens High/Middle School office as a secretary. I've also coached for over nine years, after the lady who was doing that turned it over to me when she moved away and remarried," she said. Prior to that, Cristy's career was in special education.

In addition to her duties as cheer squad sponsor and school secretary, Cristy is also a mother, a daughter and a talented artist who says she absolutely loves to draw. "I get to indulge my artistic side by drawing the 'bust-through' we



use before every game." Cristy said. She creates the bust-through (a large poster paper drawing that the football team runs through on their way to the field) by sketching out a theme then using a carpenter's pencil to draw it out in detail. "After the drawing is done, I give it to the cheer squad, and they paint it," she said.

Cristy, born in Mount Pleasant, Texas, moved to Kerens early in life, where she graduated from Kerens High School in 1991. After attending Navarro College, she married and had three children. Cristy says this year looks like it will be a busy one for her and the Kerens Junior High cheer squad. "One night in August, we will spend the entire night in the gymnasium and make the signs for all the games we'll cheer at this year," she said, adding that they will start planning their cheer agendas and deciding what they will perform for the upcoming football season.

Another much-anticipated activity Cristy leads is the Junior Bobcat Cheer Camp for prekindergarten through seventh grade cheerleader "wannabes," which is held each year in September. "Everyone who attends the junior cheer camp participates at a home game in the fall where they get to cheer with our squad," Cristy explained.

Historically, the Kerens Junior High Cheer Squad starts each season by cheering for the seventh grade, eighth grade and junior varsity teams. "We



get to cheer all three games, one right after the other," she said. During the holidays, the squad volunteers its time and cheerleading talent by performing at numerous venues in and around Corsicana, Kerens and Dallas. "We perform regularly at Sterling House, Heritage Oaks West, the Kerens Care Center, Medical City Children's Hospital, La Petite and Six Flags," Cristy said. The squad begins the yearly cheer schedule with practice beginning in October, followed by the first performance starting in November and continuing all the way through Mother's Day.

Cristy admits the squad's great reputation is possible thanks to diligent practice, which starts well before football season begins. "We start practicing 30 days before cheer summer camp, and all the parents get to see what we've accomplished when we invite them to a parent night we host every year in June," Cristy said. The squad maintains a strict practice schedule, meeting from 4:00 to 6:00 p.m. Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays at Kerens I.S.D.

Cheerleader Kayleigh Avants, team captain for the current year, said she has learned a lot about how a successful cheer squad operates, especially from her perspective as captain. "It's a lot of responsibility being captain and seeing all the administrative things that go into



keeping things running smoothly," she said. Kayleigh gives most of the credit for that success to Cristy. "I just love her. She is an awesome coach, very funny and very cool."

Most importantly, Cristy is proud that she is a friend and counselor to every girl on the cheer squad. "We've had some girls who came to the squad as very shy and introverted, and I've seen them changed in positive ways by being part of the cheer squad," she said, noting that she's also seen how the discipline and responsibility of being part of the squad made every girl a better person for the experience.

"Every girl in the squad knows they can always come to me to talk about anything," Cristy reflected. "I've learned that there's really no such thing as a bad kid — just good kids who sometimes make bad choices. I look at each one of those girls as an extension of my own family, and they are truly the sunshine in my life."



For Good Health, Eat Healthy

It's a well-known fact that our nation has a critical weight problem. More than one-third of U.S. adults — nearly 38 percent — are obese, according to the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention, and the percentage continues to climb. Overweight and obesity are linked to several chronic diseases including heart disease, stroke, type 2 diabetes and certain types of cancer. In Texas alone, the percentage of overweight or obese adults tops 31 percent.

There are resources to help you make the right choices to maintain a healthy diet, a healthy weight and good quality of life. Proper nutrition can help prevent or manage high blood pressure, high cholesterol, depression, diabetes, heart disease, sleep apnea, gallbladder disease, bone and joint disorders, certain types of cancer and many other conditions.

Obesity and diabetes link

Numerous studies have documented the link between obesity and diabetes. If you already have diabetes, you know the importance of controlling your blood sugar — what you eat, when you eat and how much you eat can make a pivotal difference in a diabetic's quality of life and activity level. Keeping your blood glucose levels within the desired range can help prevent the development of other health problems that are common among diabetics: heart attack, stroke and kidney failure, for example.

Nutritional Counseling

People who are on a medically supervised diet for weight loss or health reasons usually see a hospital-based dietitian for individual counseling and weight management, in conjunction with their doctor's plan for their care. A professional dietitian or nutritional counselor can also help design a program to aid in weight loss for patients preparing for bariatric surgery or heart surgery. If you are recovering from surgery, or have high cholesterol or hypertension, your doctor may recommend that you consult with a professional dietitian to design a low-sodium, heart-healthy diet that will support goals for your recovery and long-term health.

If you're beginning a weight-loss program for preventive health reasons, or as part of a chronic disease management plan, talk with your doctor about the resources available to support your long-term goals. A physician's order from your primary doctor is generally required for nutritional counseling and services.

More specific sites include: www.johnscheepers.com for bulb lovers, www.lilypons.com for hints and plants for ponds and www.petesherbs for herb information. Sick plants can perhaps be helped by checking out Urban Plant Pathology at http://sickplants.tamu.edu/. For help with soils and water problems as well as Texas-tested plants, try the Texas A&M site http://aggie-horticulture.tamu.edu/earthkind/. This site even has a section where you can enter your ZIP code plus the color, size and other specifics about the plant you want, and they will give you a list of plants that will not only meet your needs, but survive your area extremes! Aggie Horticulture also has sections on vegetables, lawn, fruit trees and pests. It's all there and is just a matter of moving through the site. Have patience!

Information on organic gardening and pest control is also available at http://organicgardeningtx.com/. When in doubt, Google it, but remember most of the large search engines will put paying customers at the top of their search list. Be sure and check several pages. Lots of state universities have great sites, but temper your choices with knowledge of the differences in climate across the United States. **NOW**

How to Afford Long-term Care

• Features. It's not easy to evaluate different plans. Be sure to compare these key features:

 Benefit trigger. The criteria or event the insurer uses to determine when your policy will go into effect.

- Elimination period. The number of days you'll pay for care out of your own pocket before you begin receiving benefits. Thirty days is the minimum

elimination period for many long-term care plans.

— *Daily benefits.* The amount the policy will pay on a daily basis. Some plans pay benefits based on the hours of service, such as the number of hours a home health aide visits your home.

- Inflation adjustment. A feature that helps your benefits keep pace with rising costs.

— *Types of services.* A description of what's covered under each plan and where you may receive this care — at home or in an assisted living residence, adult day care facility, nursing home or other setting.

- Duration of benefits. The length of time you'll receive benefits, from a few years to as long as you live.

- *Exclusions*. Stipulated conditions or acts that the benefits won't cover. These could include conditions caused by alcoholism or dangerous behaviors.

Crock-Pot BBQ Chicken

- I 18-oz. bottle Sweet Baby Ray's
- Barbecue Sauce
- 1/4 cup vinegar
- I tsp. red pepper flakes
- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 to 1 tsp. garlic powder, or to taste
- 4-6 boneless, skinless chicken breasts (can be frozen)

 Mix barbecue sauce with the next 4 ingredients.

8. To make icing, whisk together the confectioners' sugar and milk, until smooth. Stir in food coloring.


9. Dip the top of each cupcake into icing. Allow excess icing to drip off cupcake before turning it over.
