
















Winning games is the charge that coaches receive from schools — especially in Texas where sports are held dear, especially football. Navarro College has a history of success on the gridiron, but when Head Coach Brian Mayper came to Navarro College to lead the Bulldog football team two years ago, he brought the Fellowship of Christian Athletes program with him. 'FCA changes the dynamics, the inner workings of the team," Coach Mayper said. 'The program teaches each member player to be a better person. Everyone on campus says participation in FCA has made a difference in our athletes."

or College ference **IE YEAR** weights. "We are doing whatever we can to get better," Carson confirmed. But for these two members of FCA, volunteerism and attending group meetings also became important. Carson volunteered at a summer church camp in Crockett, and Desmond volunteered at Corsicana's Texas Youth Commission. At the invitation of Dr. Richard Sanchez, then president of Navarro College, Carson went to Austin to lobby for the continuance of the program in Corsicana.

Both young men have been involved with the team's efforts to build a Habitat for Humanity home. Team members have helped as volunteers at Fannin Elementary School in CISD and they helped with set up for the spring Youth Expo this year. "It's special, just to be

able to give back to other people," Desmond said.

"We would like to get these athletes even more involved as community volunteers," Coach Mayper added.

The FCA meetings are held on Monday nights during football season. Coach Mayper arranges for speakers and opens the meetings to the Navarro College

family. The gatherings are encouraging and inspirational. "It's a chance to refocus and be reminded of what's really important in life," Carson said. "When my mom and dad are not around and I have to make decisions, FCA helps to keep me out of trouble and builds character. It helps us in focusing on and off the field."

The son of a coach, Carson grew up around football. His parents live in Robinson, Texas, where his dad is still a coach,



but Carson didn't start seriously playing the game until seventh grade. Carson played for three different high schools during his career, and found Navarro College attractive since it was close to home. He also felt he could trust the coaches.

Desmond, on the other hand, grew up in Kenya where he played soccer, rugby and a little basketball. His mother brought him to North Carolina to attend high school and to ultimately attend a college prep school. "I work to get in shape and to get to know the game, because I'm new to football," Desmond revealed. His mother, her job accomplished, has returned to Kenya. The advice Desmond gives to younger students is solid: "Stay focused and do well in school. Take care of school first."

Academic success definitely comes first for these athletes. "The bar is set high," Coach Mayper affirmed. "To go to a D1 school, a 2.5 GPA is required. They have to be on time to class, attentive and participate in tutorials and study hall."

Last season, the Bulldogs celebrated many wins. The sweetest victory came against Tyler Junior College. "We lost to Tyler in regular season but beat them in the first playoff game," Carson

remembered. That game was also his first start experience with the team. The worst of times came when the team lost the conference game.

"When we lose, we try to figure out if it was due to a lack of preparation, the coaches' calls or if we just didn't respond quickly," Coach Mayper observed. "The players have to be prepared to make their decisions on the field. Mistakes can be made, but the goal of every offensive play is to score. However, we also want the players to be winners in life, not just to win games. We only have them for two years and have a short time to develop leadership. So we find students who are natural leaders. We just help them keep their ultimate goals in place." Coach Mayper believes the impact of coaches equals that of parents. "So we present the Gospel to students," he added. "If we don't do that, we are failing."








Coach Mayper was reared Jewish. In football he "practiced a whole bunch behind an All-American punter and great receivers" while at Sam Houston State University. It was at Southern Arkansas University that he accepted Christ in 1995. While coaching at Howard Payne University, Coach Mayper became involved in FCA. "I was on fire," he recounted. "God wanted me there, and I truly believe God placed me at Navarro College when he did. I just have to keep listening."

Receiving Coach of the Year honors from the Southwest Junior College Football Conference after his first season with the Bulldogs was recently topped by being awarded the FCA Coach of the Year after the 2013 season. "The conference award was great, but the FCA



children, Lily, age 8; Walker, age 6; and baby Maggie Lou, is set on land that has been owned by Laura's family for generations. "This was my grandparents' Circle J Ranch," Laura explained. "My mom grew up just over the hill. The Smiths' home was about three to four years in the planning and building, but the work was worth the life they now enjoy. They built the house, a garage, shop and fencing, even roads and a lake. "We did a lot of the work ourselves including all the prep work," Stuart



remembered. "There were times we had to believe that if God wanted us to build, he would open doors for it to happen."

thinks I cut up her wedding dress in order to make various items she requested, but I had extra material," Joan smiled. She used some of the leftover fabric to make a suit for her grandson's christening. Joan will tackle just about anything that piques her interest.



Her love of creating has opened up many other avenues. She has sculpted concrete fountains, and she's embraced a very old art form called quilling. Quilling, or paper filigree as it's also known, involves taking strips of paper that are rolled, shaped and glued together to make intricate designs. The paper is looped, curled, twisted and manipulated to decorate anything from greeting cards to jewelry. The paper used is very pliable, making it difficult to break or crack during the design process.

Quilling began during the Renaissance when nuns and monks would curl paper to decorate religious objects. Later, during the 18th and 19th centuries, the art form became a favorite pastime for the upper-class ladies of England. Today, it's no longer limited to the rich. In fact, the craft has become popular throughout the world in large part because of the low cost of the materials needed. When quilling, a seasoned artist like Joan, can take the basic shapes and place them together to create a beautiful picture



that has as many intricate details as she wishes to include.

Joan has used quilling in various mediums. For her relatives, she has taken their wedding invitations and quilled a decorative scene around the frame and for others, she has made cards. "When



I'm finished quilling cards, the card typically has more thought and effort than any gift," Joan said with pride. "They are hard to part with, but it's worth it." She has expressed interest in taking her quilling to another level eventually. "One day I'd like to take a photograph of someone and reproduce it in quilling," she admitted. "I guess you can call it art, but I see it more as preserving memories."

Both Joan and Mike are active in their church, Thien Tam Benedictine Monastery. Together, Joan and Mike worked on a special project there. The monastery has a display room named "Relics Chapel" which houses over 100 artifacts associated with various saints. Relics can be pieces of clothing, bone or hair directly from the saint, and each bears a certificate of authenticity. Usually, the certificate is framed with a picture of the saint along with the relic which is placed in a decorative case called a reliquary. Joan and Mike, noticing the frames were coming apart and the glass





By contrast, a water feature merely sets off the water with decorative elements like a fountain or a lighted waterfall. They are as low-maintenance as a gardener can get. You just switch it on or off.

What to know before you build.

Before your landscaper or contractor lays out your koi pond, consult the local code enforcement department. There may be laws restricting the depth of your pond or access to it, and you'll need to be prepared to meet those or other requirements. Ordinances may also mandate fencing types, a building permit or an inspection of the site before and after construction. Finally, call 811 free of charge to request that all gas, electric, phone and cable lines be mapped out for your safety.

Collaborate with your builder.

You may want to hire either a landscape designer who specializes in gardens and pools or an independent contractor. But you can also pick one of many construction companies that now perform the excavation and initial cultivation of koi ponds.





Work from architectural drawings or images of your builder's former projects or provide your own vision for the size and layout of the pond. Incorporate highlights of your existing garden, for instance a gazebo or arbor, into the scheme. Decide with your builder on the kind of stone to be used for pathways around your pond.

Perhaps you'll want a small, rustic terrace constructed nearby so guests can admire the carp whizzing to and fro. A grotto or other forms of recessed seating along the path to the pond are attractive ideas for individualizing the addition of a koi pond to your garden.

Select the location.

Choosing the perfect site for a koi pond is key to reducing maintenance while optimizing safety and enjoyment. Make sure the pond is built lower in the surrounding landscape, but not so low that runoff threatens the pond with fertilizer or other lawn chemicals. The pond should sit in an area that receives four to six hours of sunlight. A location fully exposed to the sun will cause issues of overheating and algae accumulation. Placement in full shade will prevent water lilies and other plant life from prospering.

Your builder will need to network with a licensed electrician to ensure safe placement and service for a pump and filters, decorative lighting and other amenities. The pond should also be constructed within access of water hoses and sprinkler lines.

Pick your fish.

There's a wide variety of koi to choose from. Distinguished by brilliant colors and patterns, the most popular types are the white-skinned, red-marked Kohaku; Asagi, with light blue and red markings; and Bekko, yellow skinned with black spots. Koi are hardy, resisting most parasites, and can live for 50 years. Koi are omnivorous, eating peas, watermelon and lettuce. But a specially designated, commercially available food is recommended, because it's nutritionally balanced and made to float, thereby bringing the fish to the surface. How to Afford Long-term Care

It's likely that at some point in your life you will need assistance with your daily activities. In fact, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services estimates that 70 percent of people over age 65 will eventually need long-term care, whether in a home setting, a senior living community or a nursing home.

Long-term care insurance can help cover the costs of these services and may help you preserve your financial resources. Keep these factors in mind if you're thinking about purchasing coverage:

Age. Look at long-term care insurance well before you need it. The older you are, the more you can expect to pay for your plan. Also, if you wait, it's more likely you'll have developed a health condition that may disqualify you from getting coverage. While there's no "right" age to buy, the American Association for Long-Term Care Insurance estimates more than half of long-term care policies are purchased by people ages 55 to 64.

Affordability. Coverage and cost vary, so shop around for a plan that will be reasonably affordable rather than choosing one that breaks your budget. The National Association of Insurance Commissioners recommends spending no more than 5 percent of your income on a long-term care policy.

Features. It's not easy to evaluate different plans. Be sure to compare these key features:

Benefit trigger. The criteria or event the insurer uses to determine when your policy will go into effect.

Elimination period. The number of days you'll pay for care out of your own pocket before you begin receiving benefits. Thirty days is the minimum elimination period for many long-term care plans.

Daily benefits. The amount the policy will pay on a daily basis. Some plans pay benefits based on the hours of service, such as the number of hours a home health aide visits your home.

Inflation adjustment. A feature that helps your benefits keep pace with rising costs.

Types of services. A description of what's covered under each plan and where you may receive this care — at home or in an assisted living residence, adult day care facility, nursing home or other setting.

Duration of benefits. The length of time you'll receive benefits, from a few years to as long as you live.

Exclusions. Stipulated conditions or acts that the benefits won't cover. These could include conditions caused by alcoholism or dangerous behaviors.

Mass Trouble

We are so scientifically advanced that we can now tell by a simple mathematical formula how overweight we are. A look in the mirror doesn't quite tell the entire story. The body mass index (BMI) measures body fat based on your height and weight. The score can be used as a screening tool to determine weight categories that may indicate your risks of developing diseases and conditions associated with being overweight or obese, such as premature heart disease, high blood pressure, stroke, type 2 diabetes, gallbladder disease with gallstones, breathing problems, high LDL cholesterol, osteoarthritis and some cancers. BMI discussed here is regarding adults. The criterion used for children and teenagers is age and sex specific for them. The BMI for adults does not use age or sex.

The BMI formula is weight in pounds divided by height in inches squared x 703 or weight (lbs.) / height (in.) x height (in.) x 703. If the formula is a bit complicated for you to calculate, you can go online and any number of websites will do it for you. A safe website operated by the National Institutes of Health that will safely calculate your BMI is www.nhlbi.nih.gov/guidelines/obesity/BMI/bmicalc.htm.

Your BMI categories:

18.5 or less	Underweight
18.5 to 24.99	Normal Weight
25 to 29.99	Overweight
30 to 39.99	Obesity

In interpreting your score, the higher the number, the more elevated your risks are for health problems. Here are some things to consider when taking note of your number: The BMI weight measurement consists of body fat and muscle. This can skew the results for some people. Usually older adults have a greater concentration of body fat than younger adults. Women, on average, have more body fat than men. Athletes have more muscle mass, whereas sedentary individuals have less muscle mass. Because of the increased muscle mass, trained athletes will have a higher BMI.

Since a look in the mirror and only one test on body mass cannot give you the whole story, it is wise to consult with your physician for guidance in these matters. However, if you are overweight, you can avoid many of the diseases by simply losing weight. Again, your doctor can assist you in the best plan for your health. Weight is only one part of so many debilitating diseases and disorders that interfere with the quality of life. Your physician will perform tests specific to you and order other tests as he deems appropriate to accurately determine your risk.

Creating new recipes or adding something special to an old favorite, thus making it new, is what Linda Rees enjoys the most about cooking. Sausage Squares

Note: If using a casserole dish, mix cheese directly into mixture.

- 1 1/2 to 2 lbs. sausage, cooked, drained and cooled
- 3 cups Bisquick or Pioneer mix
- 6 eggs
- 2 cups milk
- I lb. sharp cheddar cheese, grated

 Combine all ingredients except cheese.
 Pour mixture into a greased jelly roll pan or a 9x13-inch casserole dish

I. Mix all ingredients; let set overnight in refrigerator.

Chocolate Scotcherues

- 1 cup sugar
- I cup white corn syrup
- I cup peanut butter
- 6 cups Rice Krispies
- 1 6-oz. pkg. chocolate chips
- 1 6-oz. pkg. butterscotch chips

I. On medium heat, cook sugar and corn syrup until mixture bubbles; remove from heat.

2. Stir in peanut butter and Rice Krispies.

3. Press mixture into a buttered 9x13-inch dish; let harden.

4. Mix chips together. Place in microwave or double broiler and melt. Spread over Rice Krispies mix. Cool and cut into squares.

- 1/4 tsp. garlic powder
- 1/4 tsp. paprika
- 1/4 tsp. onion powder
- 1/4 tsp. pepper
- 3/4 cup celery, chopped
- 6 Tbsp. onion
- 1 8-oz. can sliced mushrooms
- 2 Tbsp. butter
- $1 \frac{1}{2}$ lbs. hamburger
- 1/2 cup slivered almonds

I. Cook rice for 10 minutes in 4 cups of water; drain.


2. Add soups.

3. Dissolve bouillon in 1 cup of boiling water; add bouillon, bay leaf and seasonings to mixture.

4. Sauté celery, onion and mushrooms in butter; add to mixture.

5. Brown hamburger; add to mixture; pour mixture into a large casserole dish. Cover; bake for 1 1/2 hours at 350 F.
6. Remove bay leaf; top with almonds and serve.
