An anniversary is a date on the calendar that is remembered because it holds special meaning for those celebrating. Such is the case for the Rev. G.J. and Sister Susan Rolen of Bright Morning Star Baptist Church. On September 11, they, along with Cheryl English, their congregation and special guests, will celebrate a ministry milestone as the church looks back over the past 150 years. The weeklong celebration will include nightly church services with guest speakers. The history of the church will be shared, and those who hold the lengthiest memberships will be honored. A formal banquet will be held the night prior to the celebratory close of the revival. "The church was definitely built on a strong foundation," Pastor Rolen stated, "but it was the Lord that held the church together."

Bright Morning Star Baptist Church hasn't always been at its present location. The church was established in 1866 in Telico, Texas, by a white minister, following a revival he held for the Negroes. The written history of the church does not list a name for the white minister, but it does note that approximately 200 people accepted Christ and were baptized during that weeklong event.

These 200 made up the initial membership roll for the newly organized church. The Rev. Furnace was called to lead the flock, and as the first African American pastor, he was able to successfully carry on where the white minister left off. For several years, services were held in different homes throughout the community. Later, a church



member by the name of Robert McQueen purchased a farm with a log cabin on it. He then donated the log cabin to the church, and it was there that the congregation planted their roots. Not long after, the land itself was donated to be used as a cemetery. In 1890, Bright Morning Star joined in the Friendship District Association. In 1921, the county built a new school in the Telico area and sold the old school to the church. Not long after the sell, the church burned and another building was constructed in its place. Even in the tough times, the church continued to grow in numbers.

In 1939, the church purchased an additional acre of land where a new church was erected. It was also at this time that they moved under the umbrella of the Rising Star Association. Construction of the new church was complete in 1943.

As time passed and Ellis County continued to prosper, people in Telico began to move to the city of Ennis. In 1958, the pastor at the time and the congregation decided to move "into town," too. They literally moved the church building into the city limits of Ennis, remodeled it and laid the cornerstone that remains in place today. "The history states that the membership increased greatly following the move," Pastor Rolen added.

Pastor Rolen first came to Bright Morning Star as a 16-year-old musician and Ennis High School student. After graduating from

EHS, he attended Navarro College in Corsicana and moved to Dallas. He spent four years in the military, stationed stateside in Oklahoma. As he was living his life, he met Sister Susan while attending a church service at New Hope Church in Altus, Oklahoma. He proposed on September 9, 1979, and she accepted. They were married two months later, on November 17, in a large ceremony in Dallas, where Pastor Rolen had retuned following his time in the service. "I planned a wedding with 15 bridesmaids, 15 groomsmen and 10 flower girls in two short months," Sister Susan explained. "We were married in a whirlwind."

As a young man, Pastor Rolen knew he had a calling on his life to minister, but like most, he felt unworthy. While serving as a deacon at Bon Air Baptist Church in Dallas, he finally relinquished his hold on the world and settled into the role God had called him into. After visiting several times at Bright Morning Star, they invited him to preach. In April 1982, he was installed as the head pastor of the church. "My entire time as a pastor has









been spent here at Bright Morning Star," he admitted. "I'm looking forward to seeing what God is going to do in the next 34 years."

Being a pastor's wife came natural for Sister Susan. "Before I became Pastor Rolen's wife, I was a child of God, and I have a deep love for all people," she said. "Growing up in the church prepared me for this journey."

The church has gone through many changes under the Rolen leadership. In 1989, just seven years following his calling to Ennis, Pastor Rolen made an announcement to the church body. "God told me it was time to tear the old building down," he explained. Without an edifice in which to worship, the congregation stayed together, fellowshipping with Corinth Baptist Church at the old Carver High School Gym in Ennis and several other churches

within the immediate area. "With a great deal of prayer and a lot of help, a new church building was constructed," he continued, stating they, the congregation, came home in 1991 to the new church building, and it's where they remain today.

The membership roll stands at 200. The future growth in this number is found in the younger members. "We have at least 75 youth," Sister Susan said. "You must have a young population to keep a church going."

"You've got to have crying babies in the church or the church will soon die," Pastor Rolen said with a smile. "A church is thriving when you hear a baby's cry."

Pastor Rolen and Sister Susan have been blessed with six children, 20 grandchildren and one great-grandchild, so to say several of the youth church members are immediate family would be an honest statement. "We have three generations serving in the church in several different capacities," Sister Susan said. "Some are in the youth choir and several more are musicians."

An anniversary of 150 years does not come without its ups and downs. The main force that has kept Bright Morning Star Baptist Church together is the strong foundation that was initially laid by a white minister. "It's taken strong roots and trust in God for us to have weathered the storms that come with 150 years," Pastor Rolen admitted.

The church is grateful, not only to God, but also to the white minister who cared enough to share his faith with others. "We thank the Lord for all the past members who prayed for the success of the church," Pastor Rolen said. "Sister Susan and I also thank the present membership for their dedication and continual support. We're looking forward to the next 50 years as our youth move into the roles they've been called to fill. We see great things on the horizon for Bright Morning Star."

Cars are fine-tuned machines that require precise care and attention. Everyone knows to keep the gas tank full, but sometimes people neglect some of the other steps needed to ensure the family vehicle keeps the family safe. By changing the oil regularly, keeping tires rotated or replaced and performing routine maintenance, you can keep your car working at its highest level.

### The Manual

• *Read it.* While your owner's manual may not be an exciting read, it is important to have a general idea of what it says. The manual will tell you what type of bulbs, fluids, tires and components to use for many of the jobs you can do on your own. It includes when to perform oil changes and other routine maintenance.

• *More than oil.* The manual will also list intervals for things like changing spark plugs, timing belts and other maintenance that often goes overlooked. Though you could neglect them and never have problems, these services are highly recommended and will help ensure your vehicle performs at its best.



### **Black Gold**

• *When to change oil.* Car lube stations put a little sticker on your car's front window to encourage you to change your oil every 3,000 miles, but that is probably more



• *Know your driving babits.* Make sure you are changing your oil based on the type of use your car gets. Stop-and-go driving, as well as driving in dirty or dusty areas, will mean you need to change the oil more frequently than optimized, highway driving requires.



• "W" means winter. The numbers that identify oil indicate how viscous the oil is, and how well it flows in cold and warm temperature tests. 10W-30 is considered the standard oil, but many modern vehicles require oil with alternate viscosity levels. Verify your car's preference in the manual, and then tell the shop. Otherwise, they will probably just use 10W-30.

• *Weigh the cost.* Synthetic oil holds up better, but it is costlier. Most oil companies offer blends, especially for higher-mileage vehicles, at a cost that may or may not be worth it. If you are not sure whether the extra cost is worth it, there are online forums for almost any specific make and model of car, where you can read the experiences of people with your same car.



### Caring for and Changing Your Tires

• *Check the pressure.* Changes in temperature will almost assuredly change your air pressure, as will any time you hit a curb or pothole. Even a car sitting for an extended period in the garage may lose enough pressure to need more air. Conversely, your tires may increase in pressure in the hotter months, so be ready to take air out as well. A tire lacking in air often looks flat, but a tire that is overinflated looks a lot like a normal tire, so always use a gauge, not just your eyeball.

• Look with your hands and eyes. If you notice any deviation in what should be a smooth, round shape, you might need a new tire. Tires start with a depth of 11mm, and need to be replaced when they reach 3 mm. But when checking depth, make sure to check the inner portion of the tire, which is often much more worn than the outer edge.

• Rotating is essential. Your tires need to be rotated every 6,000 to 8,000 miles. This is possible to do yourself if you have the

proper equipment, but there are plenty of inexpensive locations where you can have your tires balanced and rotated. Most tire shops will include lifetime tire rotations, either free or for a nominal fee, when purchasing new tires. And if you happen to be installing two new tires instead of four, make sure the new tires are in the rear of the vehicle, which gives the most stability, especially in wet conditions.

### Taking Care of Your Brakes

• Pay attention to warning signs. Unless something catastrophic happens, your brakes are not likely to stop working completely, but many components in your braking system wear down over time. If you hear your brakes making a squealing, grinding or any sound that is loud enough to hear over the engine, you may have an issue. In addition to sounds, you may notice your car wobble or shake when braking. In any of these instances, your best bet is to take your car into a shop to check components. It is wise to use an ASE-certified mechanic. Look for the blue seal indicating automotive service excellence before having work done on your vehicle.

### The Sticker

• Deciphering the system. The state of Texas has switched to a single sticker to track your car's registration and its safety inspection. While there are long-term benefits for the state and its residents, these first few years of implementation are proving to be slightly confusing. You will get your single sticker, if you have not already, when you register with the local tax office. In order to do that, you have to have a current inspection on file. Most counties will allow you to renew your registration online for an extra \$2, and the system will recognize whether your inspection is up to date. If you have not switched to the single sticker yet, just make sure to get a new inspection no more than 90 days before your next registration date.

You can never prepare for every situation you might face while driving your car. Following these tips, however, should prevent some issues and keep you and your family safe on the road.



# Pre-retirees Blindsided by Impact of Taxes on Retirement Income

Recent research focused on examining how individuals plan for and manage living expenses before and during retirement found that more than half of pre-retirees underestimate or don't even consider the effect that taxes may have on their income flow in retirement. Specifically, when pre-retirees were asked what they thought their top expenses would be in retirement most said "home/mortgage," "healthcare" and "travel/leisure" in that order. On average, when reviewing all household expenses paid on an annual basis, retirees reported spending the most on federal income tax.<sup>1</sup>

The lack of tax planning did not appear to be rooted in ignorance. In fact, a solid majority (62 percent) of those surveyed said they were aware of recent tax law changes, although tax law awareness levels shifted on a gender basis, with 66 percent of males indicating knowledge of recent tax law changes versus 53 percent of females.

When asked what actions they have taken to minimize taxes, 35 percent said they had itemized deductions while 22 percent indicated they rely on some types of tax-deferred investments. Further, more than half (57 percent) said that they had regular discussions with their advisors about tax laws and the implications those laws could have on retirement income, while a significant minority (43 percent) said their advisors did not discuss taxes with them. The study, "2013 — Expense Challenges of Age 62-75 Retirees," categorized respondents by age segments — 62 to 65, 66 to 70 and 71 to 75 — as a way to obtain a greater insight into the thoughts of the various groups. The data clearly illustrated that those aged 62 to 65 had more anxiety than other age segments about major retirement issues/concerns, such as outliving assets, health of self and/or spouse, generating enough income to maintain their desired lifestyle in retirement and leaving a legacy.

# A Sick Tooth

With your hand gingerly laid across your cheek and a grimace of pain on your face, you've just made the universal signal of a toothache. In the course of a lifetime, most of us experience a toothache at one time or another, whether the pain is from early childhood when teeth are growing, sensitive teeth in adulthood, foreign matter lodged in teeth, trauma to a tooth and/or an abscessed tooth. One thing is for sure: an aching tooth will not be ignored!

If the origin of the pain is from growing teeth or objects that become stuck between them, the situation can usually be resolved without medical intervention. However, an infection or periapical abscess that occurs at the root of the tooth needs the attention of a professional. An abscessed tooth is an infected tooth caused by a bacterial infection. Tooth decay is a major cause of the infection. Gum disease or some type of trauma to the tooth can set up the scenario for an infection to develop.

The most overwhelming symptom is pain. The pain can be sharp, throbbing or persistent and gnawing. There can be swelling of the face, fever, a foul taste in the mouth, sensitivity to the touch on the outside of the face and a feeling of malaise. If you have any of these symptoms, you need to be treated. If you begin to have difficulty breathing or swallowing, go to an emergency room right away. An infection in your mouth needs to be treated, or it will just get worse and cause additional problems — even death. According to *Journal of Endodontics*, over 400,000 people have visited emergency departments because of infections in their teeth.

The first step in lessening the pain and beginning eradication of the infection is to drain the pus or the abscess. If the tooth can be saved, a root canal or endodontic surgery will be performed. If the tooth cannot be saved, it will be pulled. You may also be prescribed antibiotics for the infection.

Neglecting your teeth increases your chances of not only dental abscess but gum disease. Limit your intake of sugary foods and drinks and in-between meal snacks. Brush your teeth twice a day, and don't forget to floss! Replace that frayed toothbrush every three months. An old toothbrush cannot do the proper job of cleaning. A fluoride and/or antiseptic mouthwash may aid in giving you extra protection. Above all, visit your dentist regularly. It may add to your expenses, but having your teeth cleaned is a lot cheaper than treating an abscess and restoring your tooth. **NOW**

# In the Kitchen With Karen Glaspy

Karen Glaspy learned to cook from her mother and grandmother who were both good cooks. "My mother had me in the kitchen cracking eggs and making pancakes as soon as I could talk and follow directions," Karen remembered. She and her husband, Joey, have five kids and seven grandchildren. "I love cooking for my family," she said. "Everyone has their favorites they expect me to have at family gatherings."

Traditional southern recipes and baking cakes are Karen's forte. An amateur baker, in May she created the wedding cake for her son, Jake, and his bride, Dixie. Granddaughter, Lillie, at age 5, loves to bake with Karen who revealed, "Lillie counts eggs, measures and times things, but her favorite part is licking the bowl."

#### **Mashed Potatoes**

This recipe serves a crowd. Potatoes can be covered and kept in refrigerator for 2-3 days until ready to bake.

# 8-10 lbs. potatoes Salt, to taste 1 16-oz. carton sour cream 2 8-oz. pkgs. chive and onion cream cheese 4 Tbsp. butter Pepper, to taste Paprika, to taste Chives, chopped, to taste

 Peel potatoes and cut into cubes. Add potatoes to stock pot. Cover with water; add salt. Cook until tender; drain and return to pot.
 Add sour cream, cream cheese, butter and salt and pepper, to taste.

**3.** Using a hand mixer, mix until smooth and creamy; pour into a buttered 13x9x2-inch baking dish.

**4.** Dot potatoes with additional butter; sprinkle lightly with paprika. Bake uncovered at 350 F for 30 minutes; garnish with chives.

#### Corn Pudding

Frozen whole kernel corn can be substituted for fresh.

1/4 cup sugar
3 Tbsp. all-purpose flour
2 tsp. baking powder
2 tsp. salt
6 large eggs
2 cups whipping cream
1/2 cup butter, melted and cooled
6 cups fresh corn kernels

 Combine first four ingredients; set aside.
 Beat eggs with a fork in a large bowl. Stir in whipping cream and butter; gradually add sugar mixture, stirring until smooth.
 Stir in corn; pour mixture into lightly buttered 13x9x2-inch baking dish. **4.** Bake at 350 F for 45 minutes, or until golden brown.

**3.** Cover roster tightly with foil; put in oven at bedtime to cook overnight.

#### Nez's Chocolate Pie

Crust: 1 1/4 cups flour 1 stick butter, softened 1/8 tsp. salt 2 Tbsp. cold water

Meringue: 3 egg whites 6 Tbsp. sugar 1 tsp. vanilla

Filling:

- I cup sugar
- 2 cups milk
- 3 egg yolks
- 5 Tbsp. flour
- 3 Tbsp. cocoa
- 2 Tbsp. butter 1 tsp. vanilla

 For crust: Combine flour, butter and salt; add cold water and mix until crumbly.
 Roll out crust and place in a greased pie pan; bake at 425 F until lightly browned.
 For meringue: Beat egg whites until stiff and glossy; add sugar and vanilla and combine.

4. For filling: Combine first five ingredients; cook over low heat until thickened.
5. Remove from heat; stir in butter and vanilla. Pour filling into cooled pie shell; top with meringue. Bake at 350 F until meringue sets and begins to brown.


