



The lessons his paternal grandmother offered have helped Peter Henderson throughout his life. It paid for Peter to listen to his grandma. "My dad had it ingrained in him by his mother Ineeze, a devout Roman Catholic, the importance of civil obedience and civil responsibility," Peter said. "She, in turn, insisted that he ingrain that in his children, and in no small way she helped him do that," he added with a chuckle. "To this day, some 60 years later, it's in me. It's part of the fabric of who I am."

The latest project for Peter, aka Pete, is being the new president of the DeSoto Citizen Police Academy Alumni Association. He took office in January, and true to his

reputation, he has tried to spark a fire in the organization. Since taking office, regularly attending members have expanded from 22 to 38, but he wants more — lots more. "Historically, there have been as many as 80 members, and we'd love to regain those membership levels," Pete said.

"He works hard, and we get him for free," said DeSoto Police Chief Joe Costa, with a smile. "That's his DNA. He loves to help. When people see people like Peter out there, it makes a difference. It gives the community a sense of comfort to know folks like him have confidence in the police. It's a testament to him."

The organization has been around since the early 1990s and is a volunteer group. Over the years, they have given the DeSoto community over 5,000 hours of service. In fact, it was part of that service that attracted Pete to the organization in 2014. "I was at Wal-Mart one day, and as a disabled vet, I went to park in a handicapped space," he said. "Then, this young man came running out and jumped in his car, which was parked there. The

next week the same thing happened, and I saw the DeSoto Citizens on Patrol issuing citations. It was through that incident that I was introduced to the organization."

The DCPAAA and COP assist the community and police department in a variety of ways. Among the things they do are help with senior symposiums, patrol neighborhoods and assist in neighborhood watches. "Heck, I was doing those things anyway, so I got involved," Pete said.

Although serious health issues forced his retirement in the spring of 2014 from the Department of Veterans Affairs, Pete had extra time. He had no doubt where to use it. "Since, I wasn't ready for a fishing bank or a rocking chair, I knew volunteering in the community was something I could do and something that I would love doing," he said.

Pete bears the name of his maternal grandfather, who was a member of

a former U.S. Army Buffalo Soldiers battalion in World War I. This is a group that still inspires Pete, and he commemorates it with memorabilia on his game room wall. "My granddad was part of an American Expeditionary Forces unit that cleared forestry for allied troops," he said. "They were on the front lines, got shot at, yet were mostly equipped with trenching tools and had no real artillery. Still, they worked hard, fought hand to hand on many occasions and made a big difference."

Hopefully, no member of the DCPAAA or COP ever gets shot at. But, they do help pave the way for police officers in the community through their support. "There's training in understanding police work, court proceedings and handling firearms," Pete said. "And being president can be demanding, but I'm an empty nester."

Pete grew up in Detroit, where he learned early on one of the great lessons

of life from his parents: "Stand for something, or you'll fall for anything." As a teen, he had a chance meeting with the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. through his grandmother. Though brief, it helped shape his passion for social justice. "He wasn't yet the prominent figure he came to be, but I knew there was something special," Pete said.

He had that same feeling years later when he encountered another famous individual. Like before, it was brief, but impressionable. "I was in the Navy, in Rome, in 1989, and Pope John Paul II was making his way through the streets in his famous Popemobile," Pete recalled. "He blessed the crowd on the corner where I was. I immediately got to a phone and called my grandmother. She talked about it the rest of her life. Her grandson got blessed by the Pope!"

Pete's career in private sector finance, health administration at the VA, and in the U.S. Navy have taken him to many cities around the world. He attests to having lived a blessed life, even though it was on a Navy ship where a freak accident gave him a knee injury that he said still "hurts like the dickens most days."

Pete lists many community involvement projects that began long before he and his wife, Denise, moved to DeSoto five years ago. They include: the Citizen Academy of the DeKalb County Police (Decatur, Georgia), Shelby County Sheriff Citizens' Academy (Memphis, Tennessee), Rotary International, 100

Black Men of America, American Legion, Disabled American Veterans, Habitat for Humanity, and being a national spokesman for Real Men Cook Charities.

"To know that he's active in Texas is not a surprise," said Audrey Newsome, a director at the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. "He has very high character. It was always a joy to work with him."

Among his goals for the DCPAAA is coordinating an advanced skills defensive driving course through the police department. He's also committed to becoming a COP trainer for the electronic citation system used for issuing fire lane and handicapped space tickets. "The judge can call up the photo on his computer in court," he said. "With the evidence in a picture, it makes for a stronger case."

But the main goal is to enlighten the community about the real work of the DeSoto PD. For example, Pete regularly speaks to citizens of all ages, handing out "Junior Police" badges, and he works the front desk at the DeSoto PD most Friday mornings. "We're ambassadors for law enforcement," he said.

Frank Styles of the Georgia State Patrol said DeSoto is fortunate to have such an ambassador. "His attitude, his laughter, sense of humor and his ability to get along with everybody regardless — those are such great qualities to have," Frank said. "He knows how to get people on his side."

And though he's moved a lot, DeSoto may well be his final stop. His sisters have relocated to the Metroplex, and one of his two sons is a chef in Fort Worth. "DeSoto fits. It's homey," Pete said. "And we've got a lot of great things we want to do helping our police department." NOW





One team he'd definitely like to continue to work with is Engineers Without Borders. He got heavily involved with the group while at Harvard and is hoping to find an opportunity to reconnect in Chicago.

While at Harvard, William was a leader for two years on a water distribution project in the Dominican Republic. Thanks to the work he and his team did, the rural community with whom they were working now has access to clean drinking water. William said his main contribution was helping design an electrical control panel. "Just getting on the ground and meeting people whose lives you're helping change for the better is the greatest feeling," William said. "I am looking to get involved with Engineers Without Borders as a professional leader with one of the local Chicago colleges."

Chris Lombardo, William's academic advisor at Harvard, was also his faculty advisor on the Engineers Without Borders project. He said such passion as William possesses can lead to a better world for all of us. He added that the

project, which began in the Dominican Republic, has now been expanded to Tanzania. "It's been amazing to watch him grow over the past three-anda-half years," Chris said. "He's obviously a very smart and intelligent person, and with his passion



the bombing occurred at the Boston Marathon on April 15, 2013. "They locked down the campus while they were chasing him around for a couple of days," William said of Dzhokhar Tsarnaev, one of the bombers. "They chased him to Watertown, a neighboring town of Cambridge. We were like, Whoa, this is happening right here, just across the river.' Though I felt pretty well protected on campus, it was crazy that it was so close."







Norvis and Jacquetta are people of hospitality, faith and service. Point of Light Church is their chosen place of worship. Passion fills her being as Jacquetta shares the work she gets to do each day with teachers and students. While Norvis could open his own practice as an audiologist, he finds fulfillment in working with the men of the military and plans to return to his field to serve veterans in the future. 













After recovering, she endured two more surgeries to correct the scoliosis in September of the same year. "I struggled with a painful recovery, tons of home-sickness and insecurity about the scars on my body," Julia recalled. "Trinity was a good school for me to attend, especially during this time," she said. She definitely was not forgotten.

At only 12 years of age, Julia not only had to recover from physical challenges, but she also had the challenge of being successful in school. She spent weeks in the hospital the year of her surgeries. However, she had a strong sense of determination to persevere and continue to be an exceptional student. While in the hospital, classes and tutoring were provided to help continue her studies while not enrolled in a traditional school setting.

Many times while battling with her struggles, she would think and cry out, "Why me?" Her friends were in sports and other activities that she was not allowed to participate in because of her delicate conditions. The biggest struggle for Julia was the recovery, because she did not feel secure in her own body. "I felt like my scars would repulse people, or they [people] would become overly protective of me," she admitted. "Without the support of my family, friends, school and the healing power of my Savior, Jesus Christ, not only would I still be ill, but I would not have accomplished the achievements I have today."







It was peaceful and somewhat symbolic of where she chooses to live in her spirit, rather than in the pit of despair.

She also gave her testimony in Costa Rica in hopes of encouraging others to push through their difficulties and overcome. "If others are going through a struggle, I want them to know they can come out of it victoriously. God can bring you through it," Julia said with sincerity and purpose. There is no doubt that this outstanding teen is headed in a direction that will bring light and life to others. While at times her faith was shaken during her struggles, she realizes that it is her struggles that are propelling her into a future with unlimited possibilities to make a huge difference in the lives of many. 
customers," she stated. "We try very hard to provide unique things that can't be found just anywhere."





In the Kitchen With Jocelyn Smith

Jocelyn Smith is from Detroit, Michigan, but her family originates from Alabama. "My grandmother and her seven sisters brought their recipes and 'country' way of cooking to the North," Jocelyn said. They had fried chicken for breakfast, lunch and dinner, always with grits with cheese and beefsteak tomatoes. Jocelyn was a tomboy and stayed away from the kitchen, other than for meals.

A military background provided Jocelyn an opportunity for cooking experimentation with simple dishes like eggs and sausages. "When I was stationed in Okinawa, Japan, there were two choices — eat chow hall food or learn to cook. I chose the latter," she recalled. Many of her crew would show up when she made breakfast. Here are her favorite recipes from her Southern breakfast feast. NOW

Fried Potatoes and Onions

- 2 Idaho potatoes
- I medium Vidalia or yellow onion (Vidalia are the best because of their sweet flavor.)
- 1 medium garlic clove
- 1/4 to 1/2 cup Canola or vegetable oil Lawry's Seasoning Salt or Tony
 - Chachere's Original Creole Seasoning, to taste

Pinch black pepper Pinch paprika Pinch Italian seasoning

- **1.** Rinse potatoes; dry with a paper towel. Peel the skin off and cut into 1/4-inchthick slices.
- 2. Peel onion and rinse; dry with a paper towel. Cut into 1/4-inch-thick slices. Slice or mince garlic.
- **3.** Cover the bottom of a 2- to 3-inch-deep frying pan with oil. Heat until oil is hot.

- 4. Place vegetables into the pan slowly and carefully. (Oil can pop if the potatoes and onions are wet or dropped too fast.) Turn the potatoes every 3-5 minutes until they are soft and the onions are sautéed.
- 5. Season to taste with Lawry's Seasoning Salt or creole seasoning. Add remaining spices and stir.

Breakfast Pork Chops

Lemon juice (optional) 6 thin boneless pork chops Paprika, to taste Black pepper, to taste

- 1 tsp. Lawry's Seasoning Salt or Tony Chachere's Original Creole Seasoning
- 2 Tbsp. virgin olive oil I clove garlic, chopped
- 1. Using lemon juice or tepid water, rinse and thoroughly clean the pork chops.
- 2. Once well rinsed, lay pork chops flat on

- a cutting board; tenderize by gently stabbing with a regular table fork 12-15 times.
- **3.** Season pork chops very lightly on each side.
- 4. Pour olive oil onto a flat griddle or into a large, heavy skillet. Heat to medium.
- 5. Add chopped garlic. Fry pork chops and garlic for a total of 5 minutes, turning each chop halfway through the cooking time, until brown on both sides. (They are very thin, so don't overcook them or they will be dry.)

Scrambled Eggs With Cheese and Mixed Peppers

- 3 small sweet peppers (orange, yellow and red)
- 2-3 eggs per guest
- 1/8 cup unsweetened almond milk (Do not use sweetened milk.)
- 1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese, or to taste
- 2 pinches sea salt
- 2 pinches black pepper
- 1 1/2 Tbsp. Land O'Lakes Unsalted **Butter**
- **1.** Wash peppers and remove the tops.
- 2. Cut peppers into halves; remove seeds and slice into 1/4- to 1/2-inch cubes.
- 3. In a large mixing bowl, whisk remaining ingredients, except butter, together. Add peppers and stir.
- 4. Heat a large frying pan on medium heat. Add butter and allow to melt. Pour egg mixture into the pan. Stir continually using a spatula or wooden spoon to prevent eggs from sticking or burning.
- **5.** Eggs should be done in less than 3 minutes and ready to serve.

Beefsteak Tomatoes

Tomatoes are absolutely necessary to complete a Southern breakfast!

Beefsteak tomatoes Sea salt, to taste Black pepper, to taste

- 1. Thoroughly rinse tomatoes; pat dry with a paper towel.
- 2. Cut tomatoes into four 1/4- to 1/2-inch slices.
- 3. Season with sea salt and black pepper and enjoy!
