

As the house lights fade, a hush falls across the theater. The magic of live performances has been part of Marc Speed's world since he auditioned for the Warehouse Living Arts Center's 2011 rendition of The King and I. He won the part of Prince Chulalongkorn. "That's how it all started. I knew the stage was where I belonged," Marc said.

Most recently named as UIL Bi-District Best Actor and to the All-Star Cast at district level due to his role in Corsicana High School's 2017 One-Act production of *The Scottish Tragedy*, which advanced to state, Marc has been busy adding 20 cast and crew credits to his growing résumé. He has appeared in WLAC and its Corsicana Children's Company productions, Collins Middle School and Corsicana High School One-Act plays, a production at the Ennis Public Theatre and productions at a summer theater camp and festival. Theater goers might remember him as a soloist in *Godspell*, the lead in *Pecos Bill*, or Oliver Warbucks in *Annie*. "Daddy Warbucks was a fun role, but the liquid latex makeup and bald caps weren't part of the fun," Marc recalled.

Marc is an all-around actor who sings baritone and can be trained in choreography. "I love musicals. It's a different art because it requires me to be a triple threat. It's much more physical," he explained.

If his name isn't listed as part of the cast, one only has to look a little further through most local playbills to find Marc listed as a crew member. His first technical experience was in *Annie Get Your Gun*, when he both served as prop manager and performed in the chorus. In *Little Women* and *Secret Affairs of Mildred Wild*, Marc was the stage manager. "I can build sets. My study of math, science and physics comes in handy," he said.

Now that he's achieved his high school graduation, Marc can look back while accessing his prior theatrical experiences and mentors who have brought him to this point. "I love that the WLAC and CCC are focusing on the new generation that's not yet sure of where they want to go or what they want to be. Our casts and crews were always very diverse

— Calico members, football players, cheerleaders — we all could show up and make the company who it was and what it was," Marc said. He counts Sandra Mahood as his first mentor. "She gave me my first role." Marc has formed great memories with Jamey Pritchett, Kati Tibbits and Annot Walthaw, as well as Todd Jones, at WLAC. "Todd played my father and still calls me 'son.' He taught me what it's like to love theater," Marc explained.

During his years at CHS, Marc's talents grew under the tutelage of the mother/ daughter theater directing team of Gloria "Mrs. Mac" and Azure McLuckie. Both McLuckies, along with a former One-Act play judge and CHS graduate, have encouraged him to become an actor and go into education. "Marc can go wherever he wants to go and do whatever he wants to do," Mrs. Mac said. "He's fearless and his analyzation of a character goes further than he's asked to do."

Accepted into the New School of Drama in New York City, Marc is on reserve status for a year while he awaits word on a scholarship. In the meantime, he's following in his family's Aggie footsteps and will be attending Texas A&M University-Commerce. "College Station doesn't have a theater program, but both the Commerce and Corpus campuses do," Marc explained. Eventually, he wants to earn a master's degree in acting and directing with a minor in Shakespeare. "I want to professionally act on Broadway and in touring shows and do some film work. I have plans to own my own theater company and direct."

Through Mrs. Mac, Marc was introduced to the Summer Theatre Camp at Southwestern University and to the Texas State Thespian Festival. "Marc has matured in his last two years," Mrs. Mac stated. "He's served as a Texas State Thespian officer, and through that experience, he has learned to be a leader and listen to everyone. He's now known around the state and nation." "Mrs. Mac's great. She's had five UIL One-Act play state championships out of 17 state appearances," Marc said. A great memory from last year's One-Act play occurred when the CHS company beat the previous year's state champions.

Marc loves to people watch and draws much of his characterizations from that habit. "I'm always wondering what people's stories are," he said. "I love being able to become someone else and tell their struggles and achievements. I want to give my best, so audiences come to the theater with blank minds and learn something that will be relevant to them."

He finds live performances challenging. "We're completely vulnerable," Marc revealed. A former CHS football player, Marc noted the difference between football and live theater. "In football, the players are still being directed by coaches from the sideline during their practices and games. In theater, we rehearse instead of practice. We become the character, while living in the moment. It's always new, so when the lights go out and the curtain goes up, it's strictly each actor who's in charge." Marc's "dream role" would be to play William Kempe in A Cry of Players, the story of young Shakespeare in Stratford.

Lifeguarding at the Corsicana YMCA and the Corsicana Country Club, where he was also a waiter, has kept Marc busy during his spare time. He has also started his own photography business. "I've learned about lighting, which is another art form," he said. He's also competed successfully in a UIL poetry and prose competition.

His parents, Ron and Cassie Speed, have been supportive in every way, as is Marc's sibling, Matthew, and his fiancée, Madison Nelms. "Matthew watched me play Captain Hook in *Peter Pan*, and was blown away," Marc remembered. His mom and dad were at the state UIL meet in Austin.

Well-traveled already, Marc will be leaving the old, restored downtown buildings of Corsicana that he loves so much for new theater experiences. He hopes to one day work with two professional actors whom he admires — Hugh Jackman and Bette Midler. In the meantime, Marc takes with him every company and person who's been along on his journey. "We know we fulfilled our purpose," he concluded, "and can cherish and hold dear to our hearts the successes achieved." **NOW**

Fire can burst forth at any time, ravaging the countryside, consuming people's homes and livelihoods in what is still a very rural Navarro County. From Richland to Kerens to Rice to Silver City, county residents and businesses outside the city of Corsicana depend on their local volunteer firefighters to serve as their first responders. It's a tall order, but the 23 volunteer fire departments of the Navarro County Volunteer Firefighters Association stand daily at the ready. "The association's focus has always been to obtain training and equipment needed to improve the fire service in Navarro County," Jeannie McCarty, association president, said.

The year was 1980. "Kenneth 'T-Bone' Stovall, my brother; Earnest Cook; and myself, representing Kerens, attended the association's first meeting along with representatives from the Corsicana, Frost, Blooming Grove, Richland, Chatfield and Dawson departments," Ted Stovall recalled. By 1981, the NCVFA was chartered. "I had joined the Kerens VFD in 1961 after having been awakened about 2:00 a.m. by a fire across the street from my house. I bailed out of bed and fought that fire," Ted said. Despite his and others' efforts, the fire took a life that night. Just like most volunteer firefighters, Ted and his brother were recruited into



the department by word-of-mouth. "John Seales and Dickie Crawford begged us to join. The department only had one truck that had been built by a fireman in town. We still have that truck, but it's not used anymore," Ted added.

Serving in a VFD is often a family affair. Ted's son, Terry Stovall, serves in the Kerens VFD alongside him. "We've got to be crazy to volunteer and do this," Ted said. "If volunteers are in it for the T-shirt or to look important, they're in it for the wrong reasons."

Jeannie serves as the disaster program manager for the Red Cross. "Most of my

family are volunteers in some capacity. My brother, Pete Ellington, is a past president and charter member of the NCVFA, as is his oldest son, John Ellington. Volunteer firefighters are some of the best people."

Formerly, volunteers fell under the Good Samaritan Laws, which meant training wasn't required. Today, each volunteer must have 70 hours of initial training followed by 40 hours of ongoing training per year. "We spend a week of our vacation time from work every year at Texas A&M University's Fire Academy," Terry explained. "The volunteers' expenses while attending are covered by their departments. "The chief of each department oversees making sure everyone is trained, and the Texas Fire Marshals Association keeps up with all the training and establishes the rules and regulations."

Advances in technology, communications, trucks and equipment and firefighting tools are making the job more efficient, but are costly to VFDs. "Air packs, trucks capable of spraying compressed air foam and heat sensors, are just some examples of what we spend grant monies and donations on. Compressed air foam systems are very important in rural areas because it saves water, which we must usually haul to a fire, but it costs \$30,000 extra to equip the truck," Terry stated.

While departments want to insure their volunteers' safety with the use of the latest equipment, it's costly, too. "It costs us about \$8,000 to outfit each firefighter," Ted said.

The challenges are great. More members are always needed - as are funds. All VFDs are 501(c)(3) designated and the Navarro Community Fund distributes monies to all 23 departments annually. Grant writing is a constant necessity, as are the usual fundraising efforts of each department - the annual fish fry or barbecue dinners, open houses or buckets for donations at county events.

Rural residents can help in another way by doing things around their acreage that will help prevent fires. Ted and Terry suggested the following: When getting ready to burn a brush pile, plow around it so no pasture grass will catch on fire and spread. Never burn outdoors on a windy day. Cedar burns like gasoline. Plant evergreens around a house, but not cedar. Mow grass as short as possible around structures, and keep it watered. (However,

green grass can burn if the fire is hot enough.) Don't pop fireworks in rural areas.

The camaraderie between firefighters and the different departments is a plus for members. "I have learned so much from this group of dedicated people and have come to appreciate each unique individual and their contribution, and believe me, we have some characters!" Jeannie said.

Under their mutual aid agreement, not only do the association VFDs work together often, but they are supported by the Corsicana Fire Department and the Powell VFD, which are affiliated members of the NCVFA. Additionally, Kerens VFD has a mutual aid agreement with their neighbor, the Trinidad VFD. When tough fires or tough times hit, the volunteers support each other, and tough times are a part of their work.

Ted and Terry cite Black Sunday and the Labor Day that followed as one of their hardest experiences. "For two days, we had grass fires going everywhere across the county, and eight structures burned inside Corsicana's city limits," Ted said.

The worst of times for Jeannie came during the West fertilizer explosion and fire in which Perry Calvin, a member of the Navarro Mills VFD, died. "Anytime there's a loss of life, whether it be someone we serve or one of our own members, it leaves a mark on our souls," she said.

An annual awards banquet is held by the association. "It's a coming together time," Terry said. Individuals and departments are awarded for their service. The NCVFA also meets monthly every third Tuesday at the Red Cross offices on Medical Drive at 7:30 p.m. Robert Slovak serves as vice president and Debbie Watson serves as secretary/treasurer. Membership is open to any volunteer firefighter residing in or volunteering in Navarro County. The association has five standing committees and offers a scholarship to the Navarro College Fire Academy in memory of Sandy Watson, Debbie's late husband.

A lifelong Chatfield resident, Jeannie said, "Time and again, I have seen the people of Navarro County generously pull together for the common good. What can citizens do to help our volunteers if they don't or can't volunteer? Find out which department serves your area, meet the volunteers, tour the station, see their equipment and find out their needs. Help us to help you!" **NOW**

"I've got a photo of her looking just like Annie Oakley!"

Travis was born and raised in Chatfield. He is the fifth generation of his family born there. He graduated from Blooming Grove High School and the North Texas Fire Academy. He apprenticed as an electrician while attending fire academy, ultimately graduating from the EMT program at Navarro College. Travis serves as a captain with Corsicana Fire Rescue and volunteers with the Chatfield VFD. 
The family moved into a travel trailer on the land while building their home. "Talk about motivation to get it finished," Travis said.





property anchors the open living, dining and kitchen area with its soaring ceiling. Holly's mom made both the rugged cross and a wreath, which hang on the walls, framed by spectacular views. Macy designed the dining table's chandelier from an antique wagon wheel, metal crosses and blue mason jars. Help was needed when Travis began installing the real butcher block kitchen countertop around the farm sink. "I stained the wood when it was 40 F in here," Holly revealed. Her collection of antique cooking utensils, including her grandmother's ladle, is set above the cabinets.

The hallway to Travis' library also leads to a powder room. Macy, already quite the artist, chalk painted the old mirror and magazine rack. Travis' library has the best views," Holly explained. 



## Cashing Out Your 401(k)

The purpose of a 401(k) plan is to help you save for retirement. When you participate in the plan, you may be able to take out a loan against your 401(k) account balance, but you might not be able to take a 401(k) withdrawal.

### Hardship

Some plans will allow you to take out the money that you contributed in the event of a true hardship, such as high medical bills due to a serious illness in the family. Other hardship needs allowed by federal regulations, in addition to payments for certain medical expenses, are: costs related to the purchase of a principal residence; tuition and related educational fees and expenses; payments necessary to prevent eviction from, or foreclosure on, a principal residence; burial or funeral expenses; and certain expenses for the repair of damage to your principal residence. However, your employer may elect for all, some or none of these needs to be eligible for hardship withdrawals from the 401(k) plan. Also, if you receive a hardship withdrawal from the 401(k) plan, you may not be able to contribute to your account for six months. These withdrawals will generally be subject to both income tax and a 10-percent tax penalty (for participants under age 59 1/2), so they need to be used as a last resort in a serious emergency.

### Leaving your job

Of course, when you leave a job, you can take your 401(k) balance with you. If you roll over your 401(k) balance into an IRA or your new employer's retirement plan, your money will continue to grow for retirement.

That big lump sum that you receive when you leave your job may be tempting. You could just take the money and spend it on whatever you like instead of rolling it over. That's not financially responsible, though, as you will generally have to pay income taxes on the funds withdrawn as well as a 10-percent penalty tax unless you are age 59 1/2 or older. That makes the withdrawal very expensive. So if you are leaving your job to go back to school or to start a business and can find a student loan or a small business loan with a low interest rate, you may be better off borrowing the money. Then, you can keep your retirement fund safe for retirement.

#### Tax considerations

If you have left your employer and are over age 59 1/2, you don't face the 10-percent federal tax penalty if you take your 401(k) balance as a taxable distribution. You will have to pay taxes on the total amount withdrawn unless part of the funds are Designated Roth Contributions. Beginning at age 70 1/2, required minimum distributions (RMDs) will be necessary for any balance kept in the 401(k) plan. You should consult with your tax advisor before taking a taxable distribution from your 401(k) plan. If you are still employed, the 401(k) plan may limit withdrawals of your account balance even if you are age 59 1/2 or older.

### In the Kitchen With Nicki Biggs

Growing up as the middle child of six children, Nicki Biggs can't remember a time she didn't cook. "Baking is my absolute favorite kind of cooking. I love cooking with vanilla in desserts and sweets," Nicki said. She passed on her techniques to her daughters and is now enjoying teaching her 10-year-old grandson, Aiden, how to cook. "He's getting good at measuring, and he can use the mixer," she said proudly.

Nicki serves as a deaf-education interpreter for Corsicana ISD and the Cowboy Church of Ellis County. However, she's known by friends, family and co-workers as the "pie lady" or "cake lady." "I love sharing what I cook," Nicki explained. "My hope is that everyone enjoys eating it as much as I enjoyed making it."

### A Good Cake!

Note: This recipe can be used with any flavor cake mix and matching flavored vanilla pudding.

Shortening or nonstick cooking spray Flour for dusting 4 eggs, separated 1/2 cup sugar 1/2 cup vegetable oil 1 cup water 1/2 cup milk 1 Betty Crocker vanilla cake mix 1 1.34-oz. box vanilla pudding (optional)

Preheat oven to 350 F Prepare a 9x13-inch pan by coating bottom and sides with shortening or nonstick cooking spray and dusting with flour; set aside.
 In a medium-sized bowl, beat the egg whites on high until fluffy. Add sugar, and beat until stiffened; set aside.

**3.** In a large bowl, combine egg yolks, oil, water and milk; beat on low until mixed well.

4. Add the cake mix; beat. Add the pudding mix;

beat on high 4-5 minutes until smooth.5. Reduce mixer to low speed. Fold in egg white mixture; scrape the bottom and sides of the bowl to blend mixtures well.

**6.** Pour the batter into the prepared pan; bake 35-40 minutes or until the cake begins to pull away from the pan's sides, and a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean.

**7** Allow to cool; apply any chosen flavor of frosting.

### Hello Dolly Bars

Crust:

- 1 1/2 cups graham cracker crumbs
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup butter, melted

Toppings:

- 1 1/2 cups pecans, chopped
- 1 10-oz. pkg. cinnamon chips
- 1 8-oz. pkg. dates, chopped
- 1 14-oz. can sweetened condensed milk

 Preheat oven to 350 F. In a 9x13-inch pan, mix the graham cracker crumbs and sugar. Add the melted butter; mix. Firmly press into pan's bottom.
 Layer pecans, cinnamon chips and dates on the crust; drizzle the condensed milk evenly over the dates.

**3.** Bake for 30-35 minutes; cool 15-20 minutes before cutting into squares.

4. Variation 1: Substitute walnuts, butterscotch chips and coconut for the first three topping ingredients.
5. Variation 2: Substitute almonds, white chocolate chips and coconut for the first three topping ingredients.
6. Variation 3: Substitute peanuts, peanut butter & chocolate chip morsels and Chinese noodles for the first three topping ingredients.

### Wooden Spoon Bread Pudding

Bread Pudding: Nonstick cooking spray 5-6 cups bread, cut into 1- to 2-inch cubes 4 eggs 4 cups milk 1 Tbsp. cinnamon 1 cup sugar 1/4 cup vanilla 1 1/2 cups pecans (optional) Whipping cream, to taste

Caramel Sauce: 1 1/2 cups sugar 1/2 cup water 1 cup cream 3 Tbsp. butter

**I.** *For bread pudding:* Preheat oven to 350 F. Prepare dish with nonstick cooking spray; layer the bread cubes.

**2.** In a large bowl, whisk the eggs; add milk, and stir well until blended.

**3.** In a small bowl, mix the cinnamon with sugar; add to the milk mixture. Add vanilla.

**4.** Pour the pecans over the bread crumbs; add the milk mixture, and press the bread, so it soaks up the milk mixture.

**5.** Let stand for 15-20 minutes before baking. Place in center of the oven; bake for 50-60 minutes or until center has a firm jiggle and an inserted knife comes out clean.

**6.** For caramel sauce: In a medium-sized heavy saucepan, add sugar and water; heat on medium for 5 minutes, stirring constantly.

**7.** Continue cooking for another 10 minutes without stirring. When mixture turns to amber, turn off heat; slowly pour in cream; blend with a whisk.

**8.** Carefully keep stirring; add butter, stirring until it melts.

**9.** Pour sauce over top of bread pudding; serve warm with whipping cream.
