"Although the breakfast area can seat 12, for the Fourth of July, we were out on the big, screened porch," Eve explained. "That is what living on the lake is all about."





Through 31 years of marriage the Nemeths have faced the ups and downs of life together — even cancer.

Laughter is good medicine and prayer is powerful. It was laughter, mixed with a great deal of prayer that brought Dan and Beth Nemeth through their battle with cancer. Today, they are survivors.

The couple's oldest daughter, Shea Gore, was with them at the doctor's office when they received the news. "They both were diagnosed with cancer on the same day," Shea said, remembering her initial shock. "I just kept thinking they were too young for this to be happening."

When a member of the family is diagnosed with cancer, it affects the whole family. When both parents are diagnosed on the same day, that day becomes the family's personal Sept. 11. "March 11, 2005, became our 9/11 moment," Dan said. "It was the first thing that came to my mind."

To fully understand how blessed this family feels today, one must go back to several months before the nightmare began. The Nemeths had their home in Corsicana and a weekend home on Cedar Creek Lake. They had been discussing the possibility of putting the weekend home on the market. "Being a water lover, I wanted to sell the home in Corsicana and be a permanent lake dweller," Beth said. "Dan felt we needed to sell the lake house. As I was praying about it, Sherry Bryson, a Realtor friend of mine, called me before I had the chance to call her. I said, 'Okay, Lord, I get the picture.""

The lake house was listed, and within two months they received an offer, closing the deal on Feb. 11, 2005. "We

took off for the weekend to celebrate our 29th wedding anniversary," Beth said.

Beth had been having trouble with bronchitis long before the process of selling the lake house got underway. Between the time that the house was listed and sold, she was sent for a chest X-ray. The X-ray showed a spot in Beth's right lung, so she went for a CT scan just one week prior to closing on the house. One week after they returned from their weekend celebration, Dan entered into the medical picture as well. He had been having some trouble of his own.

While Dan saw one doctor in Dallas, Beth underwent a PET scan because of the spot also seen in the CT scan. On March 11, 2005, Dan was scheduled to have a colonoscopy. Needless to say, the results showed the unexpected – colon cancer. "Shea drove her father home after he had a full body CT scan," Beth said, replaying the events of that day. "My son, Brian, drove my car home, while my mom and stepfather took me on to my appointment. The PET scan showed a 'glow' in my lung. There was something there that had to come out."

The journey through cancer truly began for the family when they received the diagnosis, and ended with a prayer of thanksgiving on Oct. 20. The timeline of events during this eight-month period began with a visit to the surgeon, Dr. Jason Harrison, who has relocated to the Dallas area since the surgeries. "We had our surgeries right here in Corsicana

at Navarro Regional Hospital," Beth said. "When the surgeon first spoke to us and told us he and his wife had already been praying for Dan and I, that was all I needed to hear to find comfort in staying close to home."

Shortly thereafter, Dan received a port and Beth was admitted to the hospital for her initial biopsy. "The tissues didn't look good, so a resection

and thoracotomy was done on my right lung," Beth said. "The 'spot' was determined to be Carcinoid cancer, a rare cancer that can show up anywhere in the human body, while all the lymph nodes came back negative." Thanks to the negative reading, all Beth had to undergo to rid her body of the parasite was surgery.

On April 7, Dan had one more test, a PET scan, to make sure his cancer was only in the colon. Eighteen days later, he was admitted to the hospital where he had a colon resection. "His lymph nodes tested positive," Beth said, "so chemotherapy treatments were required." Two weeks later, Dan had his first treatment. A chemo drip was started on a Tuesday and ran for 48 hours. After they returned home from having the pouch removed, they

received a phone call stating that Dan's father had passed away. "Daddy was unable to fly because of the recent surgery," added Shea, who had become her parents' primary caregiver. "I took a week's vacation from work and drove him to Pennsylvania for the funeral."

Dan's pump was removed on Oct. 20, following his final chemo treatment. "We walked out of the clinic," Beth said, still smiling, "and let out a big 'woo-hoo,' thanking God [that] it was finally over." In April 2006, Dan went in for another colonoscopy and all was clear. It was another "woo-hoo" moment for the family.



Shea is the eternal optimist in the family, though that is not to say that the rest of the clan is all about "gloom and doom." In the beginning, she kept telling her mother that the spot in her lung was nothing to worry about, and had hoped the first colonoscopy her father underwent was just routine for a man his age. "I just like to always think positive," Shea said. "As their caregiver, I tried to always be patient, loving and kind. I learned to put my own feelings and emotions on the back burner."

The family has learned to take one day at a time. A doctor's visit may still cause a bit of apprehension, but they look back and know without a doubt











that everything happened for a reason. "I can't help but see God's hand guiding us through it all," Beth said, referring to the chain of events leading up to the cancer diagnoses, the trips to the hospital for chemotherapy treatments, the meals provided by



their Cornerstone Baptist Church family and the care they received from family members and friends. "It was a hard year, but God makes people stronger through trials."

On Sept. 23, the first ever "Survivor/Caregiver Appreciation Day" will be held at Camp Wanica. The free event promises to offer a time where those touched by cancer can come together to fellowship with one another, while enjoying all the special activities planned throughout the day. Activities will include an old-fashioned picnic, horseshoes, games and even a dessert contest. You can bet that Dan, Beth and Shea, along with the rest of their family and friends, will be in attendance. "In fact, we're looking forward to it," Shea said. "It's part of this remarkable journey we're on as a family."



Ira Bradford Jr. is a country western singer like none other. His style of performing often involves an interactive evening, dancing with his audience, but he is known for singing country ballads with an impressive voice that has been likened to the style of George Strait, Alan Jackson or Merle Haggard. "I feel comfortable on stage with every song I do, because I pick songs that fit me. Whether it is a ballad or an upbeat song, I do what fits me," Ira said.

He has had the opportunity to meet many notable country singers, including Charlie Pride and Reba McIntyre. "She is the most awesome human being. I got to sit on her bus and talk with her." One memorable time, when Ira was getting ready to do a performance, he got a phone call from Merle Haggard's son. "He was scheduled to be where I was playing, and we did some duets of some of his dad's

of some of his dad songs together."

Ira stands alone though, with his unique singing and dancing. "Everywhere we go, even the Dallas clubs, we always get a fan base. I think we are the only local country band that actually plays in the highly competitive Dallas area. Because of the quantity of talented

bands in DFW, it is hard to play up there without a very good resume. My band has performed at Billy Bobs in Fort Worth, Post Time in Dallas, Boots and Saddle Club in Dallas,

> Neon Cowboy in Dallas, Boot Scootin' Barbeque in Rowlett and other top clubs in the area including Cowboy's in Arlington and WWFairfields," he stated.

Wherever he performs, Ira is greeted by fans.
"With my style, I am different from most performers," he explained.
"My fans all know that if they want me to dance while I am performing, I will take my guitar off,

"If I'm on stage, they say I am pretty energetic, depending on the song. The easiest part of performing is to just be myself." Being himself leads to busting loose with some dance moves, and no doubt led to the name of his band, "Ira Bradford & Bustin' Loose." It is a five-, and sometimes six-piece band. Ira is the lead vocalist, and he also strums a Takamine acoustic guitar. The

nucleus of the band has remained the same over the years. "Gary Cooper doesn't play full time now, but he has been with me from day one as my keyboard player. Jeff Valek of Ennis has been with me for nine of our 12 years. He is the lead guitarist, and he also works at Leggett & Platt with me." Ira is a quality assurance manager at Leggett & Platt in Ennis, where he has worked for 17 years. The second lead on electric guitar is Mark Bowling. "Both my lead guitar players are awesome guitar players," Ira said. Jim Stovall is the bass player, and Mike O'Conner is on drums.

The band plays basically every weekend, often being booked on a yearly basis for regular monthly engagements by area clubs. They can be seen at Coal Miner's in Malakoff. 


Cutting

Walking onto the Crouch's farm is like walking into an equestrian haven. The barns are set against the far back section of the land. When walking through the main barn, it is easy to see that each stall is neatly kept with fresh saw dust. Labeled plaques distinguish which horse resides in each stall.

Casey and Chelsa Crouch, married eight years, are cutting horse riders. Their way of life entails traveling from show to show on the weekends, seeing new places and experiencing exciting adventures. "We are gone every weekend from the day after Christmas to early November," Chelsa said. "It never gets old." Casey agrees with his wife. "It is ever-changing, and there's always something different. Sure we get tired, but after we're off one weekend, we're ready to go again," he admitted. The couple definitely has a real knack and talent within the cutting horse industry. Casey is the youngest trainer to be inducted into the American Cutting Horse Association (ACHA) Hall of Fame with three World Champion titles in three different classes under his belt.

It is quite obvious that Casey loves what he does. He has a real gift for the sport of riding, especially when it comes to cutting horses. "They are all unique animals; their physical aspect is phenomenal," Casey said. It is a rigorous sport for the animal, as well as the rider. Casey explained that the animal is controlled and directed solely by the use of the rider's gluteus maximus muscles and legs, so a long ride or event can be physically draining.

Casey further explained that the training process the horses, trainers and riders must all go through to prepare a horse for showing is tedious and a bit time-consuming. When a yearling is brought to Casey, it typically takes about 90 days




to break a horse, from "catch" to "saddle" to "safe." Once the horse is broken, it then goes through another 45 days of training that includes 35 - 40 days of saddling and about 10 days of riding, with 25 - 30 total rides. Finally, at about 3 years of age, the horses are ready for showing. During the week





while they are home, Casey rides the younger horses almost daily. The horses that went to a show the previous weekend earn Monday and Tuesday off, while the older horses that have been involved in years of shows are run through exercises, but do not typically get ridden that much.

The work never ends, even at the shows. "The horses that aren't trying during an event are worked between events at the shows. If they are trying, then we leave them alone or what we









call 'knock the cow fresh off," Casey explained. The slang term simply means that perhaps the horse has gone too long between events and just needs a bit of freshening up before its next event.

Casey, who has been riding since the age of 6, and a professional cutting horse rider since the age of 18, manages the family's farm, trains horses and organizes all the events they will be attending. Chelsa explained that Casey



is a professional, whose winnings earn him circuit respect and a reputation among other riders. "With Casey having won 7th in the National Cutting Horse Association show, it proves that he is a good rider and a successful trainer," she said proudly. Chelsa herself is considered a non-professional rider, not amateur, by association to her professionally-titled husband. She started her career off in the rodeo circuit, riding and goat tying. She won her first buckle at the young age of 5 and loves the art of cutting horses. "It is amazing to watch them work," she enthused.

To really make a name for yourself in the cutting horse circuit, you have to earn your way through various affiliated shows. Some of the more recognized and notable shows include the Eastern National Championship, which takes place in Jackson, Mississippi, and is one of Chelsa's favorites. To move on from there, you have to qualify in the top 10 of your area. Then after working your way up through the various shows, you can eventually be invited to participate in the World Finals, which takes place in Amarillo, Texas, every February for the preceding year. This year, Casey managed to bring home 7th place out of the top 50 horses in the world.

Obviously, they make a strong team. Casey admits that Chelsa is his rock. "She is there to pick me up," he stated. "She is my intermediate if I am having a bad week." They support each other completely in every aspect of their equestrian activities. "It is a family thing," Chelsa said.



elen was born during the Depression, but never knew how bad things were. "My daddy had a meat market, so we always had meat and we had our grandmother's garden," she said. Helen recalled that stores only had the basics, but her parents never let on that times were hard financially. "We were fed and loved well," she remembered.

MOM'S DRESSING BREAD

1 cup flour

2 cups cornmeal

1/2 tsp. baking soda

2 tsp. black pepper

1 tsp. salt

6 eggs, beaten

4 Tbsp. melted butter

1 1/2 cups buttermilk

Butter the baking dish well. Combine first 5 ingredients, then add eggs, melted butter and buttermilk. Bake at 350 F until golden brown. Let cool. (Can be made ahead of time.) Add any other ingredients you prefer to the mix for dressing. I like to crumble the bread and add it to other prepared biscuits, cornbread or day-old bread.

MOM'S WILTED LETTUCE SALAD

3 - 4 slices bacon Head of lettuce

2 - 3 eggs, hard-boiled and sliced

In a skillet, cook 3 - 4 slices of bacon, drain and tear into pieces. Reserve drippings. In a serving bowl, tear 3 - 4 handfuls of lettuce. Combine the slices of eggs and bacon pieces with the lettuce. Lastly, drizzle the warm bacon drippings over the mixture. Lightly toss.

MOM'S PEACH COBBLER

1 cup flour

1 cup sugar

2 tsp. baking powder

3/4 cup milk

1 29-oz. can O'sage Raggedy Ripe Peaches

Mix and blend flour, sugar, baking powder and milk. Roll into crust and place into a well-buttered 9 1/2 x 12 x 2-inch casserole dish. Pour peaches, juice and all, onto crust, breaking up the larger peach pieces with a spoon. Bake at 350 F for 45 minutes to an hour until crust is light brown. First layer will rise to the top.





Divide and Conquer

September is finally here, so can fall be just around the corner? It is time to think in terms of what you want your yard and beds to look like next year! Any of those big clumps of perennials (the ones that come back year after year) that did not bloom as well as you would have liked, or have outgrown their space, need to be attacked this month. A sharp spade will help get them out of the ground so you can ruthlessly hack them into two or more parts. Use several large pieces to fill the space back in, and then spread them around! Just remember to water them daily for a week after you make the move, and then let nature take its course.

Daisies, irises, daylilies and Turk's-cap lilies all respond well to division with added vigor and blooms the next year. If you just want to trim back some of your grasses and

bushes, now is the time to consider doing it. If you wait too long, the new growth stimulated by the trimming will not have time to harden off before the first freeze.



Prostate Cancer: What's a man to Do?



Prostate cancer is now the most commonly diagnosed cancer among men, excluding skin cancer, and is now the second-leading cause of cancer death in men. An estimated 30,350 American men will lose their lives to prostate cancer this year alone. This is more new cases than any other form of cancer, and represents 33 percent of all new cancer cases in American men.

Prostate cancer is nearly 100 percent survivable if detected early. Because there are often no early warning signs or symptoms, however, the only way to detect this disease in its early stages is through a simple blood test (PSA) and a digital rectal exam (DRE). Both are simple; each could save your life.

Before you gamble, know the odds!

- Every 2 1/2 minutes an American man finds out he has prostate cancer.
- Every 18 minutes an American man will lose his life to prostate cancer.
- Every 24 hours, prostate cancer will claim the lives of 83 American men.
- 1 in 6 American men is at lifetime risk of prostate cancer.
- The five-year survival rate when detected early is nearly 100 percent.

How do you know if you are at risk?

- The older you get, the greater the chance you will develop prostate cancer.
- If someone in your family has or has had prostate cancer, your chance of having the disease is higher.
- If you are African-American, you are twice as likely to have prostate cancer, and twice as likely to die from it.
- If you are Hispanic, you are at high-risk of developing prostate cancer.

What can you do to protect yourself?

Have a physical exam and the PSA blood test.





- · Watch your diet. Studies show that a diet high in dairy and fatty foods increases the risk of developing prostate cancer. Foods rich in antioxidants (vitamin E, selenium, and lycopene) have been shown to control cell damage and may prevent prostate cancer.
- Get physically active. A healthy exercise program will increase circulation, lower body weight, lower stress and may decrease levels of prostate stimulating androgens (hormones).
- · Know your family history. African-American men and men with a family history of prostate cancer should begin screening at age 35; all others should start at 40.
- Talk to your doctor. The life you save may be your own! - WOW




