




It was a wintery day in 2008 when Mary Slaney and Peggy Harkins invited eight women to join them for lunch. The date was February 14, Valentine's Day, and everyone arrived at Peggy's home eager to sample her chicken enchilada soup and share the dishes they brought. "After lunch, we gathered around my TV to watch a video that Mary and I had borrowed," Peggy said. The video featured best-selling author, humorist and motivational speaker, Nicole Johnson, performing a skit called "Girlfriends." Its point is that "every woman needs a good girlfriend and having one is as good as cash in your wallet." With her ingratiating style, Nicole expressed how female friends laugh and cry together, see movies that men will not see, stay up with each other and, most importantly, enjoy doing what they do best — talking. "As I watched everyone watching the DVD," Peggy smiled, "I was moved by their reactions. I could see bonds beginning to form, and I knew that Mary's idea was good."

Interestingly, Mary and Peggy met in a women's group, and when that group began to dissolve, it was Mary's inspiration to start something new. "I moved to Burleson in 2005 and didn't know anyone," she said. "I'm married, yet I also treasure my women friendships. When I met Peggy, we decided to create a circle of friends who value the importance of women sharing and supporting each other."

Peggy's motivation was a little different. "I had recently become a widow," she said. "And through the challenges of meeting people and becoming involved in new experiences, I learned how difficult it can be for anyone surviving the loss of a spouse after 30 or 40 years and how helpful friends can be."

As it turned out, the Valentine's luncheon more than fulfilled their expectations and, as a result, a group known as "The Circle" was born. "Mary came up with the name," Peggy said. "When I think of the circle that formed around the video screen at our first gathering, I cannot imagine a name that would be more appropriate. Also, we often begin our meetings by forming a circle and saying a prayer."

Brenda Huskins and Diane Lybbert were quick to join Mary and Peggy as founders of The Circle. Like Peggy, Brenda had lost her husband after many years of marriage. And, like Mary, Diane is married. "I retired from Bell Helicopter at the end of 2006, and after 33 years of working, I wanted to find women friends to do things with. I belong to the Burleson Monday Night Book Club that meets at the library, and that's where I met Mary. I was at the right place at the right time to become a founding member of The Circle, and it has been great fun! Since I always have my camera handy, I started keeping scrapbooks for the group beginning with that first luncheon," Diane shared.

"We welcome any woman with a happy heart, open mind and the wish to participate," Peggy explained. In age, the group ranges from 50 to 82 with the majority in their 60s. Ninety percent are retired, and over half have enjoyed professional careers. While most live in Burleson, the group also includes members from Fort Worth, Arlington, Crowley and Granbury. Women, married or single, may join and religious affiliation is not a factor. "There are a lot of personalities and histories," Peggy shared. "It's what makes The Circle so special. If one of us encounters tragedy, sickness or simply needs support, we are there for each other."

Since Valentine's Day 2008, members have celebrated and cried with each other through illness, family deaths and life changes. "Most of us continue to stay connected," Peggy said, "except for some who may not be as mobile as they used to be or have shifted their energies toward a new relationship."

"It's an honor to be part of this group," Brenda added, "and it means a lot to all of us. Within The Circle, there is always someone to talk to and share activities." As an outgrowth of her involvement, Brenda rediscovered her love of dancing. "I am now part of the Hi-Steppers," she smiled. "We line-dance every day, often up to seven hours a week, and perform in the community."

Last February, The Circle celebrated its third year. The membership has grown from 10 to near 20 regular members with up to 50 participants per activity. "This



group doesn't just go shopping," Brenda laughed. "We have an activity every month and an annual trip. We're going to San Antonio this year, and last year, we rented a five-bedroom, bed-and-breakfast inn in the historic area of Jefferson, Texas, where we took a swamp boat ride, toured the museums and some of us visited the casinos in Shreveport."

"We meet in January to plan our

calendar and decide who will be responsible for coordinating each activity," Mary explained. Completing this year's calendar, they look forward to touring Fort Worth's Texas Civil War Museum, attending the "Miss Firecracker Contest" at Theatre Arlington, enjoying a train ride from Palestine to Rusk and back, visiting the State Fair of Texas, spending two nights in San Antonio, participating in the Women's Holiday Tea at Burleson Baptist Church and enjoying lunch and shopping at the Montgomery Street Antique Mall/ Tea Room in Fort Worth.

"When women get together, ideas explode," Mary said. "We participate in the American Cancer Society Relay



for Life of Burleson and last year, we generated close to \$3,000 toward the fight against the disease. We also bring gifts to our annual Christmas party to donate to a charity."

As the director of first impressions (truly her title) at the Burleson Area Chamber of Commerce, Mary coordinates the new "Power of Heels" program — a uniting of female business leaders to make a difference in the community. "We're working with the local Women's Jobs Corps," Mary said, "and I would love to add a 'Golden Division' to include the support of our Circle as mentors for the women in the Job Corps program."

Sporting a tiny multicolored feather woven into her short hair, Mary is a woman who wants to reinvent the world. According to Nicole, "every friendship arises out of an invitation." By inviting women into their circle on that exciting day in 2008, Mary and her friends not only enriched their lives, but began a process of touching many others. Brenda is the baker in the family, and on weekends they both enjoy cooking with their kids and grandchildren. The grandchildren's favorite things are "granddaddy eggs," scrambled by Gregg with a slice of deli cheese, and climbing up on the kitchen counter with Brenda to bake cookies with her.

Sometimes, Gregg goes out in the garage where he keeps his woodworking tools. He built the bookcases in Wilder's room and made Brenda the hutch she put near the kitchen table and filled with family pictures. She has another family memory spot: her "Grandmother Room." In this guest room, where Brenda frequently comes to read, she keeps her great-grandmother's rocking chair, made of quarter-sawn oak. "It creaks," Brenda said, with glee. "I rocked my daughter and both grandchildren in it. It is one of my favorite things!" In this room, she also proudly displays two quilts that were pieced and quilted by two of her grandmothers.

Perched above the door is a feathery Mardi Gras mask. "That was my Athena mask," said Brenda, who was inducted this year into the Athena Society of Burleson. "The mask reminds me of those ladies and all they stand for, to



collectively help the community." Lately, when she is relaxing on the bed, Brenda has been planning the Muy Caliente Pink Luncheon, next month's fundraiser for The Careity Breast Care Center at Huguley. Having survived cancer 28 years ago, Brenda understands that it is the "what-ifs" that drive a person crazy. "We've already helped seven women go through the cancer center. Brenda also likes working in the yard with Gregg. She put up a curtain, rather than an awning, for shade, and they grow tomatoes and azaleas. "This is the longest we've ever lived in a house," said Gregg, whose company moved his family every three years. In this backyard they planted two burr oaks plus crape myrtle, and together, the Gammons are watching them grow.



Linda Arnold arrived in this world with a sense of her own destiny and a connection to the passion that would define her life. Today, she stands firmly on track. "I'm a rural country girl with a love of sports," she shared. "If there was a sport to be played in high school, I did it. I played volleyball and basketball and ran track, and if it had been allowed, I would have played football!"

Linda was born in a small town in East Texas called Pennington, where she lived in the same house until she was grown. She graduated from Groveton High School. Her father managed a department store, and her mother was secretary to the high school principal. "My dad was a big sports enthusiast," Linda said. "Together, we watched sports on television and went to a lot of games." With two older brothers, she was the youngest in her family. "Tve always loved sports, so I was my dad's athlete."

"I was the assistant track and basketball coach at Weatherford



a multitude of competitive events. It is not unusual for her work days to carry over into evening hours. "I do my best to attend our games," she said. But since sports overlap, it's not possible for her to see every event. Fall season includes football, volleyball, cross country, golf and tennis. Winter brings basketball, soccer, power lifting and swimming, and spring includes softball, baseball, tennis, golf and track. "I love to see educators at the games because the kids really appreciate it," she explained. "When teachers show interest in an athlete, it can make a difference in the classroom. Many athletes are perceived as leaders and can be a positive influence on classroom morale and behavior."

Being a coach and serving as the athletic coordinator are significant achievements for Linda, professionally and personally. "All of our student athletes are my children," she smiled. As the athletic director of Crowley ISD, Charles Lincoln oversees the athletic operations in both high schools. "I am grateful to him for giving me the tools, the time and the opportunity to do what I love," Linda said. Last year, Crowley High School welcomed Dr. Thurston Lamb as its new principal. "We're very fortunate to have a principal like Dr. Lamb," she explained. "He is an athlete and a huge support to all of our students."

Coaching takes energy, focus and commitment. It is a specialized field with a lot of requirements and, thankfully, rewards. One reward is the sense of community and camaraderie with other coaches. "I have spoken at the TGCA convention numerous times," she shared. She has also been honored as a three-time TGCA All Star Track & Field Coach and TGCA Track & Field Coach of the Year.

"I know what sports have done for me personally," Linda said, "and that's what







Luke Rosales is remarkable. He has big dreams, a heart of gold and he's only 11 years old. His buddies are also remarkable and, as a group, these boys get things done. The majority of them play football for the Burleson Pee-Wee Elks in the Major division of the Boys & Girls Club youth program. Last season, they practiced hard, played hard and helped their team make it to the playoffs. Judged by friendship and football they had a great year, but Luke and his friends wanted more. Their definition of "more" and their commitment to finding it are what distinguish these six boys as truly remarkable young men.



Football season lasts from July through November or December. This is Luke's fourth season in Burleson. He plays defensive cornerback and offensive tight end, and his best friends are Bryce Howard, Isaac Dagley, Bailey Mullins, Drew Durham and Christopher Gonzalez. "We go to different schools," Luke said, "but we call each other and hang out at each other's houses. Last year, we started talking about doing something outside of football, something to help others."

Luke had always wanted to volunteer in some way. "We didn't know what to do at first," he said, "and, then, we heard about SLANT 45." SLANT 45, Service Learning Adventures in North Texas, is a program designed by the North Texas Super Bowl XLV Host Committee and Big Thought Inc., an organization focused on creative learning. From February 2010 through January 2011, the program offered challenges and rewards to young people involved in community service, and it appeared to be the answer to Luke's dream. Not only did the program offer workbooks and tools to help organize projects, it presented an enormous reward in the form of an invitation to a special "SLANT 45 Kid's Bowl Bash Party."

"We had already decided to do something in our community before we knew about SLANT 45," Luke explained, "so when we found out that Johnson County was not included in the program, we were disappointed but decided to go ahead anyway." They named themselves the "Boys of Burleson" and quickly moved into action. Their first project was the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society Walk in which they raised over \$1,000 toward finding the cure for cancer. "We looked for opportunities to volunteer,"

Luke said. "We collected our toys and donated them to Cook Children's Medical Center. We gathered canned goods and toys, sorted and loaded them in a truck and took them to the Harvest House in Burleson. It was hard work, but an excellent and unbelievable feeling."

When the company where Luke's mother worked was sold, the boys were given 25 new messenger bags printed with the previous company's logo. "We donated them to a center that helps women look for work," Luke said.





# Getting to Know You

Treating people of all ages, the physicians at Family Medicine Associates want to know your family. — By Melissa Rawlins

The physicians at Family Medicine Associates practice medicine by dealing with the whole patient. "I could be an ear, nose and throat guy and only look at ears, noses and throats," Dr. Mike White said. "But in my office, I spend 20 seconds on their sore throat, for instance, and then talk the rest of the time about how they're not sleeping and their grandmother died." Dr. White and his colleague, Dr. Heather McKenzie, take care of the whole patient, plus their families — many of whom they have known for 25 or more years.

Since 1980, Dr. White has built trust with his patients in Joshua and Cleburne. He moved here in 1980 after medical school, residency and two years in the U.S. Army. "The day we pulled into town, it was 116 degrees," Dr. White remembered. "We nearly pulled in the other direction!" He and his wife, Kay, reared their three children here and see their kids and grandchildren frequently. The community benefits from his time, too. He served as a Kiwanian and a member of the Joshua Chamber of Commerce.

"He also does a lot of medical mission trips," Dr. McKenzie bragged. Dr. White goes all over the world with Manna Worldwide, and has seen the need for travelers to be immunized. So, Family Medicine Associates is about to start a travel medicine clinic for those planning to travel oversees to get their immunizations without having to go to the public health

department in Fort Worth.

Dr. McKenzie does not yet go on mission trips. "I can't leave my two boys," she said. Her eldest child is 8, and her youngest is 5. Her husband is an agriculture teacher in Joshua, where Dr. McKenzie grew up. She became Dr. White's protégé during medical school and residency, after spending her high school years working as a file clerk and receptionist at Family Medicine Associates, which was founded by Dr. White and Dr. Steve Johnson. "Dr. White's been my doctor since I was 5," Dr. McKenzie remembered. "I left for school, had a practice, and then moved back about three years ago to work with him. He's always been my mentor, and now it's nice to have him as a colleague."

Family medicine treats people of all ages, from birth to death. The practice offers vaccinations for students and implantable bio-identical hormones for adults. Dr. White has chosen to specialize in helping children and adults with attention deficit disorder (ADD). Dr. McKenzie enjoys helping people with diabetes. "I trained in San Antonio, where there is a heavy population of diabetics, which is [a disease] more common in Hispanics," she said.

Patients can trust Family Medicine Associates to help them in other ways. From their Web site, patients can learn more about specific issues, including ADD/ADHD. They can also log into their own account, access their lab results, send questions to nurses, pay their bill and even schedule appointments. Family Medicine Associates offers two clinics for the convenience of their patients. The Joshua office houses its own laboratory and X-ray, allowing patients to get any needed tests done during their appointment.

The Cleburne office provides an afterhours clinic available on weekends and evenings until 8:00 p.m. At that location, they also have a cardiac lab and a sleep lab for diagnosing the source of people's complaints. In addition, anyone with a question about their health can ask Dr. White during his call-in show on Big Country Radio 1460 AM. And when Dr. White is out of town, Dr. McKenzie gets to be the fill-in.

#### Learn the Laws

• After midnight and before 5:00 a.m. unless for employment, school or because of a medical emergency.

• With more than one passenger under 21 in the vehicle who is not a family member.

#### Parent Teen Driver Contract

Parents can start the conversation with teens about the importance of safe driving and set guidelines and rules through a family meeting where parent expectations are delivered. If you want a healthy heart, start by using your brain! Take this quiz to see how much you know about reducing your risk of heart disease.

1. What is the leading cause of death for women? (a) heart disease (b) cancer (c) stroke (d) chronic respiratory disease

Health NOW

A — Heart disease, which is the cause of death for 25.8 percent of American women. Cancer follows with 22 percent, strokes with 6.7 percent and chronic respiratory disease is 5.3 percent.

2. Which lifestyle factor puts you at the greatest risk for heart disease?(a) obesity (b) lack of exercise (c) high fat diet (d) smoking

D — Smoking. Smoking raises blood pressure, increases the tendency for blood to clot, reduces good cholesterol and increases atherosclerosis, the tendency for fatty substances to build up in the arteries.

3. Which of the following healthy foods is not a heart "super-food"? (a) blueberries (b) oatmeal (c) whole grains (d) salmon

C — Whole grains have many health benefits, including regulating blood sugar and improving digestive health, but they don't have the antioxidants of blueberries, the cholesterol-lowering power of oatmeal or the heart-healthy omega-3 fatty acids of salmon.

## In The Kitchen With Rita Shipman

Rita Shipman's favorites cooks — her mother, Louise James, and grandmother, Cleo James — are gone from her life. She still digs into their recipe boxes, though. "I hope to be able to pass their legacy on to my two daughters," Rita said. "Grandmother, who was one of the head cooks for the lodge at Yellowstone National Park, never really measured anything. It was all about the touch and the amount she was preparing." Louise and Cleo taught Rita the Southern style of cooking — which she is now modifying to combat her husband, Melvin's, diabetes.

Rita and Melvin moved to Burleson in 2001, and her youngest daughter and family followed and are buying a home in Crowley. Living in our laid-back community gives Rita time to experiment with the recipes she inherited from her mother and grandmother.

#### **Cleo's Buttermilk Pies**

3 eggs 1 1/2 cups sugar 2 Tbsp. flour 1/2 cup butter, melted 2 cups buttermilk 1 tsp. vanilla 1 unbaked pie shell

 Beat eggs; add sugar and flour. Add melted butter, buttermilk and vanilla.
 Cook in an unbaked pie shell at 375 F for approximately one hour until golden brown on top.

#### **Cleo's Date and Nut Squares**

2 eggs 1/2 cup sugar 1/2 tsp. vanilla 1/2 cup flour
1/2 tsp. baking powder
1/2 tsp. salt
1 cup walnuts or pecans
1 cup finely chopped dates

**I.** Beat eggs, until foamy. Add sugar and vanilla. Set aside.

Sift together flour, baking powder and salt.
 Add to egg mixture. Add nuts and dates.
 Spread in a well-greased, 8-inch pan and bake until top has dull crust. Cook in slow, moderate oven of approximately 250 F until brown. Turn after 30 minutes.

#### **Cleo's Butter Cobbler**

I cup milk I cup flour Pinch of salt I tsp. baking powder

## cup sugar l/8 lb. butter, or more, if desired qt. can peaches, undrained

 Put milk in a bowl and then add sifted flour, salt, baking powder and sugar. A few lumps in the batter are OK.
 Melt butter in a 9 x 13-inch pan. Pour batter into middle of the butter. Add peaches to the middle of the batter. Do not mix.
 Bake at 350 F until light brown on top. Serve hot with vanilla ice cream!

#### Louise's Chicken Vegetable Soup

- 1 10 3/4-oz. can boned chicken
- 1 10 3/4-oz. can chicken broth
- 1 10 3/4-oz. can water
- 1 10 3/4-oz. can cream of chicken soup
- 1 10 3/4-oz. can mixed vegetables
- 1 Tbsp. minced onion
- I pkg. small egg noodles
- 1/2 tsp. celery salt
- Pepper and salt, to taste
- 1 8-oz. can peas (if desired)

**I.** Bring the first 6 ingredients to a boil. Simmer 20 minutes.

2. Add noodles and cook until tender.

**3.** Add celery salt, pepper and salt 15 minutes prior to serving. Add peas, if desired, just before serving so they get hot without becoming mushy. Serve with crackers.

#### Louise's Strawberry Cake

- I white or yellow cake mix
- 1 1/2 cups water
- 1 24-oz. container frozen strawberries
- 1 9-oz. pkg. strawberry Jell-O
- 1 5-oz. pkg. instant vanilla pudding
- 1 12-oz. container Cool Whip

**I.** Bake cake, according to package directions, in a 9 x 13-inch pan. Cool and crumble.

Boil water, strawberries and Jell-O for I minute. Pour over crumbled cake.
 Prepare pudding as directed on box. Layer pudding over Jell-O. Top with layer of Cool Whip. Chill overnight.
