



A new, permanent exhibit is opening at the Cook Center. It has been the dream of several people who have worked tirelessly for the last four years to make the Robert S. Reading Collection: The Hunters and Gatherers of the Blackland Prairie a reality. A unique feature of this exhibit is the use of the first person narrative. In this way, the ancient inhabitants of what is now Navarro County and the surrounding area tell their own story of living on this land during their time. 'Bill Young, Forrest Green, Tom White and Oliver Albritton were really the catalysts, but they passed away before the project got underway," said Lloyd Huffman, chairman of the board of trustees at Navarro College and owner of Huffman Communications. Lloyd has served as technical resource adviser on this project along with Dr. Don

Wyckoff, resource consultant, Ross Edwards, designer and project manager and Dr. Tommy Stringer who helped raise the necessary funds. Together they have taken what was once a dream and made the exhibit a reality.

These individuals all had a vision that through Robert Reading's collection of artifacts, for many years exhibited in the Arrowhead Room of Navarro College, the story could be better presented. The collection's namesake, Robert Reading, served as mayor of Corsicana in the late 1950s and was a civic leader, writer and businessman. During the 1930s-1950s, he followed his interest in archaeology by searching for arrowheads in Navarro and

neighboring counties, especially after rains or when farmers were plowing their fields. "It was a good era to do this since this was a farming region, and he knew all the farmers," Lloyd said. The Blackland soil gave up its hidden treasures often to



Reading, thus producing a vast collection of points, some of which date back 6,000 years.

With the Cook Center's recent expansion, more space was provided for events, but an odd-shaped 1,400 square feet had been set aside. "The expansion of the Cook Center would not have occurred without Oliver's efforts," Llovd recalled. "Oliver told us, 'We have this area. We ought to do something with the arrowhead collection.' He started really researching, reading, visiting museums and educating himself. Oliver tried to educate us, and that was the fun part of the project. He just had an energy and knew how to make things happen. Oliver had been a banker and was used to working with so many people from all walks of life, and he had the contacts."

"Oliver was always so passionate about the college, just as his dad had been," Tommy added.

"There was randomness and no logic to the Arrowhead Room display," admitted Don, an award-winning archaeologist and curator emeritus of the Sam Noble Museum of Natural History at the University of Oklahoma. Don had known about the arrowhead collection for about 20 years through his friendship with the late Bill Young. "Oliver came to Oklahoma to meet me and recommended to the board that I get invited down to work on this project," Don remembered. "He would start asking questions and could make us laugh." Some of those questions will be answered for visitors through the scripts Don has written for the exhibit's videos. Now retired, working on this exhibit has been a labor of love that drew Don to cross the Red River to

ensure the story was told accurately.

As always, with a project like this, money had to be raised. Grants and private monetary and in-kind donations from local trusts, businesses and individuals have funded the creation of new cases, interactive exhibits and videos. When funds were still a little short, one more donation came from Arnold Coldiron of Ohio last fall, so the project could move ahead. "We have been graced by donations, such as deer skins and other artifacts, that enhance the exhibit," Don added.

Ross, owner of Creation Nest Visual Art and Display in Midlothian, was already a familiar face around the Pearce Museum due to previous work he had created there. He has again made a story come to life through his design and artistry. An experienced storyteller through art, Ross has worked not only at the Pearce but for other renowned museums, businesses and private collectors. With a background in the studies of philosophy and psychology, Ross came to the team fascinated with the challenge of combining facts in such a way that would be entertaining and interesting to all ages but would also enable the serious researcher to access information easily.

As an artist, Ross specializes in interpretive realism focusing on people, places, and happenings that can be appreciated and understood. His favorite medium is airbrushed acrylic. The exhibit features Ross' talent as a designer of interactive displays and the cases and layouts of articles within the cases.

"The story is rich," Ross revealed. "It's been fun learning about these people

through working with Don. He has been the silver lining. We have gotten together periodically to make sure all the content is accurate, and Oliver was our inspiration," Ross acknowledged. "I remember when I got the call that he had died. The last thing Oliver told me was that he was looking forward to finishing the project. I think he would be very pleased now, since the exhibit shows how maybe as many as 200 generations of people lived on this land."

Many other local individuals have volunteered much time and expertise in making the Hunters and Gatherers exhibit a reality. That community volunteerism will continue with docents' training and volunteer staffing, but as Helen Albritton, Oliver's widow, pointed out as she viewed the almost completed display, "This was Oliver's brain child, but it also just shows what can happen when fertile brains get together. This exhibit is exciting."

While generations come and go, the land remains through time. "We want people to realize there was someone living on this same land long before them," Tommy explained.

"It has been said we often stand on the shoulders of giants. Oliver was that kind of person — a gentle, self-effacing giant. His support was thoughtful and constant with never a hint of self-promotion or desire for reward," Lloyd concluded. Thanks to the Reading Collection, and these individuals who kept nurturing its creation, the story of those who came many years ago to this land will be faithfully preserved in the Cook Center for the enjoyment and education of future generations.





A Bit of Wirginia Riddle

Third Avenue and Beaton Street was the happening place for young people when Bill and Betty Barnes met. "We met on Beaton Street," Betty remembered. "Back then, you could make a U-turn at 3rd and another U-turn at 7th. You had to 'make Beaton,' and Napoli's was George's Grill then." That meeting, when Bill was 20 years old and Betty was 16, led to a marriage that's lasted 62 years. Bill, a native of Corsicana, and Betty, who moved to the area when she was 6 years old, have seen many changes in Corsicana throughout the years and are excited over the current downtown revival.

Bill's family was in the café business in Corsicana. "Before going to high school each morning, I would open the café, light the burners and fix breakfast," Bill recalled. A graduate of Corsicana High School, Bill continued his education as one of the "Barracks Bunch" at Navarro College. Betty is a graduate of Mildred High School. "She was Queen of Mildred High when I got her," Bill quipped.

With the exception of a few years in which the couple lived in Houston and Conroe when Bill worked for a Brown & Root subsidiary, Corsicana has been home. "I was tired of traveling, public relations and sales," Bill said, so the couple moved back. In the 1970s, they started a local fencing company, B & D Fencing, with a partner. The business was located in the building that now houses the Meals-On-Wheels where Bill and Betty have volunteered for the last 10 years. "We built the business together," Bill related. They retired from the business in 1987 when taking care of family became more important.

"We buried three parents in 1989," Betty recollected of those stressful times.

"We had 'homesteaded' around the corner," Bill revealed, "but Betty wanted a house that looked country, so we built and moved into our home 35 years ago. We were our own architect and contractor. The plans were drawn on a cardboard box."

"I wanted a bit of whimsy," Betty confessed. "We love this house, and we have wonderful neighbors." Betty described the original decor as primitive, but there have been alterations



made through the years. "Times change and things change," she said. Betty loves to decorate for the four seasons, while the home has gone through some major transformations itself. For instance, the original carport served in many capacities and has now been converted into the couple's master bedroom.

Bill and Betty's love of living outdoors is fulfilled through the many garden seating areas; two patios, one covered and one open; and a wide, covered porch that wraps around three sides of the house. "We have 100 trees on the lot," Bill said. Bamboo lines the fenced perimeter. In reference to the fast-growing, prolific





bamboo, Bill said, "Once a week, I get out there and reestablish my territory." Flowers abound along with Bill's homegrown tomatoes. The open patio features a fire pit, while the covered patio is cooled with floating white gauze. The porch features ceiling fans, wicker furniture, wind chimes and rocking chairs. A soft glow from solar Chinese lanterns and lights lets friends and family enjoy watching flora and fauna day or night.

"It's just gorgeous," Betty exclaimed. "We live on the porch." The couple has built two storage units that complement the house. One is Bill's tackle room, containing his fishing equipment. 



Quilting is more than a pastime for Judy Green. Quilting is a form of therapy. Born in Dallas, Judy moved to Kaufman her senior year in high school and there met her husband. After graduation, the two were married and went to East Texas State University (now Texas A&M University-Commerce). Shortly after, Judy gave birth to the first of her three children. The Green family eventually arrived in Corsicana in 1991, and the following year, a friend suggested she check out the Piecemakers Quilt Guild. 'I learned

how to sew in high school," Judy reminisced. 'It was required back then, but once I found quilting, I jumped in with both feet."

Like most quilters, Judy was self-taught. When she first joined the Piecemakers Guild, a lady who taught an introduction to quilting class helped her with the tools of the trade while showcasing the various types of quilting. Since then, Judy has worked on a project every day. Whether it's at the machine or hand work, she quilts every night. "I can't watch TV without something in my hands," she joked. Once she was experienced enough, she started teaching in 1995 at a quilt shop in Garland, creating new patterns for the following quarter. As a result, her home is filled with quilts. Eventually, she had to retire from teaching due to a string of unfortunate family illnesses.

Judy has pieces of quilts everywhere, each in different stages of completion. She even has a project that is portable. It was one of these movable projects that helped her keep her sanity during a


time of unbelievable sorrow. In 2005, her mother passed away and three months later her youngest brother fell ill and died. Over three years, Judy and her remaining brother were the caretakers of their elderly father who passed away in 2008 and four months later, Judy's other brother died. When Judy was going back and forth between hospital stays and sitting by bedsides, she needed something to occupy her mind and her hands. "I carried this pattern called grandmother's flower garden with me to each family member's bedside," Judy recalled. "After they were gone, it went in the closet. I kept thinking about it. Either I can't look at it again, or I need to get it out and make something beautiful out of it." Judy chose to take the pieces she created during that sorrowful

time and create a special quilt she has named Memories. The quilt serves as a tribute to her family.

Another quilt Judy considers her pride and joy is displayed in her living room. This quilt took Judy two long years and over 1,000 hours to make. The pattern was created by Sue Garman, one of Judy's favorite quilt designers. This beautiful and intricately detailed quilt was the most extensive work Judy has ever put into her hobby, and after submitting it to a few quilt shows, it placed well.



The border of Judy's sewing room is lined with the ribbons her quilts have received at quilt shows starting in 1994. "I spend most of my time in my sewing room," Judy explained. "Looking back, the first quilt I entered in a show was so awful, but if you get it judged, you get a critique, and you can learn from your mistakes. You just can't get your feelings hurt." These mistakes and her time with the Piecemakers Quilt Guild has enabled Judy to grow as a seamstress.

The Piecemakers Quilt Guild was founded in November 1986 by a group of local women who wanted to make new friends while sharpening their quilting skills. The goals of the guild are to preserve the heritage of quilting and to share information (and the fruits of their labor) with the community. The guild meets at West Hill Church of Christ once a month. At these meetings, they have either a teacher, workshop, guest speaker and/or a program. There are two groups within the guild that meet the third week of each month - Monday through Friday - to quilt during the day.

Members of these two smaller groups prefer hand quilting to using sewing machines. "It's just like an old-fashioned quilting bee," Judy shared, "where everything in the world is discussed, and we try to solve all the world's problems."

The guild has long been involved in various community and national projects. Each year, every guild member makes a kid's quilt that's donated. They try to find children in need within the community to bless with these works of art, but if there is an overabundance, the quilts are donated to the Ronald McDonald House. Since the price of fabric has increased,



the guild has found new and creative patterns to donate, such as pillow cases and portable carriers for books. More recently, the guild has been involved with making heart-shaped pillows that are given to Navarro County Hospital and M.D. Anderson Hospital for breast cancer patients.

The guild is proud to be associated

with Quilts of Valor. These quilts, created all over the country, are given to wounded servicemen. Since it's a national effort, guild members must follow the organization's regulations. "Quilters all over the country volunteer their services," Judy stated. "One group will put together the tops and send them. Someone else will quilt them, and then another will finish up the binding. Once complete, the organization will send them to a veteran in need or to a VA hospital."

Every October, the guild presents its annual quilt show at the Warehouse Living Arts Center. It's a communitywide event and participants don't have to be a member of the Piecemakers Quilt Guild. "That is the one difference in our quilt shows," Judy explained. "We will take any quilt from the community, and you can choose to have it judged or just displayed. We usually have about 100 quilts each year." During the show, there will be a donated quilt for a raffle. The majority of proceeds go back into the guild, while a portion benefits various charities that are dear to the guild.

Throughout life's ups and downs, Judy has found comfort in quilting, whether in the act itself or through the friends she has made over the years at the Piecemakers Quilt Guild. "You'll never meet anyone like a quilter," admitted Judy who has herself made over 200 quilts to date. "They are the most generous people in the world. Quilting is my therapy. I don't know what life would be like without it."



A World of Care

Hand In Hand Hospice brings love to patient care.

New beginnings have been a theme at Hand In Hand Hospice this past year. Michelle Shaw, owner/administrator and director of nurses, married Rick Taylor, the company's new operations and marketing director. Together, they have been busy designing a new logo, informational material and a website for the company that Michelle founded in 2005 after 13 years' experience as a registered nurse in the Dallas area. Rick and Michelle's new mission is to better educate the public about hospice care. "There are so many misconceptions about what hospice is," Michelle stated.

The company's motto puts its approach in perspective: "Touching One Life At A Time." The 13-member team at Hand In Hand Hospice provides "highly skilled, compassionate care for terminally ill patients and their families" in a 10-county area surrounding Navarro County. "We are privately owned and operated by a nurse, and Michelle is very involved with all of our patients every day," Rick said.

One common public misconception about hospice care concerns the cost of services, which are provided at no cost to the patient or family. Medicare, Medicaid or private insurance covers the costs. "Caregivers often wait to contact us because of costs until a patient's final days when they could be receiving this help so much sooner," Michelle revealed.

How a patient qualifies for hospice poses another frequent misunderstanding. "Patients can be on hospice as long as they need it, and can get off the service if their health improves," Michelle said. Some of the diagnoses that qualify patients for hospice include Alzheimer's, congestive heart failure, chronic

obstructive pulmonary disease, dementia, cancer, Parkinson's and multiple sclerosis. "The main thing to understand is that a patient doesn't have to be actively dying to get help from hospice care," Michelle said. "Families can go to the company's website and use the Hospice Eligibility Check to see if their loved one may be eligible for Hospice Care."

Finally, Rick and Michelle want to make it clear that hospice isn't a bad word. "Often patients and their families are unwilling or afraid to ask their doctors about hospice, and often doctors are hesitant to start this discussion with patients," Michelle said. Hospice, Michelle stressed, is a caring, wellrounded, holistic approach to helping patients. It uses a team approach.

Hand In Hand Hospice employs Dr. Ron Rodriguez, medical director, who works with patients' doctors and the Hand In Hand team. The company also employs nurses, a social worker and chaplain, nurse aides and provides volunteers.

Per Medicare guidelines, 5 percent of total patient care must be performed by volunteers. After passing a criminal background check, hospice volunteers are trained by the staff. "They go into homes and nursing homes and sit with patients and paint nails, read or just have a conversation," Michelle said. "Volunteers perform a great service to patients and their families."

Hand In Hand Hospice surveys patients and family members quarterly to assure quality service. Following a patient's passing, the staff also works with surviving family members for the next 14 months. "Our patients are what keep us going," Michelle acknowledged. "I have learned so much from patients and their families. They have the best stories, and I've even learned how to garden! Patients are our blessing."

"We are so excited about the future," Rick added. "Deciding to seek hospice care and which service to use is a very personal choice. Patients need to know that the choice is theirs to make. We want to help patients and family members to understand the benefits they may receive and how hospice can help a family in many ways." **NOW**



When It May Make Sense to Borrow Money

In the Grip of a Cramp

Muscles that contract are doing what they were made to do. A problem occurs when the muscle does not return to a relaxed state. A muscle or muscles can create incredible pain when the contraction continues and becomes a cramp. Involuntary muscle cramps can last a few seconds to almost an hour. Regrettably, on occasion, they can last longer.

Health **NOW**

We have three types of muscles: smooth, cardiac and skeletal. Smooth muscles line the inner organs in the body. For example, they are what propel food through the digestive system or cause you to regurgitate something unpleasant. Cardiac muscles power the functions of the heart. Smooth and cardiac muscles are involuntary, meaning you can't control their action. Skeletal muscles are voluntary and can be controlled by you. They are what allow you to move your arms and legs at will. The majority of muscle cramps occur in the skeletal muscles. You can see the muscle bunch up and become hard while in the grip of the cramp.

Muscle cramps can be alarming, but they are not uncommon. They occur most often in older adults. Cramps can be caused by a variety of conditions. Injury to a muscle or nerve can cause cramping. Dehydration, cold weather, pregnancy, depletion of certain minerals and deficiencies of some vitamins can be the source of muscle cramps. Overusing a certain group of muscles or even being in one position an extensively long time might trigger cramping. Cramping can be the side effect of some medications. Medical problems, such as peripheral artery disease, can also be the cause of cramps because of inadequate blood flow to an area.

The treatment for muscle cramps is relatively simple. If it occurs from injuries, then medications such as muscle relaxants and/or antiinflammatory drugs, may be prescribed. Usually, stretching alleviates the cramped muscle. Relief can also be found with the use of heating pads or soaking in a tub of warm water. Massage can bring a reprieve from the pain. If the disorder is occurring from a medical or physical condition, then that needs to be addressed. If you develop cramps from dehydration, rehydration should solve the problem.

Prevention of muscle cramps should focus on the reason the cramp is taking place. If cramps occur in a calf muscle from running, then stretching adequately before exercise will help. Make sure you are wellhydrated before exercising. For nighttime cramping, stretching before bedtime may help. If you think a medication is causing your cramping, consult your doctor. Do not discontinue medication before seeking the advice of your physician. With a little investigation and preparation, you may be able to keep muscle cramps at bay. **NOW**

Theresa's Coconut Cake

- 1 yellow cake mix 1 1/2 cups milk 1/2 cup sugar 2 1/2 cups coconut (divided use)
- 1 8-oz. container Cool Whip, thawed

I. Prepare cake mix according to package directions; bake as directed in a 9x13-inch dish. Cool for 15 minutes. Poke holes through cake with long-tined fork.

2. Mix milk, sugar and 1 cup of coconut in a saucepan; bring to a boil while stirring. Reduce heat; simmer 1 minute.

- 1 10 3/4-oz. can cream-styled corn
- I cup buttermilk
- 2/3 cup bacon grease
- 1 1/2 cups corn meal, sifted well
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 3 jalapeños, diced
- I cup grated cheese
- 1/3 cup bacon, diced (optional)

I. Mix ingredients in order of listing; stir well after each addition.

2. Pour into a greased baking pan or iron skillet; bake at 425 F for 30 minutes.

Mother's Italian Meat Loaf

1 1/2 lbs. lean ground beef

- 1 14-oz. can tomato sauce (divided use)
- 1 tsp. Parmesan cheese
- 1 egg
- 3/4 cup cracker crumbs
- 1/2 cup onion, finely chopped
- l tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. oregano
- 1/8 tsp. pepper
- 2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese

 Mix ground beef with 1/3 cup of tomato sauce and Parmesan cheese. Add all other ingredients except mozzarella cheese; mix well.
 Spray baking dish with Pam; flatten meat mixture into a rectangle. Add mozzarella cheese lengthwise along center of meatloaf leaving 1 inch on each side.

3. Bake at 350 F for one hour. Remove from oven; drain. Pour remaining tomato sauce over top of loaf; bake an additional 15 minutes.

Tropical Grilled Shrimp

2 cups pineapple juice
1 cup soy sauce
1/4 cup olive oil
3 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
1/4 cup molasses
1 onion, cut into medium wedges
2-3 lbs. unshelled shrimp
Array of tropical fruits, cut to bite-size

 Mix first 6 ingredients; set aside 1/2 cup for basting. Add shrimp; refrigerate overnight.
 Baste with set aside marinade while grilling shrimp over medium coals for 4-6 minutes.

3. Serve in enamel or glass bowl with an array of tropical fruits as accompanying dish.

Roquefort Dressing

Note: If dressing sepates, add 2-3 eggs.

1/4 lb. bleu cheese
1 pt. cottage cheese, large curd
1 tsp. garlic powder
1 tsp. pepper
1 qt. mayonnaise
2 Tbsp. wine vinegar
2/3 cup buttermilk
1/2 cup half-and-half
1 cup vegetable cooking oil

I. Mix two cheeses together on lowest speed. Add all other ingredients in order listed; mix only enough to blend.
