

Carnegie Hall is a place where musicians dream of performing. Many work toward this goal their entire life, yet never receive the coveted invitation. Fortunately, Anthony Peterson didn't have to wait long — when he was 9 years old, he placed second for his age group at the Cincinnati World Piano Competition. This award earned him a performance spot at the famous venue.

Now 16 and entering his junior year of high school, he said, "Well, it's a talking point. I've done it. I feel like I accomplished something big at a young age." The first time he ever heard

about Carnegie Hall was when his piano teacher told him about his invitation. "People told me, 'It's a big deal,' so I guessed it was a big deal." Nevertheless, he didn't fully understand the significance of playing in the prestigious hall.

Anthony's father, Craig, understood the importance of the invitation his son received within the first two years of playing piano. "We had lots of support from family and friends," Craig said. A trip to New York can cost a lot of money. People cared about Anthony's budding career, and they supported him. They encouraged him, but also raised funds to help cover the expenses for the amazing opportunity.

"I think I'd be able to appreciate it more now," Anthony said, although he doesn't regret having received the opportunity at such an early age. He started playing the piano in first grade. His





first teacher, Matt Doudt, recommended Irina Gorin as a replacement teacher. She suggested competition during his second year of lessons.

"It isn't for everyone," Craig said. "Competition that young can help or ruin you." But Anthony loved competing. His dad believes music gave him an advantage in handling pressure in both performance and general life situations.

"I think I started getting motivated when I went to competitions and did surprisingly well," Anthony added. He doesn't keep track of the number of

trophies, medals or awards even though they include local, regional and national events. Performing well prompted him to try bigger things.

Music has played a big part in Anthony's life. Coming from a musical family, he never knew a time without it. Ironically, his interest in piano grew from the interactive video game, Guitar Hero. A few years after Carnegie, he picked up drums by playing the same game.

The Petersons moved from Indiana to Mansfield, Texas, in 2011, primarily because of extended family in the area. "Bit of a culture shock," Anthony said. Nevertheless, he fits in well and enjoys many opportunities with his music.

High school marching band opened doors not only for using his piano skills, but also to pursue his love for playing drums and other percussion instruments. He first connected with the band director in seventh grade and was excited about moving on with the same director in high school. He attributes his band and percussion directors with being big influences in playing and improving his drum skills. As part of the band, he made the percussion section in the top Texas All-State Symphonic Band as a sophomore in 2015.

In the 2015-16 school year, Anthony will continue performing college-level percussion pieces in preparation for

auditions using marimba, snare drum and timpani. While he dreams of earning a spot at the Boston Conservatory, he is realistic about the intense competition. He plans to work toward acceptance at Texas Christian University as his preferred alternative.

Once he reaches college, Anthony wants to shift gears toward composing music for all genres and applications. He hopes to play with an organized orchestra and perhaps freelance as a clinician for high schools along with composing. He also serves as the percussion section leader of Legacy Wind Symphony, the drum captain of the Legacy Bronco Marching Band, is a member of the student leadership council, plays drums in the Legacy Jazz Band and accompanies various Legacy choir groups.

Band rehearsals consume a great deal of Anthony's time. "Marching band kind of takes over your life," he said. Yet he finds time to play piano accompaniment for people during solo/ensemble competitions. "I wouldn't say I'm done with lessons, but I'm not taking them at this time," he said. With advanced placement classes on his schedule, he also maintains an A-B average and manages to hang out with friends.

In addition to Anthony's school activities, he plays drums in a rock 'n' roll band with his older brother, Michael.

He's very developed in singing," Anthony said, proud of Michael, who plays guitar and bass along with singing.

"He is talented and smart," Craig said about his older son, who received an academic scholarship to The University of Texas at Arlington.

Anthony's sister, Christina, also sings and plays guitar. He sometimes accompanies her on the piano. The two of them perform at open mic nights, with the entire family cheering them on from the audience. "We get along pretty well. I have a great relationship with all my family," Anthony said. "My brother's one of my best friends."

Anthony admits his family is his biggest influence. His dad plays woodwinds, primarily the saxophone, and stays involved with his kids. Even though his mom isn't musical, she is artistic and supportive of her children in their endeavors. "I can't believe it's been 10 years," his dad said. "I always tell him, it is one thing to be talented, but you have to be dedicated. I'm proud of him for being dedicated and focused on what he wants to do."



Anthony enjoys most music genres, but his favorite ones include introspective tunes. "I think it's fun to look for meaning behind music," he said. He strives to entrench feeling in the way he plays music, regardless of the type or instrument. Aware of the deep impact music can have, he tends to play upbeat songs during sad times instead of slow, sorrowful pieces.

For Anthony, music isn't only about the technical aspects, but also the emotion. "One of the greatest parts is seeing how it affects other people," he said. "They can see the emotion you're putting into the music." From a stage, he may not always see the way music affects the audience, but when playing for family members he takes pleasure in seeing reactions move across their faces.

Perhaps someday in the future, a film score will identify Anthony
Peterson as the composer. In the meantime, he'll continue with school activities and joining his siblings to fill audiences with emotion through the wonders of music.





table flanked by silvery-gray upholstered chairs. "When we upgraded the kitchen, the backsplash was so unique, I decided to use it as an accent in the dining room," she said. Bold and beautiful describes this home. But ask Zach what he likes most and he'll say, "The thing I like most is being home." **NOW**



When the first season ended, Jolene and Jesse realized they were on to something, but in order to make it last, they had to take it even further. One fateful night, she went to a local













Inflation and Your Retirement Income Strategy

You might not think much about inflation. After all, it's been quite low for the past several years. Still, you may want to take it into account when you're planning your retirement income strategy.

Of course, no one can really predict the future course of inflation. But it's a pretty safe bet it won't disappear altogether — and even a mild inflation rate, over time, can strongly erode your purchasing power. Consider this: If you were to purchase an item today for \$100, that same item, in 25 years, would cost you \$209, assuming an annual inflation rate of 3 percent. That's a pretty big difference.

During your working years, you can hope that your income will at least rise enough to match inflation. But what about when you retire? How can you minimize the impact of inflation on your retirement income?

One thing you can certainly do is include an inflation assumption in your calculations of how much annual income you'll need. The number you choose as an inflation factor could possibly be based on recent inflation levels, but you might want to err on the conservative side and use a slightly higher figure. Since you may be retired for two or three decades, you might have to periodically adjust the inflation factor to correspond to the actual inflation rate.

Another important step is maintaining an investment portfolio that can potentially provide returns well above the inflation rate. Historically, stocks have been the only investment category — as opposed to investments such as Treasury bills and long-term government bonds — whose returns have significantly outpaced inflation. So you may want to consider owning an appropriate percentage of stocks and stock-based investments in your portfolio, even during your retirement years.

Now, you might be concerned at the mention of the words stocks and retirement years in the same sentence. After all, stocks will fluctuate in value, sometimes dramatically, and even though you may be retired for a long time, you won't want to wait for years to bounce back from a bad year in the market. But not all investments move in the same direction at the same time. Spreading your

dollars among a range of asset classes — large stocks, small and mid-cap stocks, bonds, certificates of deposit (CDs), foreign investments and so on — may help you reduce the impact of volatility on your portfolio.


And you don't even have to rely solely on stocks to help combat inflation. You could also consider Treasury Inflation-Protected Securities, or TIPS. When you purchase a TIPS, your principal increases with inflation and decreases with deflation, as measured by the Consumer Price Index. Your TIPS pay interest twice a year, at a fixed rate. This rate is applied to the adjusted principal, so your interest payments will rise with inflation and fall with deflation. When your TIPS matures, you will receive adjusted principal or original principal, whichever is greater. As is the case with other bonds, though, you could choose to sell your TIPS before it matures.*

Work with your financial advisor to help decide what moves are right for you to help protect your retirement income from inflation. It may be a hidden threat, but you don't want to ignore it.


* Yield to maturity cannot be predetermined, due to uncertain future inflation adjustments. If TIPS are sold prior to maturity, you may receive less than your initial investment amount. If bonds are not held in a tax-advantaged account, investors will be required to pay federal taxes on the accredited value annually, although they will not receive any principal payment until maturity. In the Kitchen With Daniela Kojouharov

Growing up in Bulgaria, Daniela Kojouharov watched her mother cook daily meals and her father prepare special-occasion meals. "My grandmother was also a great inspiration for me. She loved to cook and invite people over to eat what she prepared," Daniela smiled.

These influences were significant when she moved to the U.S. with her husband in 1995 and began to cook every meal. Now, Daniela enjoys preparing both American and Bulgarian dishes for her husband and two sons, and continues the tradition of sharing meals with friends and family. "At the end of each week we get together with friends, cook wonderful food and catch up with each other," she said. "We always have a good time, and it beats going to a restaurant!"

Roasted Bell Peppers Salad (Lyutika)

10 green bell peppers 6 eggs 1/2 cup crumbled feta cheese 1 cup plain yogurt 1/2 tsp. salt

- **I.** Preheat oven to 450 F. Clean, deseed and cut peppers into quarters. Place in oven on a piece of foil or a baking sheet and roast until skin is blackened. Remove from oven and allow to cool before peeling skin off; chop.
- **2.** Bring a pot of water to a boil. Add eggs and boil for about 10 minutes. Remove from water and allow to cool before peeling and chopping.
- **3.** Mix peppers, eggs and remaining ingredients in a bowl and mix well. Refrigerate for at least 1 hour. Serve cold.

Bulgarian Moussaka

2 lbs. ground beef
1 medium onion, diced
6 large russet potatoes, cubed
2 carrots, diced
1 tsp. salt
2 tsp. paprika
1 Tbsp. dry oregano
1 14 1/2-oz. can diced tomatoes
3 eggs
1/3 cup flour
1/2 cup milk

- **1.** Preheat oven to 400 F.
- **2.** In a skillet, sauté ground beef and onion until well-browned. Add potatoes and carrots. Sauté for 5 minutes. Add salt, paprika and oregano. Mix well. Add tomatoes and mix well. Pour into a greased 9x13-inch

baking dish. Add enough water to cover the ingredients by 1/4 inch. Bake for 45 minutes.

- **3.** While this bakes, beat eggs and add a pinch of salt. Gradually add flour until the mixture is thick. Add milk to make a batter. Mixture should have the same consistency as cake batter.
- **4.** Remove moussaka from the oven. Pour batter mixture on top and spread evenly. Return to oven and bake for about 15 minutes or until top is brown.

Individual Beef and Vegetables Casseroles (Guvecheta)

I lb. beef stew meat
30 small cocktail smoked sausages
I onion, roughly chopped
I large potato, roughly chopped
8 oz. fresh mushrooms, quartered
1 2.25-oz. can sliced black olives
I 14.5-oz. can fire roasted tomatoes
Salt and pepper, to taste
I/4 cup parsley, chopped
I tsp. paprika
I tsp. dry oregano
I/2 cup water
6 slices mozzarella cheese
6 eggs

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 F.
- **2.** Place beef in a large pot, cover with water and simmer for 45 minutes. Reserve the beef broth for later.
- **3.** Divide beef, sausages, onion, potato, mushrooms, black olives and tomatoes into 6 individual casserole dishes. Add 1 cup beef broth to each dish. (If you do not have individual casserole dishes, this recipe can be prepared in a 9x13-inch baking dish.) Add salt and pepper. Cover and bake for 45 minutes.
- **4.** In a bowl mix parsley, paprika and oregano with 1/2 cup water.
- **5.** Remove casseroles from oven. Divide parsley mixture into 6 parts and add to each casserole dish. Mix carefully with a spoon. Taste and adjust salt and pepper if necessary. Place one slice of cheese on each dish and then crack an egg over the top. Cover with foil and bake for another 10 to 15 minutes, or until the eggs are set.
