Believers Not Beggars By Melissa Rawlins



Two buildings at FM 1187 and Gertie Barrett Road represent the free spirits of those who worship with Liberty Church, which now sits on property where settlers of Irish and Scottish descent built Bludworth School, the first in Mansfield, in the 1850s. When Liberty Church took ownership, the Bludworth District No. 98 structure had not been designated a historic building. "If it had been, the renovations inside wouldn't have been legal," Pastor Marvin Raines said. But as the church motto goes: "Where the spirit of the Lord is ... there is Liberty!" So multiple members of the church freely poured their creative spirit, talents and resources into decorating this 100-year-old building in a fantastic way.

Variously referred to as the Youth Building, the Fellowship Hall and even the SWAT Building, so-called when Students With a Testimony met there when Pastor Raines' son was youth pastor and gave the kids tactical training in the spirit, the Bludworth Building is a moniker that stuck. Originally two stories with an exterior stairway, a new structure was built in 1916 when Bludworth School District No. 98 was created by consolidating three little school districts: Pool No. 72, Gibson No. 73 and Wyatt's Chapel No. 75. Mansfield Historic Society's excellent records show that in 1961, the school was merged with Mansfield ISD. The building housed students until December 1963. Afterward, Southridge Baptist Temple occupied the property and a new sanctuary was added about 50 years ago.

When Liberty Church arrived in 2004 with 30 members and a couple hundred dollars, the old school building was in shambles. Randy and Cindy Hennard saw its potential. Though the church had no budget for renovations, as the Hennards led the way, other members pitched in to help.

Requiring little reconstruction, the walls are made of a substance like adobe brick. Its floor is part concrete, part wood. "Certain parts are solid concrete offering no crawlspace," said Pastor Raines, who worked in construction most of his life. "The structure is incredibly strong. In those days, if you had a two-by-four, it was a real 2-inch by 4-inch beam of wood." The church roofed the Bludworth Building with shingles and expertise from a member who is a roofer.

Resources are always on hand when the congregation is called to provide outreach or embark on renovations. From the food given away to 50 families every Wednesday and Sunday, to the wood floors in the Bludworth Building and the tile floors in the sanctuary's children's



hall and foyer, if Liberty Church has a need, they pray about it and wait. "I teach that we're believers not beggars," Pastor Raines said. "We obey Him, and leave it up to Him how He'll do it."

As Cindy decorated Liberty Church, other members saw her vision and did whatever she needed. Staven Corev painted the murals throughout the Bludworth Building and even in the children's hall. A son of a preacher Pastor Raines knew, Staven sells cars for a living. "I didn't even know he was that talented until he said, 'I can paint that,' and immersed himself into it. We gave him freedom to do whatever he wanted to do, creatively," Pastor Raines admitted.

Staven painted a scene of a city skyline in the auditorium, another of the



interior of a train station in the hallway, a country setting in the kitchen, and a 1950s-era billiards room in the pool hall. The restrooms are themed in I Love Lucy for the women and motorcycles for the men.

Staven had so much fun in the Bludworth Building. He then turned to the hallway for the children's church, which he painted in a jungle theme. Inside the children's room, Kathy Wall has been doing an incredible job remodeling.

One family has had a major role in all the renovations. As owners of Brantley Drywall Company, Steve and Doris Brantley, with their sons, Jessie and Chris, prepared the Bludworth Building's 28-seat Brantley Theatre Room. Here, people enjoy teachings or films. Inside the

sanctuary, the family built the stage and added visually appealing acoustic panels left over from one of their jobs building a bowling alley.

Throughout both buildings are stainless steel countertops installed by two brothers, Ronnie and Russell Scarborough. They ground a circular brushed design in each counter, from the kitchen and bathrooms to the billiards rooms and the children's arts and crafts room.



Three years ago, after the renovations were complete, the Bludworth Building caught on fire. Smoke damage was repaired by homeless men from a ministry called The House of Peace. One of those men, Billy Holder, now contributes mightily as a member of Liberty Church. "Billy is a leader in our church with his wife, Michelle," Pastor Raines said. "He's one of those guys that nobody wanted, yet now everybody wants."

Billy headed up the workday last spring to paint the buildings and add shutters in preparation for this fall's celebration of the Bludworth Building's centennial. During the open house, food will be served and people's stories will be shared. Pastor Raines is hoping locals with really good memories will talk about their early education at Bludworth School.

It's to honor the old-timers that the church members gave their day off, their tools and their talents to spruce up the church. The other result of such teamwork over 12 years is that

the membership, now 100 strong, has bonded. Each individual's sense of ownership helps them know they are important.

Reminding people of their value is at the core of Pastor Raines' ministry. A Texan by birth, he moved from West Texas to Kennedale in 1968 and lived in a shack in a wrecking yard with a mother who died of cancer and a father who had a heart attack at a young age. "We were hardworking, but weren't church going," he recalled. They found J.D. McBrear to conduct Mr. Raines' funeral at Oakdale



Baptist, located at Debbie Lane and FM 157, where the QT is now. Young Marvin began attending that church. "From there I gave my life to the Lord and then entered the ministry. My heart has been to reach people most churches don't have time for — the hurting. That's who Jesus ministered to," Pastor Raines said.

His wife, Debbie, started dating Marvin when he was 16 and she was 14. Married 46 years now, the couple has made their mark in different ways. Debbie quietly works in the background. When she inherited her grandmother's furniture, she and Corla Smith, one of her best friends, decorated the prayer room.

Their goal is to teach people necessary skills, so they don't have to stay poor. "God's bigger than that and will change their lives," Pastor Raines said. "They just have never been told they're valuable, nor loved and accepted. We don't accept that they're worthless." Kind of like that old Bludworth School.



education classes. She went back to school several times obtaining degrees in many areas, including library science, and she ultimately became a librarian. "As a coach's wife and educator, I basically did something new every time we moved districts," she explained.

Terry experienced much success in his career as a head football and basketball coach. He led Mart to the 1999 Class 2A state title, Commerce to a 3A title and Bartlett to a Class A championship. He was also inducted into the Hall of Fame at his alma mater in 2012 and has been nominated for the Texas Coaches Hall of Fame. "The accomplishment I am most proud of is being named one of Dave Campbell's 50 Most Memorable Coaches in Texas," Terry stated. But honestly, the fame and notoriety was just a perk. The real satisfaction of the job came from working with the students and players. "Building and maintaining relationships is what coaching and teaching is really all about," he explained.



Terry was hired as athletic coordinator and head football coach when Timberview opened. He led the football team through the rough beginnings of combining players from two rival schools into one team and brought them to a place of solidity and unity. "Everything we did there was a first — the first game, the first touchdown, the first win, all of it was the *very* first," Terry reflected. "We went from a 4A school to a 5A school in the first year. The growth in both size and progress was amazing!"

Leslie was hired as Timberview's first head librarian. One task she aimed to accomplish was to have the gigantic white wall in the library painted, so she convinced her principal to let her son-in-law, Deon, paint a 64-foot mural on




it. The mural is still there, along with the thousands of books she obtained for the school. "In the past, I had always come into an established, functioning library that was full of books and resources. This was a completely different scenario, because I was coming into a brand new library. It literally had nothing," she remembered. "I had to build it from scratch, and while it was challenging, I loved every minute of it. I still think of it as my library and my school."

Terry and Leslie's daughter, Brooke Robinson, followed them to Mansfield, working first at Timberview and then as a head track and cross-country coach at Lake Ridge. Most recently, she has been hired as the head girls' basketball coach in Cleburne. In high school, she was the state 3-point champion and wanted to coach the sport she loved so much in her youth. Their son, Chris, also joined the Cleburne coaching staff as the assistant basketball coach, working alongside his sister.

After long and fruitful careers, Terry and Leslie both realized the families they had built together at home and at school were thriving, and thus, they could step away to take care of the families they had come from. Leslie retired in 2007 in

Dallas has a very casual and comfortable energy that both welcomes and encourages students to feel confident while creating original artwork. This is due in part to her undeniable love for all things art, which first developed during her senior year in high school. "Tve always had a passion for art," she declared.

High school was not a priority for Dallas until she took an art class. Prior to that, she was more preoccupied with her friends and having a good time. She ended up having a child, which saved her life. Although she gave her daughter up for adoption, with this one life crisis came opportunity. Dallas turned her focus onto Marilyn Melton, her art teacher. "I had dropped out of school when I was a junior. When I came back at the end of junior year, I met my art teacher, and she changed my life," Dallas explained.

The once at-risk young woman who lacked direction and had no real vision for her future blossomed into a straight-A student. She went from not caring or trying to being genuinely concerned about her education to peer mentoring. It is often said that a piece of art has the power to transform one's

outlook on life, which is true. But a piece of art also has the power to transform the artist who creates it, which is exactly what happened to Dallas.

Like a phoenix rising from the ashes, Dallas realized her future when she was awarded her school's Boot Strap Award, which was presented to her by her beloved art teacher. "Basically, the award was given to the student who had made the most progress, the student everyone thought might not make it, but did," she said. "When my teacher gave me that award, it solidified my desire to become an art teacher because I wanted to give someone else what I'd been given. I wanted to show kids that they could do it, too."

Growing up in tiny Washougal, Washington, right on the Columbia River, Dallas was constantly asked if she was from Texas, perhaps in part due to her noticeable (and ironic) name, but more so because of her undeniably spunky, take-charge personality and laid-back demeanor. "I loved my little town, but after a divorce I applied for a job in Texas, interviewed over the phone and flew here the night before school started," she recalled. It was a whirlwind of transition, but looking back, it was one of her best decisions. Now, married for 16 years to her husband, Jeff, with a blended family of four kids and five grandchildren, Dallas has spent the last 10 years of her 20-year-long teaching career completely content at Timberview High.

















But traditional teaching in the classroom isn't all Dallas does at Timberview. She also leads the school's art club. The club meets each Thursday after school to plan community events and create cool artwork. Each year, the club consists of anywhere from 15 to 20 members and a few officers. The great thing is that the members aren't just art students. They are from all areas of the school.

The club works events in the community, such as Third Thursdays in historic downtown, the Pickle Parade, the Cinco de Mayo celebration and various events at Mansfield Methodist Medical Center. "The club typically sets up art and craft tables for the kids," Dallas said. "They also do face painting and balloon animals."

The most rewarding events the club organizes are the various art camps they host for kids throughout the year. The camps originated eight years ago as a way for the art club to raise funds for trips, materials and other expenses the budget does not cover. The club has traveled to Washington, D.C., New York City and Los Angeles for art experiences.

Several camps are offered throughout the year, including both day and week camps. Day camps are offered on Saturdays from 9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. in the fall, winter and spring, and are open to children in kindergarten through









sixth grade. A weeklong camp is offered Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. in the early summer, where children entering grades one through five are welcome. "The camps are all run by the art club. They pick the projects and plan everything," Dallas said.

The one-week camp is designed to provide campers with diverse art-making experiences, including a community art project. "The campers learn the fundamental elements and principles necessary for making original art using various mediums such as painting, sculpting, drawing, printmaking and fiber work. It's a blast! It's messy and creative and full of play," she explained with a slightly devious grin. "We are able to do all the time-consuming projects that we're unable to do during the one-day camp."

Mediums like ceramic, papier-mâché and glasswork are all highlighted during the week. Past campers have made papier-mâché hot air balloons, Eric Carleinspired animals, fused glass sailboats and various clay pieces. Each project requires skill and time, which the art club members help campers with. "All of the kids are so respectful," Dallas added. "They are just good kids."

Ultimately, sharing her love of art with students is her main goal. Working with them and building relationships just makes the job even better. "I love what I do here. Working with high schoolers is the best. The processes we go through and the relationships that are formed," she said, "that's what it's all about. They renew my passion daily!"

• Get Your Papers in Order

Before you do anything else, make sure your licenses are up to date. You may purchase licenses at most sporting goods outfitters or large superstores. You can also now purchase licenses online through the Texas Parks and Wildlife website.

• Know the Calendar

Texas has outlined specific seasons for different animals. This area, called the North Zone, has start dates as early as September 1 for doves. The most anticipated season — white-tail deer — starts November 5, and there are dates for various game and fowl

starting everywhere in between. There are several animals with multiple or split seasons, so be sure you are hunting your prey legally, as the penalties include loss of license, hefty fines and can even involve jail time. If you want to try your hand at bowhunting, your season will start about a month before rifle hunters.

· Pick Your Spot

There are several options when choosing a hunting spot. You may try to find a friend who has a hunting lease, allowing them to hunt on someone else's property. Or, you can opt for one of the many public hunting lands nearby. There are plenty of options within an hour or so, but if you are willing to travel a little farther, the Texas Hill Country is known to have the largest number of white-tail deer.




GET READY

· Before You Lock and Load

You'll want to have your guns and ammunition ready before your trip. Cleaning your shotgun or rifle takes a little time, so you do not want to wait until the. big weekend to take your gun out of the safe. Be sure to bring enough ammunition. If you have a great hunt, you may only need a few shots to reach your limit, but you should plan on a few misses just to be safe. If you have never hunted, you will want to spend some time practicing your shot, which means you should plan a weekend to go shoot targets or clays. This will also help you get familiar with your weapon. It is also very important to know your surroundings. You especially need to know if other hunters are nearby.

• Blend In and Stand Out

The right camouflage can be paramount in keeping your game from spotting you



before you pull the trigger. Make sure your gear is right for the natural environment that will surround you. On the other hand, there are clear laws requiring hunters on public lands to wear at least 400 square inches of hunter orange, in addition to orange headgear. So, when you are packing your camouflage, do not forget your orange vest and hat.

· Bring Your Vittles

You will probably be in the field for a while, so be sure to pack some food and drinks. Avoid odorous things like garlic, as

If you are planning on making an entire weekend of your hunting trip, you will have to add another level of preparation. Research what camp grounds are available. If you are planning to go on the season's opening weekend, you will want to reserve a spot ahead of time. If you are pulling your tent from a pile of things you rarely use, set it up and check it for leaks before your trip. Bring a flashlight and extra batteries, and be sure to bring a warm enough sleeping bag for potentially cold temperatures. Lastly, be mindful of local wildlife. If bears or other animals are a potential threat, take precautions to keep food and trash sealed and out of reach from such critters.



SAFETY FIRST

• Fire When Ready

Guns can be dangerous if not handled correctly. The state of Texas requires a hunter's education course for every hunter, which is good for life, after completion. You can get a one-time deferral good for a year, but it is highly recommended that you go through safety courses before operating a gun.

• Beware of Snakes

Most likely, your hunting site will be home to slithery critters, as well as the prey you are there to hunt. Only about 10 percent of Texas' snakes are dangerous for humans, so the first step to safety is identification. Bring a field guide, and be on the lookout for copperheads, cottonmouths and rattlesnakes. If you or a companion are bitten, the best solution is to get to a nearby hospital. Do not try to cut around the puncture or try to suck out the venom. Instead, clean around the wound with disinfectant soap, take off jewelry or items that may restrict the area, and try to limit movement of the extremity until you can get to a doctor.

Whether you are hoping to bag meat for the winter, or you want a 16-point buck over the mantel, a great trip starts with the right equipment and preparation. Staying safe while you are out will ensure a successful hunt is not overshadowed by injury or tragedy. With these tips, you are ready to aim and fire. NOW

In the Kitchen With Deborah Gery

Over the past 45 years, Deborah learned the value of experimenting while developing tried-and-true recipes for her husband.

She shares at potlucks and Bible studies for First United Methodist Church Mansfield, where she also volunteers as a Stephen Minister. With United Methodist Women, Deborah recently produced a special tea. Her fun menu included hot and cold tea served with a trio of sandwiches accompanied by a veggie cup and a fruit salad. To top it off, there were lemon snowball cookies, scones, a lemon raspberry loaf and shortbread cookies.

Cucumber Tea Sandwiches

3 oz. cream cheese
2 Tbsp. real mayonnaise
1 tsp. minced garlic
2 tsp. dry Italian seasoning
6 slices bread
Salt and pepper, to taste
1 cucumber, thinly sliced

- **1.** Mix first four ingredients in a food processor. Spread mixture evenly on 6 slices of your favorite bread. Sprinkle with salt and pepper.
- **2.** Top 3 slices with thin slices of cucumber, peeled or unpeeled.
- **3.** Close with the other 3 slices of bread, cut into quarters and serve on a pretty platter.

Chicken Salad

1/2 medium onion
1 stalk celery
1/2 cup dried cranberries
1/2 cup chopped pecans
3 cups cooked chicken, chopped
1 cup mayonnaise
1 tsp. prepared mustard
1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 tsp. pepper
1/2 tsp. dill weed, or to taste
1/4 tsp. garlic powder
1 loaf bread

I. Chop onion and celery in a food processor; set aside.

- **2.** Chop cranberries and pecans. Mix chicken with onion and cranberry mixes.
- **3.** Add mayonnaise, mustard and seasonings. Mix well, adding more mayonnaise if needed. Refrigerate.
- **4.** Spread evenly between two slices of your favorite bread.
- 5. Cut sandwiches into quarters before serving.

Avocado Egg Salad

12 large eggs, hardboiled2 Tbsp. onion, finely chopped3 Tbsp. Dijon mustard1 Tbsp. mayonnaise1 tsp. dried basil

Salt and pepper, to taste 3 avocados, diced (divided use)

2 baguettes 1/4 cup olive oil 1/8 cup Italian spices

- **1.** Peel and chop eggs. Add onion, mustard, mayonnaise and seasonings. Mix to combine.
- **2.** Add 2 diced avocados and stir to incorporate.
- **3.** Cut baguettes in half lengthwise. Spread with olive oil and Italian spices, and then toast lightly.
- **4.** Spread avocado egg salad evenly atop the 4 baguettes, slice the open-faced sandwiches into as many servings as necessary, and top each off with several chunks from the third avocado.

Daphne's Scones

2 cups flour
1/4 tsp. baking soda
2 tsp. salt
4 Tbsp. sugar (divided use)
1/3 cup butter
1 large egg
1/2 cup buttermilk
Pam Cooking Spray
1/4 cup milk

1. Combine flour, baking soda and salt with 2 Tbsp. sugar. Cut in butter. Add egg and buttermilk. Mix until a ball is formed, but do not overmix. Roll out to about 1/2-inch thickness. Using a 2-inch biscuit cutter, cut out about 18 rounds. 2. Place on baking sheet sprayed with Pam. Brush

2. Place on baking sneet sprayed with Pam. Brush with milk and remaining sugar. Bake at 425 F for about 10 minutes until they begin to brown.




