



TO JUST SING

When 16-year-old Alex Webber opens his mouth to sing, you know you are going to hear something special. Performing a Latin tune flawlessly, he demonstrated why he received the honor of singing with The New York Pops at Carnegie Hall two years in a row. This incredible experience might never have happened without the insight of a teacher.

Missy Webber, Alex's mom, decided that part of his homeschool experience was to take piano lessons and hired Jeannine Kessinger. "She has worked with Alex since he was 7 years old. He started out taking piano lessons from her and would sing every time he hit the key. He was like tone perfect, even then. She's really a vocalist and kept telling me he could sing. I kept saying, 'No one in my family can sing,'' she laughed.

"I would hum along to the song I was playing, and Mrs. Kessinger picked it up," Alex shared. "If it hadn't been for her, we never would've pursued singing." The first time Alex performed in front of others was during a Christmas recital, in which he sang a song from Alvin and the Chipmunks. "I learned that I liked being in front of crowds," he confessed. "It was very comfortable to me." Alex's ease in performing opened the way for him to begin singing at church events and competitions and in the







church choir. The first time he sang in front of his church, at age 13, was during a talent show, which he won. It was also the first time he sang in Latin. "I loved it! I remember everyone was surprised that I could sing that well," he enthused. "I can sing Italian, German, Latin and English. It's easier for me to sing foreign languages than English, and I prefer it. It only takes about a couple of months to learn how to pronounce the words. My teacher understands all of the ways to sing foreign languages."

Alex typically spends hours every day practicing his music. But when his brother, Ethan, was born with reticular dysgenesis — an extremely rare condition in which a child is born with no white blood cells — Alex took a break from music. His brother needed a bone marrow transplant. "Siblings are almost never a match," Missy enlightened. "Alex was found to be a perfect match — 100 percent. He donated his marrow to his brother, who was only 23 days old." Today, Ethan is a very active and happy little boy.

When Alex resumed his pursuit of music, he continued to gain experience in performing. Every Sunday, he can be found singing in the adult choir of St. Joseph Catholic Church. He participated and received a 1, which is the highest number you can score, in his last two solo/ensemble competitions. He did numerous plays and musical theater at Artisan Center Theater, in Hurst, and at Mansfield Community Theatre, in Mansfield. "My first main role was



Winnie the Pooh. I had the best time, but I see participating in the theater as a hobby. I prefer to just sing," he admitted. Alex also competed in the homeschool organization Texas Private Schools Music Educators Association, which services the musical needs of private school students but allows homeschooled students to participate. "I made All-State Region 6th chair," he shared.

An opportunity for him to expand his horizons by auditioning with Camp Broadway was presented by Mrs. Kissinger. "Camp Broadway is an organization that helps and promotes children who want to learn more about music theater," Missy explained. "Alex was one of 60 Camp Broadway kids from around the U.S., ages 12 to 16, chosen to perform with the New York Pops at

Carnegie Hall in New York City. He got to go up there for a week. Last year, he auditioned for the show and was chosen. This year, he was invited back, so he did not need to try out again."

Alex's tryout for Camp Broadway was in the form of an audition tape. "We went to a film studio to have it taped for a professional video submission," he said. When he arrived in New York for the camp, Alex had rehearsals from 8:00 a.m.-5:30 p.m. every day. The composers for the show brought in the music, and the kids had the chance to meet them. The kids met with the choreographer who trained them in all of their dance routines. They had two days to learn the dance and two days to learn the songs. They were kept so busy that after the first day of rehearsal, Alex had blisters on his feet. "It was very strenuous, but it was fun, also," he added. All of the week's


preparation and practice climaxed in a performance with The New York Pops.

"This is really all about the kids being incorporated into this type of environment and learning what all the people do in the different career choices in theater costumers, lighting, directors and writers," Missy stated. "This gave the kids exposure to all the different things they can do. It's not just singing and being on stage. It opens their eyes to a whole new world. It was an expensive venture for our family, but my husband and I felt like we couldn't say no to such an experience. If this is where Alex's passion lies, then he needed to see what it's really about."



Being accepted into Camp Broadway and performing with The New York Pops is not the only achievement for Alex. Presently, he is very excited about having auditioned for the very select Children's Chorus of Greater Dallas and being accepted. He will join the Youth Chorus for the next two years. "We are beyond excited for this opportunity and the experience Alex will receive working with them," Missy enthused. "He will get to travel and perform at the Meyerson Symphony Center numerous times over the next few years."

In looking to the future, the homeschool sophomore wants to double major in vocal performance and computer science after graduation. "TCU would be my dream school, and there's also Baylor. I want to stay close to home." The year 2015 was a great year for Alex with his performances in the solo ensemble and at Camp Broadway and All-State Region. This year promises to be just as busy for him. He will participate in all of the events he did in 2015, with the addition of the Children's Chorus to his list. REVVING UP TO GIVE





For some people, there is no sound as heavenly as the roar of an engine and no smell as sweet as oil and gasoline. For more than a century, young boys have made a hobby out of their love for classic cars and pickups, but college, the draft and getting married ended that hobby decades ago for many of the guys in Midlothian Classic Wheels. Nothing, though, could end their love for classic cars and hot rods. Today, Alan Krohn is part of a group that has turned this passion for classics into one of the most generous charities in Ellis County.

Midlothian Classic Wheels was born out of several people's common love of hot rods. "A group of us got together almost 15 years ago, and we just picked the name 'Midlothian Classic Wheels," he explained. "We had a great time bringing our cars together and letting people see what we had." Right away, though, they knew that just showing off their cars wasn't enough, so they included charitable giving in their charter. "We have three things in common," he explained. "That's our love for our families, love for our cars and our willingness to help children who cannot help themselves." Beginning in February 2004, Midlothian Classic Wheels started showing their cars and raising money for charity.

"We like to say there are really only two requirements," Alan quipped. "You have to have \$25, and you have to be breathing! But we might be willing to overlook that second one." There were fewer than 10 members when they started the club, not knowing how big it would grow or how much money they would raise. "We are an open club, which means you can have any year and make of car. We're up to about 140 members," Alan said. "We do events most weekends, and we have three big shows a year." The club generally hosts events for charities that target children, specifically,

commonly working with St. Jude Medical Center, several local adoption homes and the area Special Olympics.

Every month, the club does cruise-ins at Brookshire's and Texas Best Smokehouse. "We ride into the parking lots and set up cars for people to see," he explained. "We'll set



up the sound system and have music and just hang out. We don't make money with those though. That's more about having fun and promoting goodwill for the club. The money mainly comes from our shows at Getzendaner Park in Waxahachie and El Chico in DeSoto." Every year, the club hosts car shows in June, September and October. They charge an entrance fee, and some people donate money, all of which goes to the organizations the club supports. "We give every cent we make away," Alan emphasized. "We don't spend club money on candy for Trunk or Treat at Halloween or presents for Christmas. That's all donated by club members. At the end of each year, the club itself is broke, and that's on purpose."

Midlothian Classic Wheels started their first Waxahachie show, Cars in the Park, almost 10 years ago. They took over a car show that had been at the park for 20 years but needed help. "Another car club





used to host the Waxahachie Fun Run that benefits Texas Baptist Home, but their club folded, so we stepped in," Alan mentioned. "We've added a few shows over the years that way. If someone asks for help with something, and it involves hot rods and helping kids, we usually say yes." They have sent the proceeds from Cars in the Park to several various charities in Ellis County, but in recent years, the biggest event has been the show benefiting St. Jude Medical Center every September. "We sell sponsorships to dozens of companies to pay for all of the awards, and last year, we had about 20 big raffle items," he continued. "They

used to send us shirts and hats as a thank you, and we would sell those to raise more money. But then we learned they were actually spending money getting that stuff. We told them to keep their shirts and hats to save the money they were spending on us."

In the last several years, the club has raised almost \$35,000 for St. Jude, and they have given just under \$140,000 to all their charities since 2011. "I hadn't realized until recently how much we have raised," he admitted. "It's not about us being so great, so we don't really list out what we've solicited, usually." Other than St. Jude, all of the money they raise goes to charities in Ellis County, specifically, and they are always paying attention to new giving opportunities. "A few years ago, we started supporting Campfire Creek, a specialneeds therapeutic horse riding center in Waxahachie," he continued.

While the money is impressive, the club is just as proud of the contact it makes with many of the kids they are trying to help. "One of the kids at the St. Jude's show told a member he hoped this would be our

last show," Alan said. "I was confused, but then he said he hoped we were raising enough money to cure everyone's sickness." Occasionally, they stop in at the children's homes they support to spend time with the kids, something they started after one of their first car shows in 2004. At Christmas, they help families who are experiencing hard times. "One year, there was a family where the dad had just left, so we made some calls, and our members put together presents for the kids, gas money for the mom and food for several weeks," he remembered.

The club cherishes the visits the club used to make to Children's Medical Center in Dallas. "The hospital keeps toys to give as presents when kids finish treatments. When we heard that, we brought all the toys we could," he explained. "One year, there was a young man who was supposed to go into hospice on a Tuesday," he detailed. "But the boy wanted to stay because we were bringing our cars the next day. They let him wait to go to hospice until our cruise-in, and, sadly, he passed away that weekend. We were sad, but we also knew he had one last happy day."

Alan admits it takes a lot of work to plan events, find sponsors and take care of classic cars. "If we drive the car one day, it takes two days to clean it back up for a show," he laughed. "But seeing those smiles on kids' faces makes it worth it every time." **NOW**







house. Inside, the wood theme continues with hardwood floors from the entryway throughout most of the home. 

It's that time of year, again! Get out your camo, start cleaning your rifle and head to the store to stock up for your hunting expeditions. While most seasoned hunters have their routines down to an exact science, there are some simple things any new or novice hunter should know before heading out to get this year's limit.

HAVE A PLAN

• Get Your Papers in Order

Before you do anything else, make sure your licenses are up to date. You may purchase licenses at most sporting goods outfitters or large superstores. You can also now purchase licenses online through the Texas Parks and Wildlife website.


• Know the Calendar

Texas has outlined specific seasons for different animals. This area, called the North Zone, has start dates as early as September 1 for doves. The most anticipated season — white-tail deer — starts November 5, and there are dates for various game and fowl

starting everywhere in between. There are several animals with multiple or split seasons, so be sure you are hunting your prey legally, as the penalties include loss of license, hefty fines and can even involve jail time. If you want to try your hand at bowhunting, your season will start about a month before rifle hunters.

· Pick Your Spot

There are several options when choosing a hunting spot. You may try to find a friend who has a hunting lease, allowing them to hunt on someone else's property. Or, you can opt for one of the many public hunting lands nearby. There are plenty of options within an hour or so, but if you are willing to travel a little farther, the Texas Hill Country is known to have the largest number of white-tail deer. 


GET READY

· Before You Lock and Load You'll want to have your guns and ammunition ready before your trip. Cleaning your shotgun or rifle takes a little time, so you do not want to wait until the. big weekend to take your gun out of the safe. Be sure to bring enough ammunition. If you have a great hunt, you may only need a few shots to reach your limit, but you should plan on a few misses just to be safe. If you have never hunted, you will want to spend some time practicing your shot, which means you should plan a weekend to go shoot targets or clays. This will also help you get familiar with your weapon. It is also very important to know your surroundings. You especially need to know if other hunters are nearby.

• Blend In and Stand Out

The right camouflage can be paramount in keeping your game from spotting you



before you pull the trigger. Make sure your gear is right for the natural environment that will surround you. On the other hand, there are clear laws requiring hunters on public lands to wear at least 400 square inches of hunter orange, in addition to orange headgear. So, when you are packing your camouflage, do not forget your orange vest and hat.

• Bring Your Vittles

You will probably be in the field for a while, so be sure to pack some food and drinks. Avoid odorous things like garlic, as

well as fibrous foods like beans or broccoli that may lead to discomfort while you are trying to hunt. The best options are foods that have carbs, protein and a little fat. A peanut butter sandwich is easy and will keep your body ready when that deer or bird comes into view.



• Staying the Night

If you are planning on making an entire weekend of your hunting trip, you will have to add another level of preparation. Research what camp grounds are available. If you are planning to go on the season's opening weekend, you will want to reserve a spot ahead of time. If you are pulling your tent from a pile of things you rarely use, set it up and check it for leaks before your trip. Bring a flashlight and extra batteries, and be sure to bring a warm enough sleeping bag for potentially cold temperatures. Lastly, be mindful of local wildlife. If bears or other animals are a potential threat, take precautions to keep food and trash sealed and out of reach from such critters.

SAFETY FIRST

• Fire When Ready

Guns can be dangerous if not handled correctly. The state of Texas requires a hunter's education course for every hunter, which is good for life, after completion. You can get a one-time deferral good for a year, but it is highly recommended that you go through safety courses before operating a gun.

• Beware of Snakes

Most likely, your hunting site will be home to slithery critters, as well as the prey you are there to hunt. Only about 10 percent of Texas' snakes are dangerous for humans, so the first step to safety is identification. Bring a field guide, and be on the lookout for copperheads, cottonmouths and rattlesnakes. If you or a companion are bitten, the best solution is to get to a nearby hospital. Do not try to cut around the puncture or try to suck out the venom. Instead, clean around the wound with disinfectant soap, take off jewelry or items that may restrict the area, and try to limit movement of the extremity until you can get to a doctor.

Whether you are hoping to bag meat for the winter, or you want a 16-point buck over the mantel, a great trip starts with the right equipment and preparation. Staying safe while you are out will ensure a successful hunt is not overshadowed by injury or tragedy. With these tips, you are ready to aim and fire. **NOW**





Grilled Mahi Mahi Tacos

Fish:

- 1/4 cup olive oil
- lime, juiced
 Tbsp. ancho chili powder
- l jalapeño, minced
- 1/4 cup cilantro, chopped
- 1 lb. Mahi Mahi

Baja Sauce:

 cup good quality mayonnaise, like Dukes or Hellman's
 1/4 cup milk
 4 Tbsp. fresh lemon juice

l tsp. garlic salt

Garnishes (Optional):

Red and green cabbage, finely shredded Pico de gallo Cilantro, chopped Cotija cheese Lime wedges Corn tortillas, warmed For fish: Mix all ingredients except Mahi Mahi in a shallow baking dish. Marinate fish in mixture for at least 15 minutes but no longer than 20. Grill at moderate heat for several minutes per side, until flakey.
 For Baja sauce: Add all ingredients to a mason jar and shake until thoroughly combined; set aside.
 Serve fish topped with sauce and garnishes of your preference.

Texas Caviar

- 3 15-oz. cans black beans, rinsed and drained
- 2 11-oz. cans small white corn, drained
- 2 10-oz. cans Ro-Tel tomatoes with green chilies
- I bunch green onions, chopped I each red, yellow and green bell
- pepper, deseeded and diced
- l bunch cilantro, chopped
- 1/4 cup red wine vinegar
- l lemon, juiced

3 cloves garlic, finely minced Cumin, cayenne pepper, chili powder and garlic salt, to taste

I. Mix all ingredients well in a very large bowl. Cover and refrigerate for several hours before serving with chips.

5 ears farm fresh corn, cleaned

1 tsp. chili powder
1 tsp. kosher salt
1 tsp. black pepper
1 cup freshly grated Parmesan cheese
Pam cooking spray
Lime wedges

 Brush corn with mayonnaise. Sprinkle on spices and Parmesan. Wrap individually in foil sprayed with Pam. Grill for 10 minutes or until kernels begin to brown.
 Remove from grill and let steam for several minutes inside foil. Remove from foil and serve with lime wedges.

Lemon Shortbread Bars

Crust:

1/2 cup powdered sugar2 cups flour1 cup butter, cubed and chilled

Filling:

4 eggs, well beaten 1 tsp. baking powder 1/4 cup fresh lemon juice 2 cups sugar 1/2 cup flour 1/2 tsp. salt

lcing: 3/4 cup powdered sugar 2 Tbsp. lemon juice 2 Tbsp. butter, melted

 For crust: Combine powdered sugar and flour in a mixing bowl and cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse breadcrumbs.
 Press mixture into a 13x9-inch baking

pan and bake at 350 F for 25 minutes. Set aside to cool.

3. *For filling:* Mix all filling ingredients together well; pour over cooled crust. Bake at 350 F for 25 more minutes; set aside.

4. For icing: Mix all icing ingredients together well; pour over baked bars while still hot. Let cool thoroughly before serving.
