

our first show years ago in Fort Worth," Ryan laughed. "We made like \$75, but we were pumped." That first gig in Fort Worth was only the beginning for the Vanderburg brothers. "From that day on, we began to perform regularly. Things just took off for us."

Things have evolved for Ryan and Caleb since those early days. Today, they are booked most every weekend and enjoy music as a full-time career. The name of their band, She Dances, consists of just Ryan and Caleb. Ryan described their music as being uplifting with positive lyrics. Their desire to impact people on a positive level is reflected in the band's name. As to the inspiration of the name, Ryan explained, "She Dances was the name of a nonprofit organization committed to helping girls escape slavery and human trafficking in Honduras. We asked permission to use the name because of the message of hope tied to it." The brothers can be found playing gigs any weekend all over Ellis County and throughout the Metroplex, delivering their positive message of hope to eager audiences.

Recently, She Dances has benefited from some national exposure. Several years ago, Caleb's wife, Briana, found an



advertisement for a Folger's Coffee jingle competition and suggested the brothers enter. With the deadline only three days away, the trio rushed into Ryan's home studio and created a jingle and video. Finishing with no time to spare, Ryan uploaded the video the night before the deadline. "The next morning, I discovered the file had failed to upload," Ryan lamented. "We missed the deadline." Folgers Coffee said there was nothing



they could do about missing the deadline, and they had to settle for a jingle and video with no purpose.

Fast forward to 2017 and Folgers Coffee, once again, decided to hold the competition. Ryan, Caleb and Briana took the jingle and video they previously made, re-recorded it with higher quality equipment and submitted it. Ryan laughed, "This time, I made sure the video uploaded successfully." After waiting a few weeks, they finally heard back from Folgers Coffee. The trio won first runner up in the competition. The prize was \$2,500 and a trip to Nashville for a mentoring session with county music star Chris Young.

About the trip, Ryan said, "It was amazing to visit some of the top recording studios and establish some really solid industry connections." The video for the Folgers Coffee jingle, as well as information about the band, can be found on the group's website, www.shedancesband.com.

In addition to playing gigs with She Dances, Caleb serves as the worship leader at Vertical Church in Ovilla, along with Briana and Ryan. Caleb is lead vocalist and plays the guitar. Briana plays keyboard and provides back-up vocals. Other musicians on stage play in perfect harmony. "I find fulfillment in knowing God can use me to lead others in worshiping Him," Caleb shared.

Between leading worship at Vertical Church and touring the Metroplex as She Dances, the three are never lacking things to do. The demands on their time are ever-increasing, so balancing career











and family is of utmost importance. However, Ryan also sees possibilities for the future.

Over the years, Ryan has assembled a quality home recording studio, which has allowed the two brothers to record and produce their own unique brand of music. Ultimately, Ryan's goal serves a greater purpose. "I would like to offer a place where other musicians can get their sound out into the community," he said. The vision Ryan has is for something greater than himself. "There is a great musical community here in Ellis County," he continued. "I would like to be a part of establishing a place where musicians can collaborate and work together."

Currently, Ryan is in the process of establishing how his home studio can fit into this big picture and how to get the word out. Explaining his desire, he offered a biblical reference. "You know how iron sharpens iron? I want to be a part of something like that."


No matter the success or demands on their time, for the trio, one thing is clear — music always comes back to worship. Caleb recalled a music conference he attended some years before. "I remember being at that conference and hearing God's voice clearly telling me that His ultimate purpose for me is leading worship." He continued with a smile on his face, "There is nothing I would rather do."

Briana echoed her husband's sentiments. "Worship music touches people on such a deep level. I enjoy being a part of that."

How does music have such power to tie these three together? Perhaps Caleb summed it up perfectly when he said, "When we play together, it's just magic." Some things are just not meant to be explained. NOW





schoolwork," Skye shared. It is evident that Terry's grandparents not only handed down a piece of furniture but also a sense of commitment and the joy of being a family.



Imagine if props and costumes could develop a child's sense of worth and being. Imagine if stages and games could instill a greater sense of values, attitudes and social norms. When the Red Oak ISD Education Foundation awarded the Imagination Grant to the students of Eastridge Elementary School, its mission to offer greater opportunities for innovative learning came to fruition.

"It provided us with a more hands-on approach, a kinesthetic approach for whole body instruction," said Tracy Pitts, Eastridge Elementary School's music teacher. "It [the Imagination Grant] was, in my opinion, one of the most important grants we received."

With the grant, they were able to secure two stages, a restaurant, a small kitchen and costumes. It was an educational wonderland for her students.



"First, they got onto the stage, and from there the kids began creating characters, then a place, and then began making up their own stories." As self-esteem and confidence continued to build, they became more creative and expressive. "Even my shiest students came out of their bubbles."

For Executive Director Karen Anderson, awarding grant money is just one aspect of the foundation's many functions. "We are here to benefit the kids," she said. The foundation's mission is to provide additional educational programs and activities not funded by the ISD's budget. "We provide the extras." With ever-increasing demands diminishing resources for schools around the nation, education foundations are the perfect complement to public schools, providing fundraising efforts and having the ability to handle and distribute monies













where needed. Since its inception in 2002, the Red Oak ISD Education Foundation partnered with Red Oak ISD to ensure the greatest educational experience possible. To date, the foundation has awarded over \$700,000 in grants, not to mention the additional funding for dual credit scholarships, school district employee-of-the-month and teacher-ofthe-month funds. They received outside grants, which awarded an additional \$45,000 from the Dart Foundation for elementary STEM labs and \$35,000 to the high school's Project Lead the Way. The foundation also assists teachers in knowing how to find and appropriately apply for specific grants.

In honor of the foundation's 15th birthday, there is much to celebrate. Yet neither Karen, Administrative Coordinator Paige Davis nor the board of directors' 21 volunteers rest on their laurels. In addition to September's birthday bash, the foundation will also host its annual golf tournament in October and the Santa Shuffle 5K race in December. To the public, the foundation is best known for the golf tournament, but it is the behind-the-scenes work that is forever shaping lives.

"Karen does a great job with fundraising and promoting," Tracy Pitts said, "but she also provides us different ways to apply for a grant." Both Karen and Paige work to assist teachers from all seven schools in the district to write their own grants. Tracy is just one of many who has experienced great success.

"These grants and the Foundation allow us to personalize lessons. Yes, we have the textbooks and classroom materials needed, but when you get a

grant that puts lesson plans outside the box, our students grow more and excel faster," Tracy said.

"The Foundation is always rallying around us to think outside the box and is willing to do anything to help the kids learn in different ways," said Diane Magier, the art and music teacher at Donald T. Shields Elementary.

In 2005, Diane received a grant for steel drums and started the Shields Steel Drum program. "It's hugely popular with the kids. We are one of a few elementary schools in Texas to have steel drums," Diana said. Twelve years later, she is still excited about all the benefits the drums offer. It's a world instrument from Trinidad, which allows her students to learn all aspects of music, from listening to each other to working together as a band. "We got drum tables and partnered with the PE teacher," Diane said, speaking of yet another grant. Together, the educators created Drum Fit, a very physical task that combines rhythm, music and fitness. "Putting all the kids together in one big setting and having them work together is magical. They are learning so many things without even realizing it."



Incorporating all the academic disciplines in a unique, exciting way spells success for the school district and its young charges. "The Foundation has worked so hard to find the funds, go for the grants, and support what we do. I'm really, truly thankful for what they've done for Red Oak," Diane said.

"I have the best job in the district," Karen said, "because everything we do is good. All that we do is for our kids." While she jokes that many in the business community might say, "Oh, boy, here comes Karen again," Karen is very proud of how the business end of the foundation is handled. "Everything we











do is transparent. Those who donate can see exactly where their money goes and how it is used." While she works very hard for the children of Red Oak, Karen is adamant that the praise belongs to the Red Oak ISD, the community and the volunteers. "We couldn't do what we do without them all," Karen added. "We are so grateful for what has been bestowed upon us."

Who could have imagined a grant for easing tensions at testing times, teaching students how to relax and better concentrate, thus improving grades, would come in the form of yoga mats and exercise balls? But when Tracy wrote for the Yoga-Nah-Love-It grant, she got just that.

When it comes time to blow out the candles for the Red Oak ISD Education Foundation's birthday cake, Karen already knows what she will be wishing for. "I would love for donations to come year-round, not just during our events," she said. Coordinating and paying for events are costly investments in both time and money. For Karen and the Foundation, the dream is to have an abundance of money for the children of Red Oak. "I wish to increase community parent awareness, to have more people understand what we do and how they can help. We do have a goal of raising \$150,000 for the year," she said. "There are just so many great ideas out there, but not enough time." With a laugh she asked, "Can I also wish for more hours in the day?"



In the Kitchen With Kay Huff

Mud pies baked in an Easy-Bake oven were Kay Huff's first culinary creations. But growing up as "number eight" out of nine kids in her family, Kay graduated early to the kitchen and learned from her mother the joy of cooking for a crowd. "My mom and I saved Imperial Sugar labels, so I could get a free copy of *My First Cookbook*," Kay remembered.

Since then, this graphic artist and web designer at Polyguard Products has added to her cookbook collection. "I collect vintage cookbooks," Kay said. With her sister, Sally Drobinski, Kay compiled the *Saunders Family Cookbook* that's filled with family favorites. Most of my cooking these days is for family holiday gatherings. Recipes should be shared generation to generation. Cooking brings families together."

Sausage Balls

- I 1-lb. pkg. breakfast sausageI cup Bisquick Baking Mix
- I lb. cheddar cheese, freshly grated (Don't use packaged grated cheese.)
- **I.** Preheat the oven to 350 F. In a large mixing bowl, combine all ingredients together; mix by hand until the mixture sticks together.
- **2.** Using 1 heaping Tbsp. of the mix, roll into balls; place each on an ungreased cookie sheet. Bake 10-15 minutes or until lightly browned.

Cheese Ball

 I-lb. pkg. cheddar cheese, grated
 8-oz. pkg. Kraft Philadelphia Original Cream Cheese, softened
 1/4 tsp. garlic powder

- 1/4 tsp. onion powder1/8 tsp. turmeric (optional)1 pkg. fresh green onions, finely sliced1 pkg. Keebler Townhouse Crackers
- **1.** In a medium-size bowl, mix the first 5 ingredients by hand; form into a large ball. **2.** Roll the ball in the green onions until the ball is covered; serve with crackers at room temperature.

Cherry Delight Cheesecake

Crust:

2 cups flour
2 Tbsp. sugar
2 sticks margarine, softened
1 cup pecans, chopped

Filling.

1 8-oz. pkg. Kraft Philadelphia Original Cream Cheese, softened

2 cups powdered sugar

1 16-oz. tub Cool Whip, thawed and softened

Topping:

I-2 2I-oz. cans Lucky Leaf Cherry Pie Filling

I cup pecans, chopped

- **1.** For crust: Preheat the oven to 350 F. Mix all crust ingredients together by hand until crumbly. Press into the bottom only of an 11x13-inch glass cake pan.
- **2.** Bake 15-20 minutes until very lightly browned; cool completely for 1 hour before preparing filling.
- **3.** For filling: Whip cream cheese with a hand mixer until smooth; gradually add powdered sugar, and continue mixing until smooth.
- **4.** By hand, gently fold in Cool Whip until thoroughly mixed; spread filling over cooled crust.
- **5.** For topping: Gently spread cherry pie filling over the whipped cheese filling, so as not to disturb the lower layer. Top evenly with pecans; keep refrigerated until ready to serve.

Banana Pudding

- 1 3.4-oz. box French Vanilla Jell-O Instant Pudding Mix
- 2 3.4-oz. boxes Banana Cream Jell-O Instant Pudding Mix

2 cups milk

- 1 1/2 cups sour cream
- 1 16-oz. tub Cool Whip (divided use)
- I box vanilla wafers
- 3-4 bananas, peeled and sliced crosswise
- **1.** In a large bowl, mix together all 3 pkgs. of pudding mix with milk. Mixture will be very thick.
- **2.** Blend in sour cream; fold in 1/2 of the Cool Whip. In a deep-dish, glass serving bowl, layer vanilla wafers, bananas and pudding; repeat layering until all ingredients are used.
- **3.** Top with remaining Cool Whip; keep refrigerated. For best results, chill in freezer for 30 minutes prior to serving.
